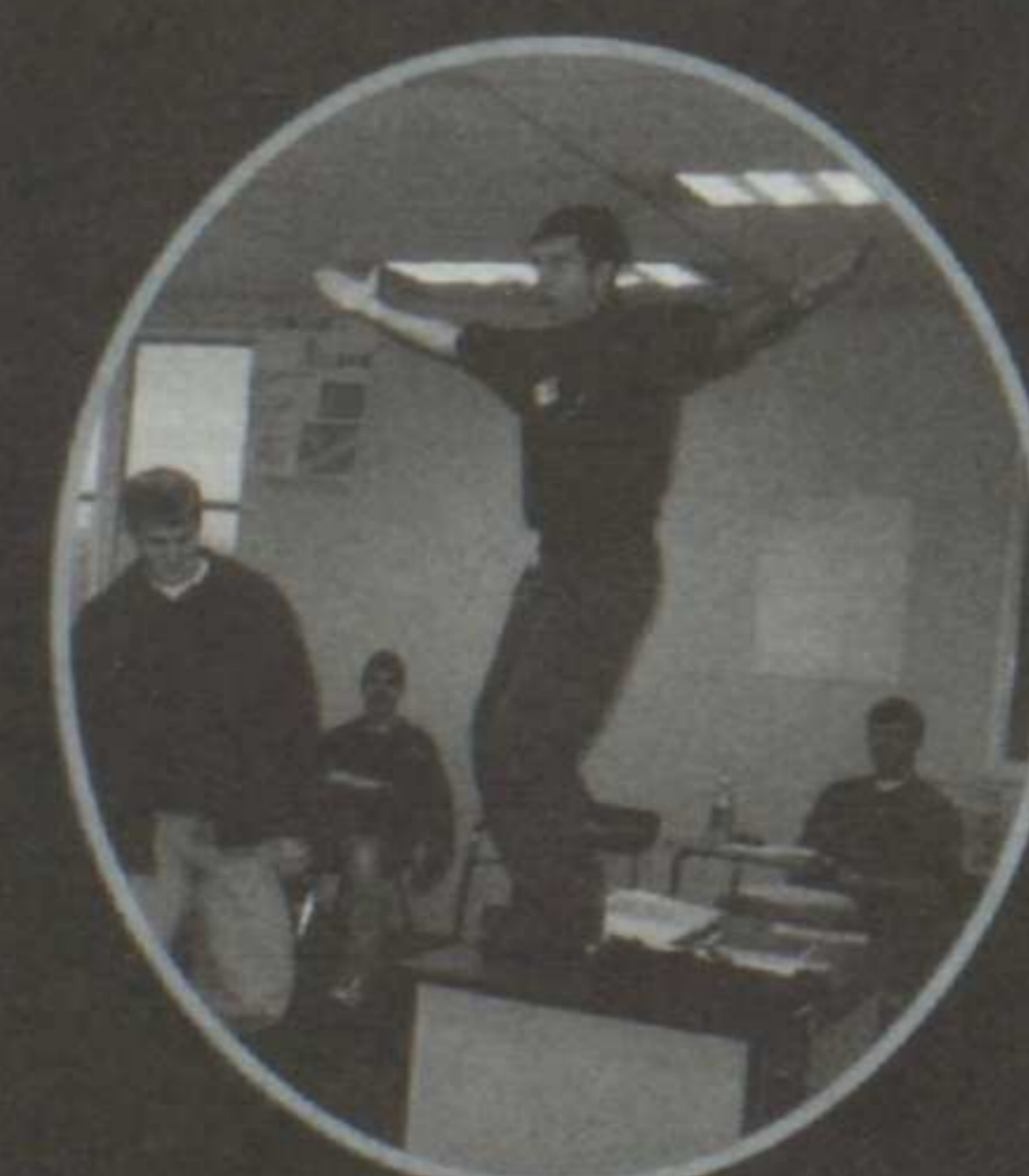

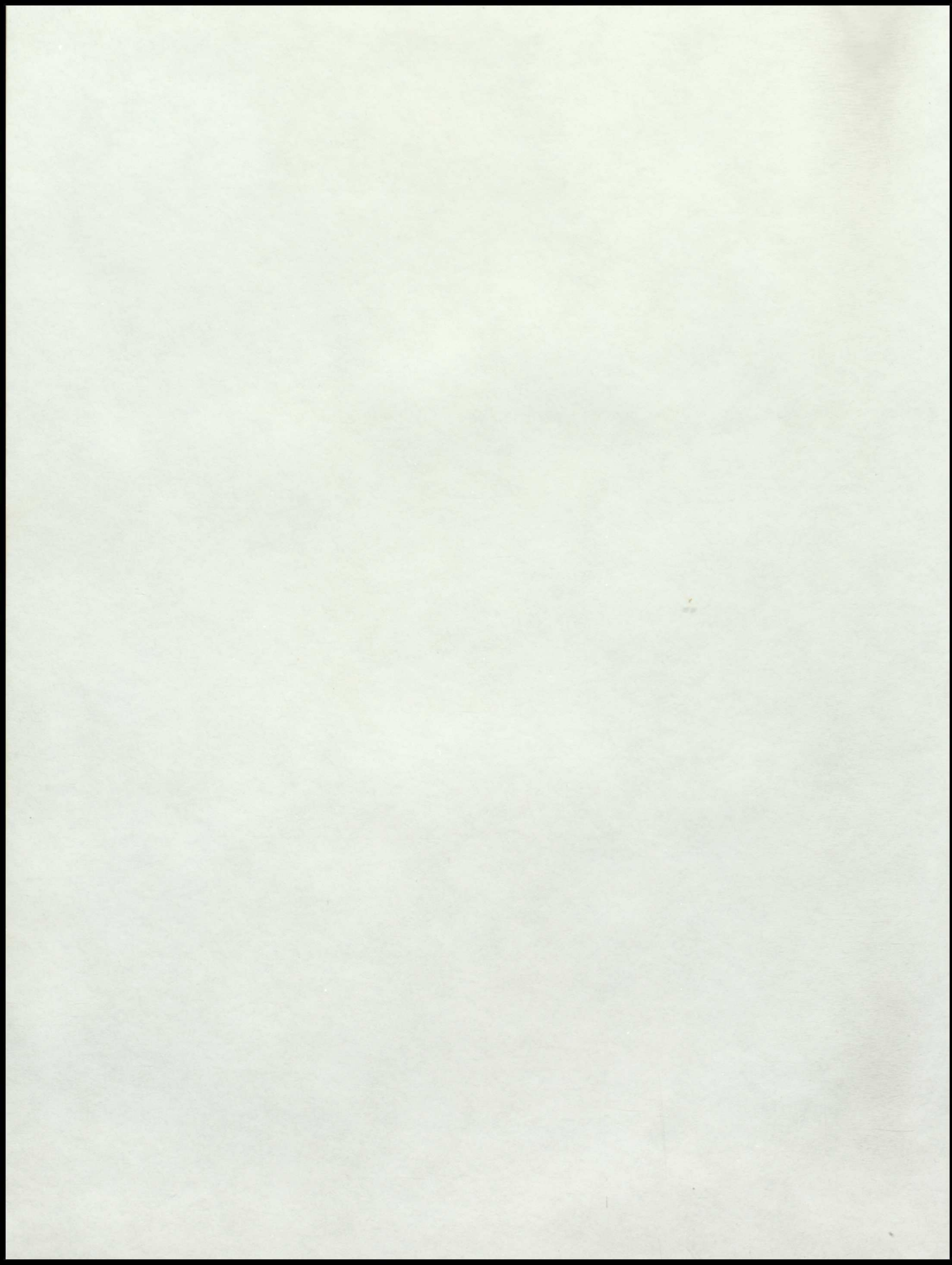

Held to a higher standard, these students become the role models. "It is an honor to be the captain of the field hockey team, but it can be stressful knowing that the underclassmen are always looking up to you," said Kim Holzaepfel, the senior captain of the field hockey team.

Leaders of other groups such as student council take on responsibilities that would never be asked of other students. "Mrs. Seils does a great job of helping us out with all our different activities but for the most part, the cabinet and other members of student council run the show," explained

Colleen Riddle, the vice-president of student council.

The different groups work hard to make our school and community a better place for everyone. After the tragedy of September 11, a new sense of unity grew. The students of Kilbourne stepped forward to show their compassion, collecting over 13,000 pounds of food for the annual canned food drive. They put their selfish needs aside and reached out to the community through the Adopt-a-Kid project by providing a Christmas for twenty-two families consisting of 62 children who otherwise would not have been so fortunate. This year the King and Queen of hearts raised over \$7,000 for Make-a-Wish to send Nick, a three-year-old boy, to Disney World. These are just a few examples of the compassion that students of Kilbourne exhibit on an everyday basis.

