The girl's soccer team realized early that their schedule was not a walk in the park. Opening with a devastating loss to Division II defending state champions Walsh Jesuit, the Lady Wolves came back to beat Strongsville 1-0 at home. Next came DeSales, a big game for the Wolves since the Stallions were seeded higher in the coaches' poll. Making two goals that the officials disallowed, Stacey Maurer insisted, "We totally dominated the game but fell short because of poor officiating. The tapes will prove my point."

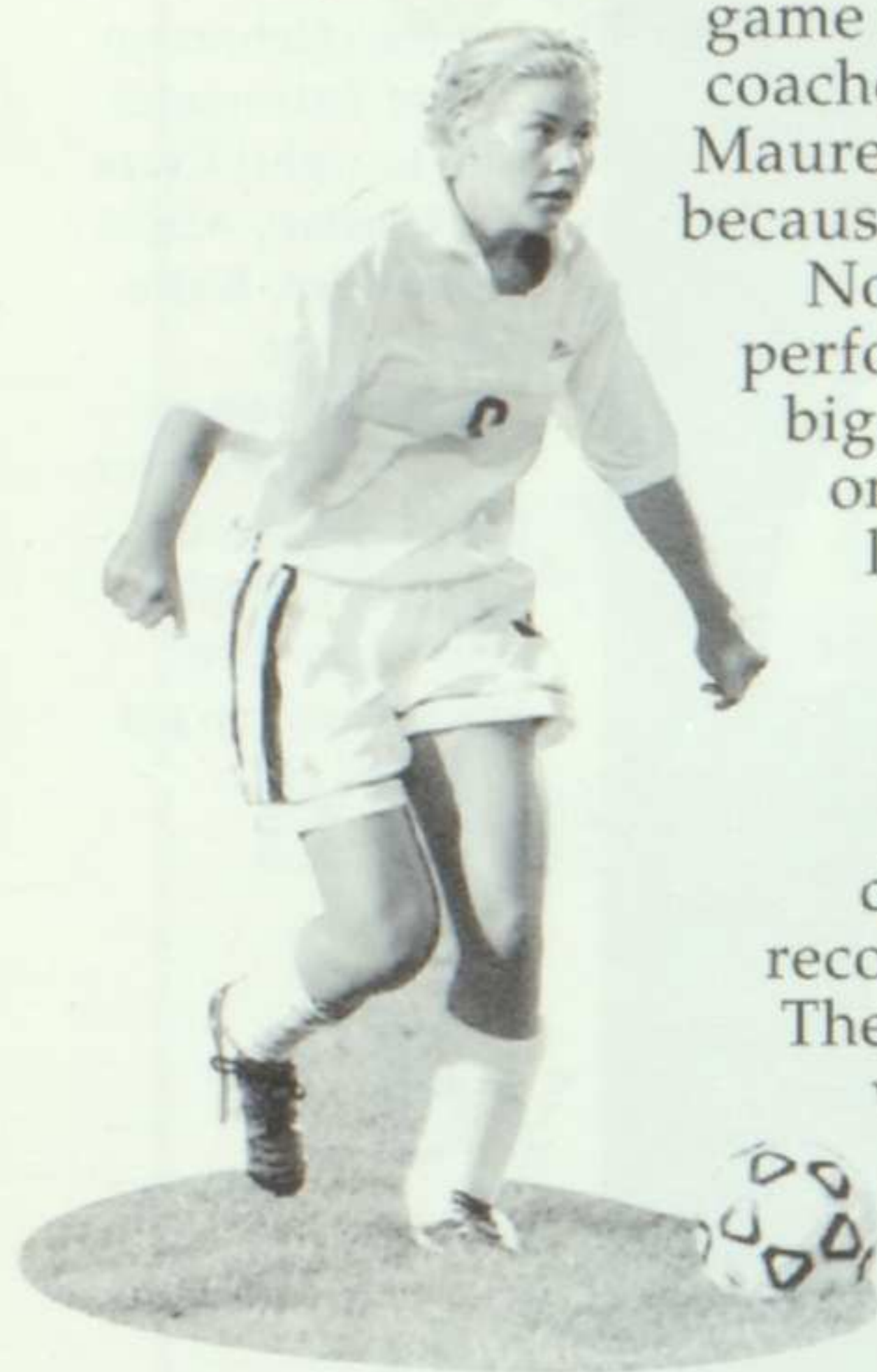
Not letting that loss get them down, they had a break through performance against Dublin Scioto, winning 7-0. Facing their biggest challenge, they met undefeated Division I state champions and number 2 nationally ranked Dublin Coffman. Coffman looked past this game, but the Lady Wolves were ready and won. The girls headed into one of their last games of the regular season against Hilliard Davidson to determine the OCC champ. A loss would have split the title between the Wolves, Westerville South and Hilliard Davidson, but they didn't have to worry since they won 2-1, making their OCC record 5-0.

They entered the tournament with the momentum of a four game winning streak and OCC championship. They won their first two district games in shutouts 14-0 and 7-0. They had been waiting for October 22nd since their last meeting with DeSales. The girls came out in the first half, scoring after just six minutes as sophomore Katie Miler put one past the DeSales keeper. After that, they went with a more defensive game plan, surviving the first half with the score at 1-0. In the second half, DeSales scored after seven minutes, destroying the Wolves' momentum. The Lady Wolves regained their composure but with eleven minutes remaining on the clock, DeSales scored again. The Wolves tried to hang on; Maureen Young fired a shot that went just wide with a few minutes remaining. They had numerous chances but just couldn't finish it.

Though the loss was devastating, the girls felt their season was an overall success. The team bonded well on and off the field, making a fun season. First year coach Courtney Irwin was pleased with her players, saying, "I couldn't have asked for a better first year here. Each one of my kids had a heart of gold and made the necessary sacrifices to achieve great things. And although I will dearly miss the seven graduating seniors, I believe a strong foundation was built and I look forward to all the success that the future holds."

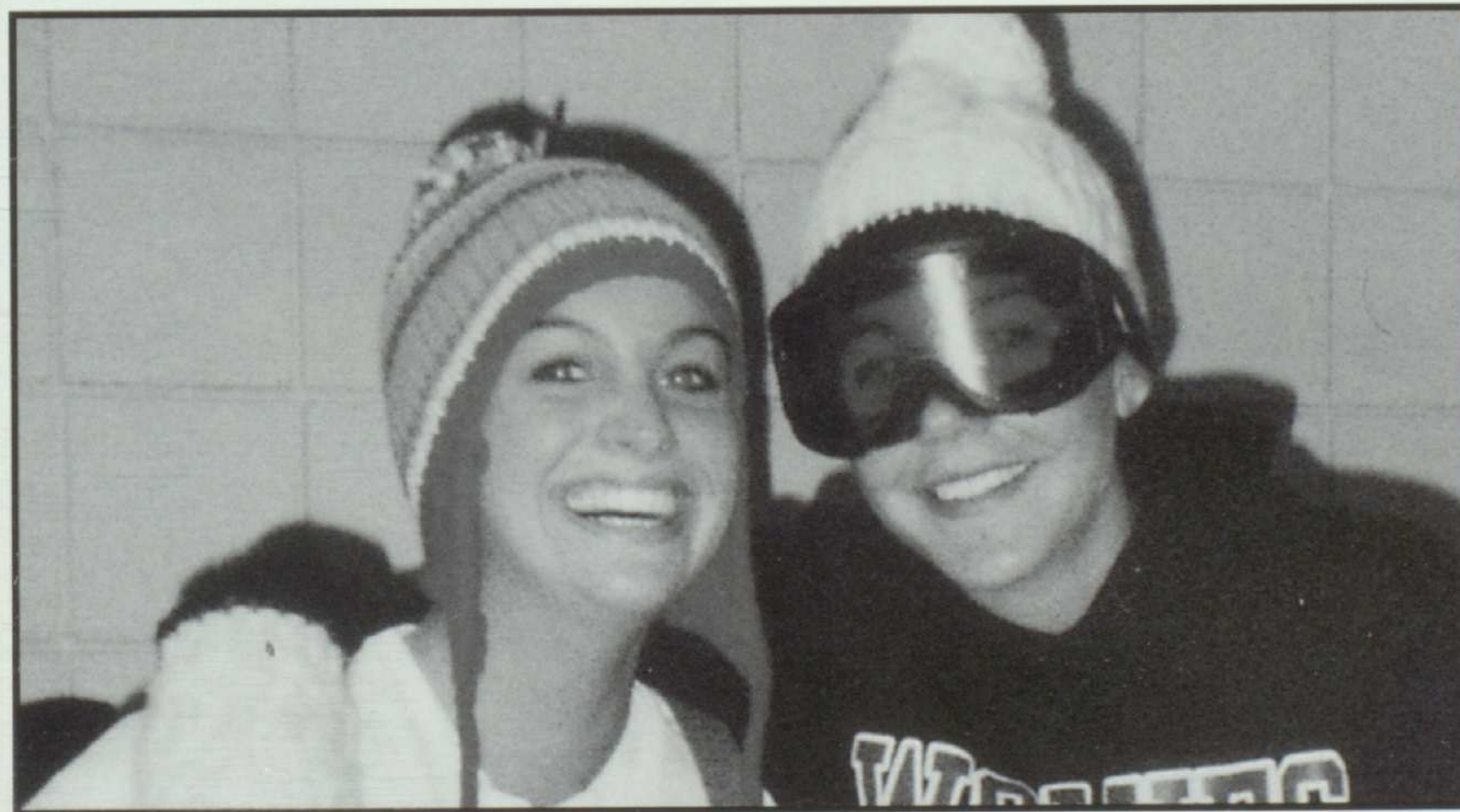

After last year's successful year, the boys' soccer team faced a tough schedule. Their season opener against Westerville North, a constant rival and threat to the Wolves, was a satisfying tie. The Wolves proved to the crowd and to themselves that they can hang with the big dogs. Their confidence led them through the season and to a (10-2-4) record. Important victories included a 2-1 win over Cleveland Saint Ignatius in the Columbus Crew Stadium and after coming back from a 0-2 deficit at halftime, they beat OCC opponent Grove City. The Olentangy win, 4-1, built their confidence further. Reynoldsburg, however, spoiled their chances of gaining an OCC title as they played to a scoreless tie. "We had a golden opportunity. We had to win this game to win the league. Unfortunately, a tie wasn't good enough," coach Jeff Vincent said.

The boys entered the tournament as the number six seed. Their first tournament match-up was unseeded Delaware Hayes, whom they beat 3-0 with Craig Neal's hat trick. Their second round game, a win against Marion Harding, raised their hopes until the district semifinal game, a nail-biting loss at Reynoldsburg. They brought the score within one goal following a three-goal deficit but, sadly, came up short. "We dug ourselves such a deep hole at 3-0, it was tough to get out. But we almost pulled out the tie by hitting the crossbar with five minutes left," said coach Jeff Vincent. Sadly, coach Vincent has decided to teach and coach in a school system closer to his home so he resigned this spring. Craig Neal and Jason Leuthold earned First Team All OCC. Erik Ciccarelli, Bobby Kosmatka and David Rupp received Second Team All OCC honors. Matt Wilkins earned Honorable Mention All OCC while Michael Blackwell earned Academic All OCC. District honors included Craig Neal, First Team; Jason Leuthold, Second Team; and Reid Zarnoch, Michael Blackwell and David Rupp, Academic All Ohio.

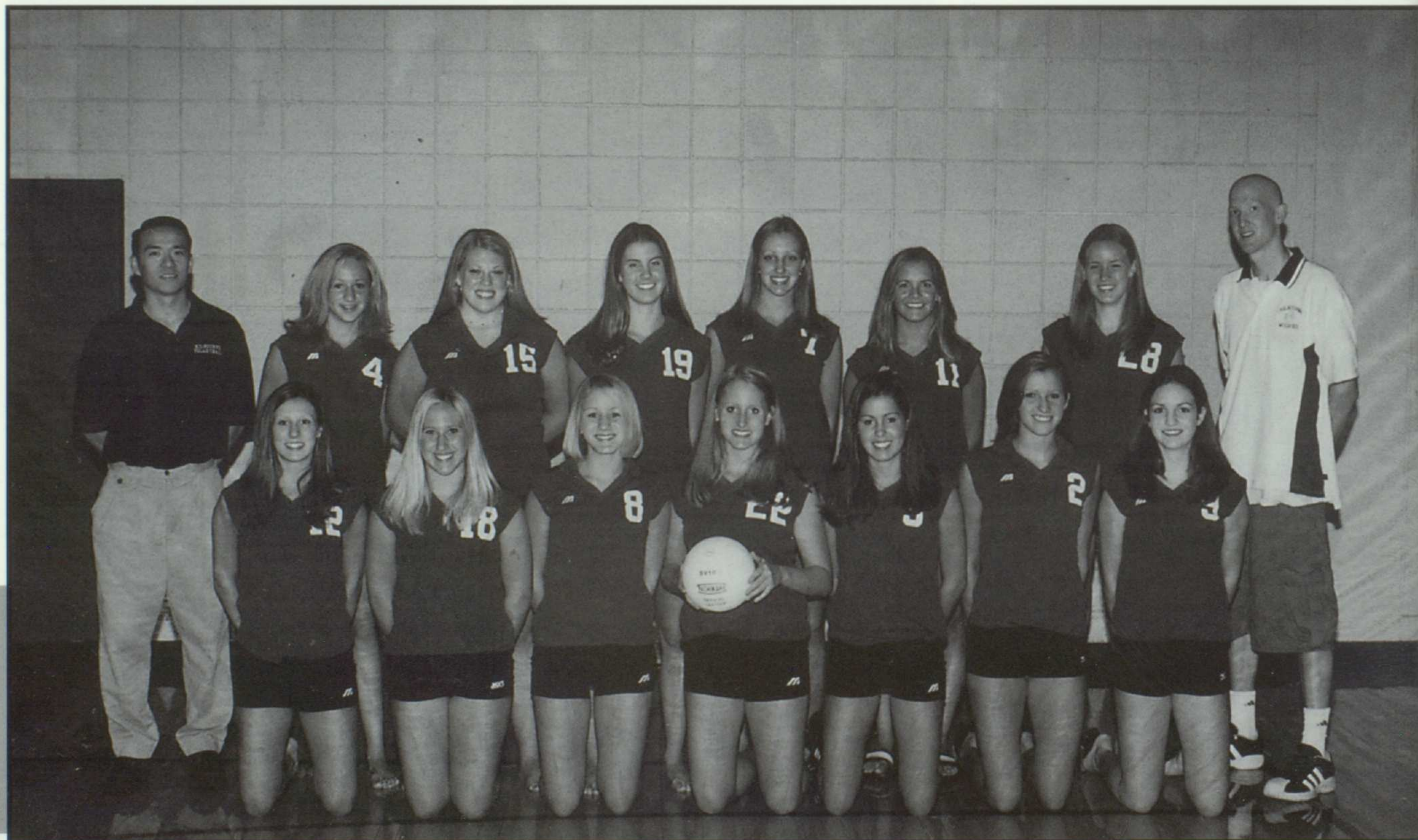
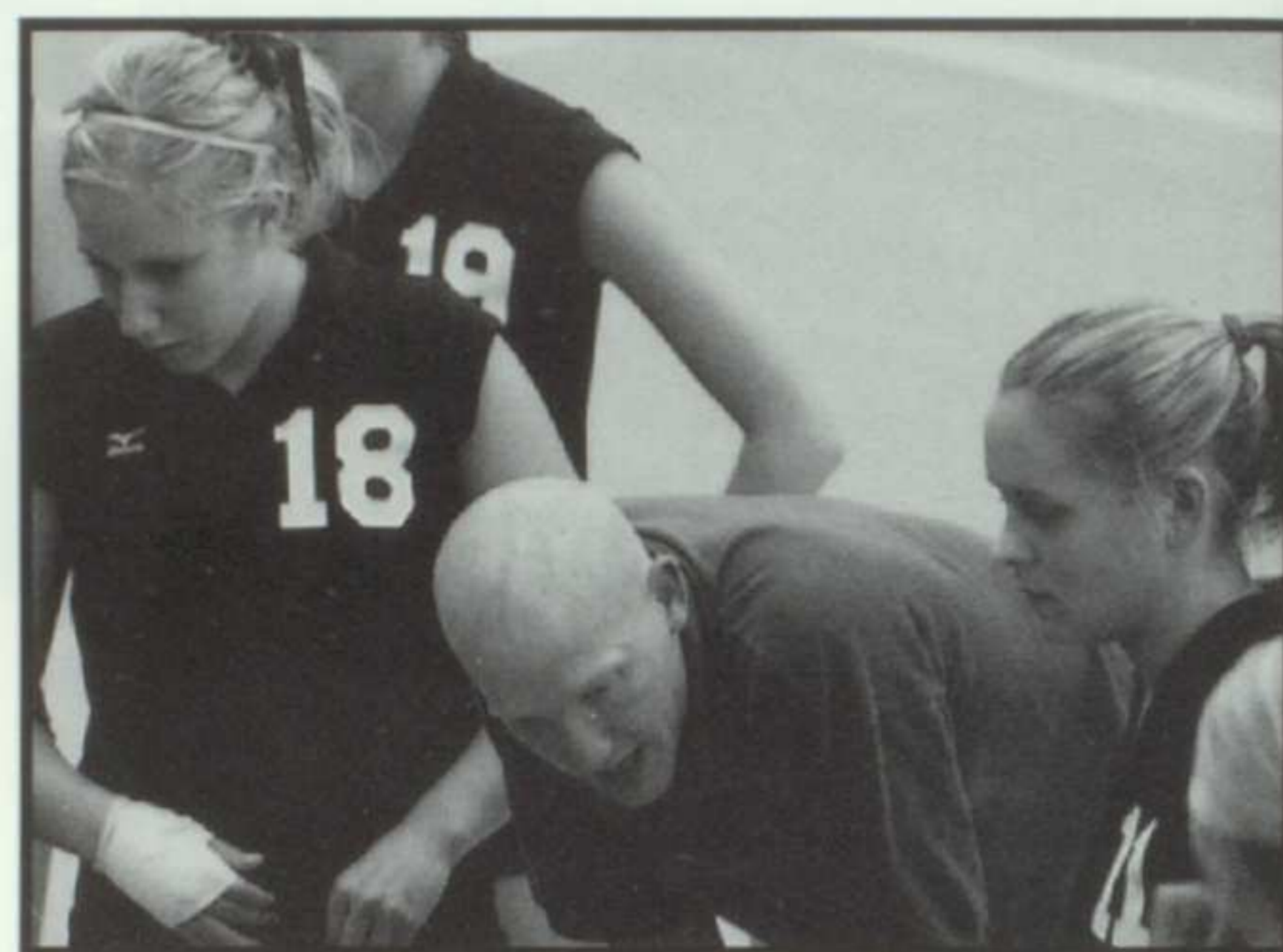
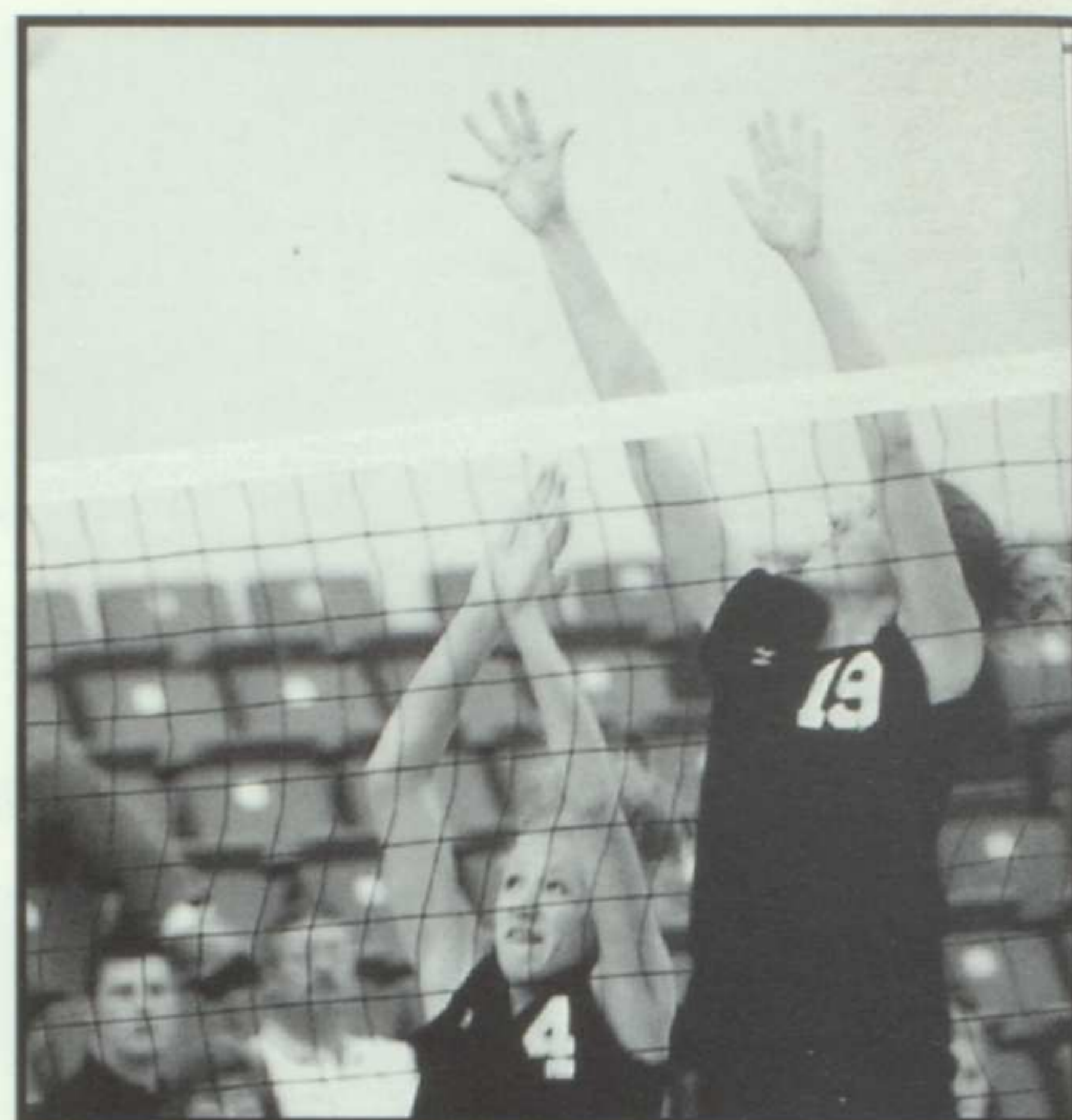
For the next two games assistant coach Dickson Lao called the shots from the sideline. The girls worked hard during extended practices held to focus on the fundamentals.