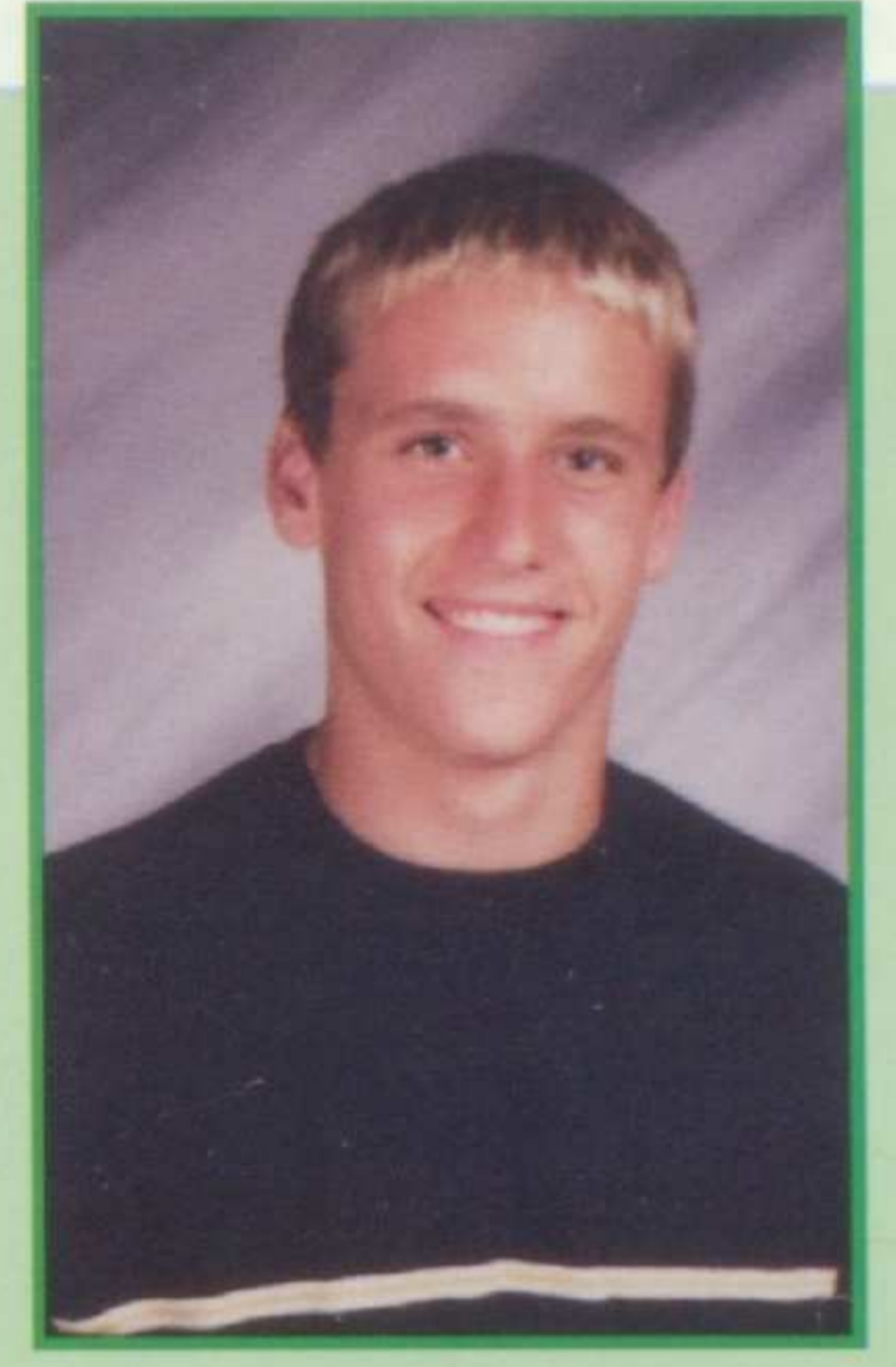

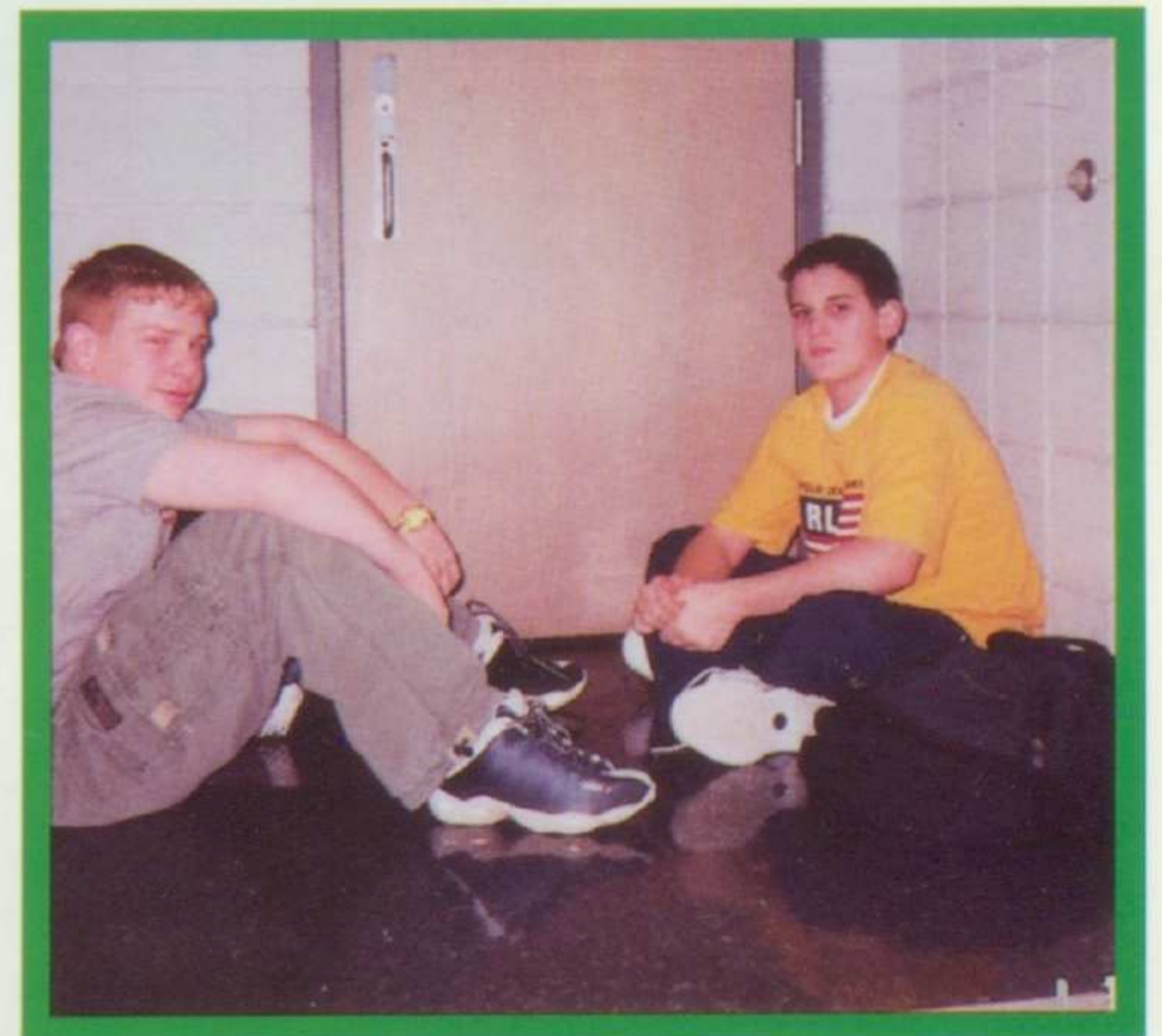

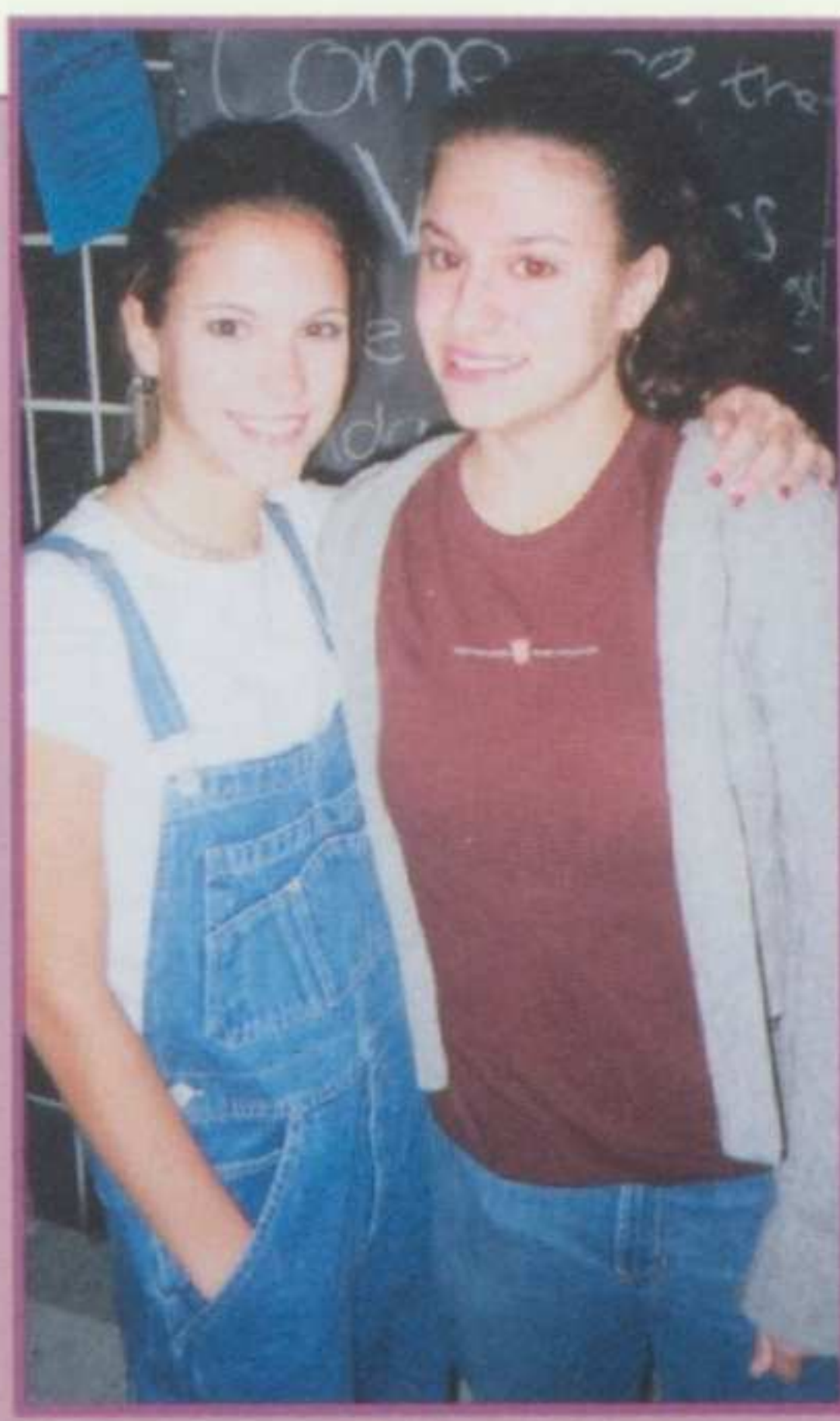