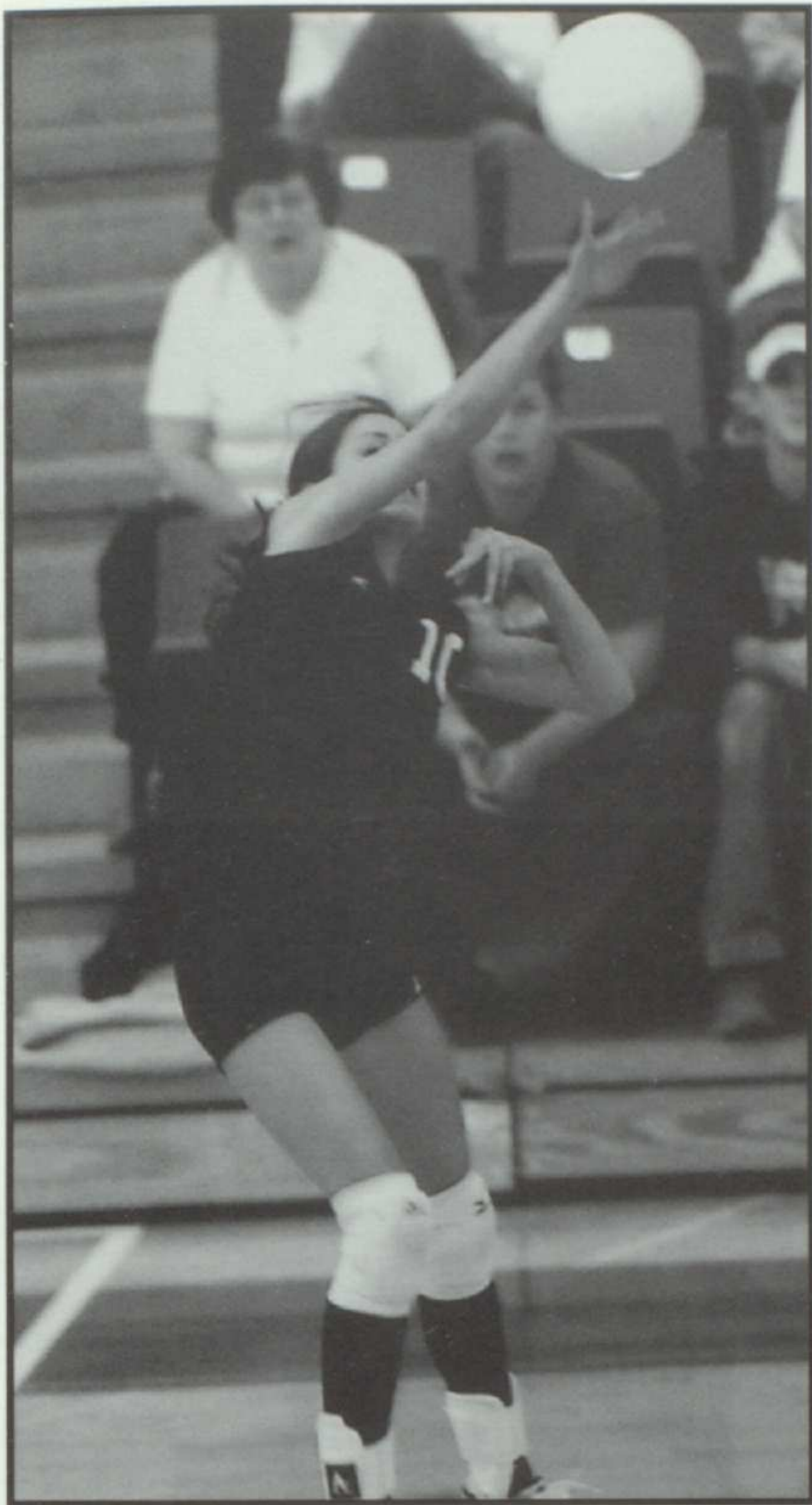

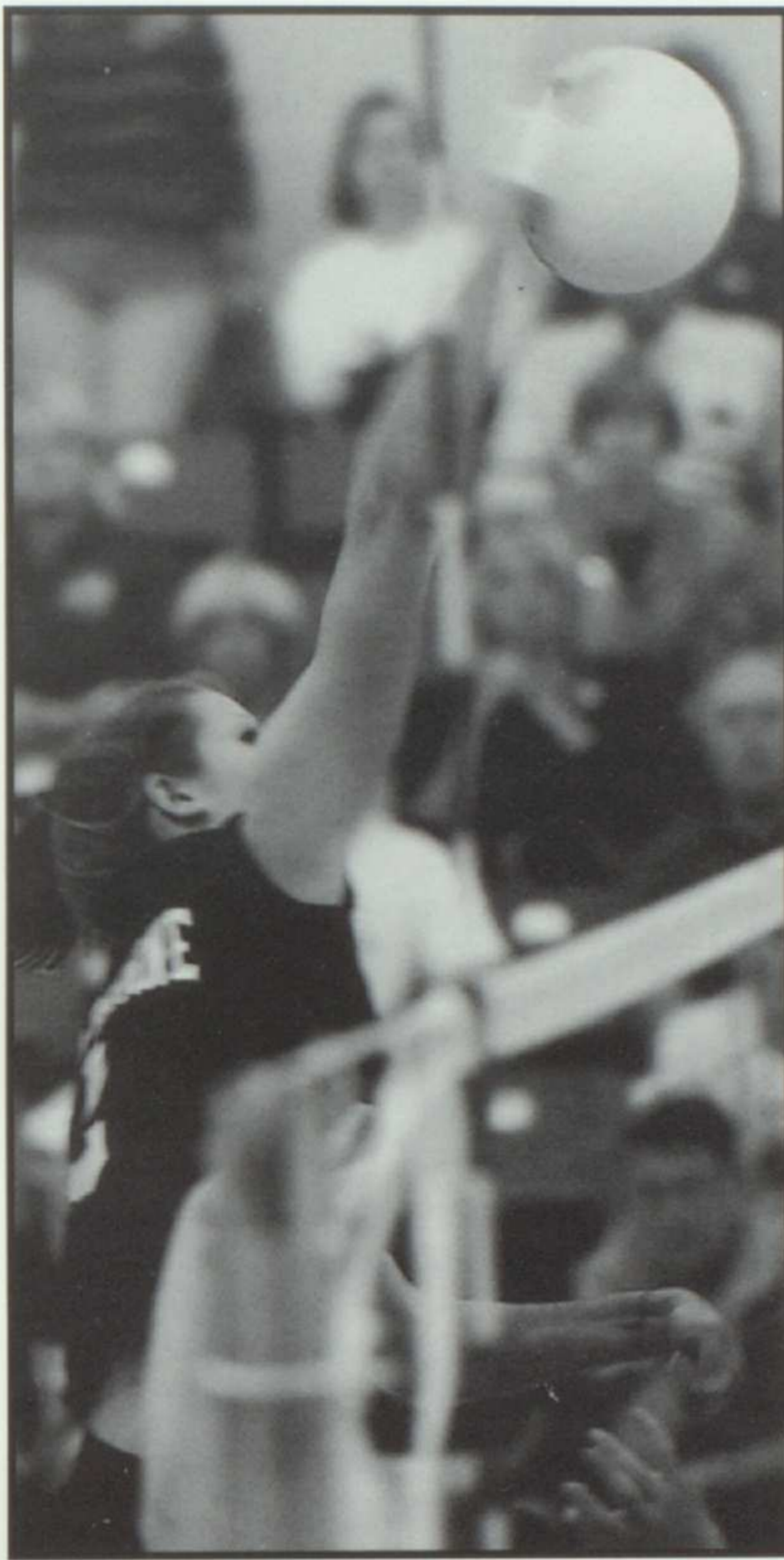

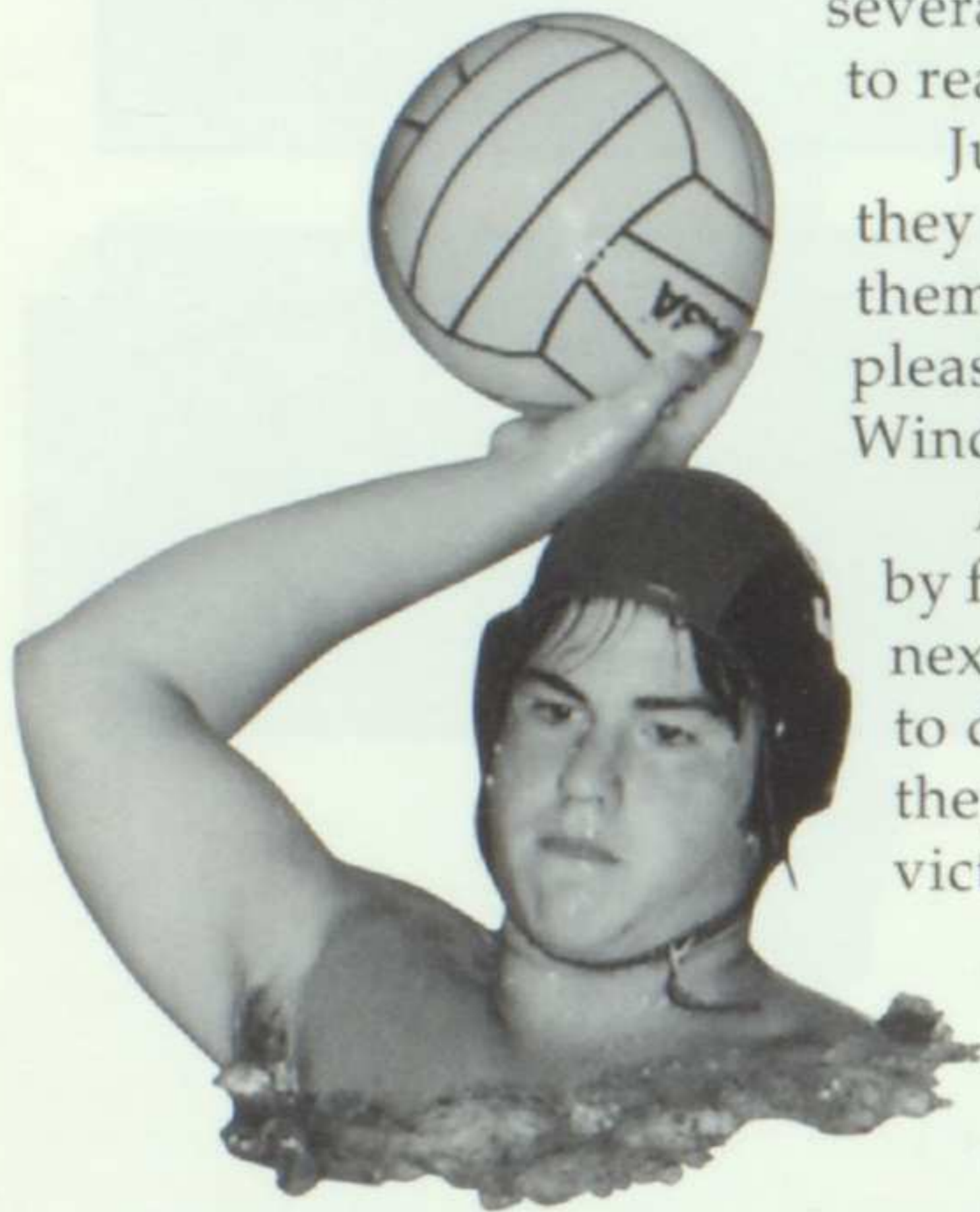

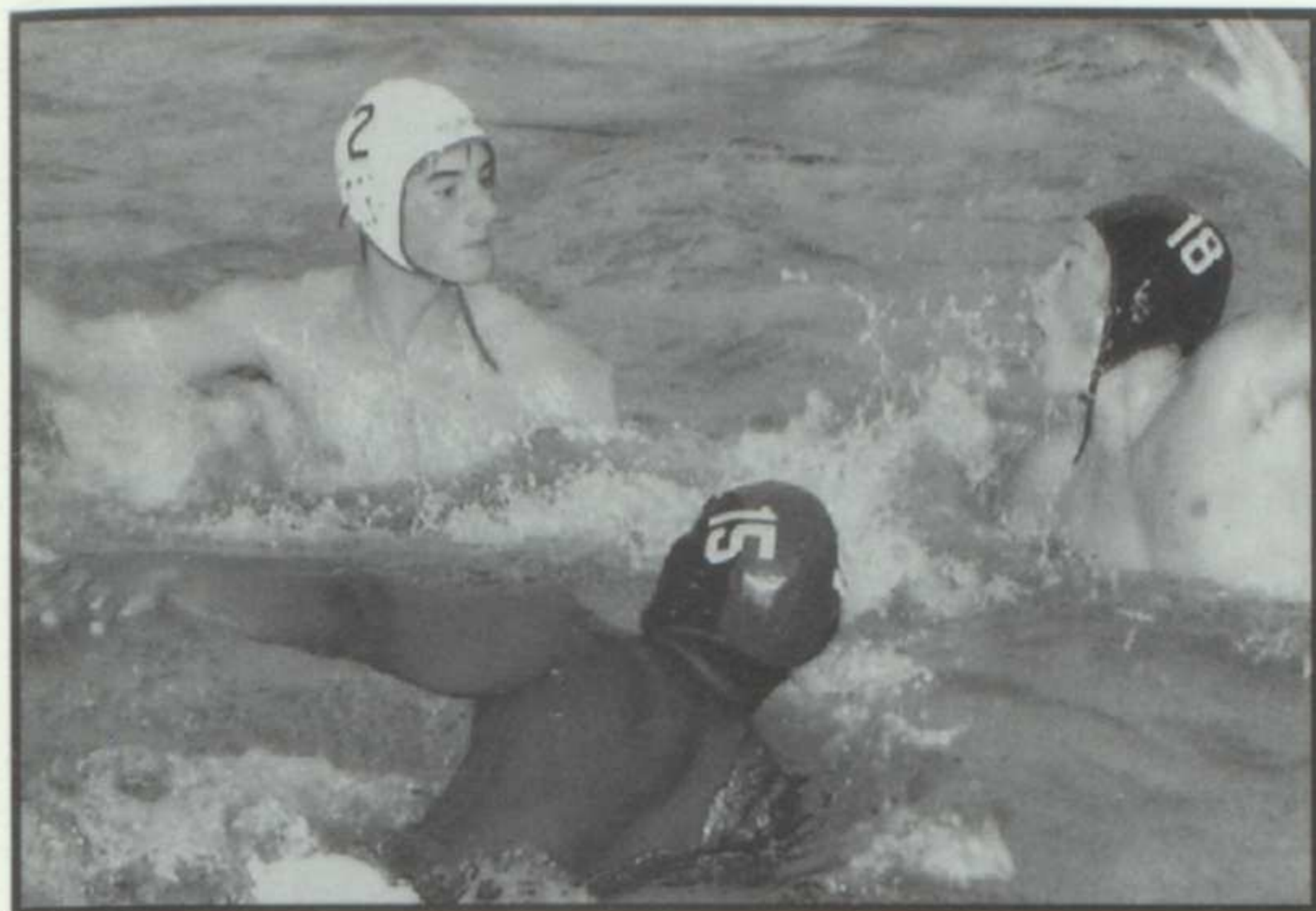

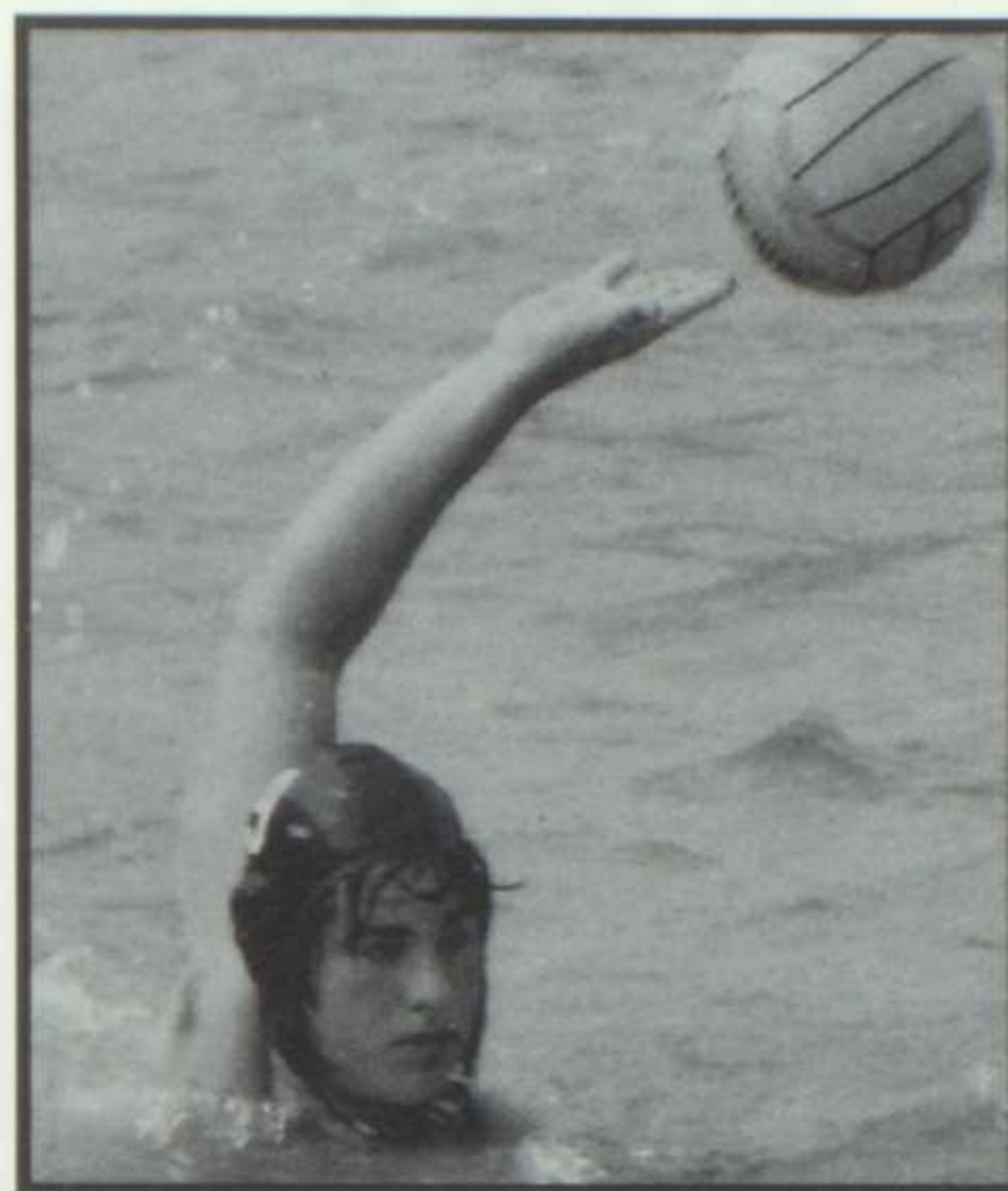

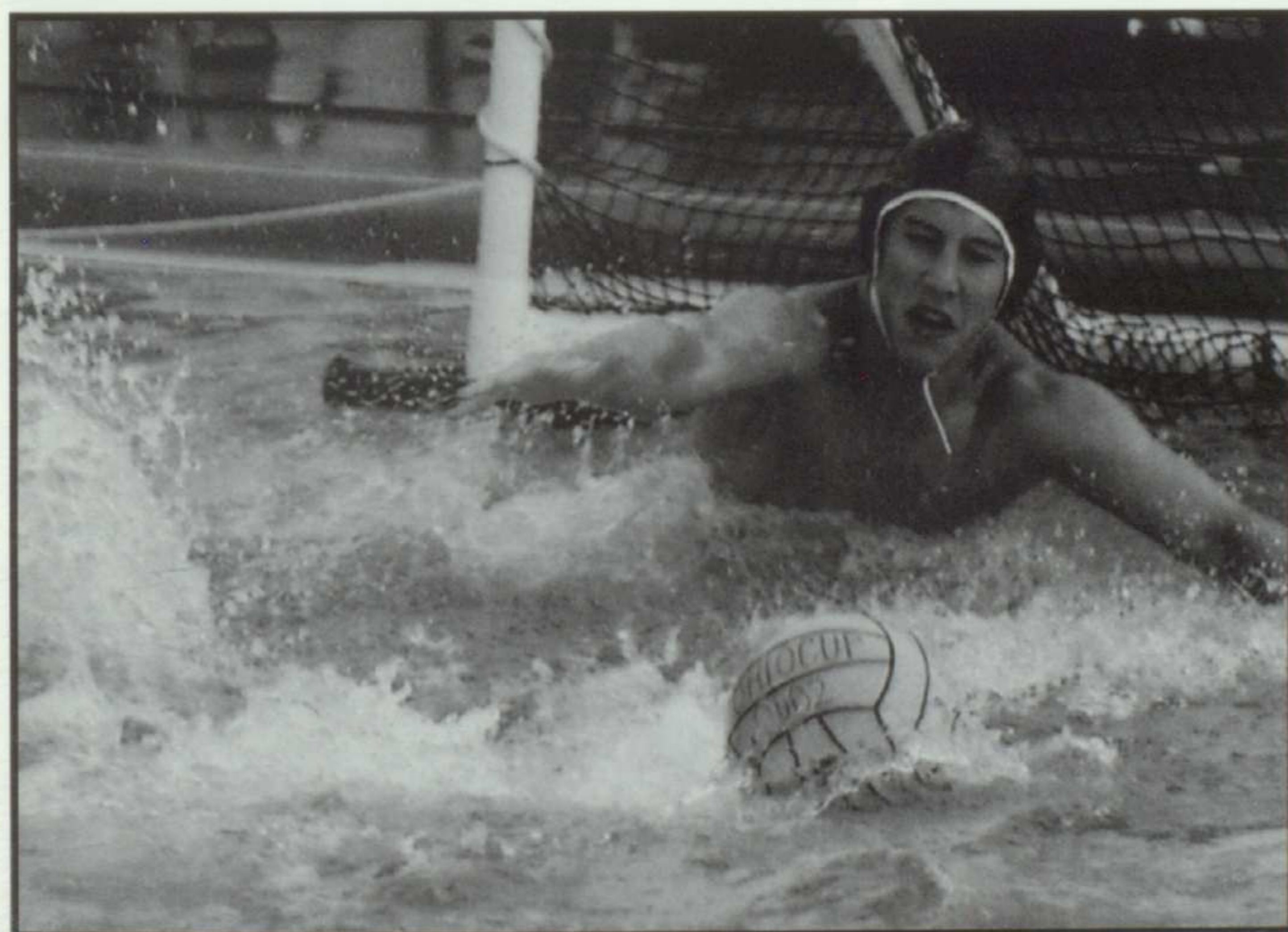

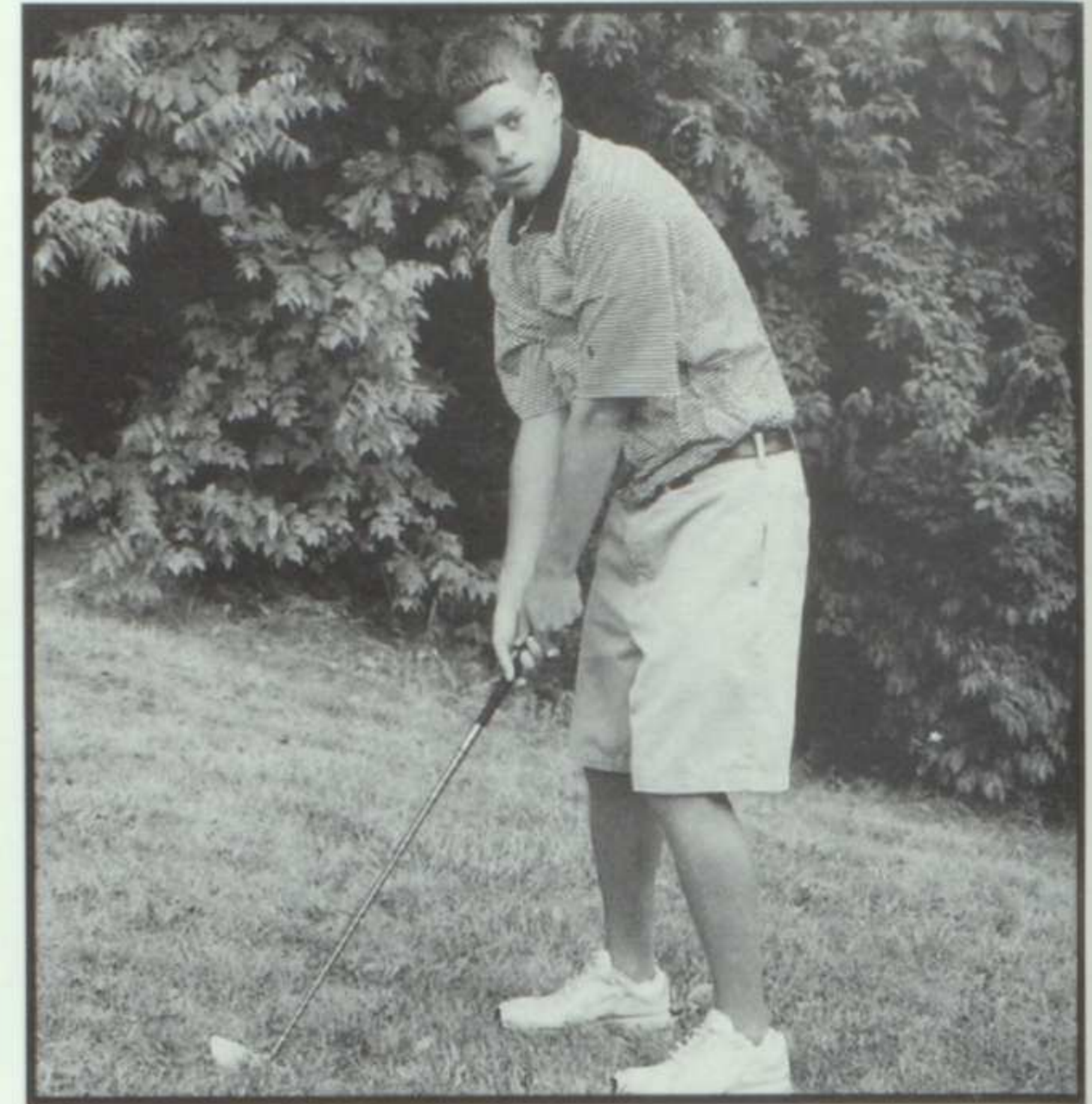
The guys golf team did well this season with a record of 138 wins and 30 losses.

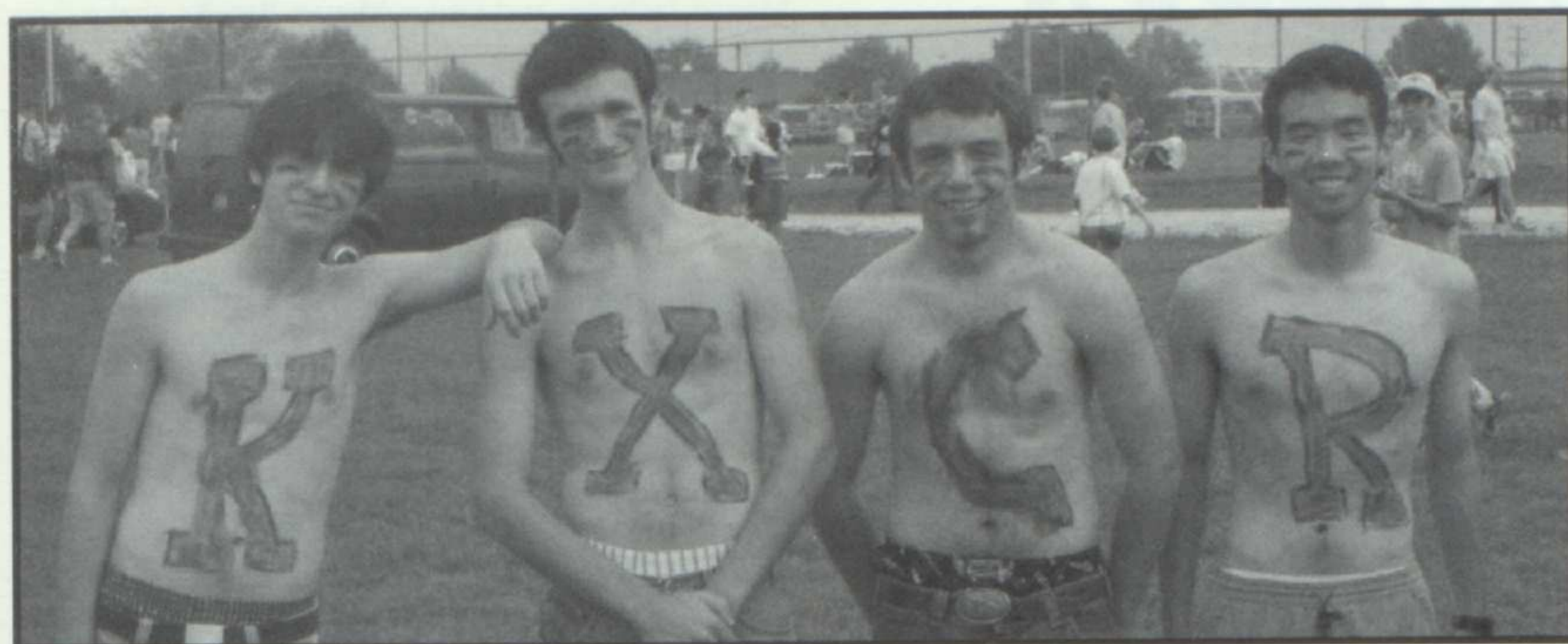

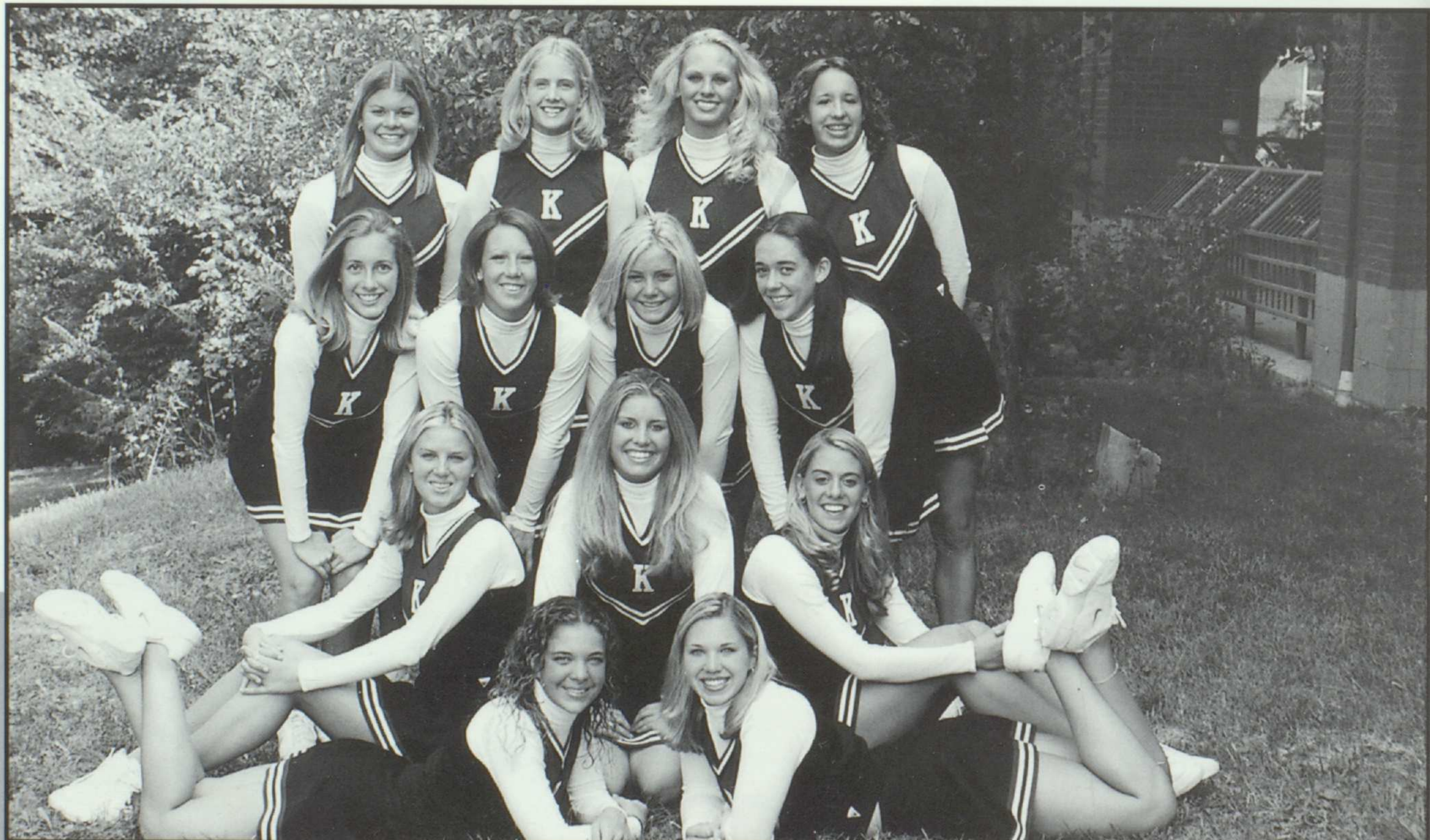

Beyond the glitter, the short skirts, and the enthusiasm are the cheerleaders, the football players' biggest fans, and that is something to cheer about.

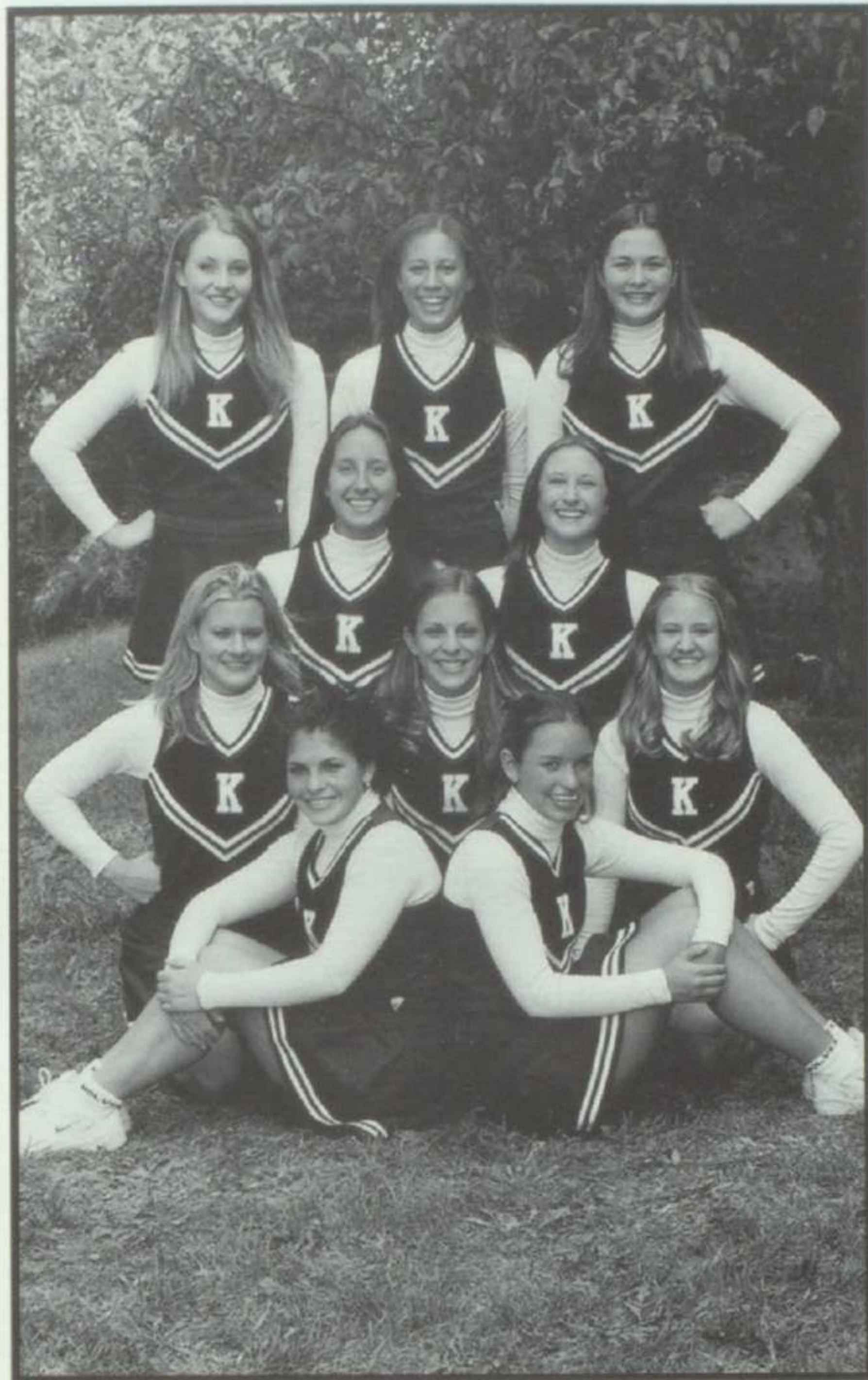

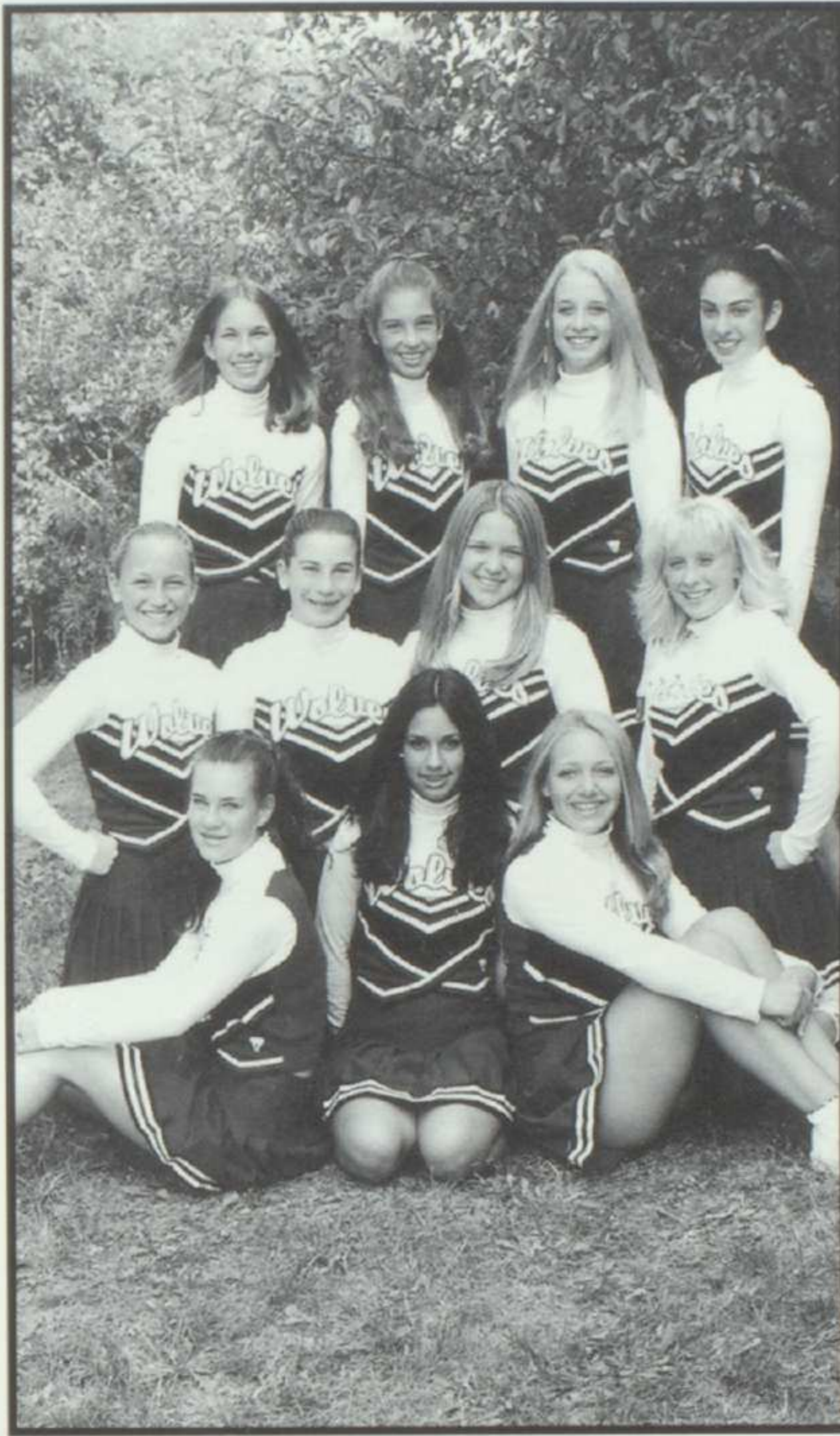

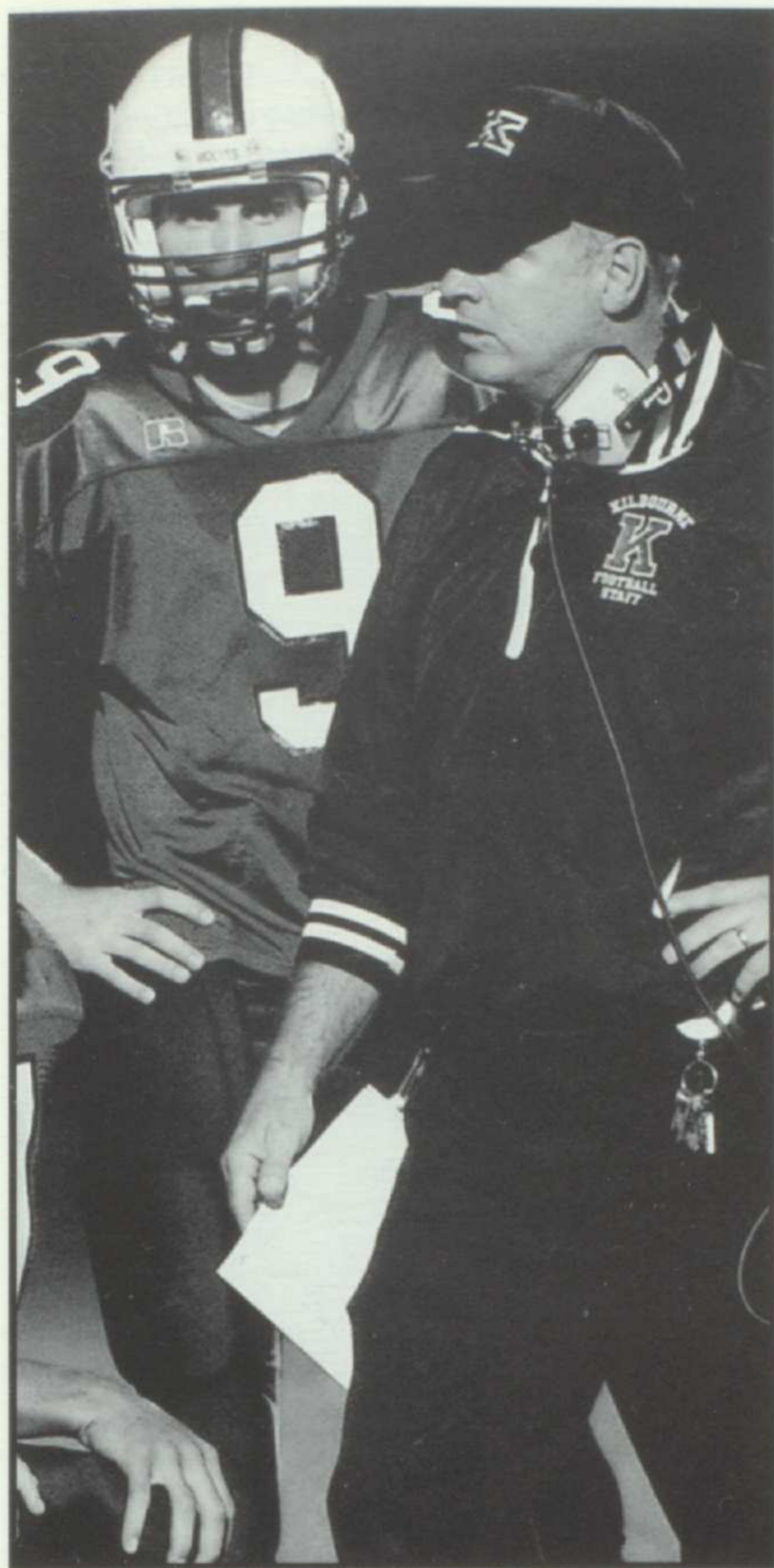

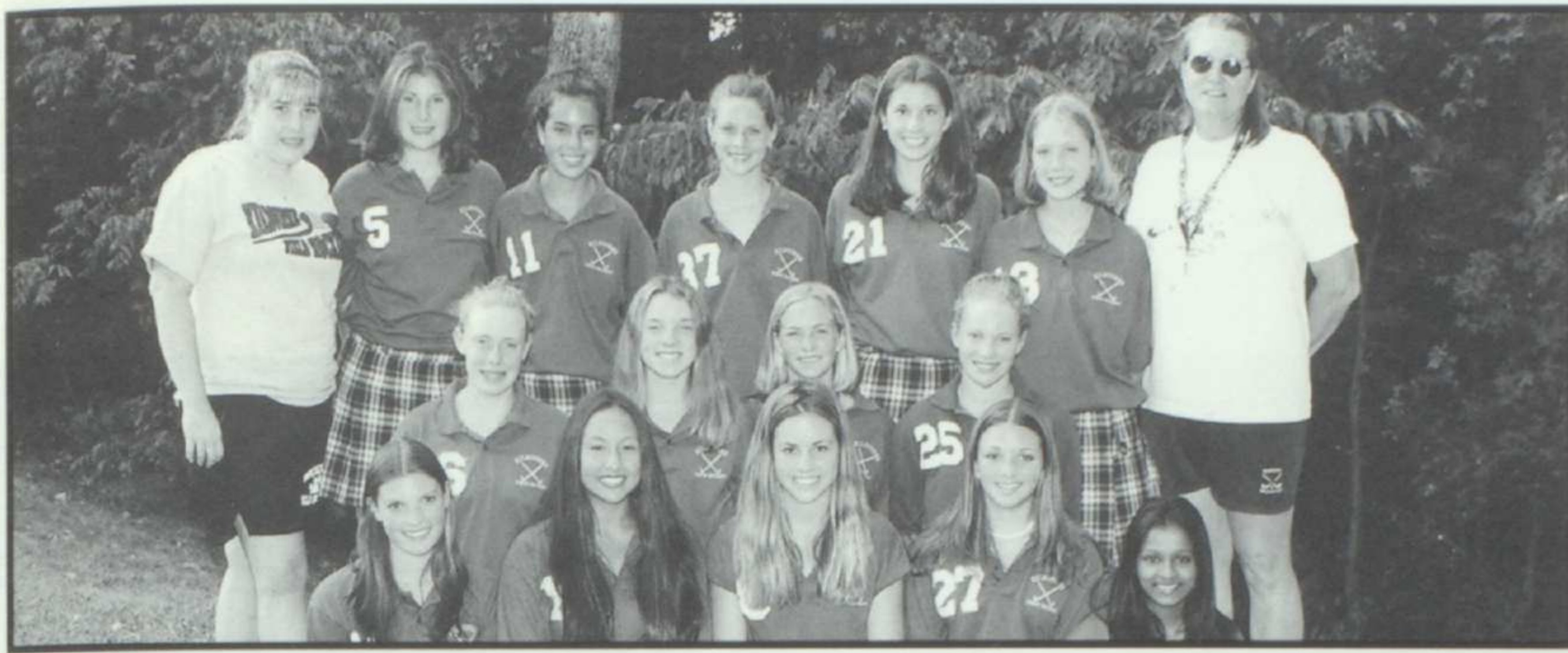

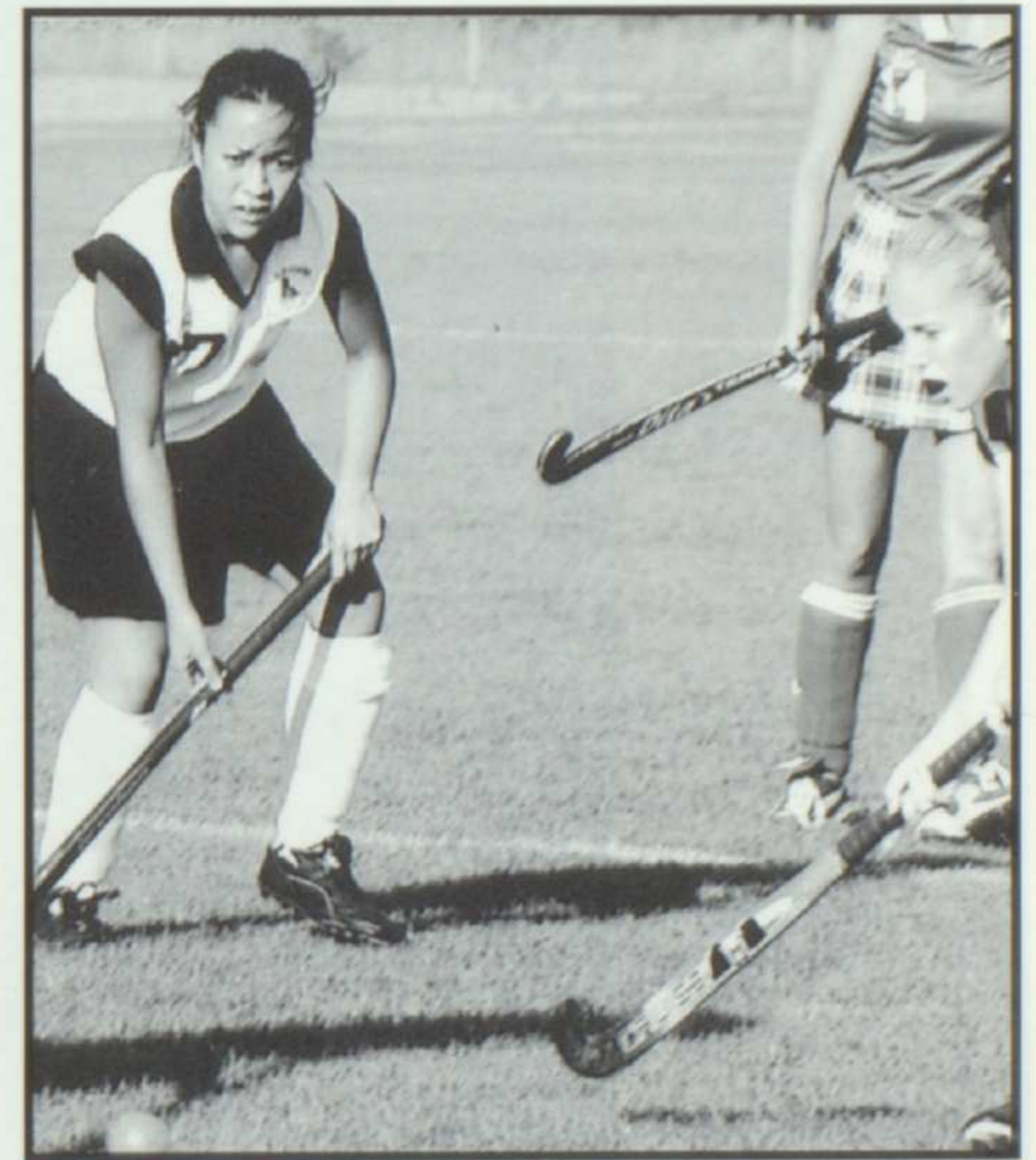

Hoopin' It up all season Long

Coming into the season with seven seniors and an OCC championship from last year, the basketball Lady Wolves wanted to win the OCC league again. They opened play with a victory at home against Whitehall, then lost a close one to Reynoldsburg in their first OCC league game. The Lady Wolves were feeling pretty down after their loss but came back strong with an OCC win against Groveport. "We didn't overlook Groveport. We had to take it one game at a time. Once the game is over, we move to the next one," said coach Joni O'Connell. Next, the girls traveled to New Albany and suffered a disappointing four point loss.

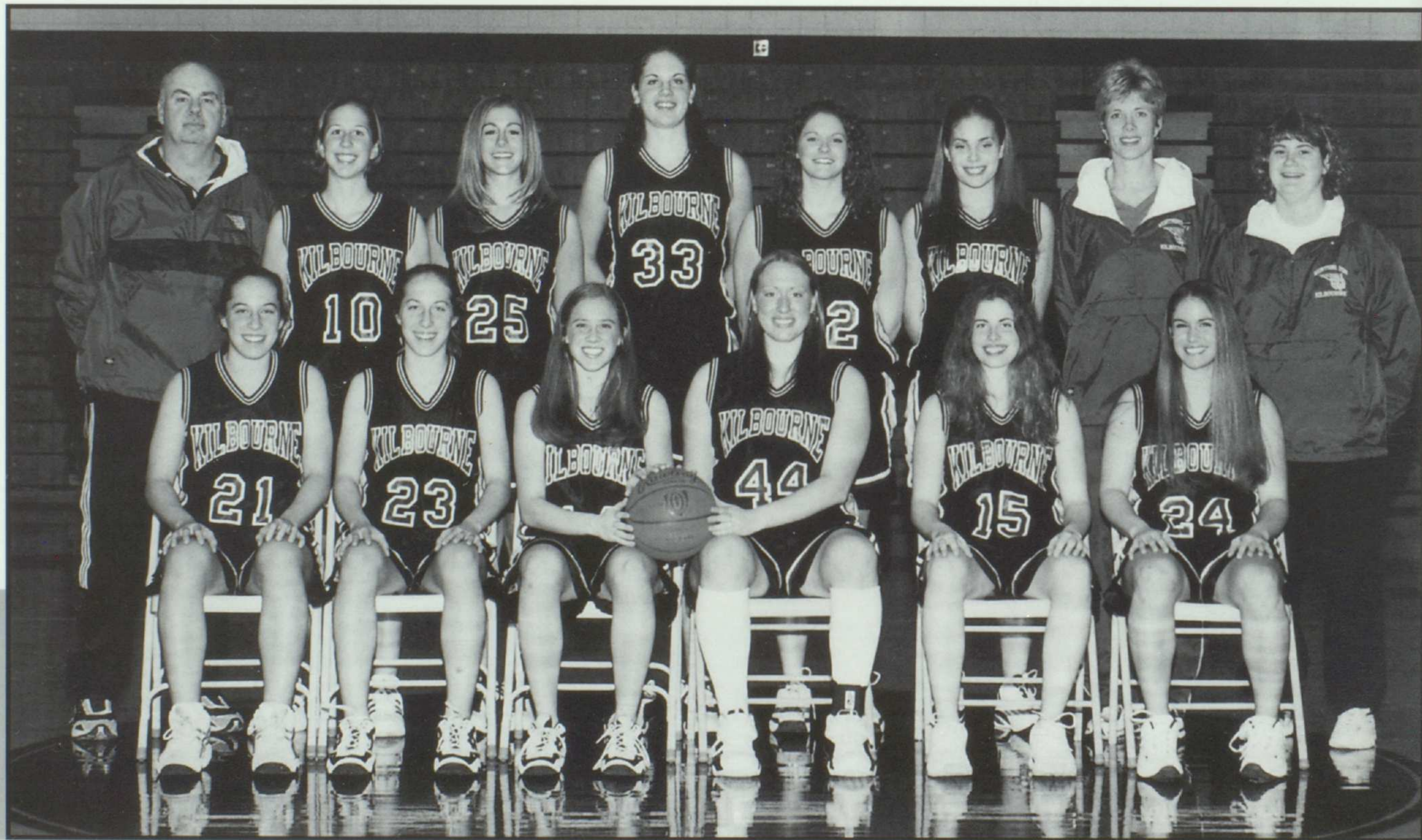


Going into their match-up against Hilliard Davidson, they were 2-2 and 1-1 in the OCC. They were pretty excited because this game was one step closer to the OCC title. They barely edged Hilliard with a two-point win after a Davidson player missed a 3-point field goal with five seconds left. Next on their schedule came Dublin Scioto and a great deal of regret after an eight-point loss. Back-to-back wins for the Wolves against Grove City and Marion Harding previewed their Christmas tournament called the Kilbourne Klassic in which they hosted Thomas Worthington, Marion Harding, and Hilliard Darby. The girls have never won the Kilbourne Klassic, so they were disappointed over the loss to Hilliard Darby in the final finishing second.

After traveling to Cleveland over the weekend, Kilbourne returned with a record of 5-5, following a loss to Mentor. The girls weren't down for too long because they knew that they had to win their next game to stay in the race for the OCC title. After their win over Westerville South, the loss to Reynoldsburg almost crushed their drive to the top.

Nevertheless, the girls and the coaches knew they still had a chance to win the OCC title, even if it was slim. Despite a lot of injuries and heartbreak, the Lady Wolves enjoyed a successful season. With three juniors, Lisa Rusch, Lindsey Rusch and Tiffany Mustric, and one sophomore, Katie Kizer, returning, they will have a young team, but with a tradition of winning, they are bound to have a successful upcoming year.

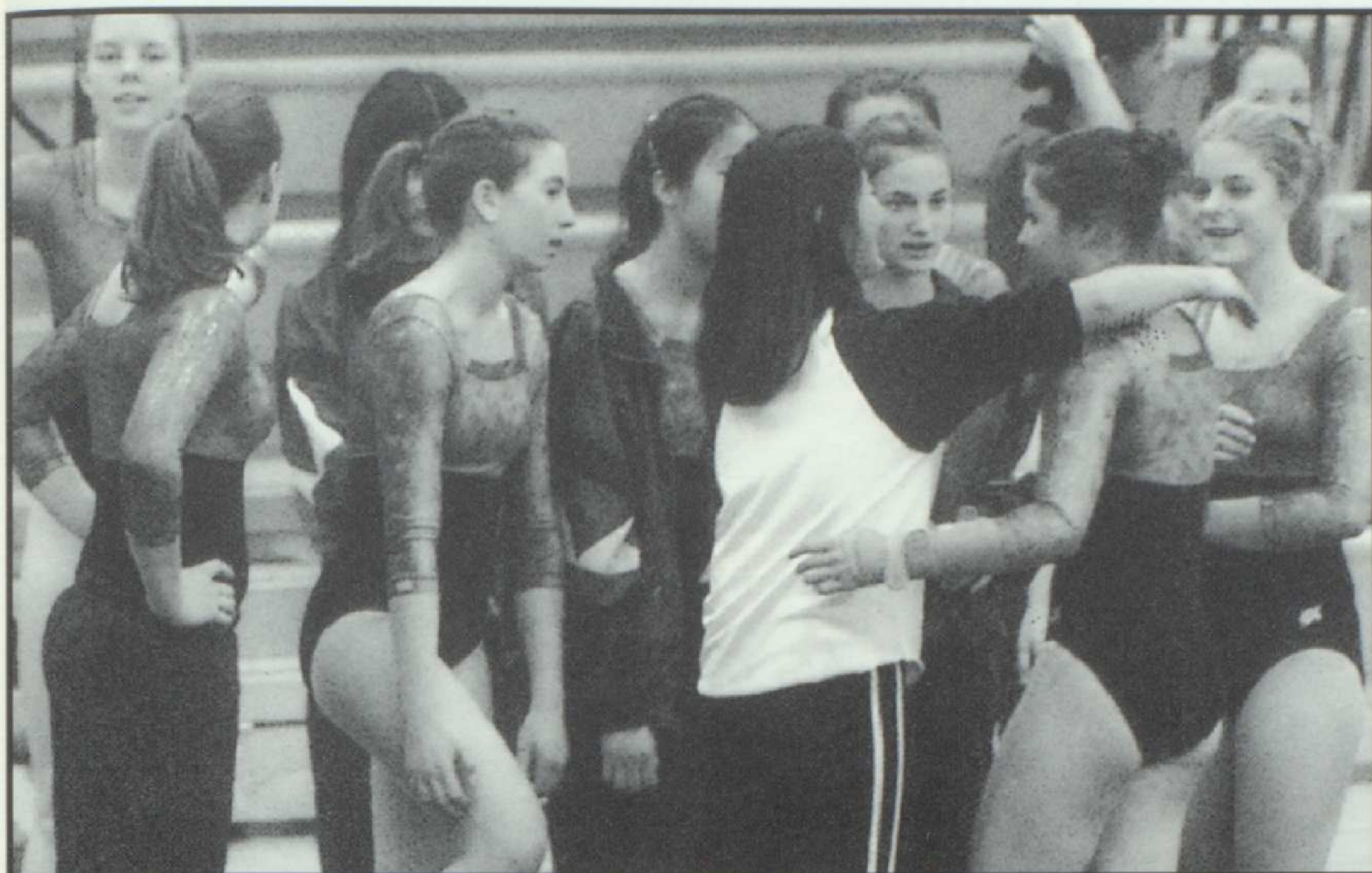

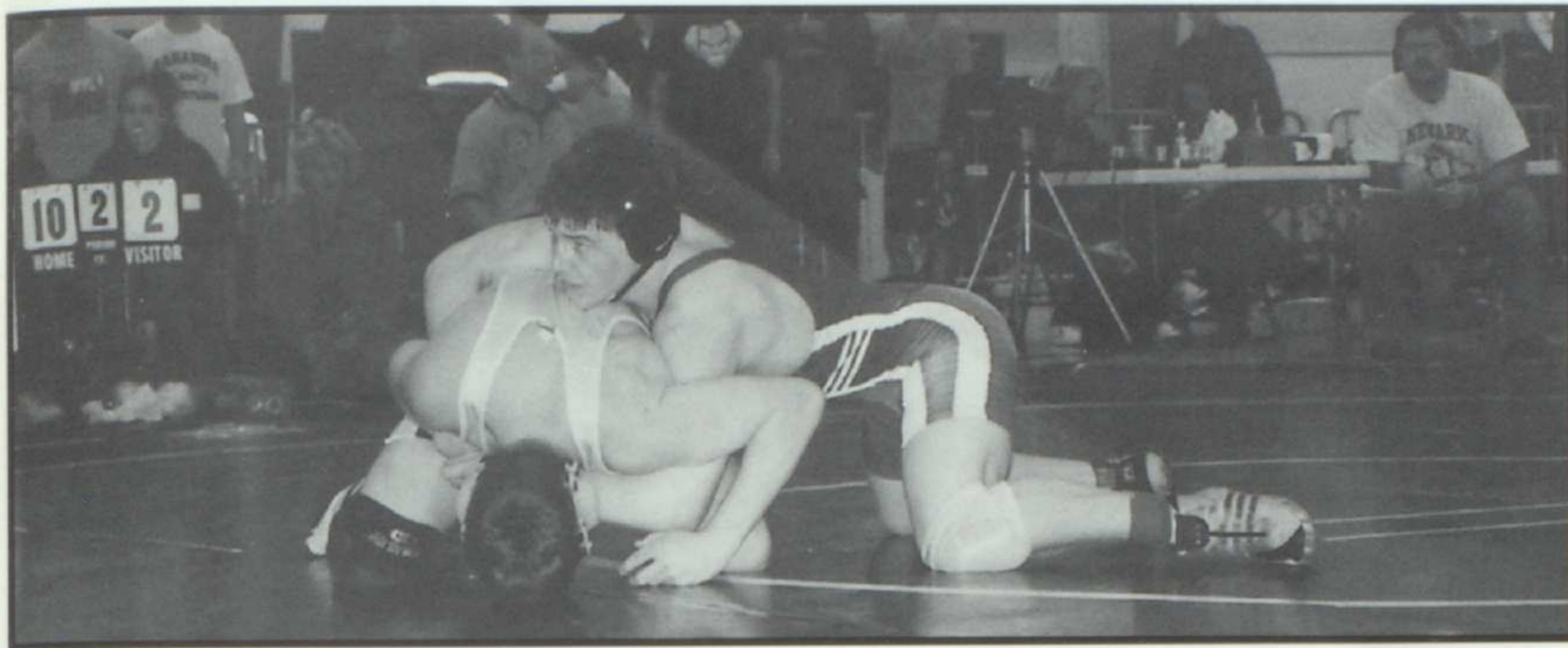

said. "We knew we could do it if we swam as fast as we possibly could."

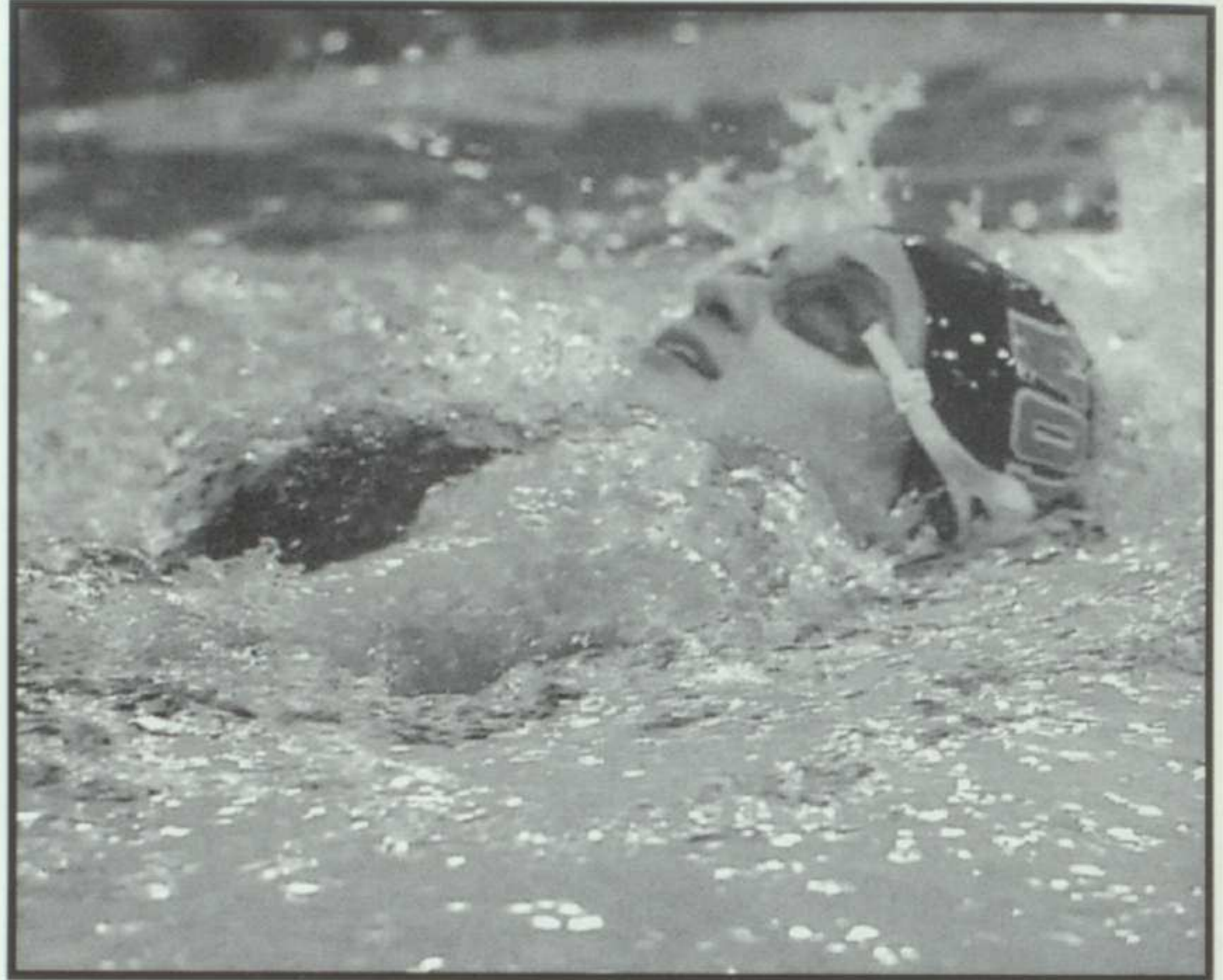

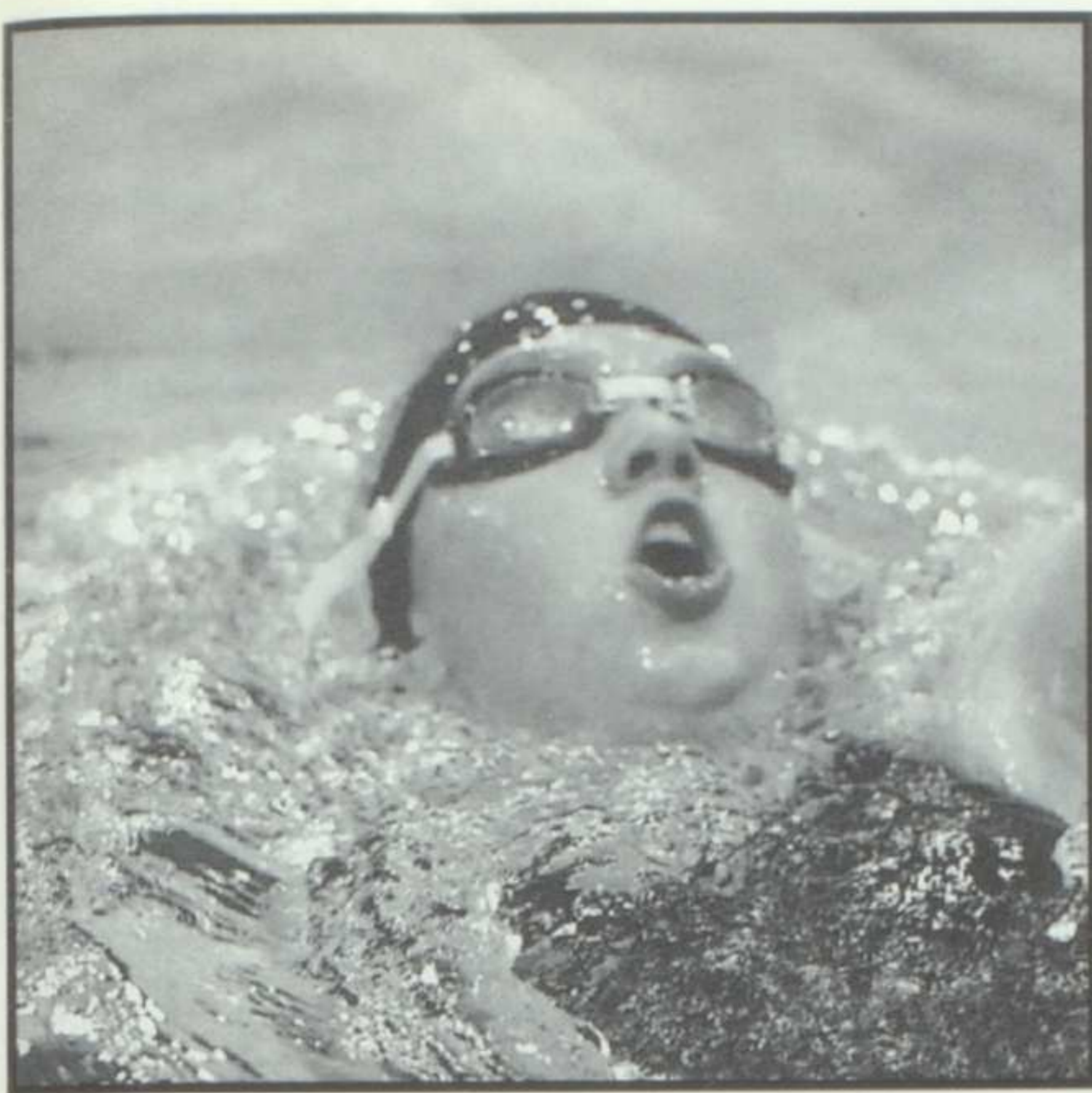

"Let's go, Wolves," shouts Hilary Buchanan as she grabs the crowds' attention to encourage them to show their team spirit.