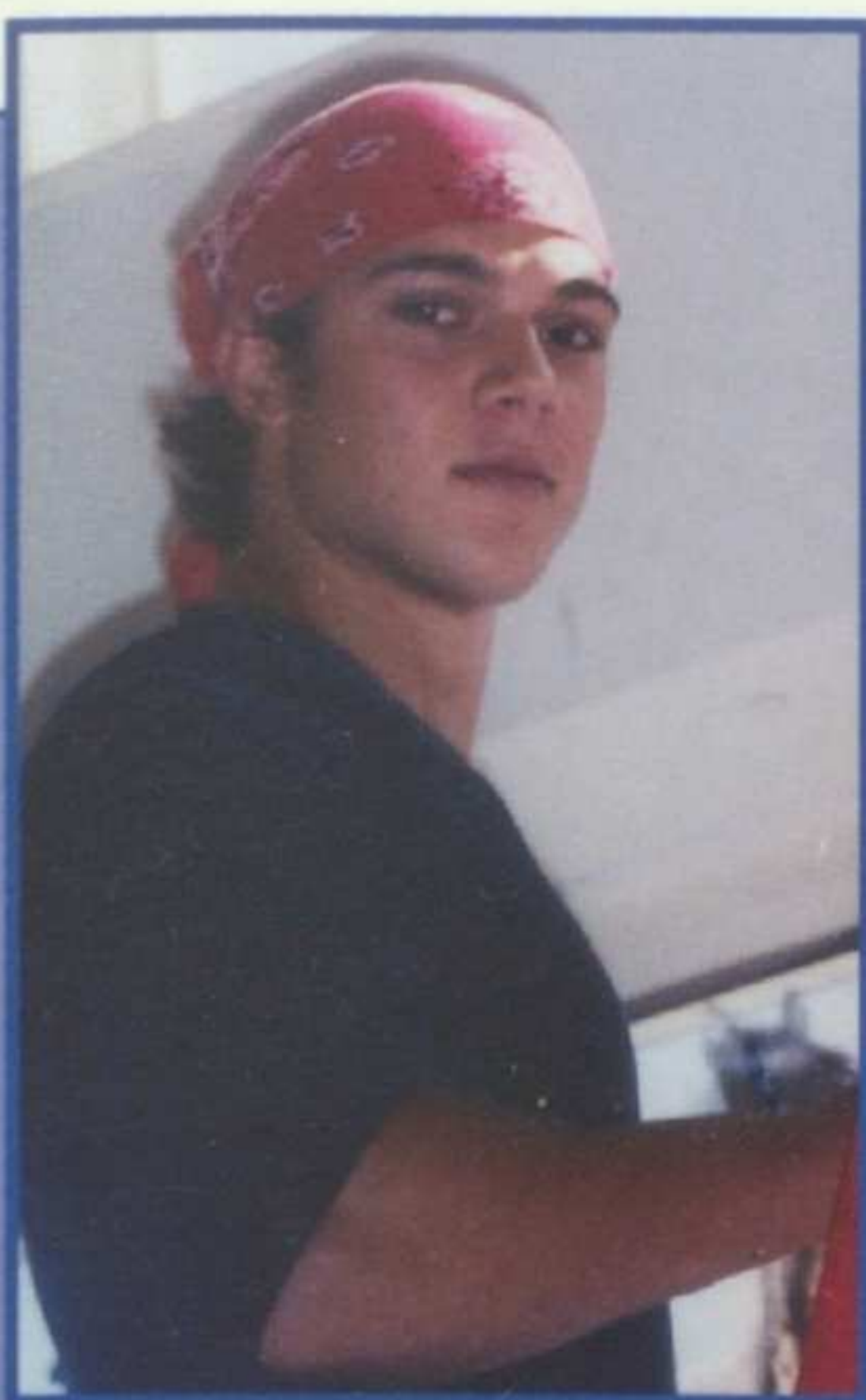

The dangers of terrorism strike Kilbourne

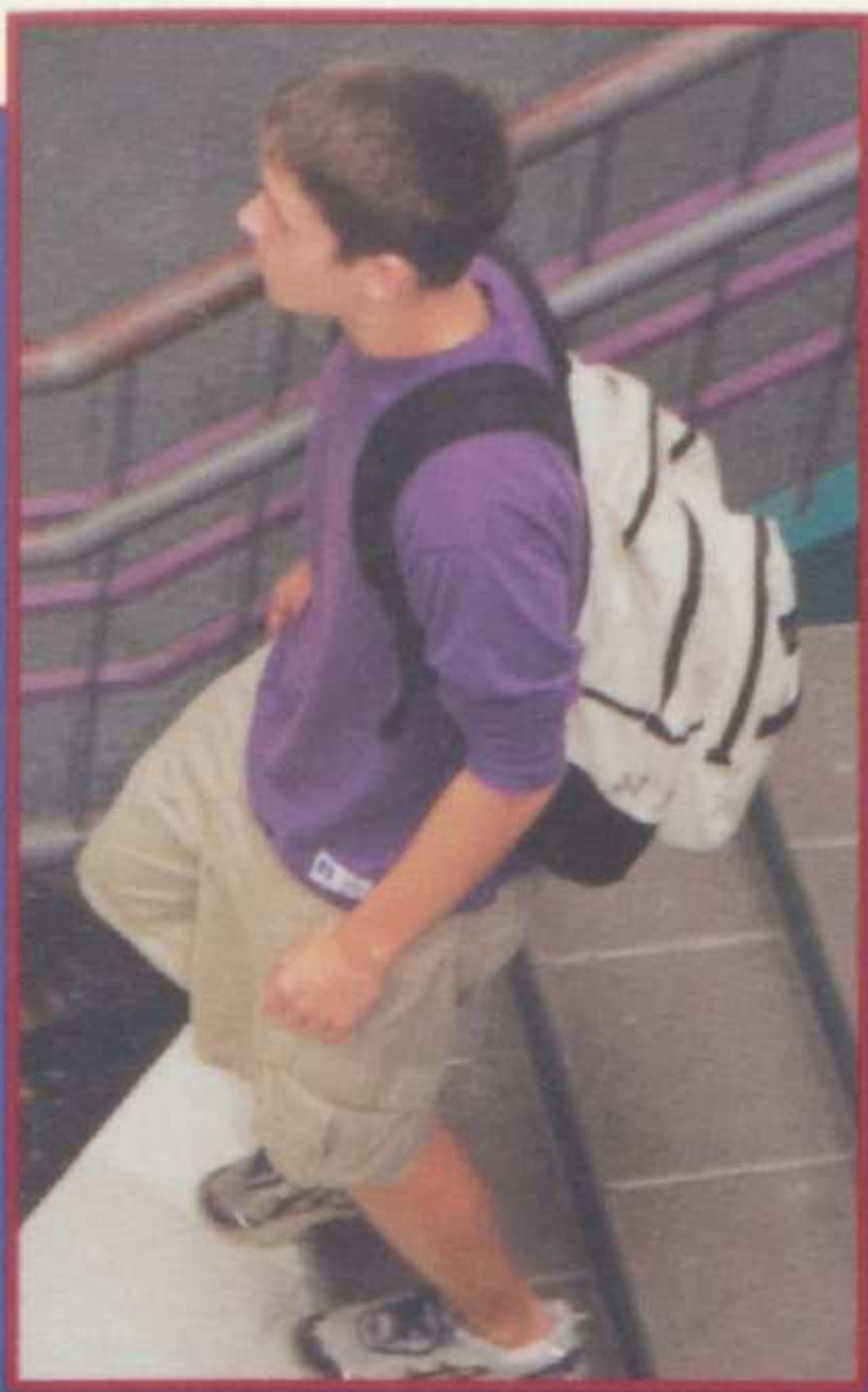