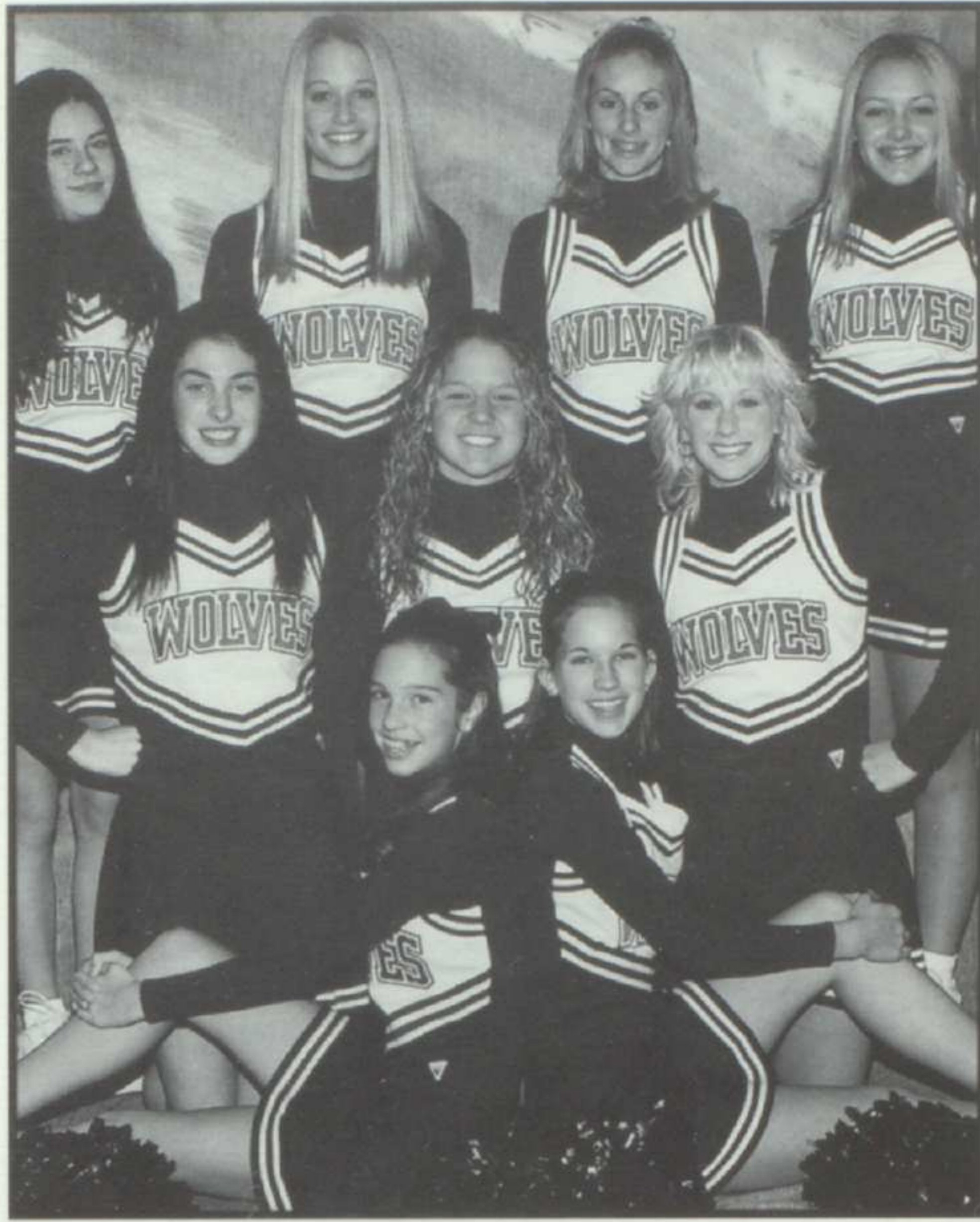

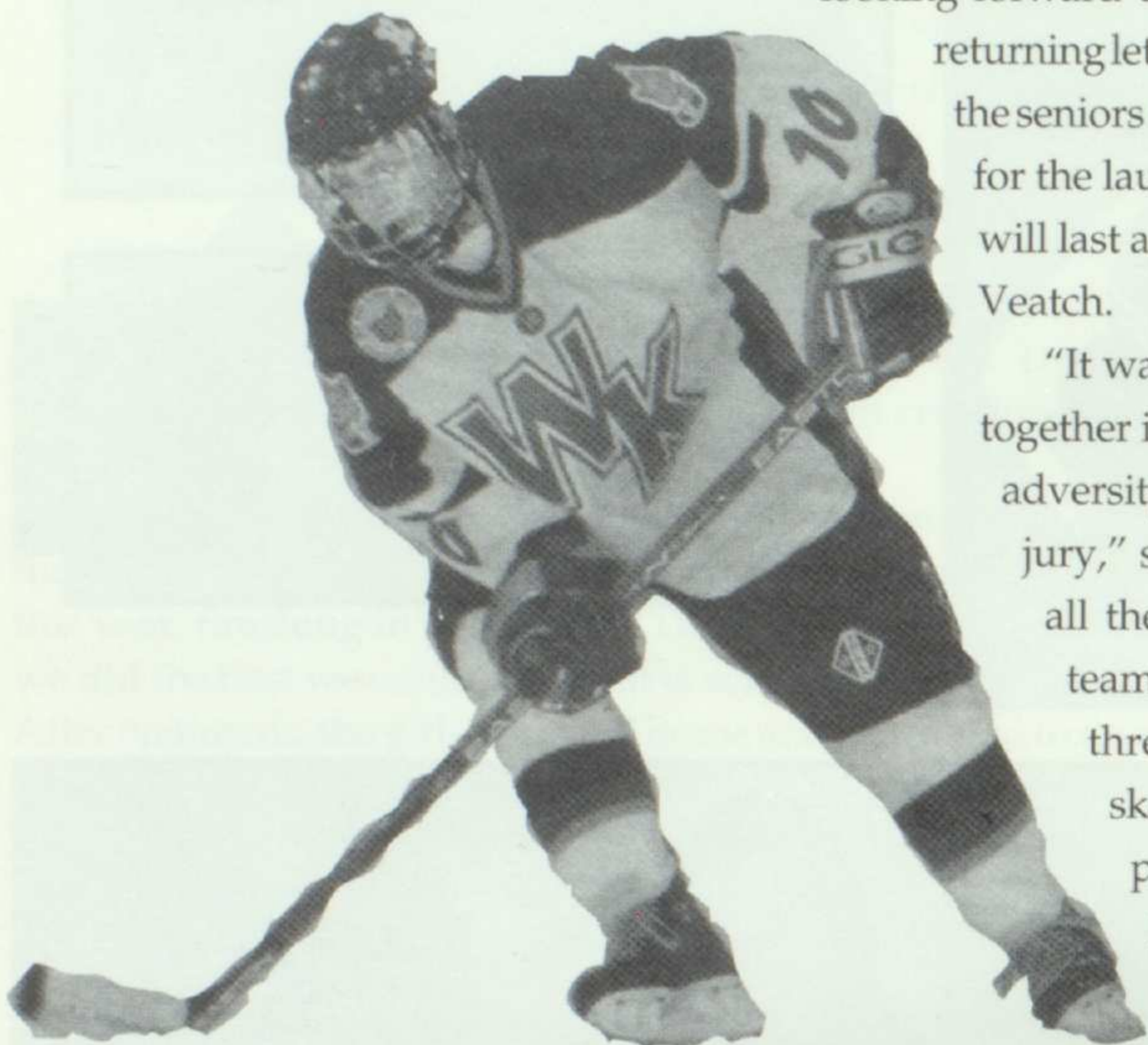

Kyle Hood graduating after playing four seasons of Kilbourne hockey will be a big loss, but the team will recover and succeed with his example as a guidepost.

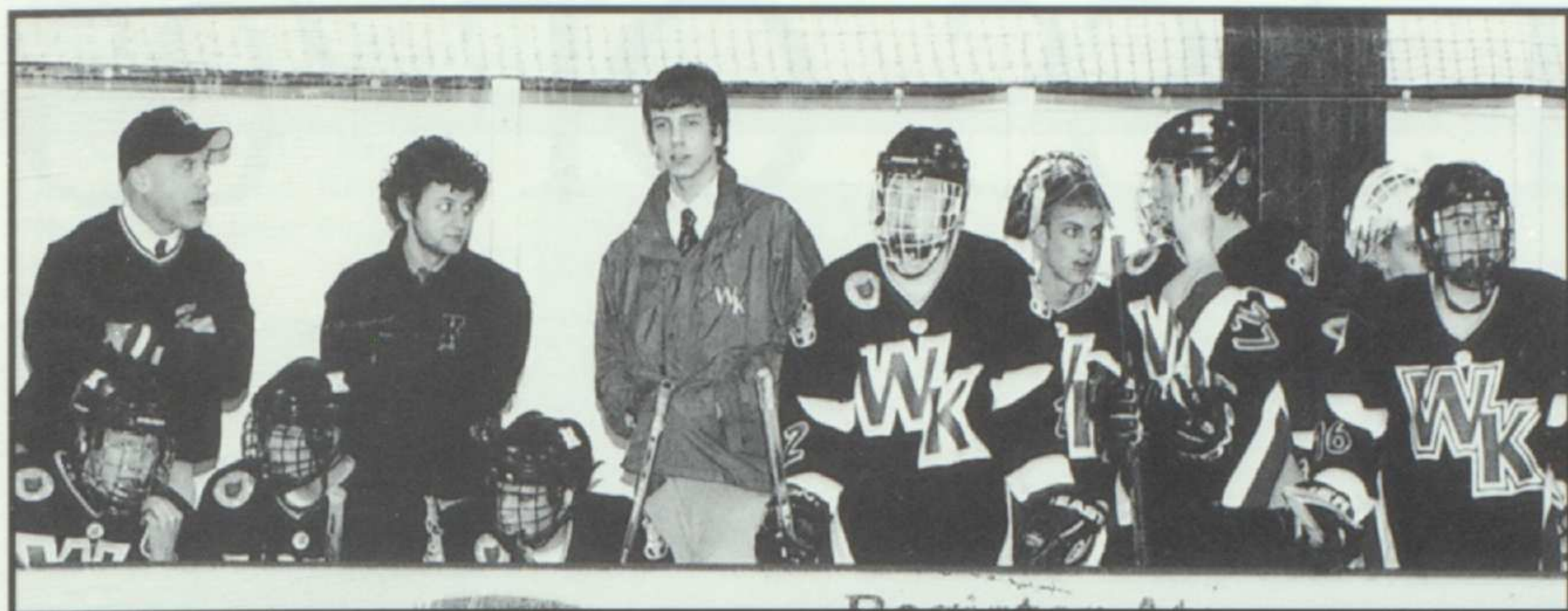

Stepping up to the Plate

This year the varsity softball team enjoyed an amazing season. After months of conditioning, training, and indoor games in the off-season, the Lady Wolves were ready. Seniors Stephanie Orr, Drea Knox, Michelle Vetter, Elyse Zavar, Michelle Massey, Amanda Kvitko, and Allie Sheetz led the team to the district championship game and tied the school record they set last year for the most wins in one season.



After a disappointing loss to Amanda Clearcreek in their first game, the girls stepped it up with a three-in-a-row winning streak. They pushed through to May, finishing 19-7 overall by winning many games in the tenth or even eleventh inning. They defeated rivals Grove City, Reynoldsburg, and Pickerington at least once this year. The team placed second in the OCC, with a 7-3 record, losing only to Reynoldsburg and Hilliard.

Head coach Bob Lee reflected, saying "... gratifying, it's nice to see the gradual progression, especially in the last four or five years. I remember seeing in the newspaper when the school first opened that the girls had won just eight games through the first five years."

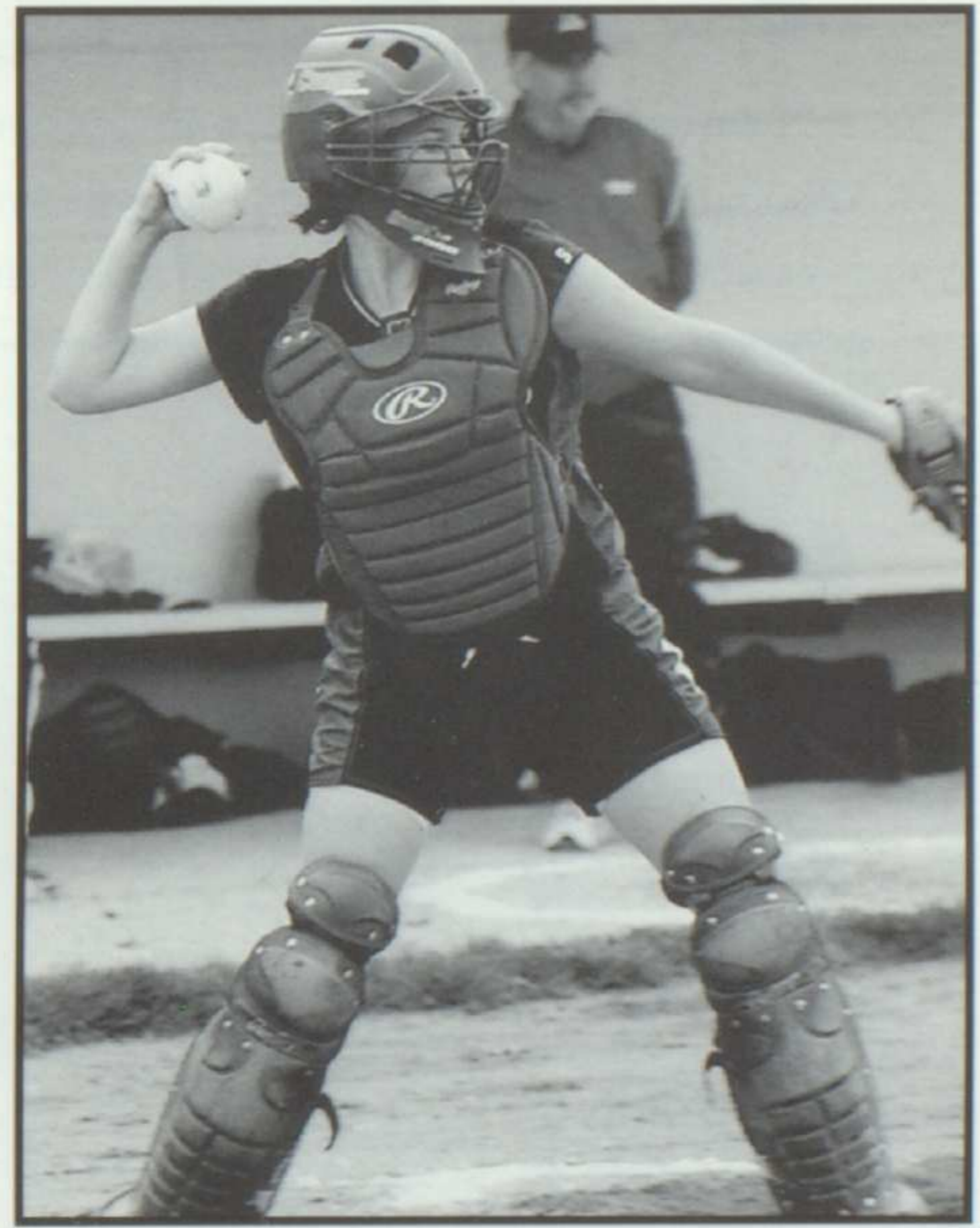

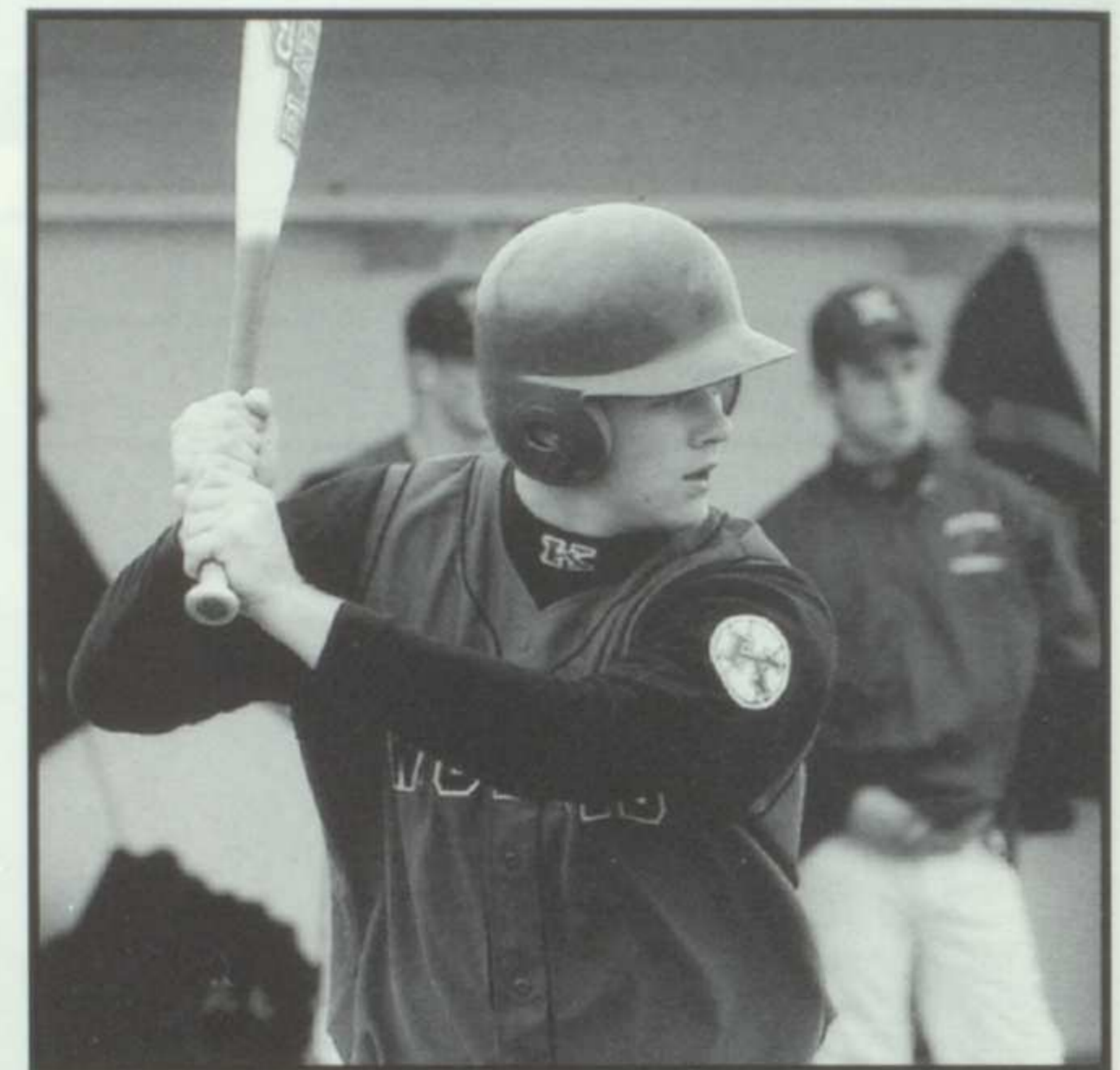

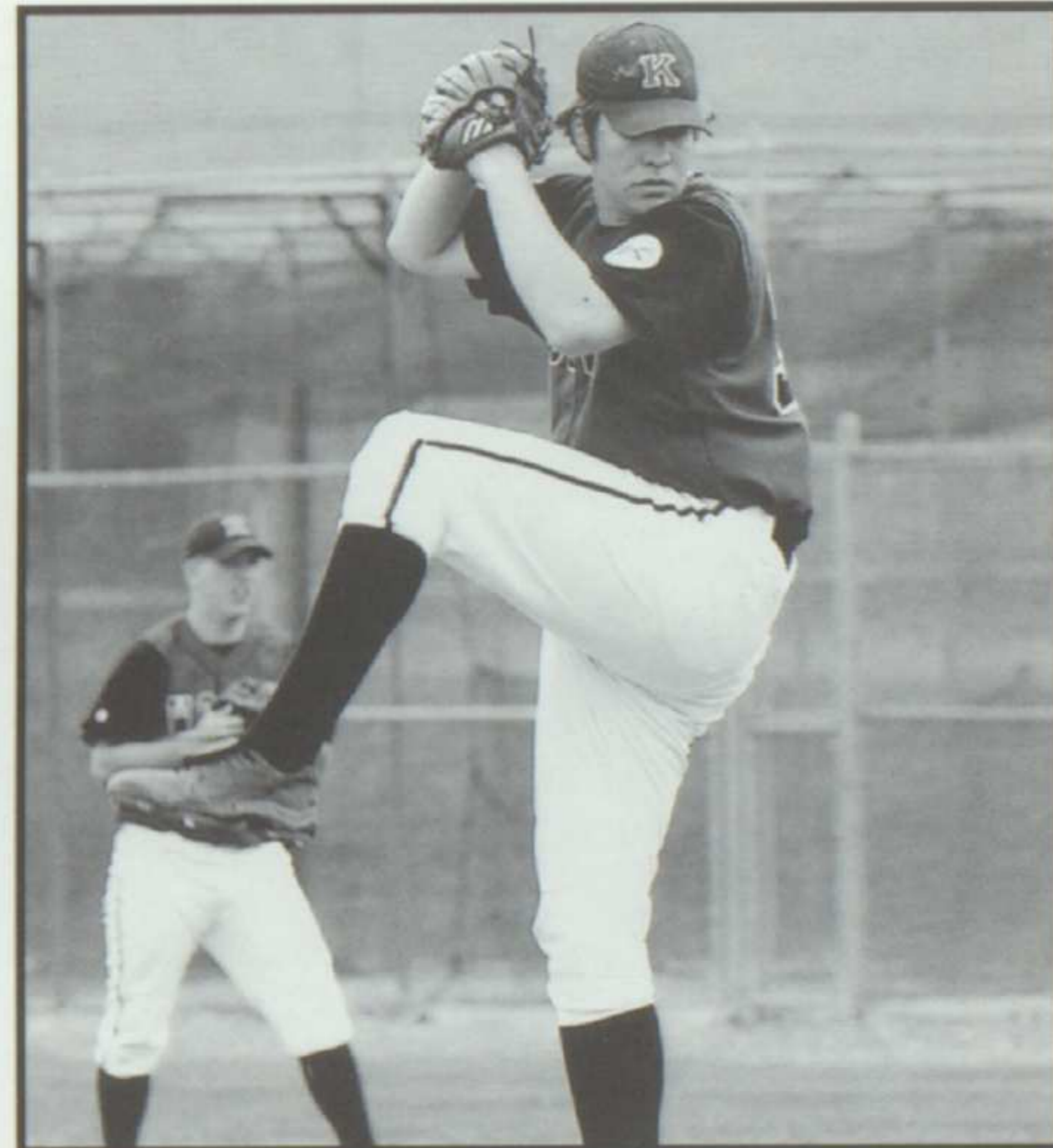

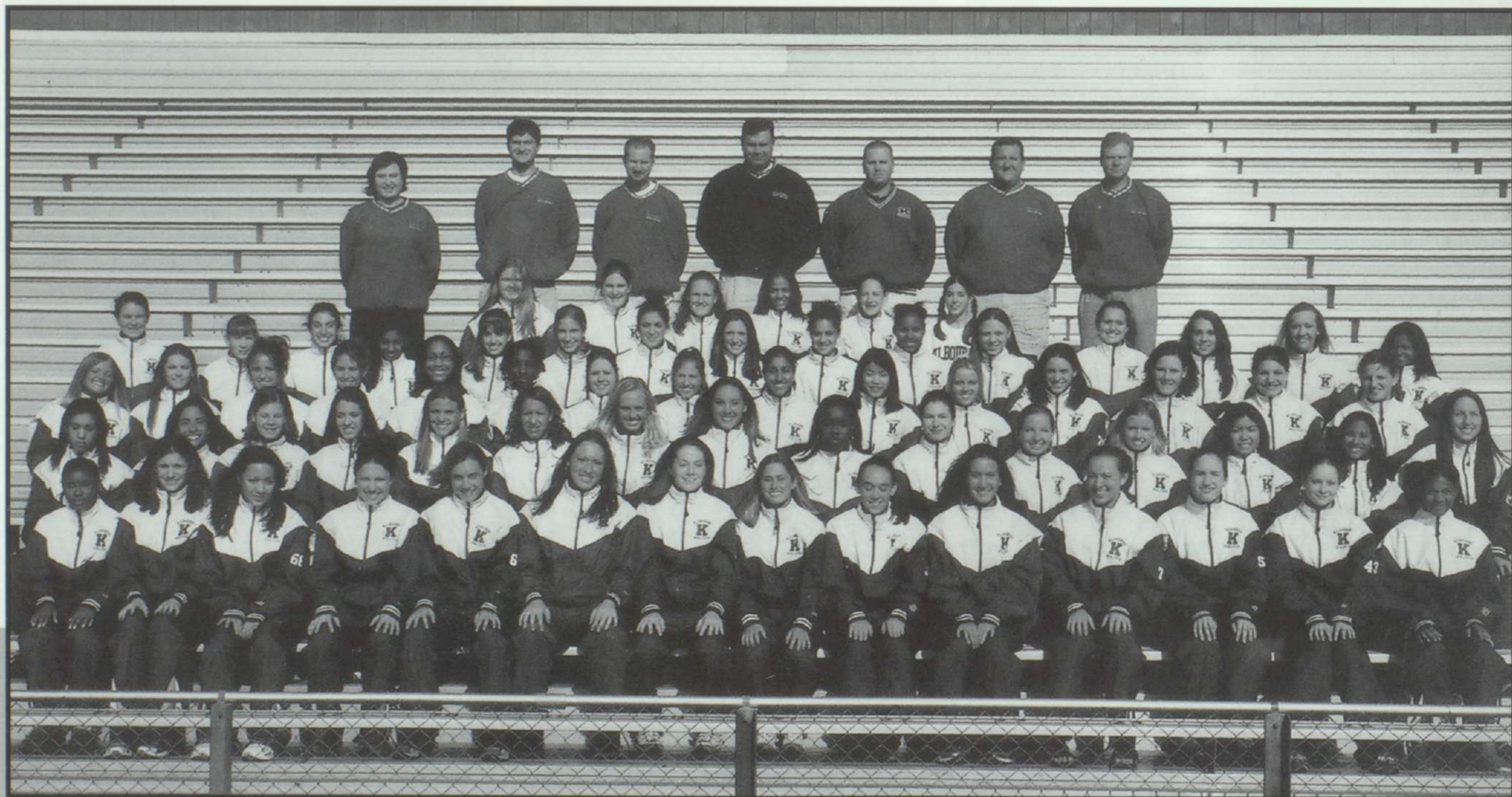

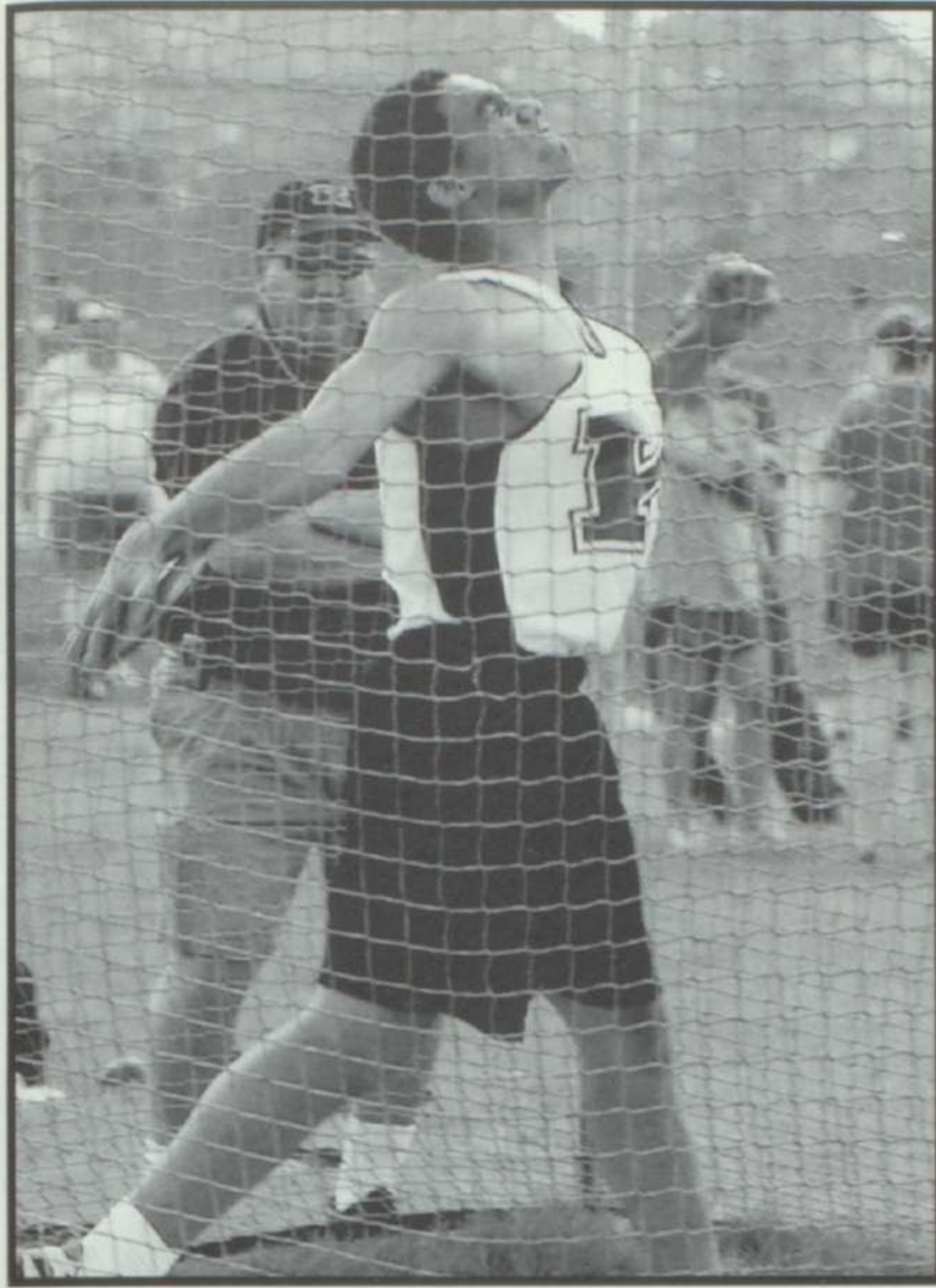

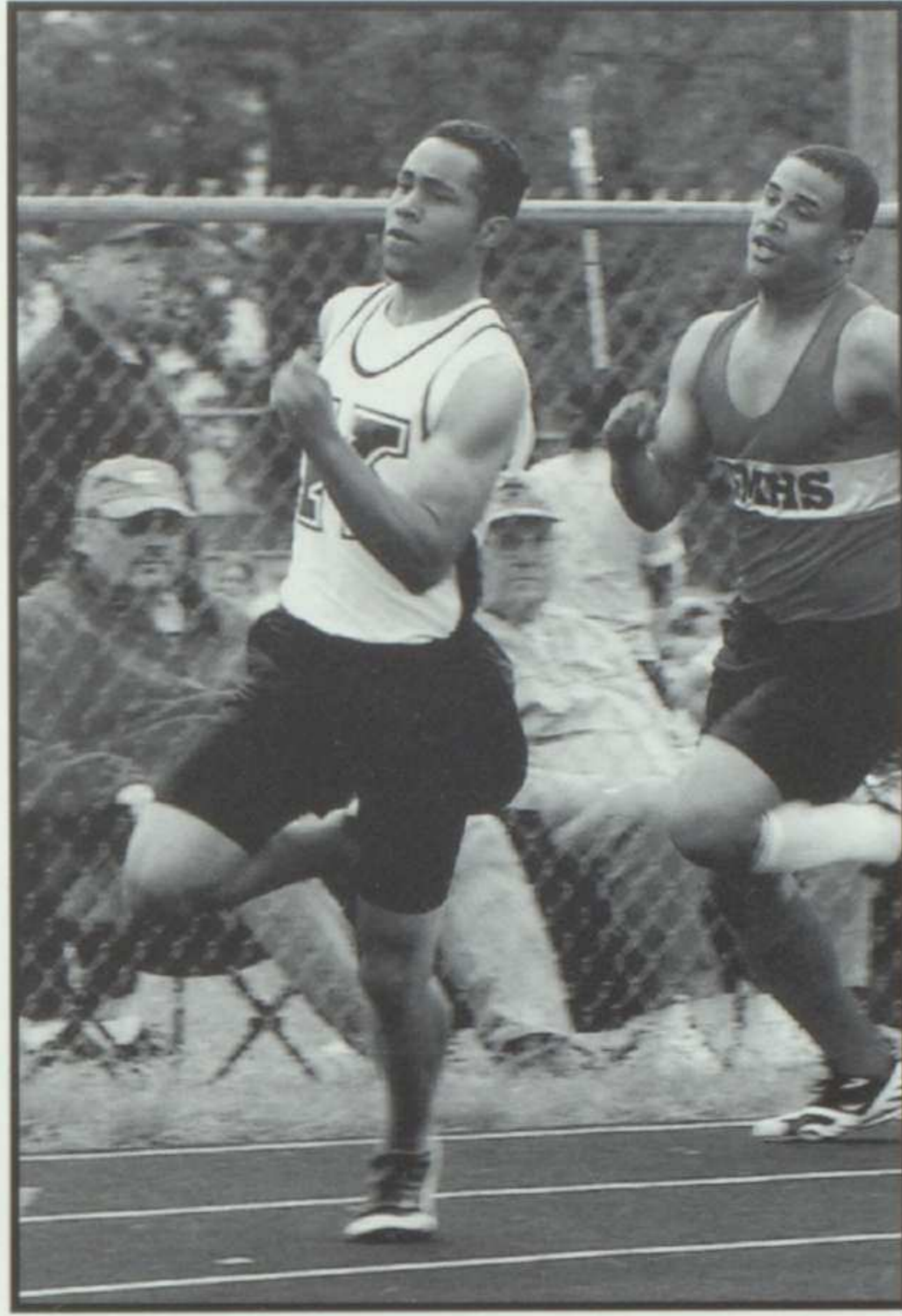

A place to *learn*, grow, and mature, based on trust and honesty, all define Linworth, an alternative school to Kilbourne and Thomas. *Linworth* gives each student the chance to be in an environment where the majority rules. Students attend town meetings to establish their own rules, work out conflicts, and plan and discuss up-coming events. Plus, all students have the *advantage* of one-on-one relationship with teachers.

Since opening in 1973, students have had the option of attending a less traditional campus. Just like the sister schools, the *Alternative Program* is dedicated to helping students learn what they need to know in order to achieve their goals and *succeed* in life. Teachers base all classes and programs around the students' learning styles.

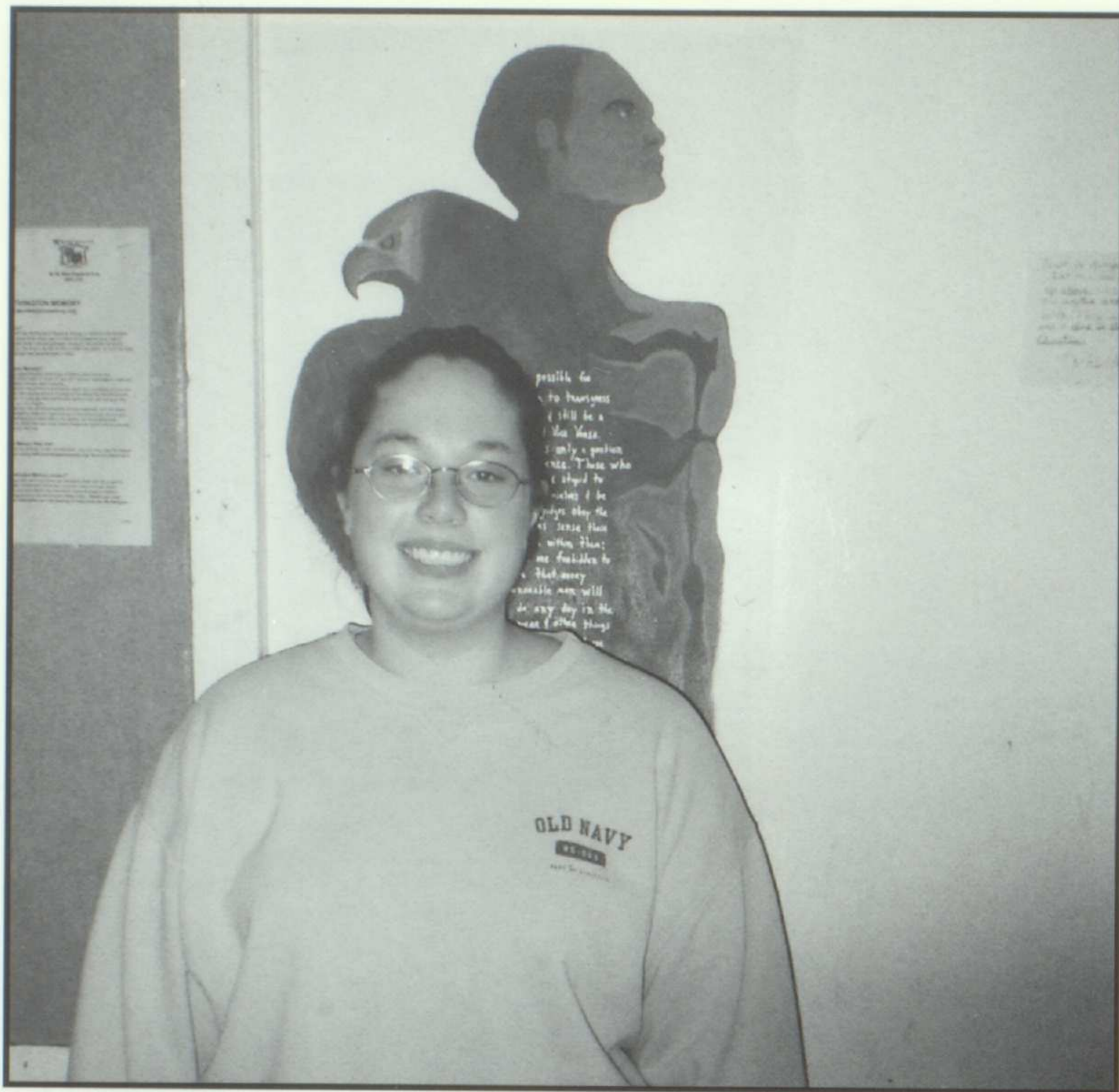
Seniors at Linworth choose extensive, in-depth projects called *walk-about*s that allow them to enter the real world for a whole semester. This project gives Linworth students the *opportunity* to see for themselves what really happens in a non-classroom setting instead of a one day shadowing or a one month senior project experience.

As long as the AP offers a *unique* approach, some students will make the choice to attend. They are no different from the traditional students; they simply make a *choice* to learn in an environment that suits them best...and that is an important difference.