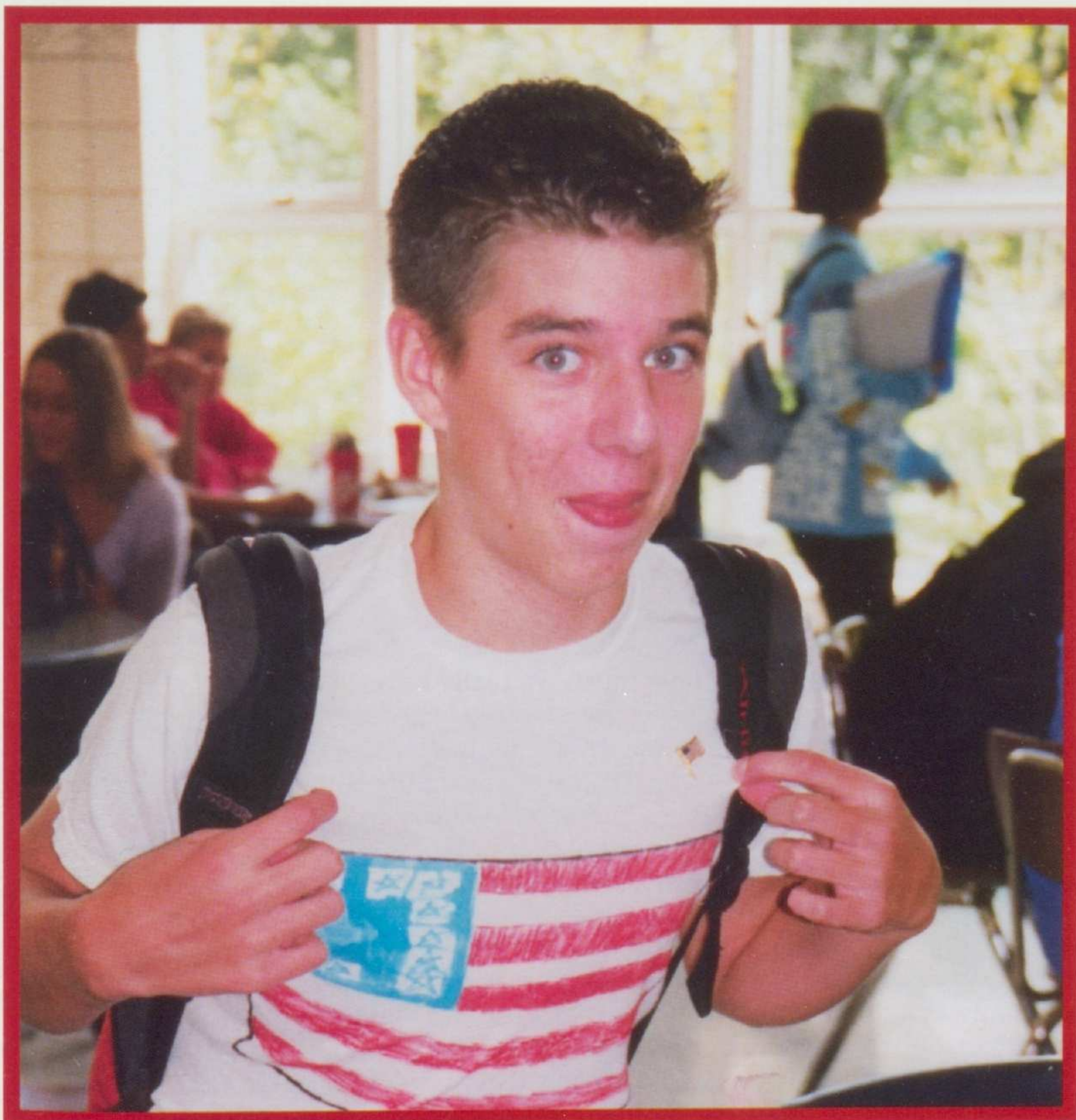

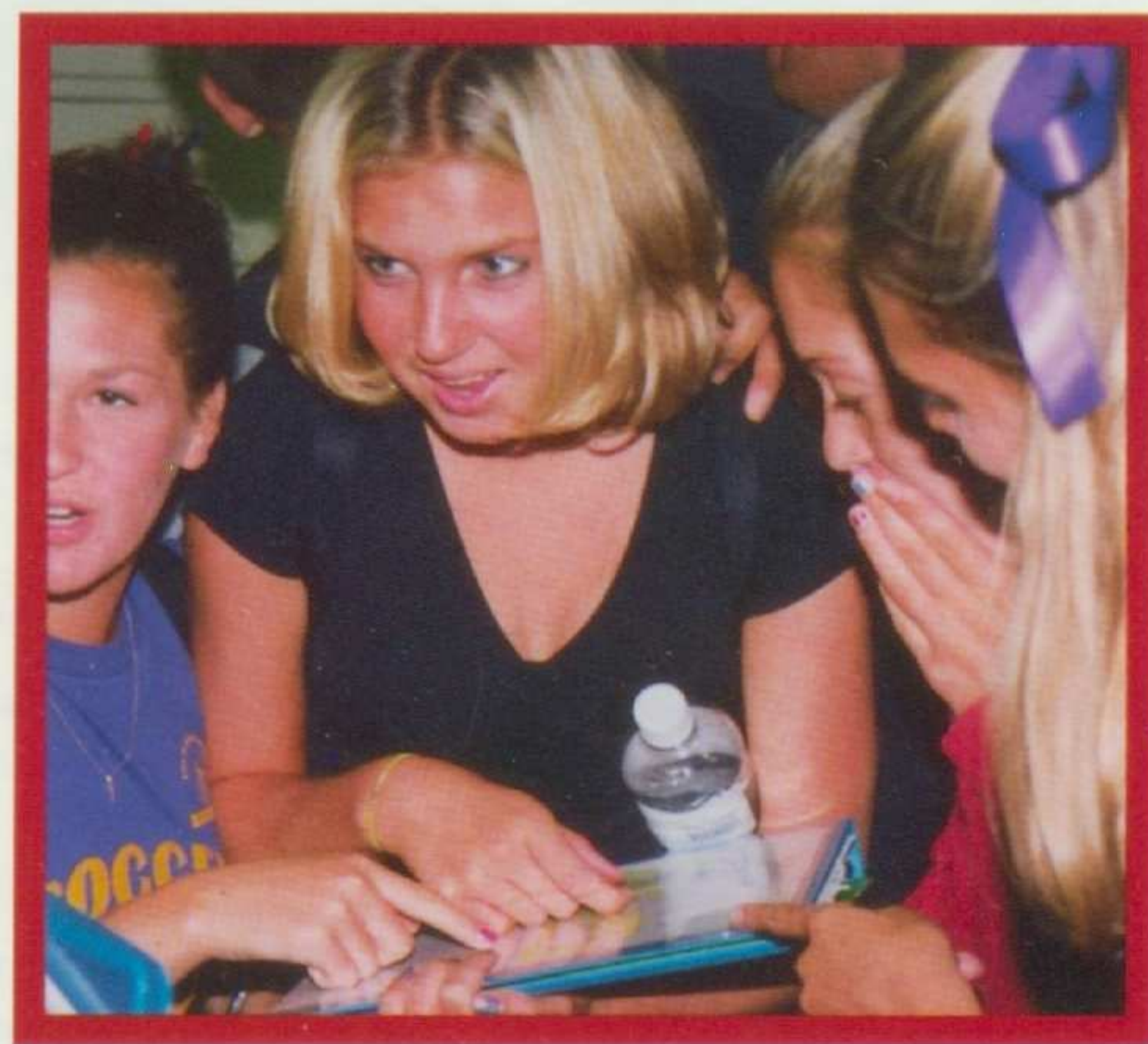