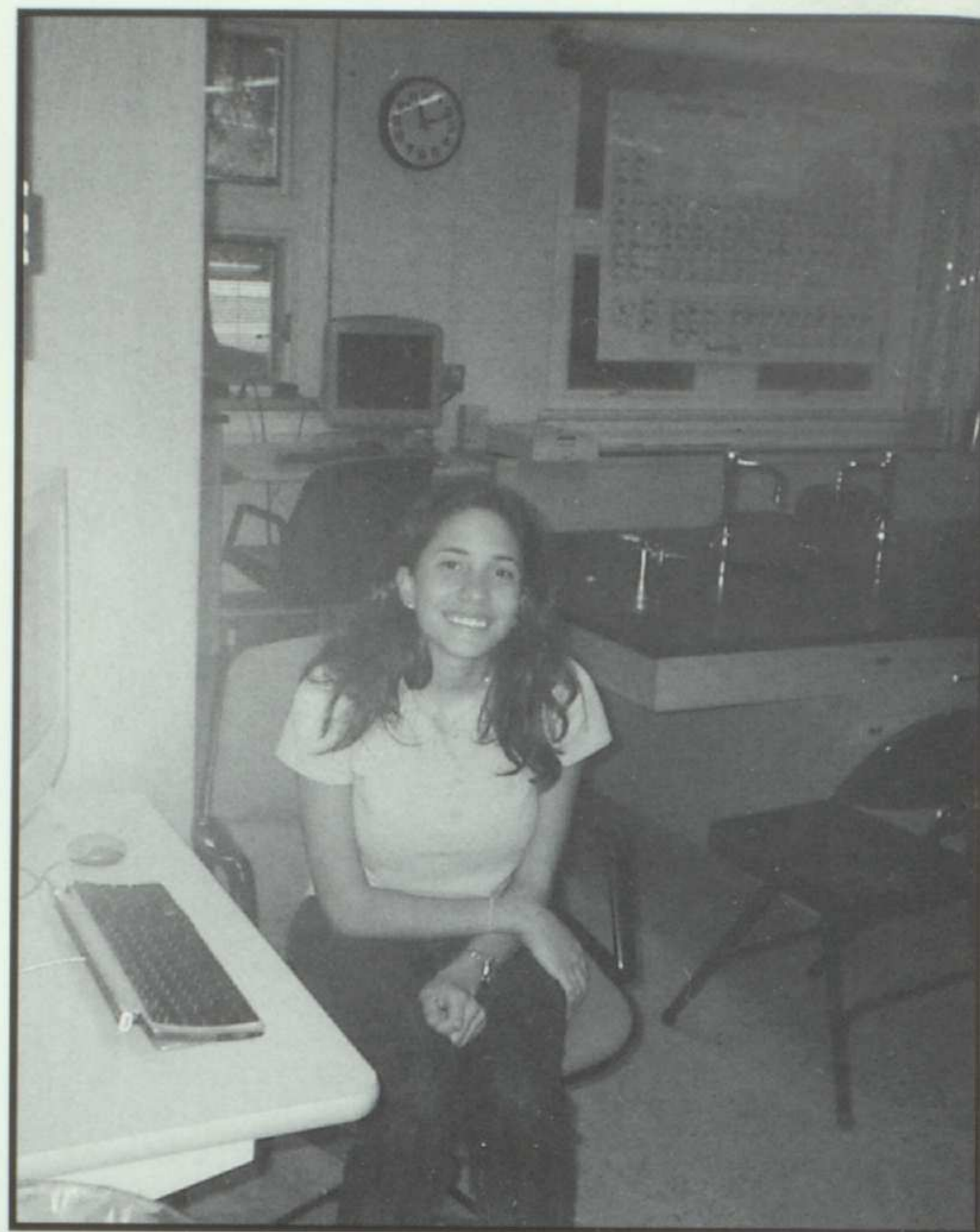

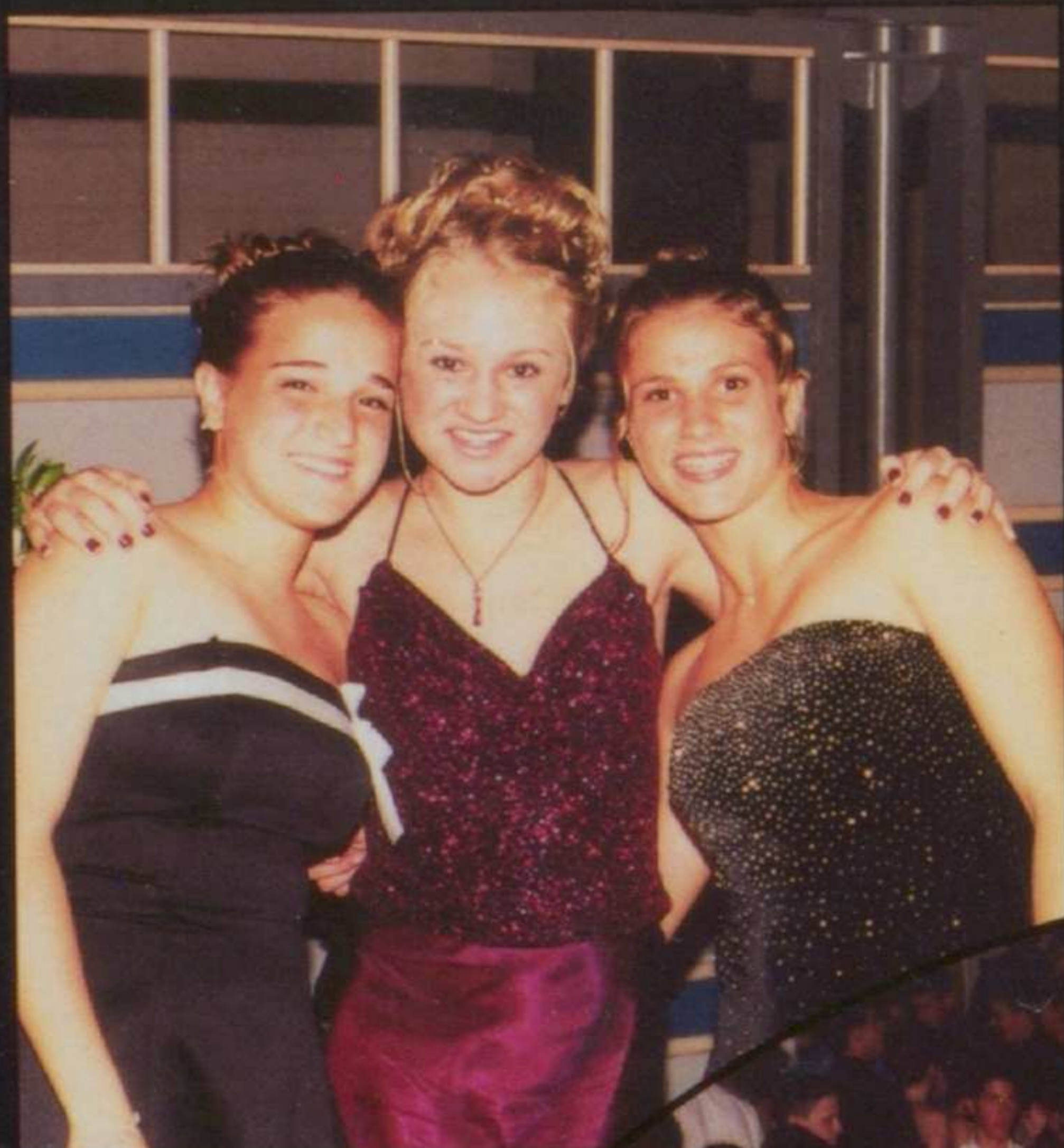

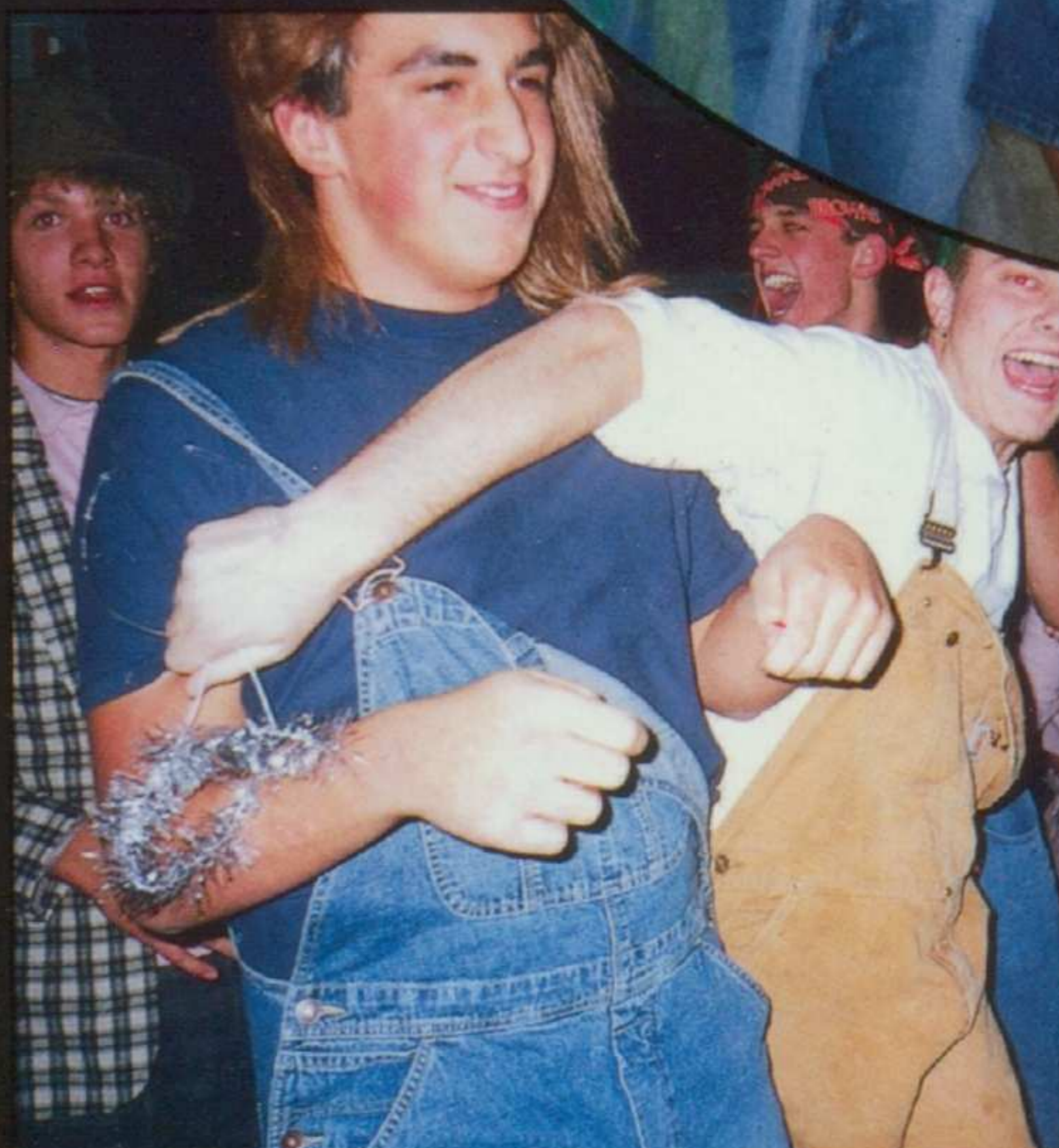

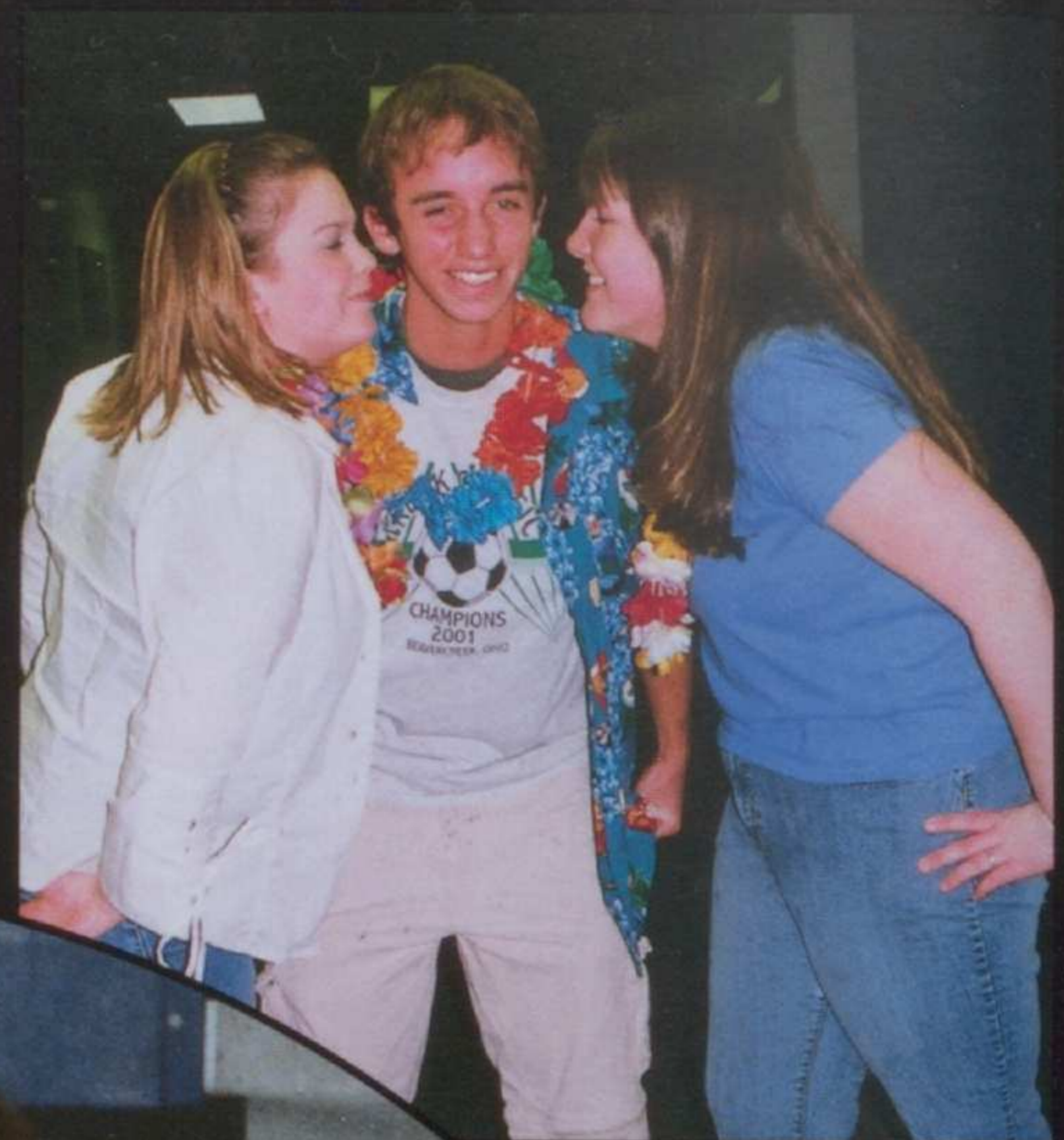

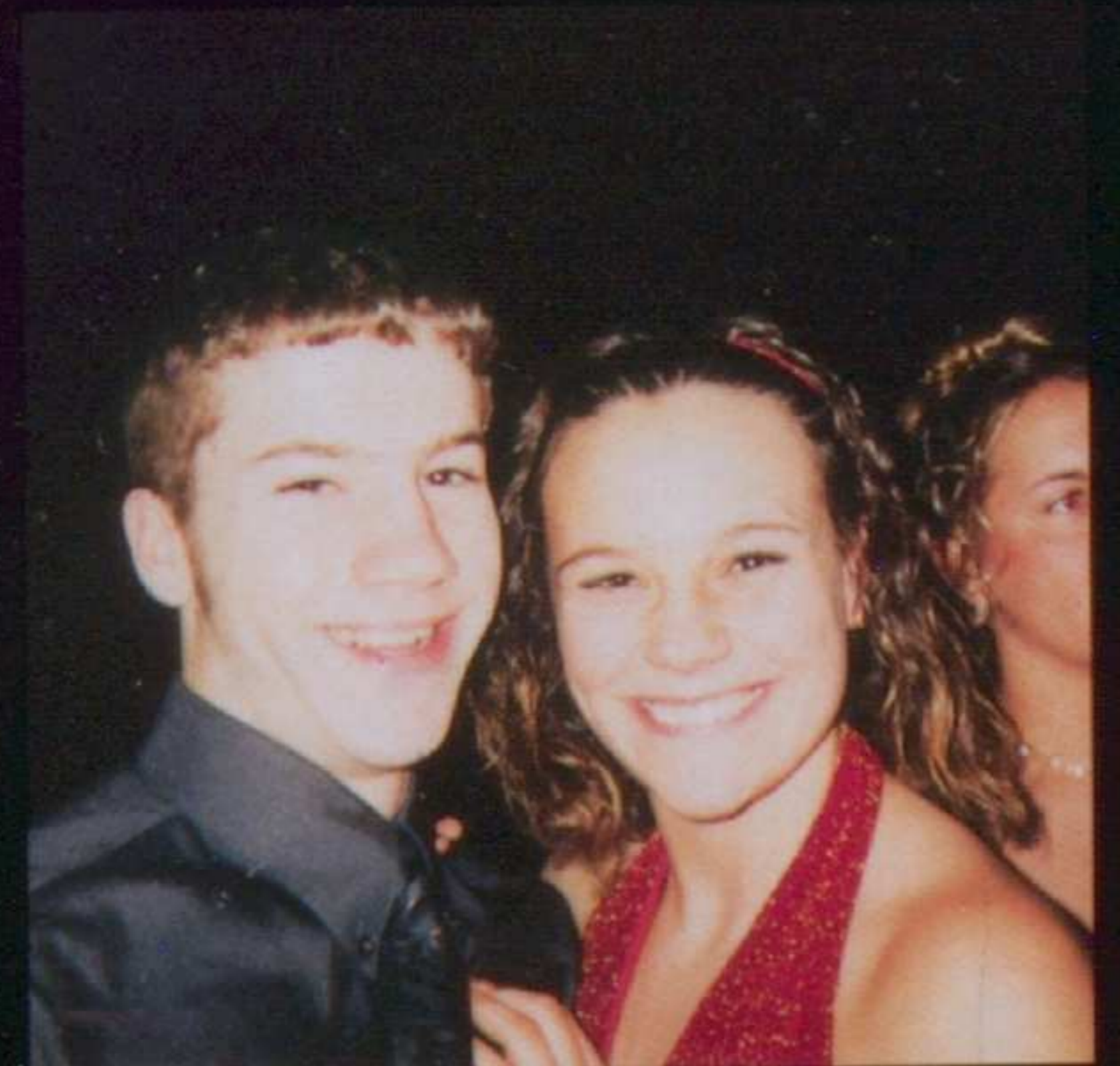

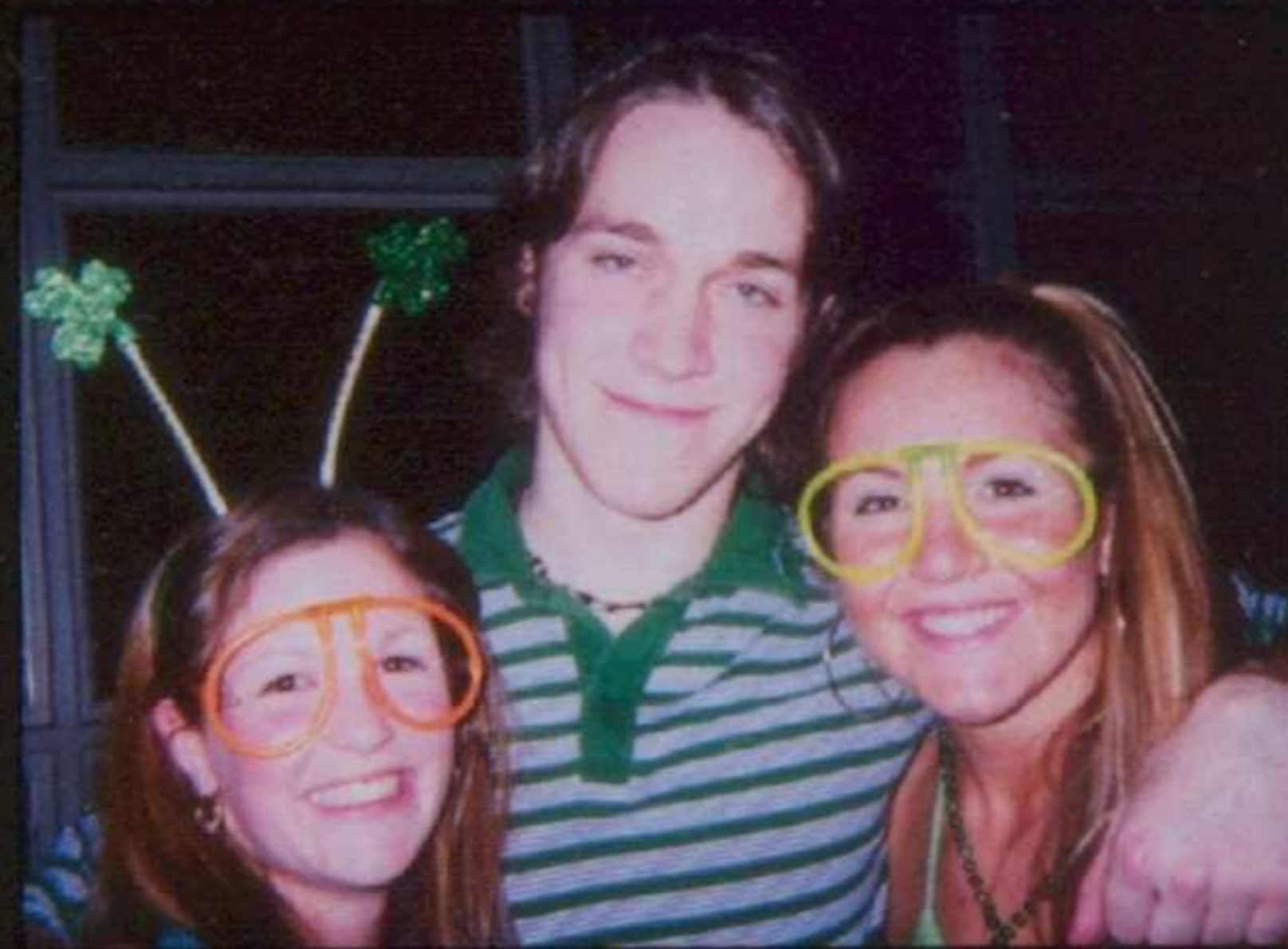


Leprechaun Leap

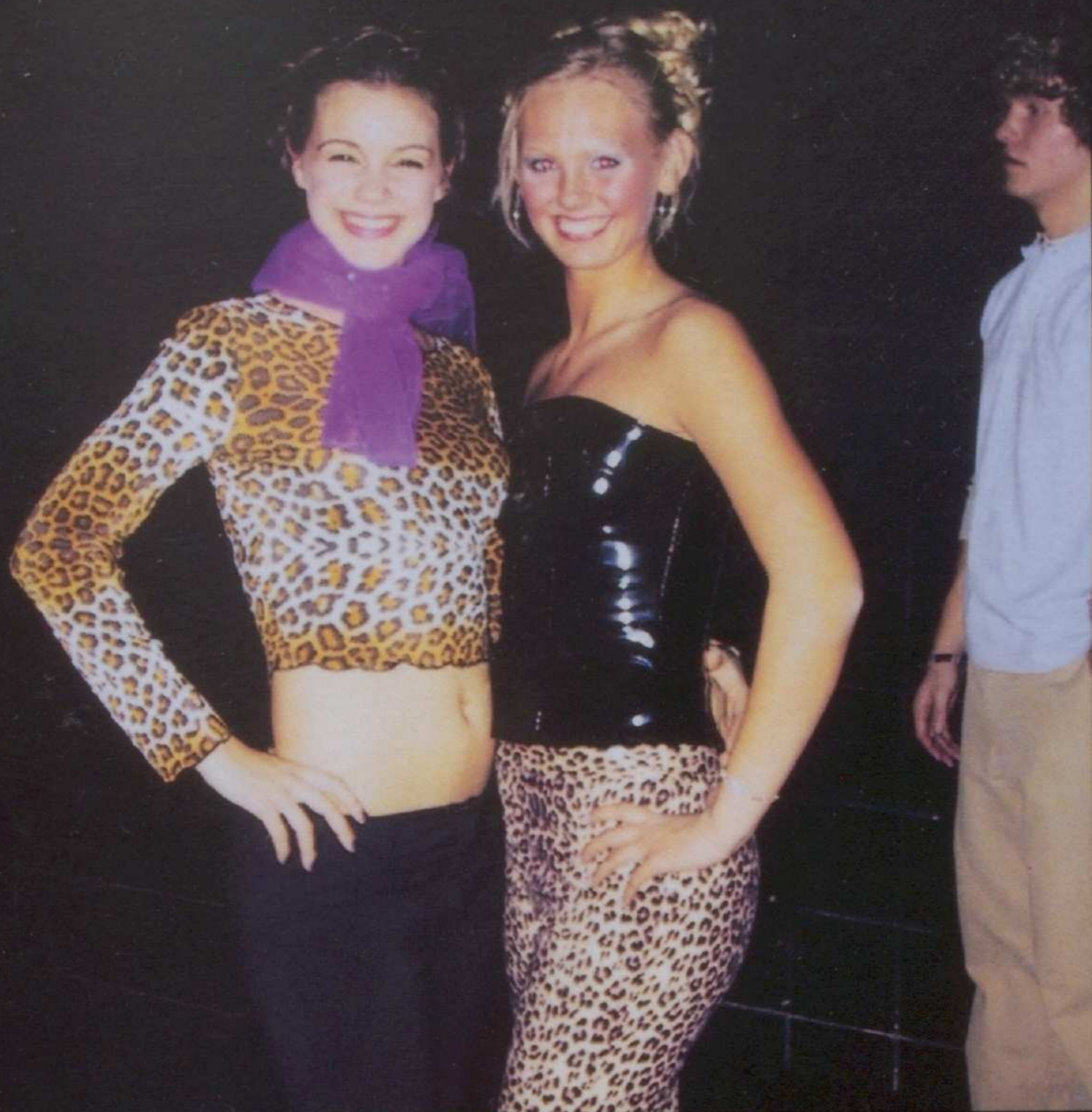

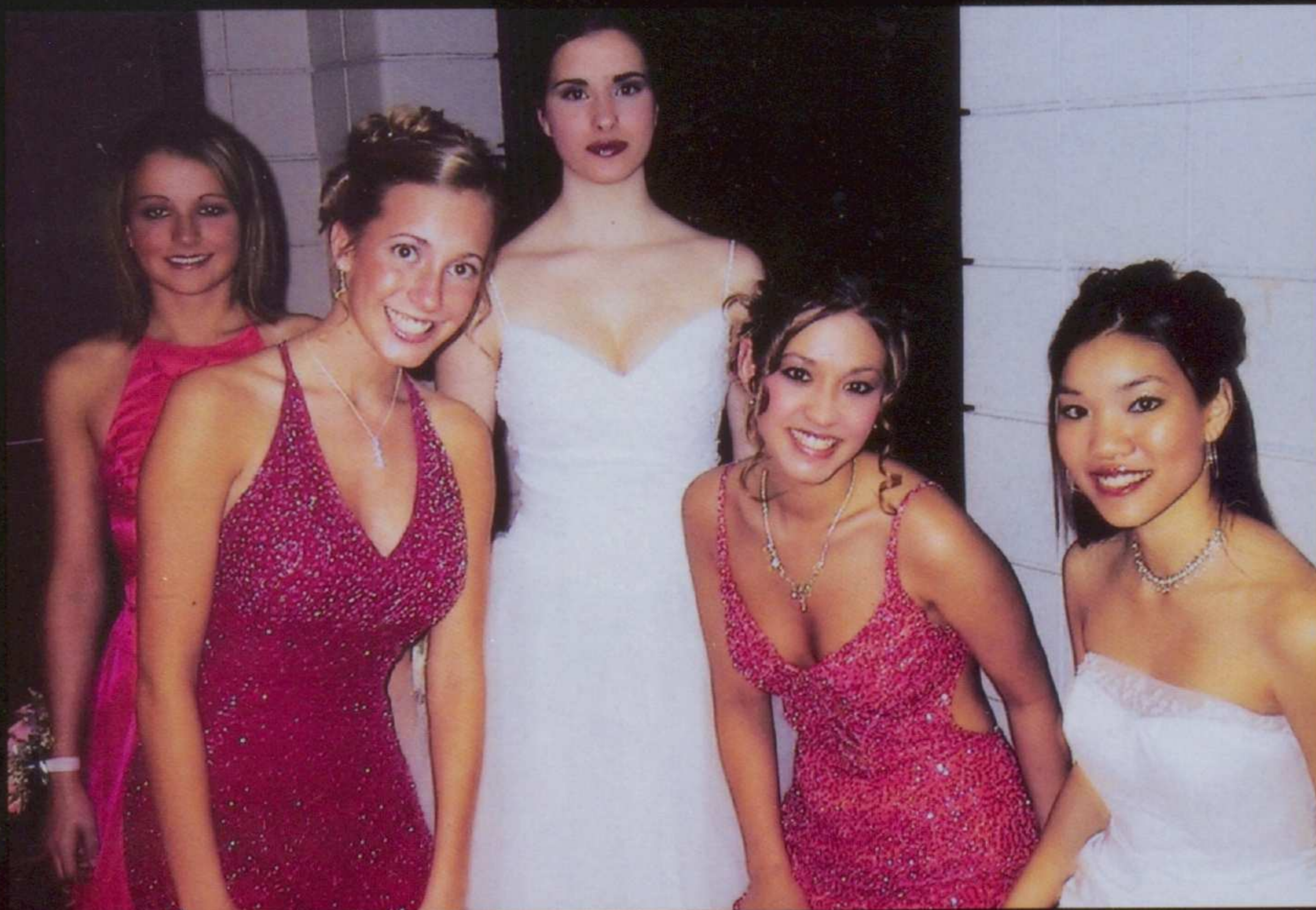
Dazzled Up!

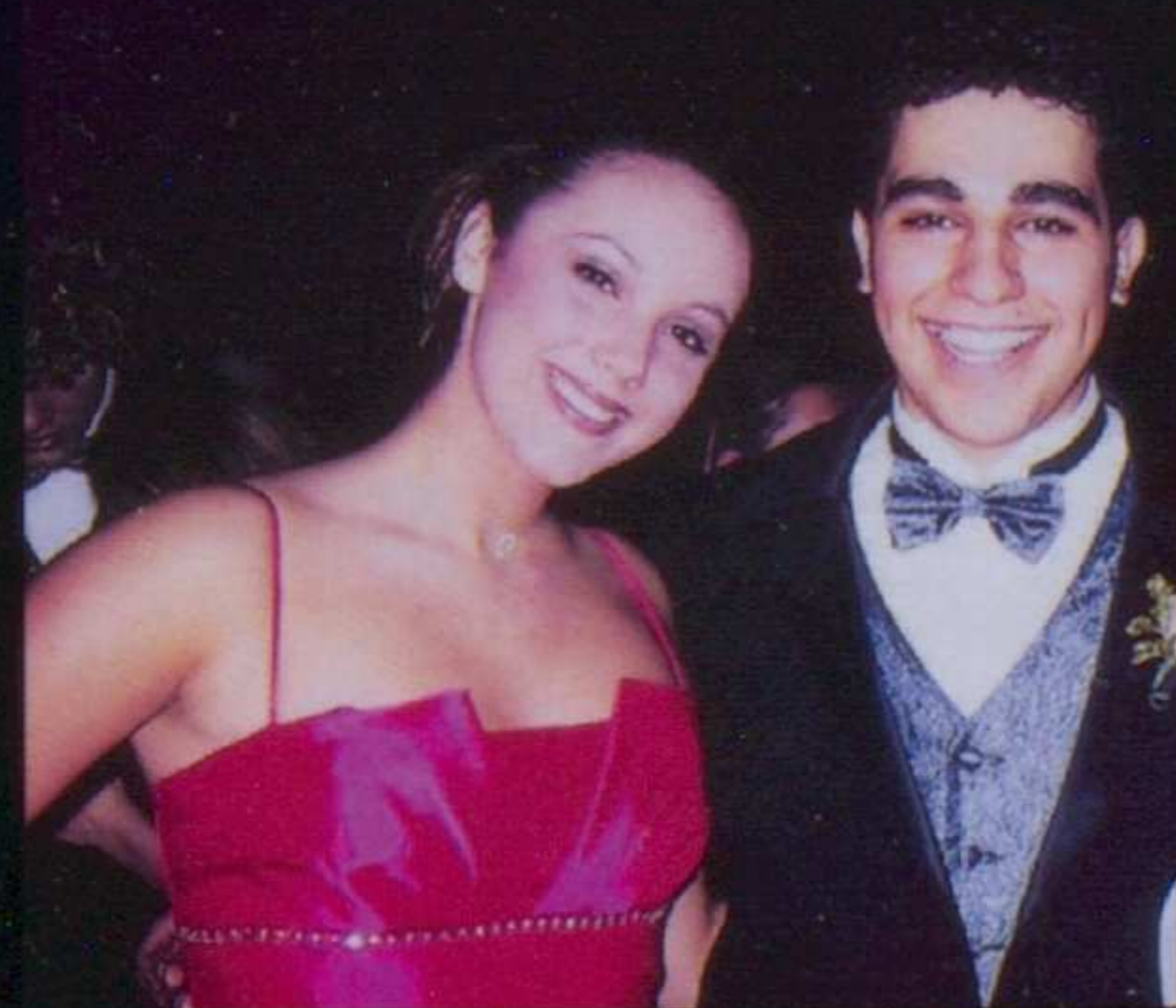

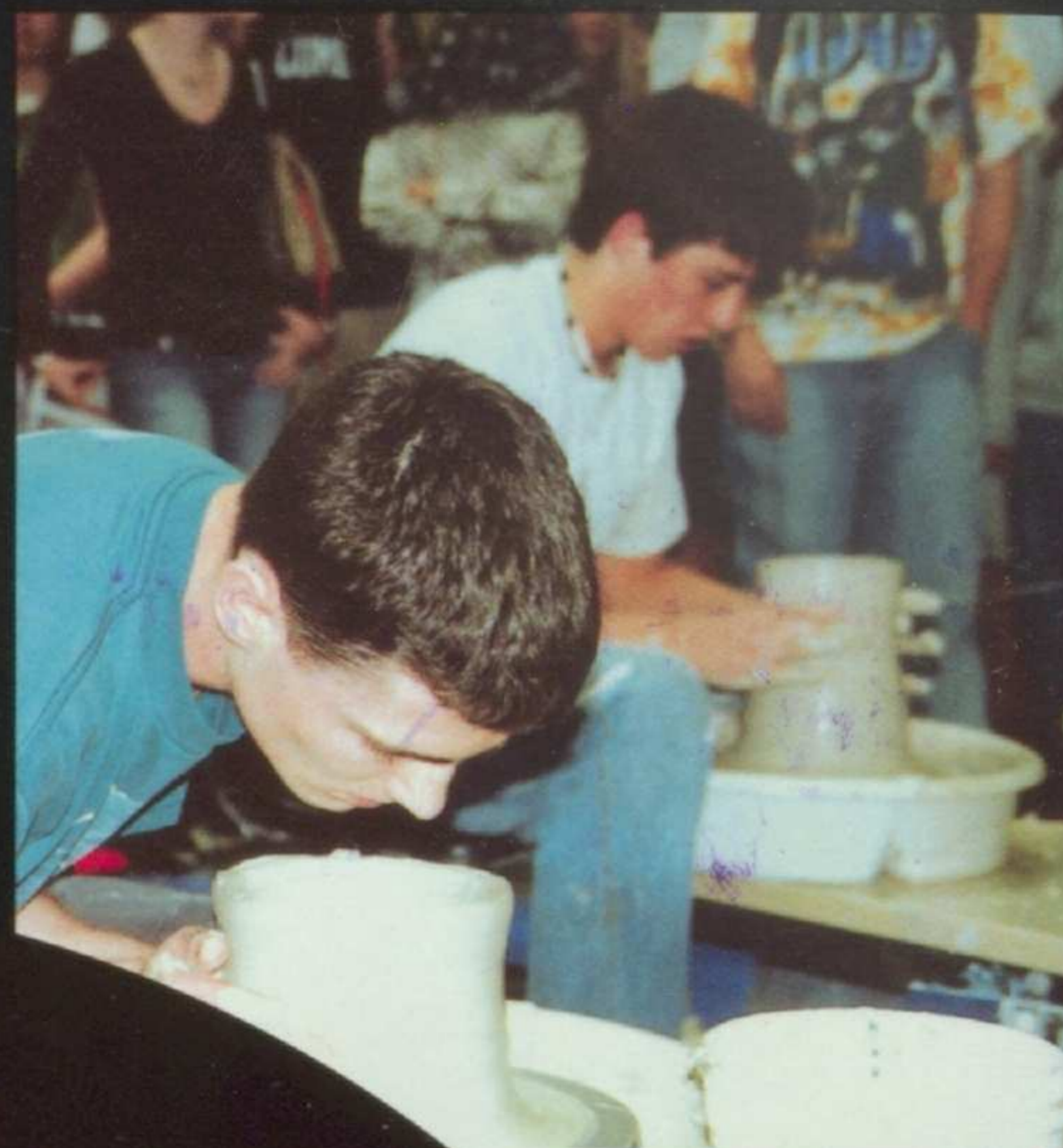

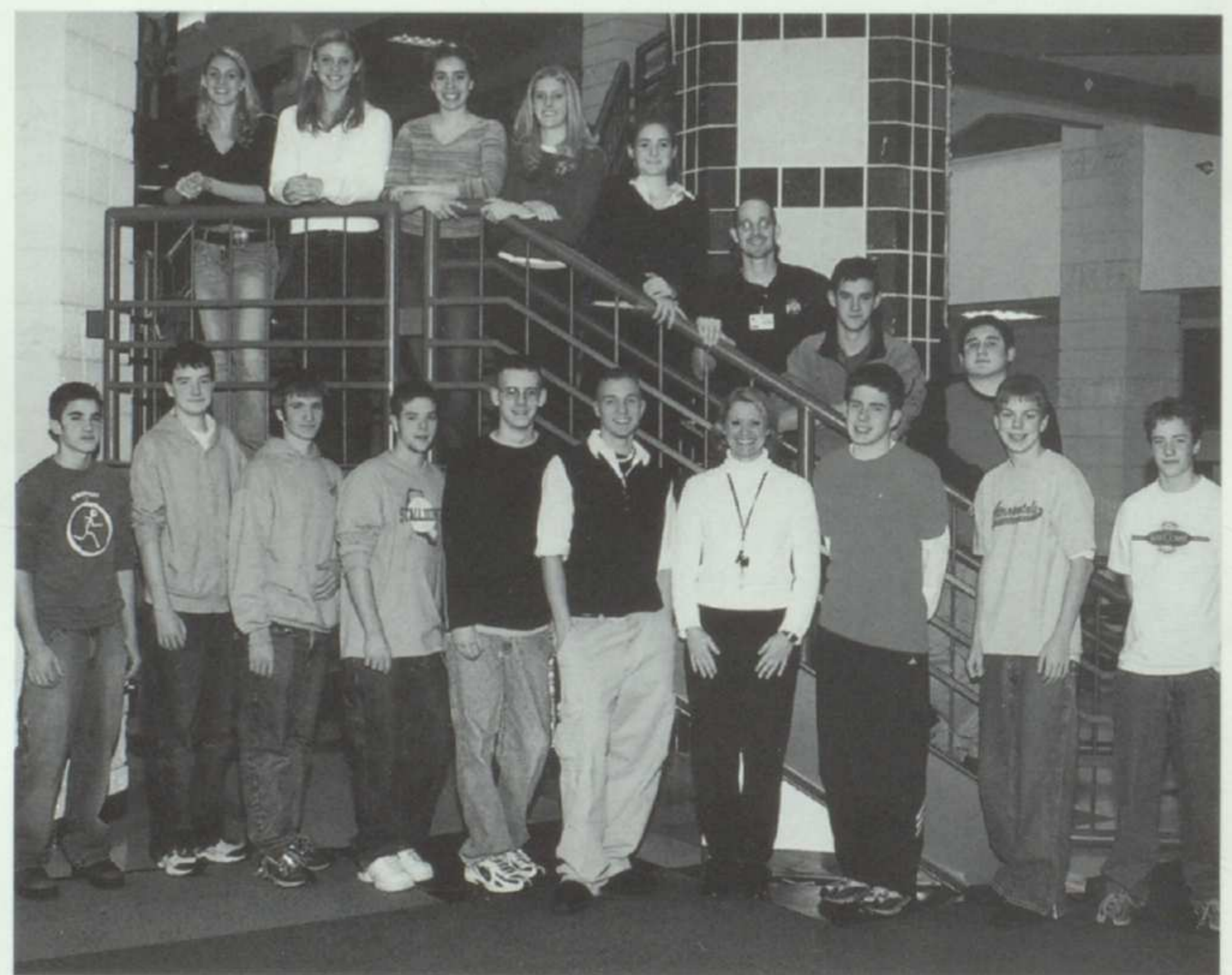

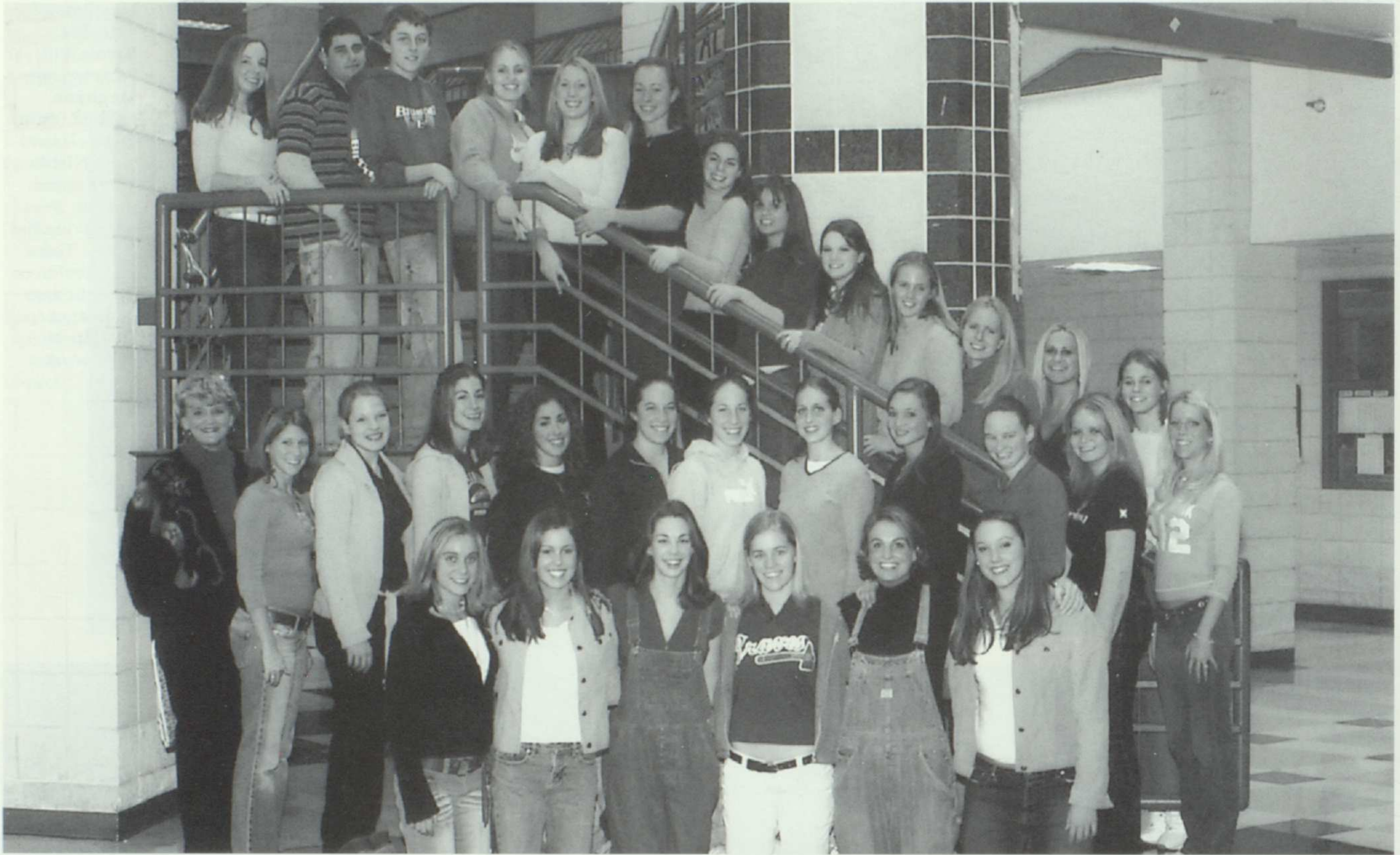

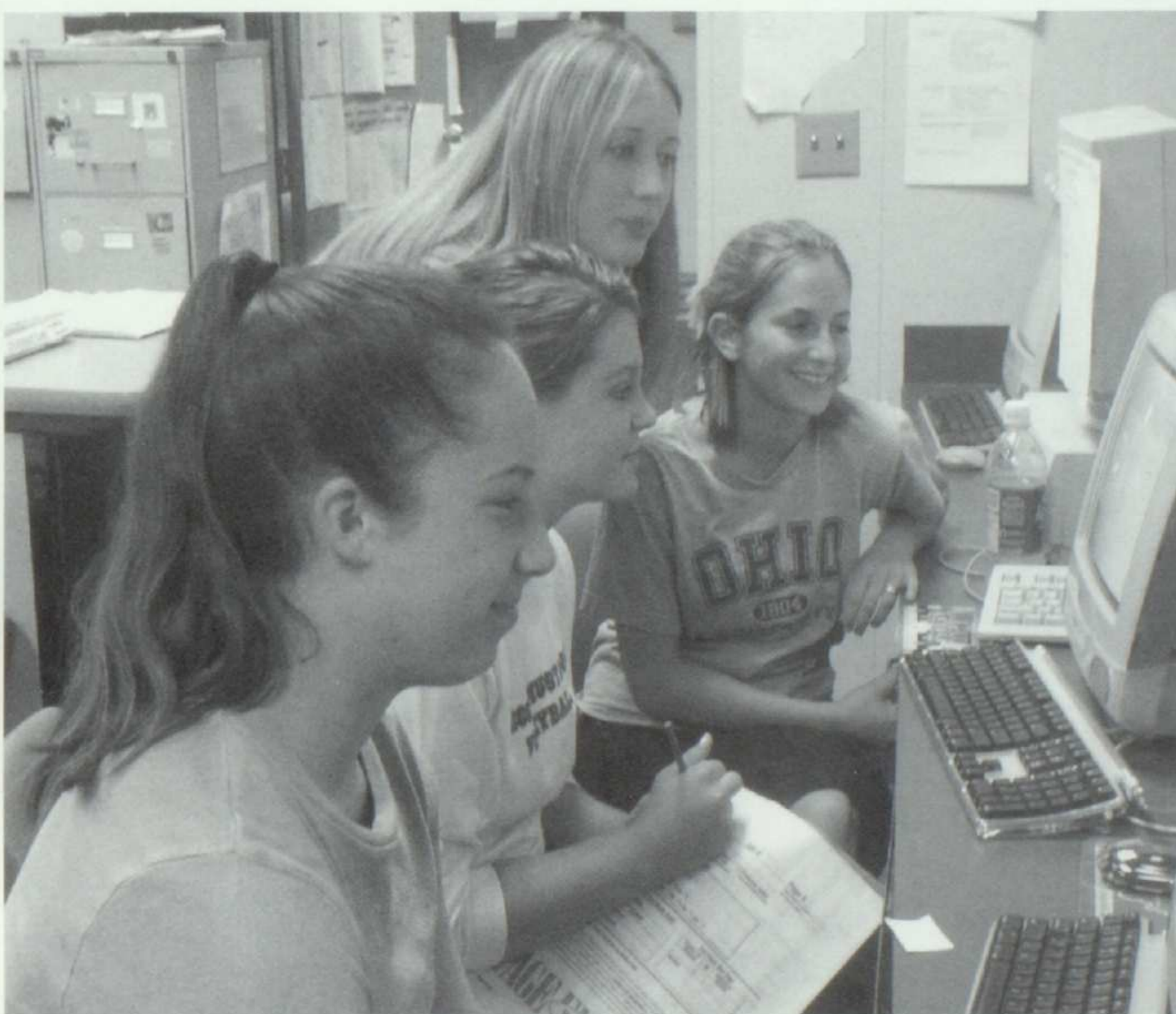

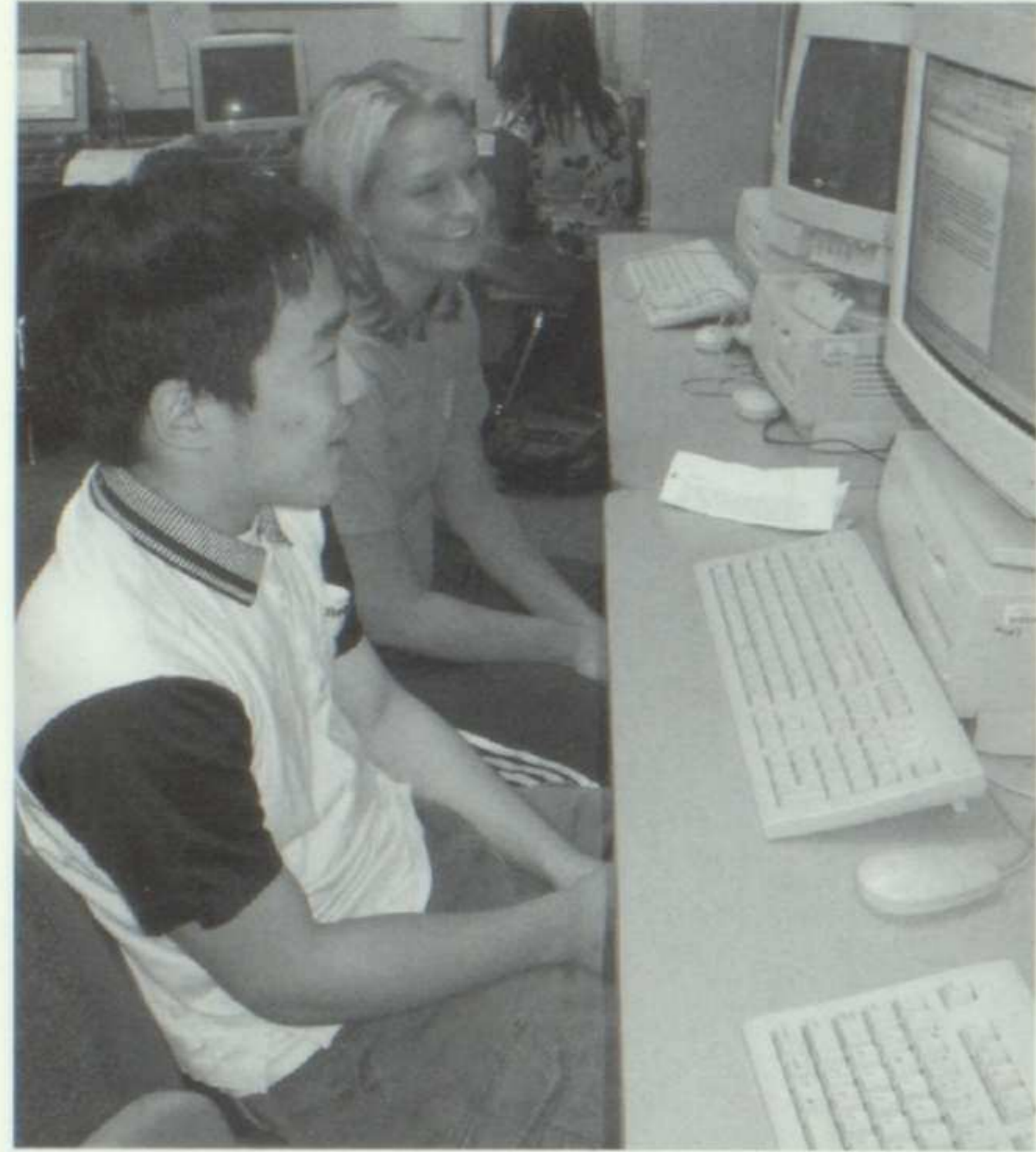

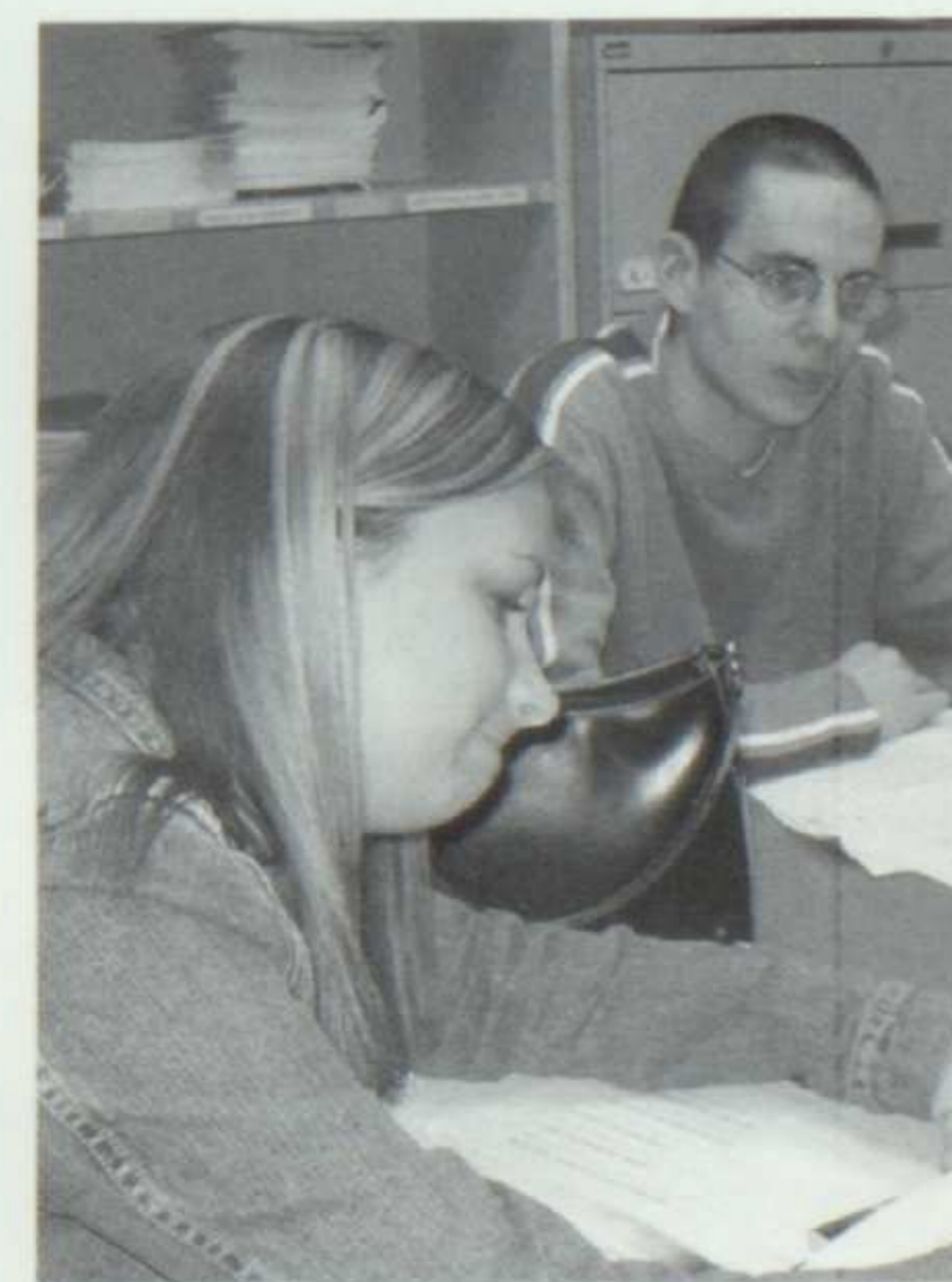

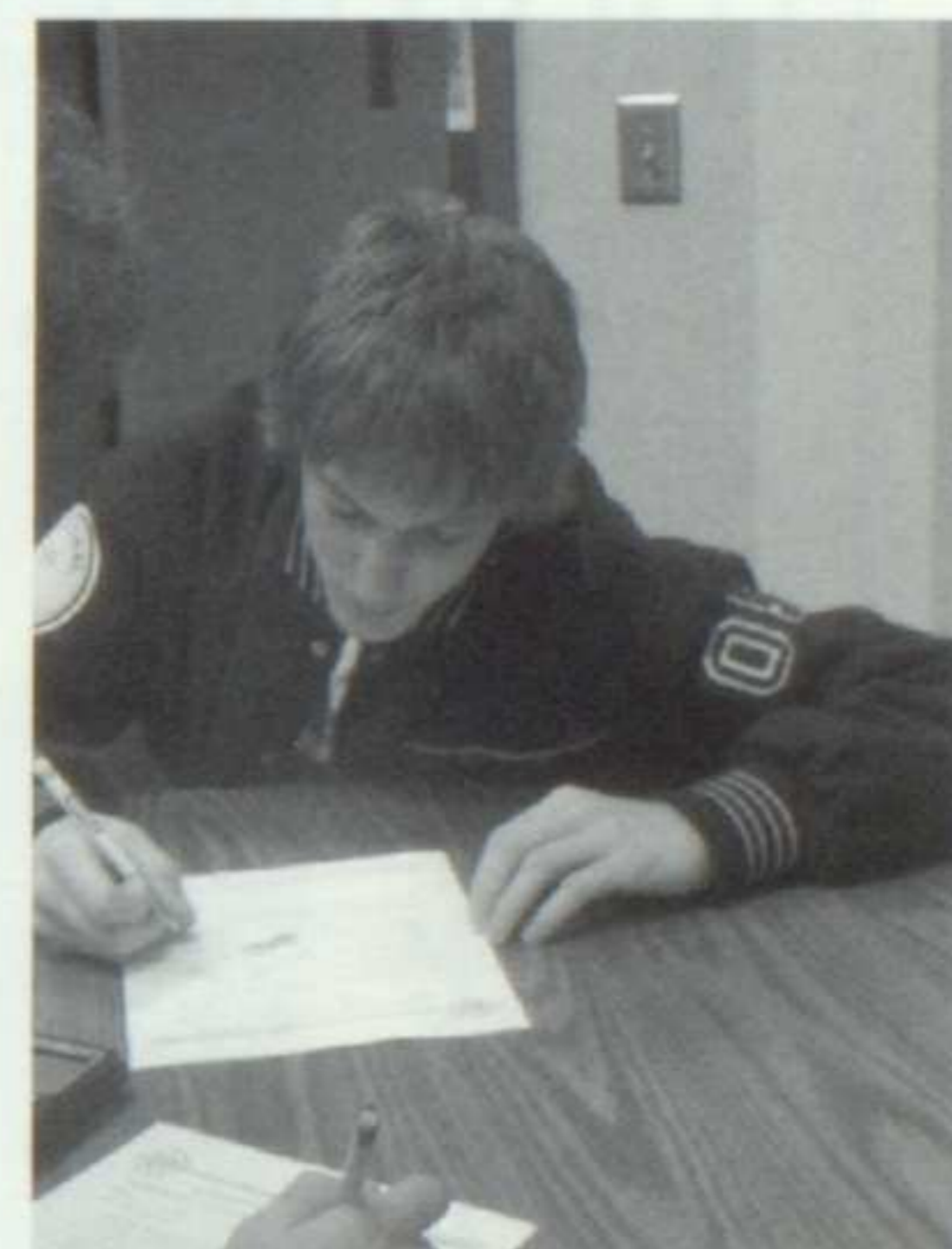

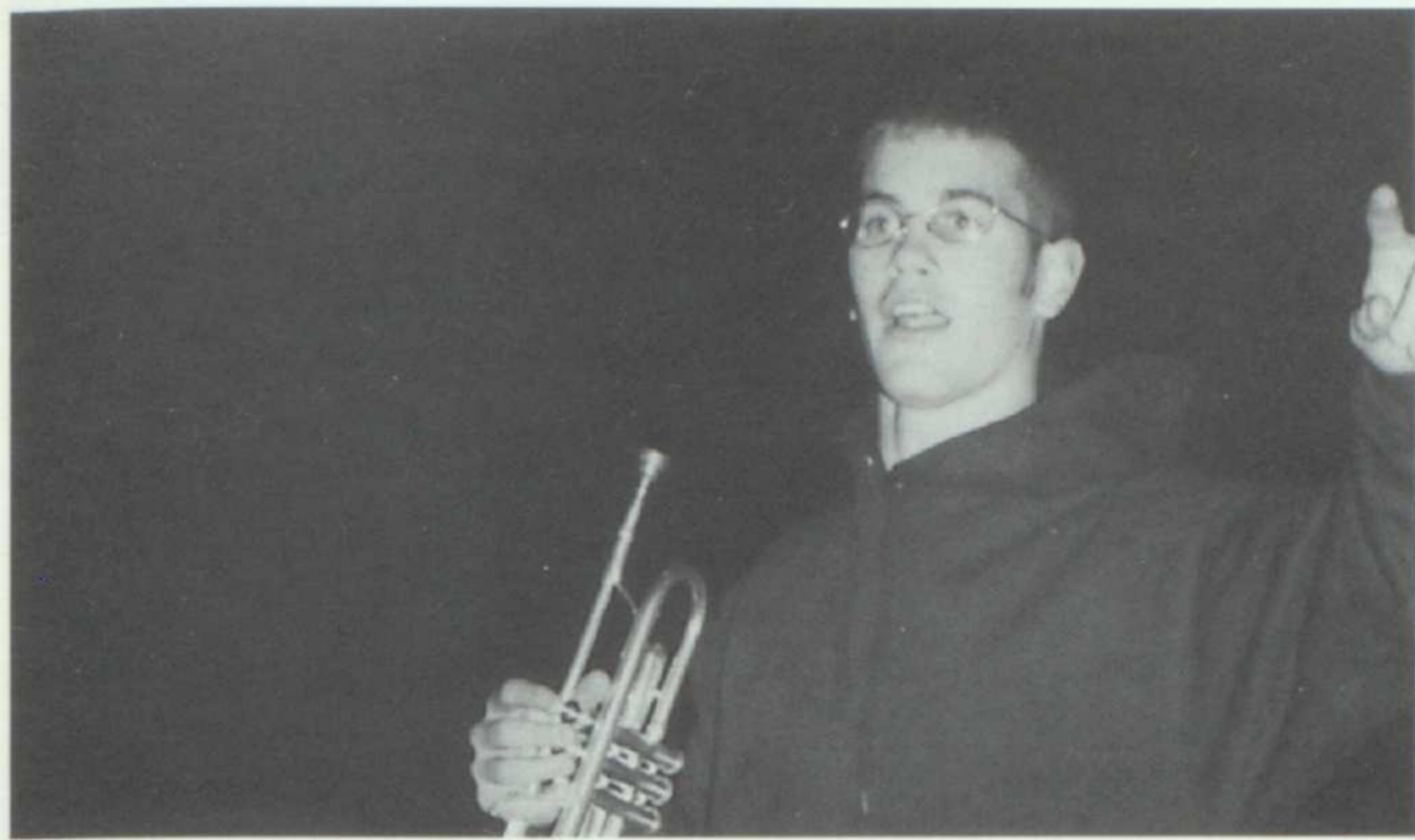

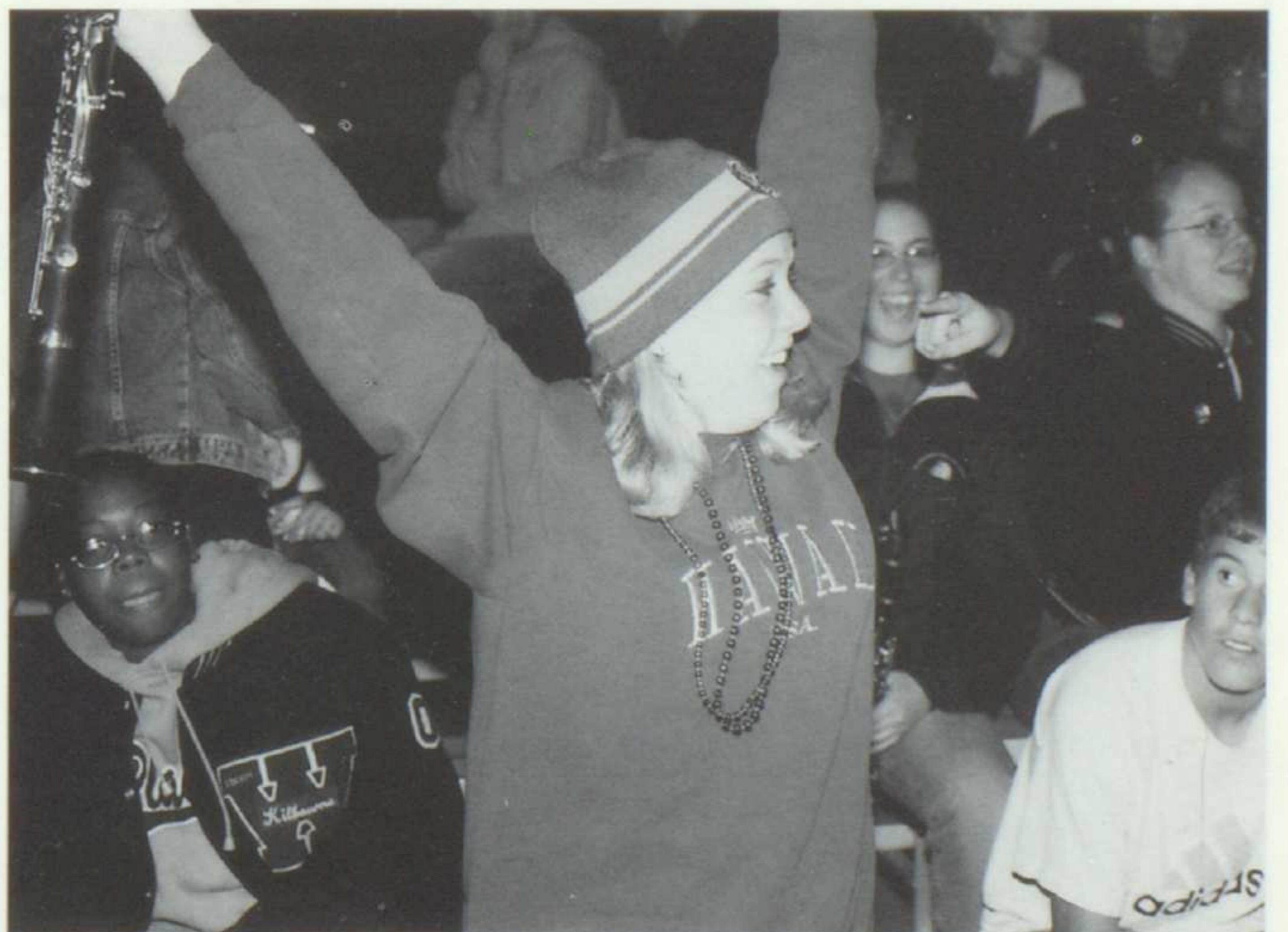

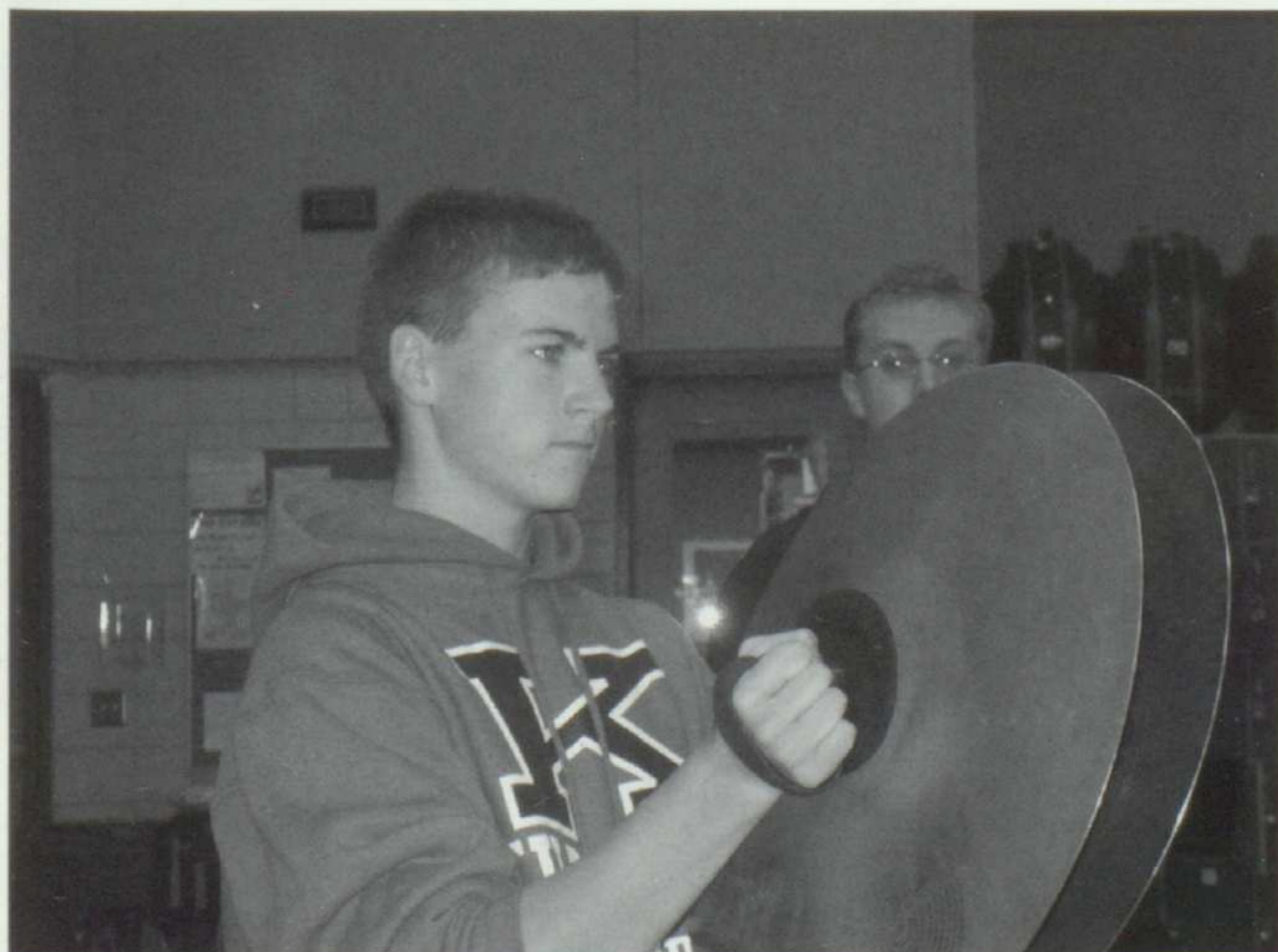

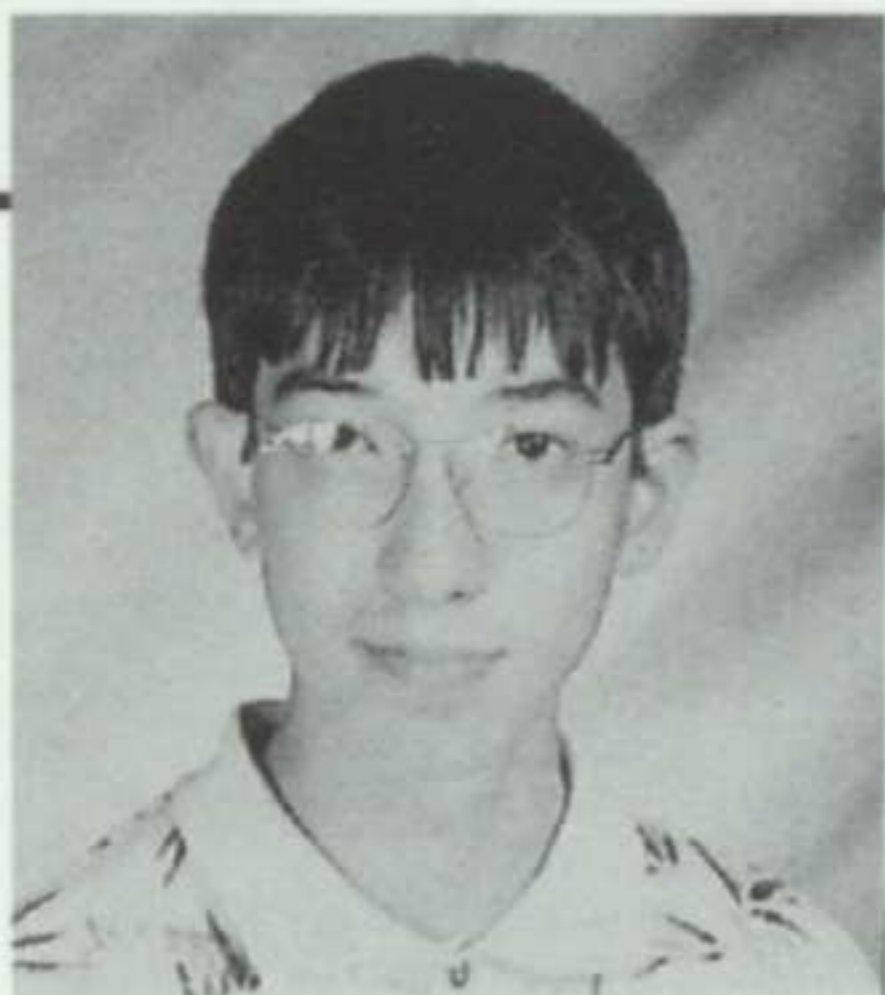

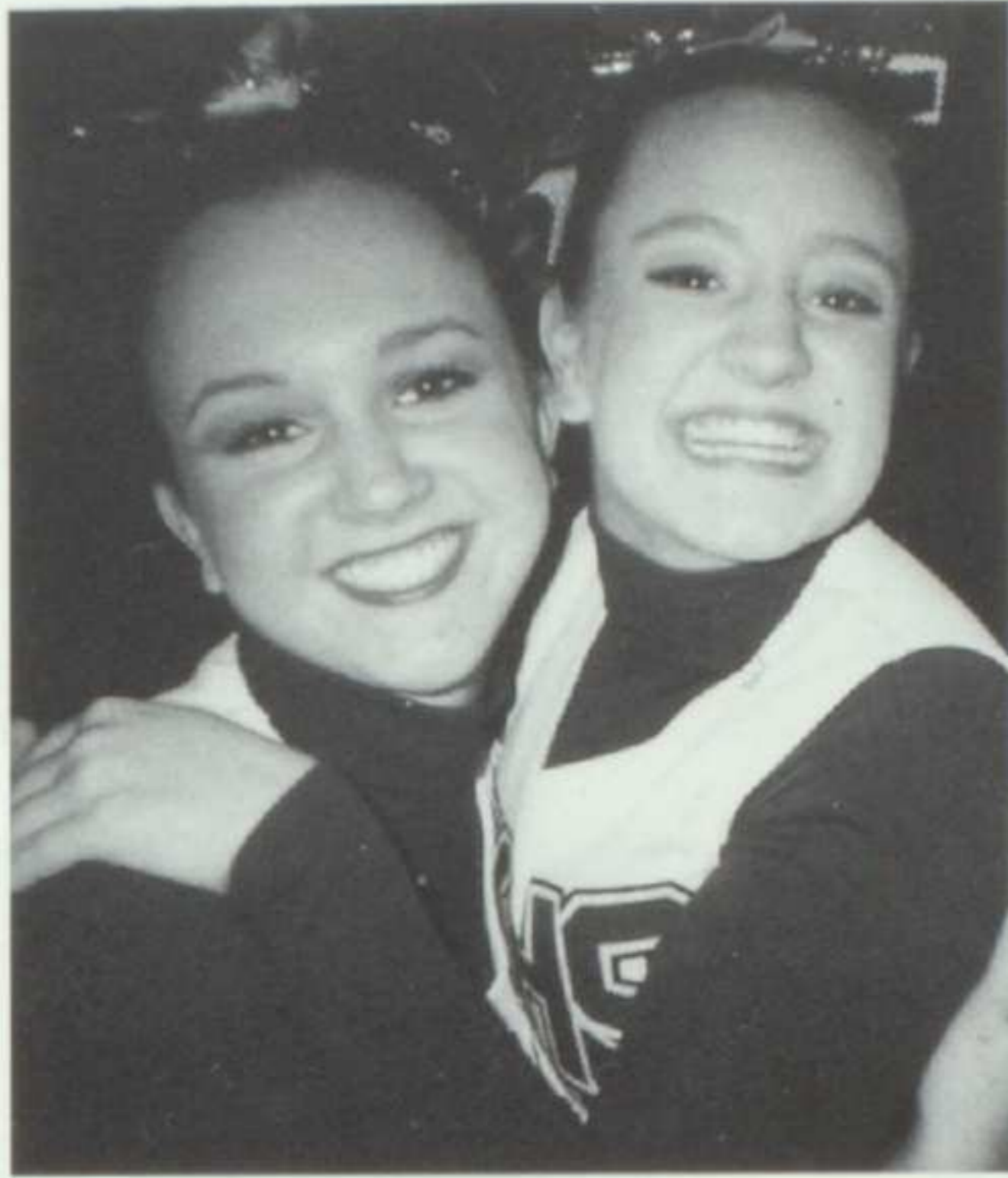

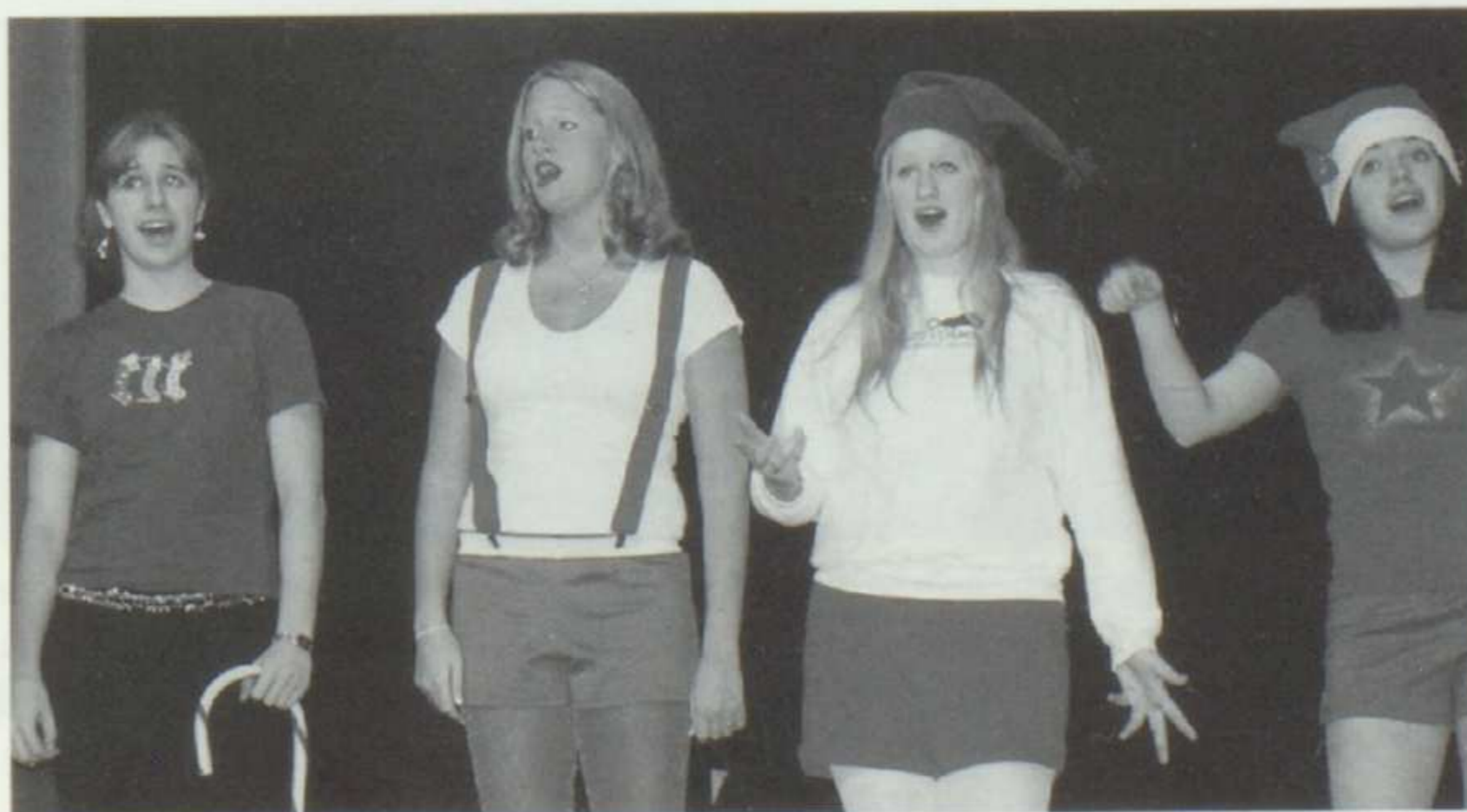

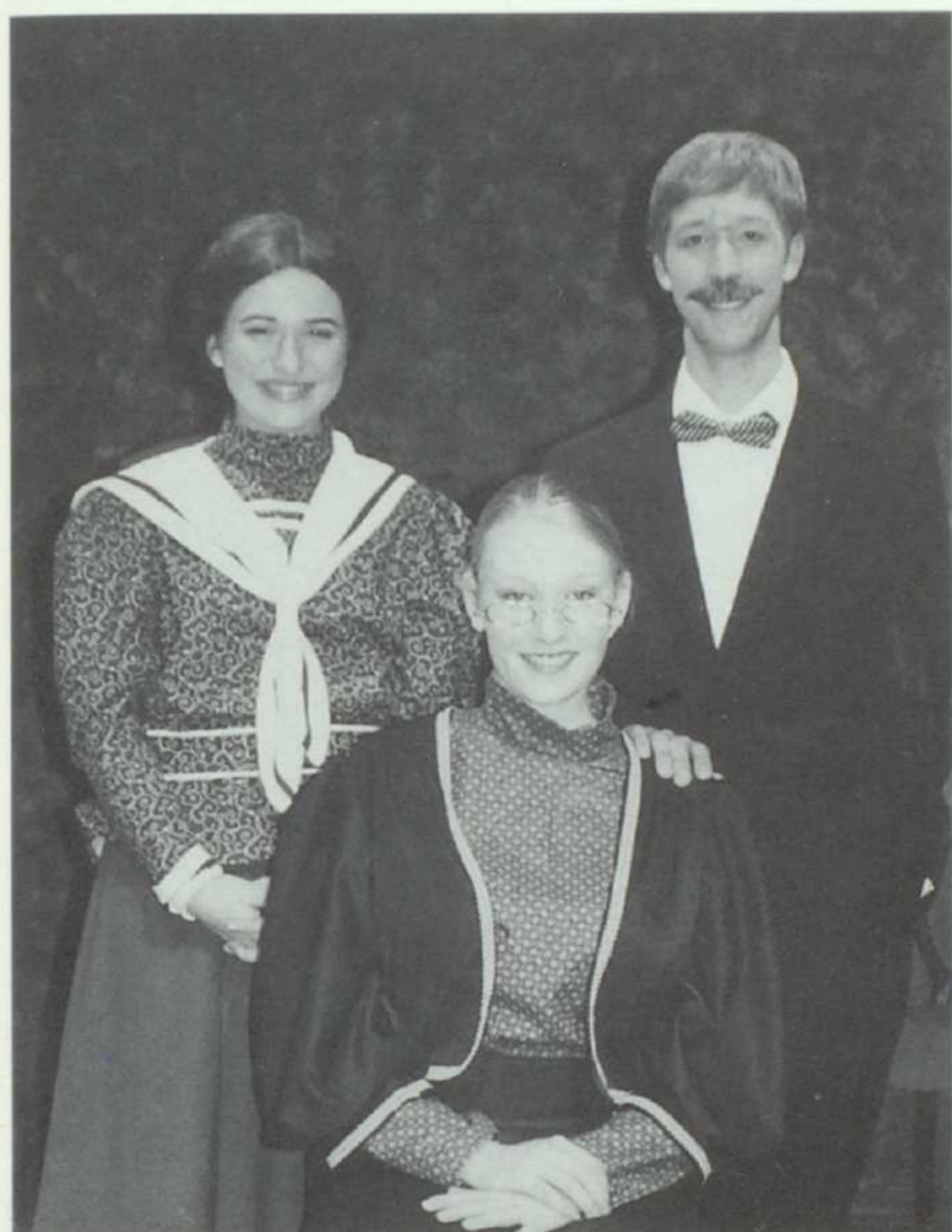

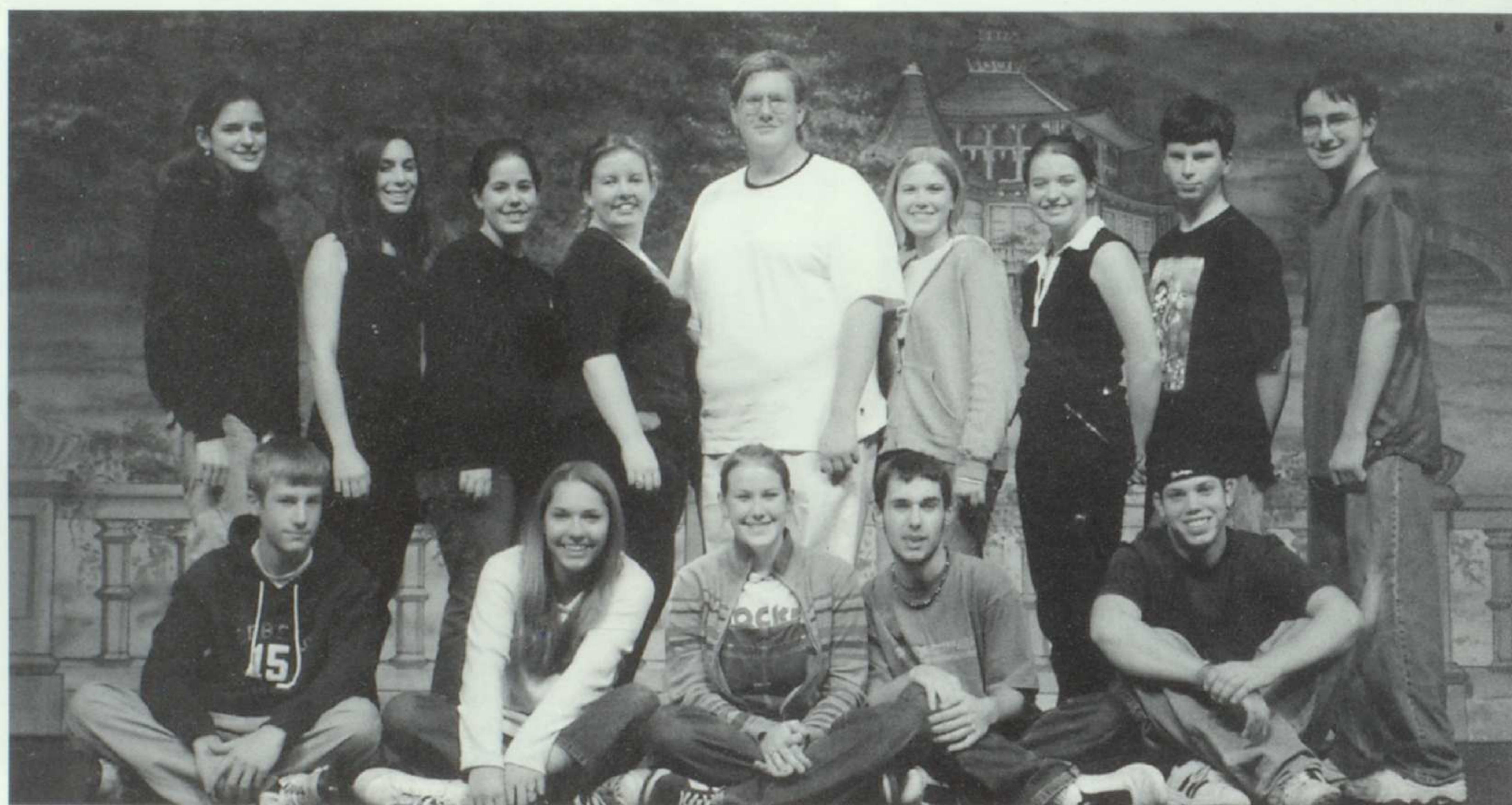

However, Mr. Spettigue is not the only man Babbs, dressed as Donna Lucia, must look out for. Jack's father also attempts to win him over.

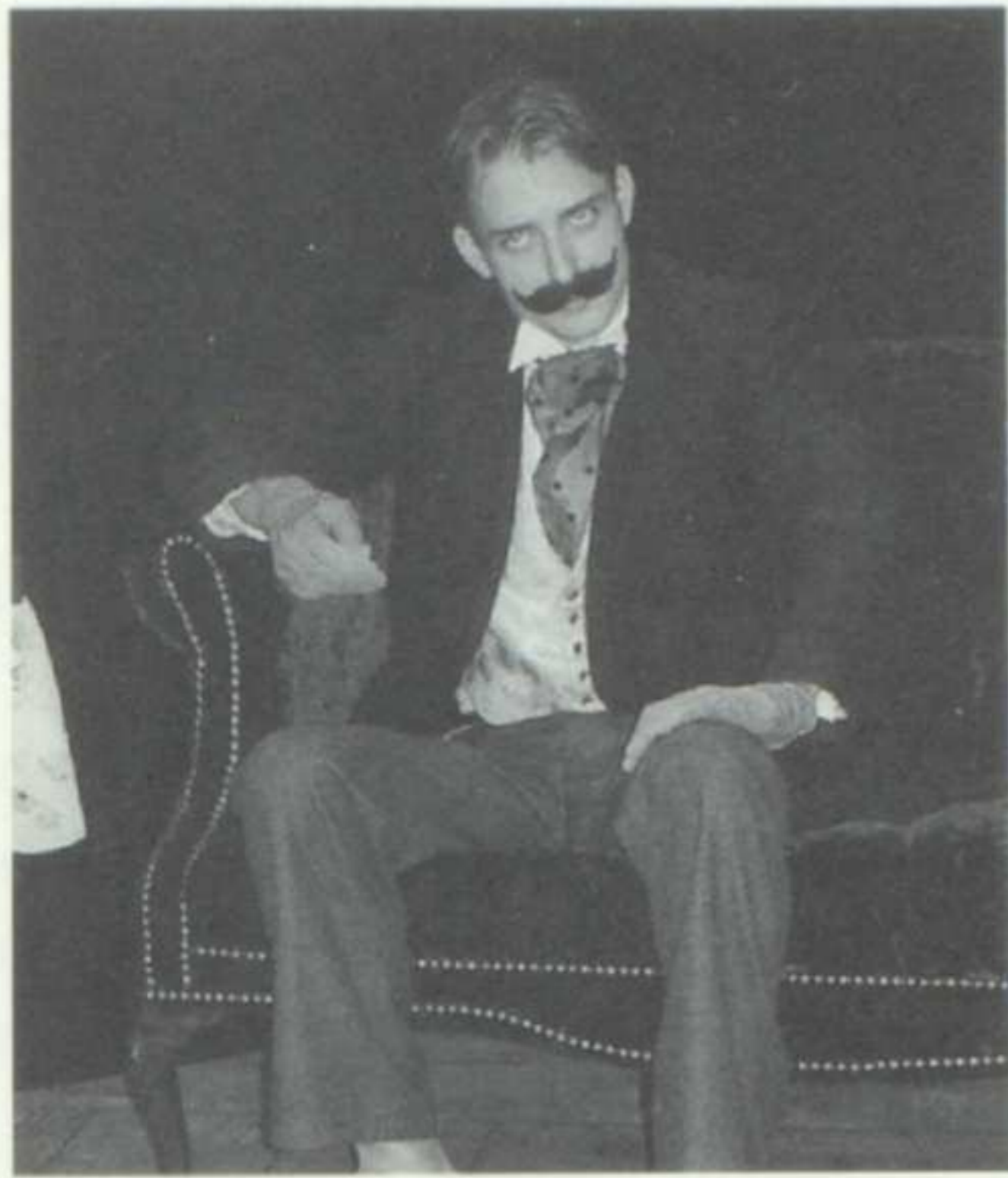

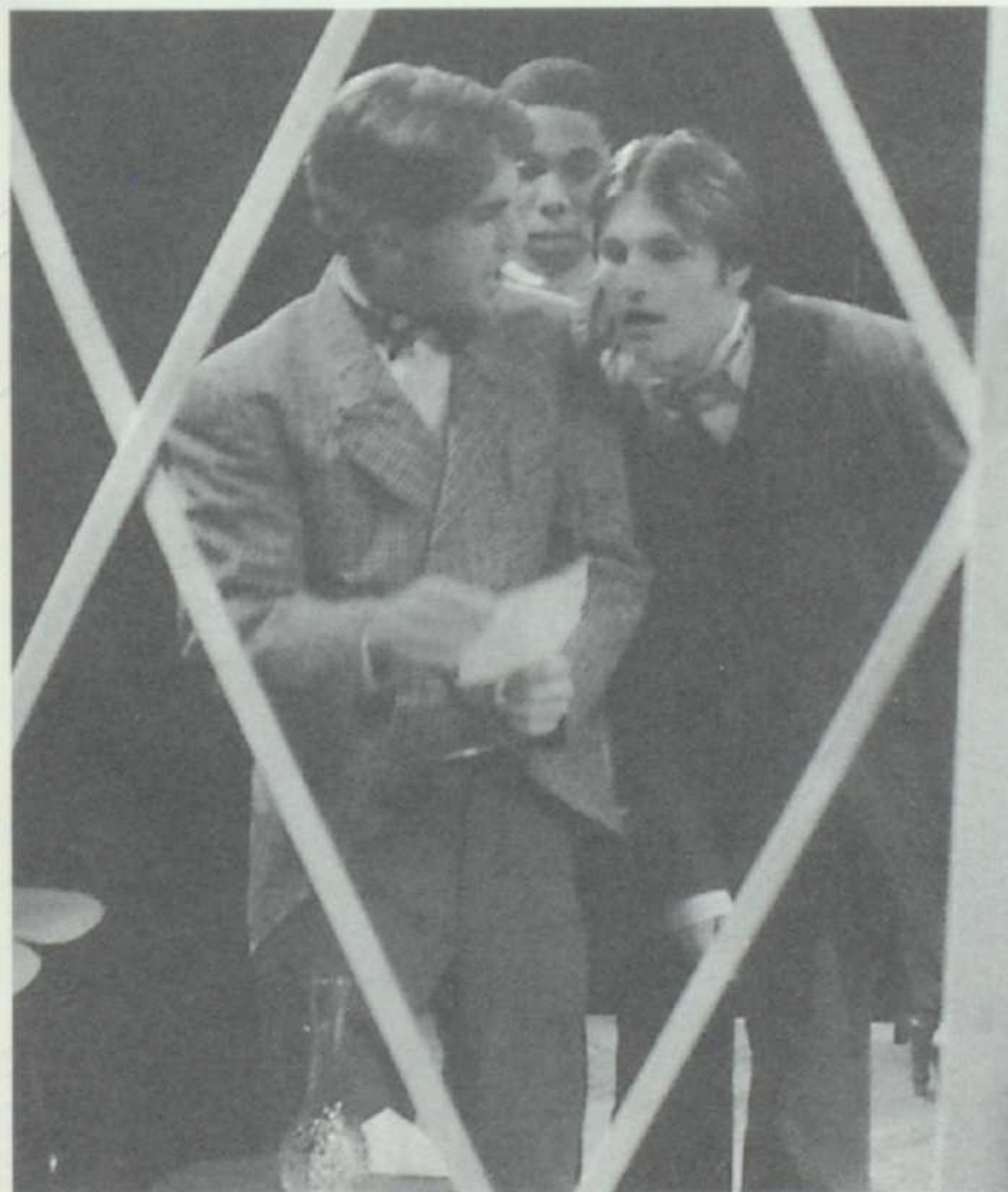

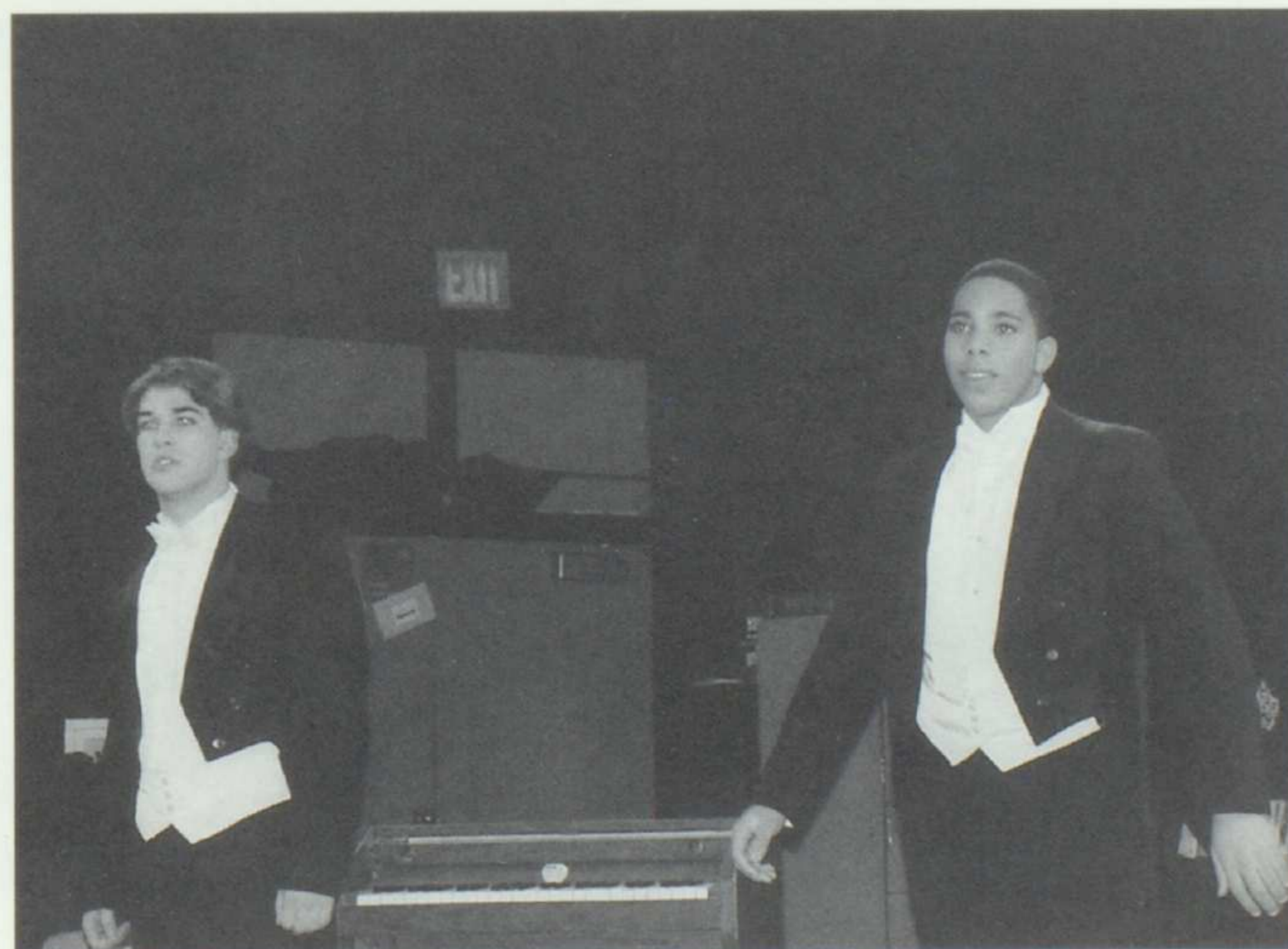

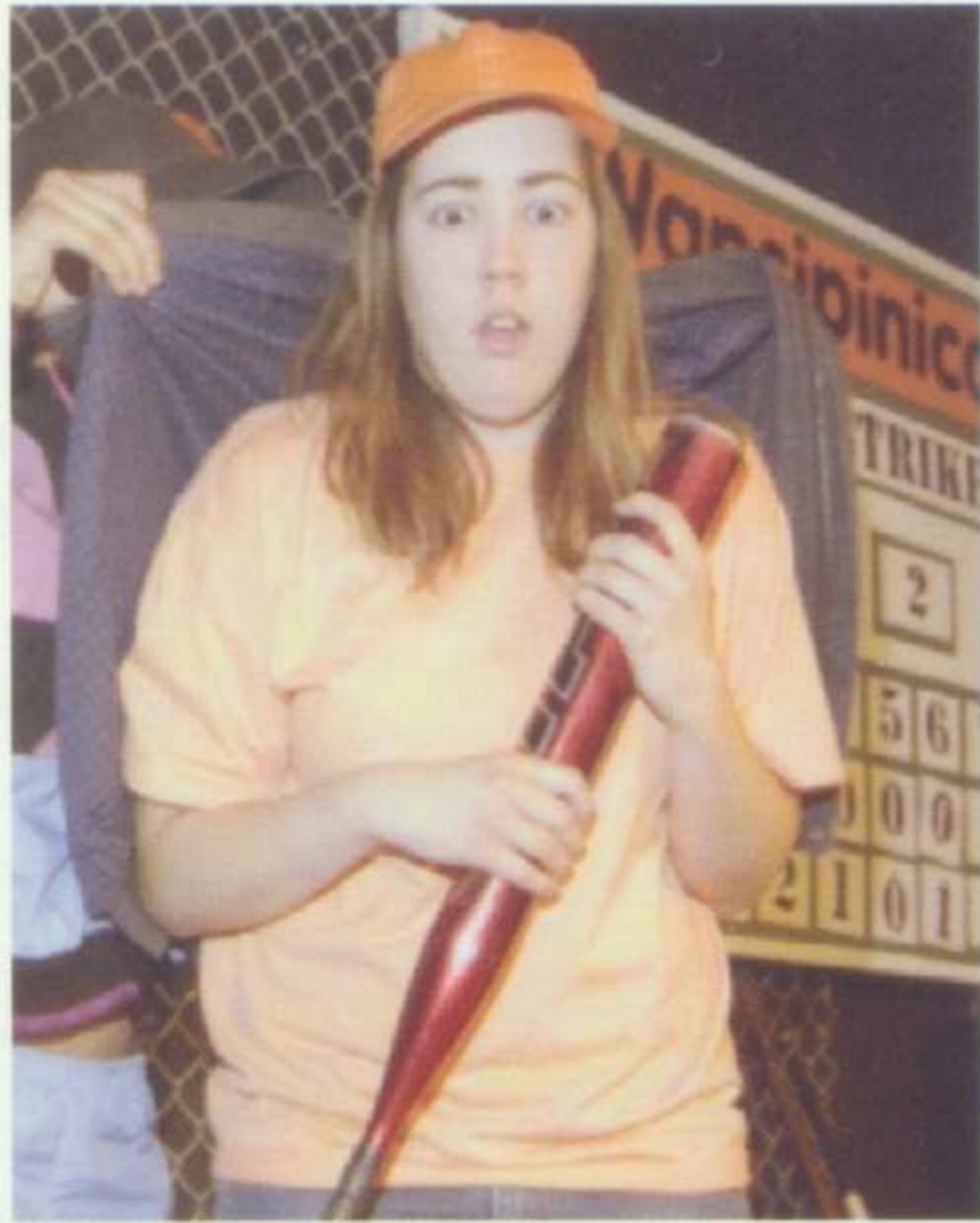

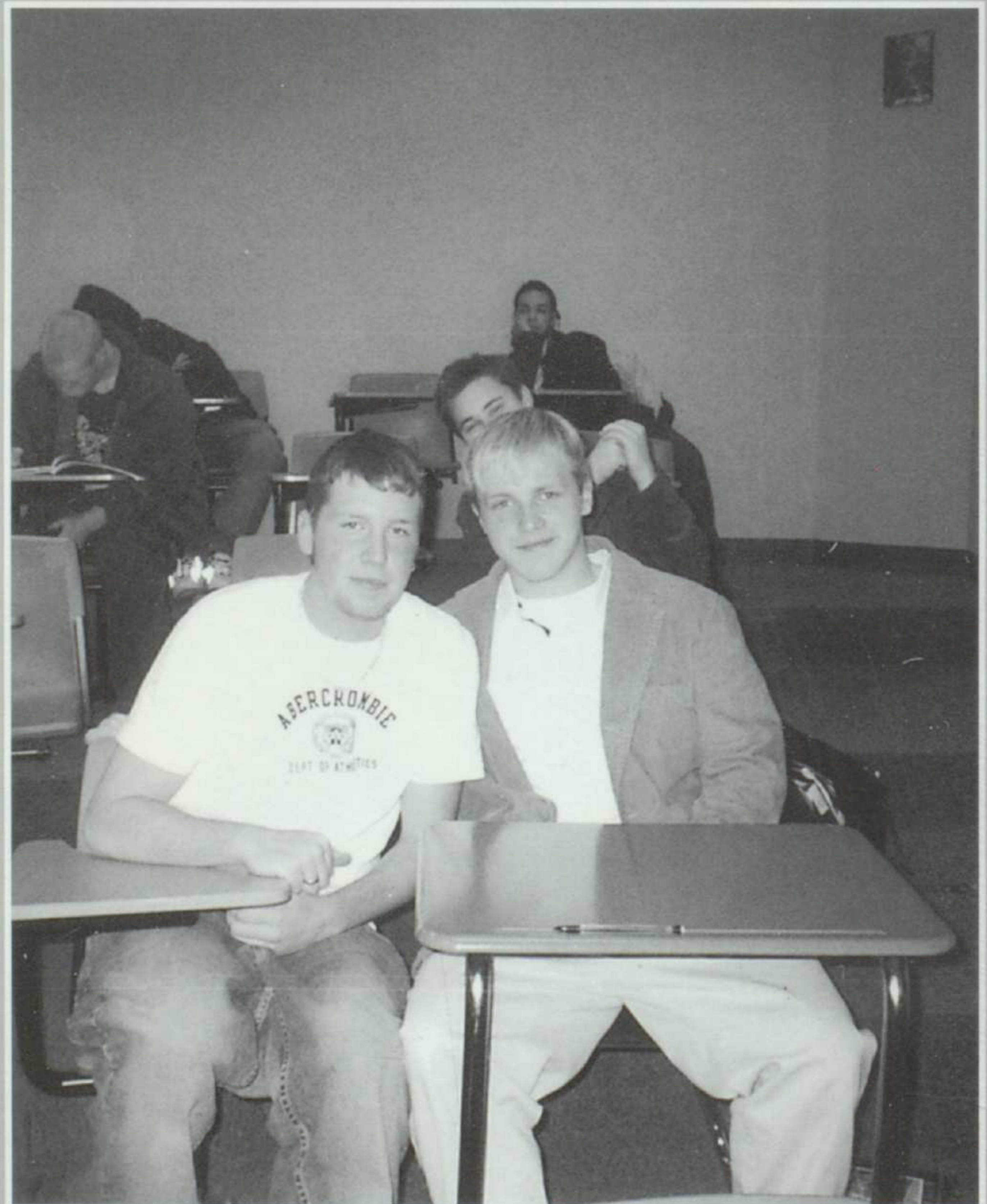

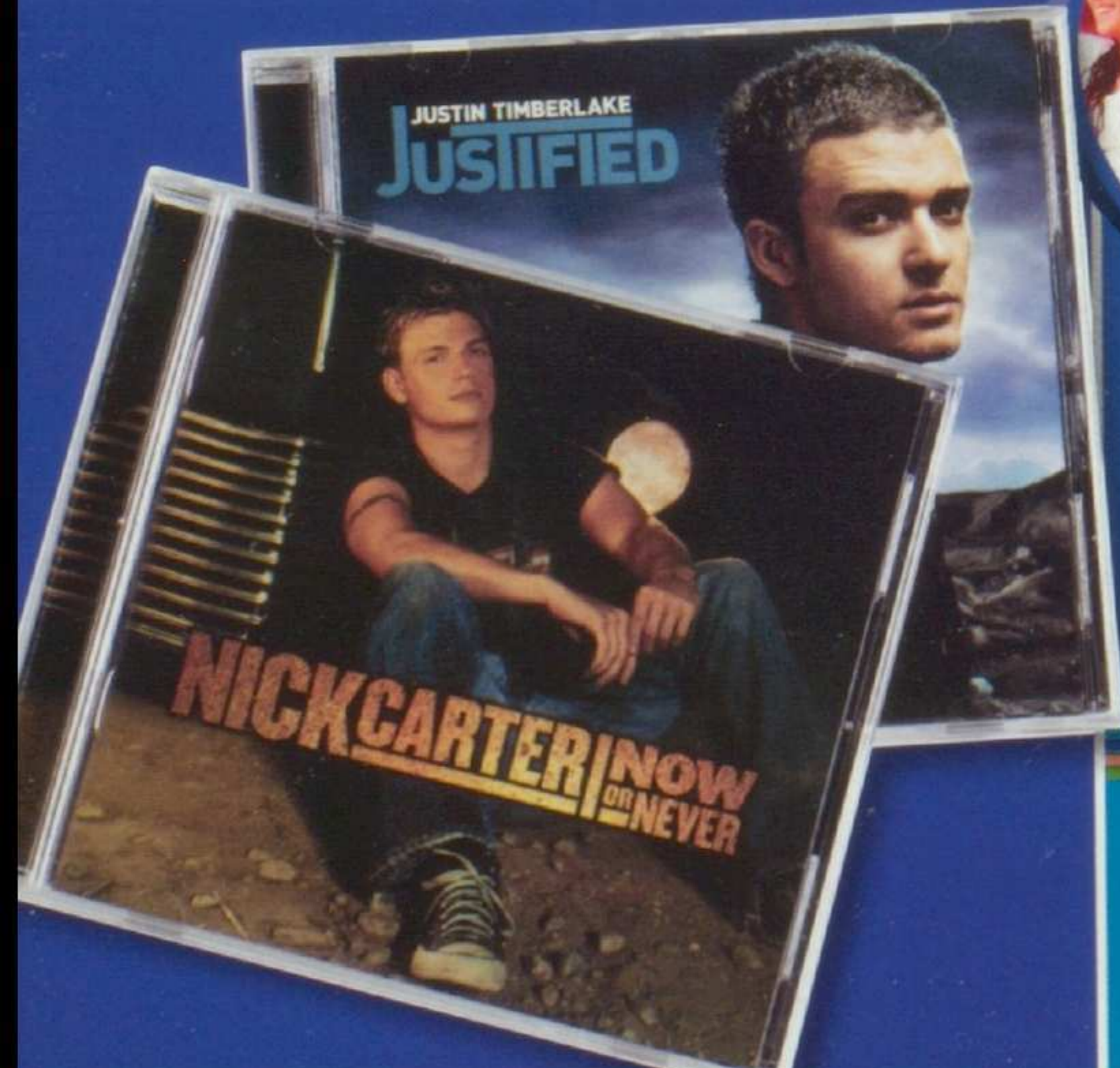

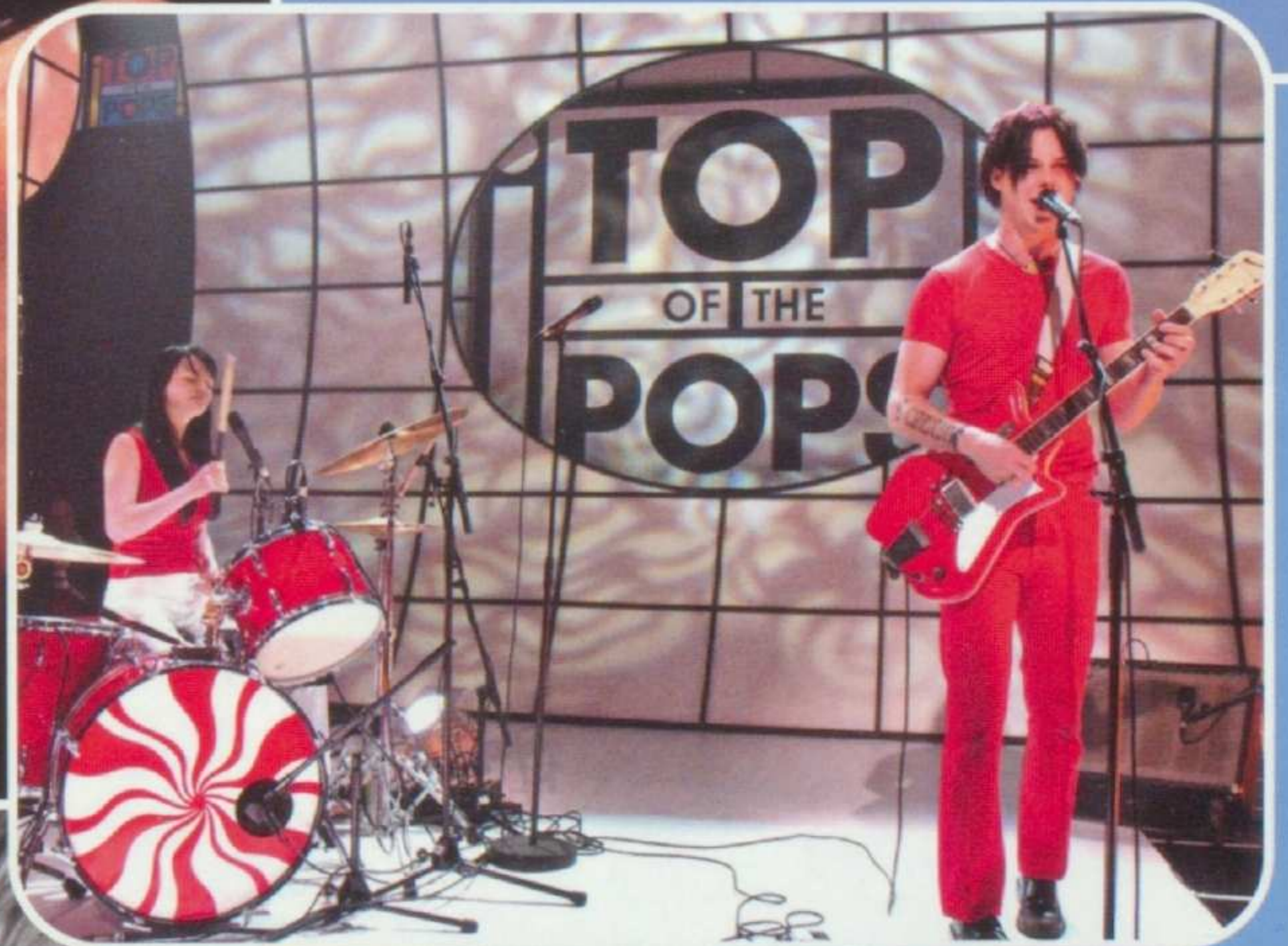