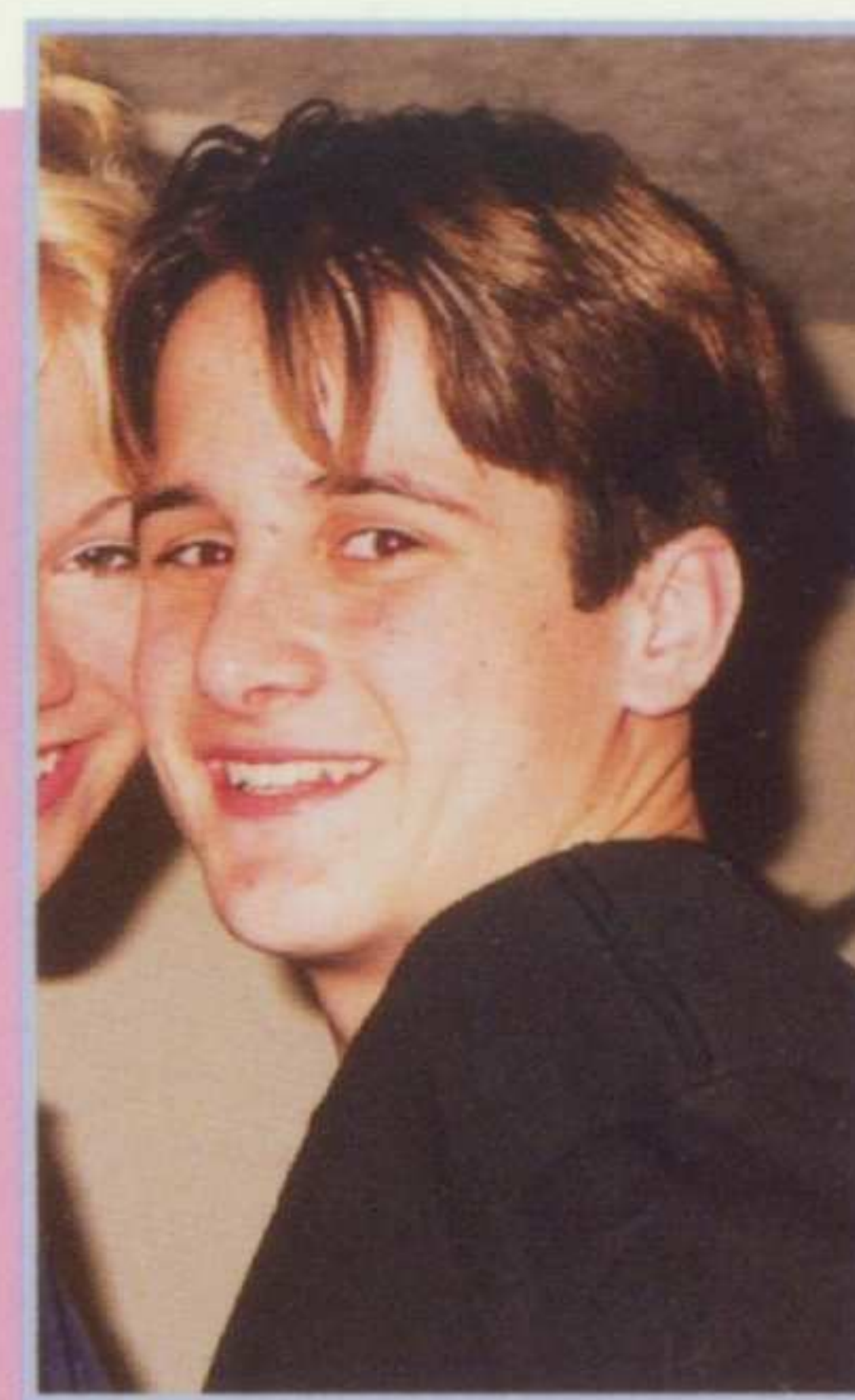

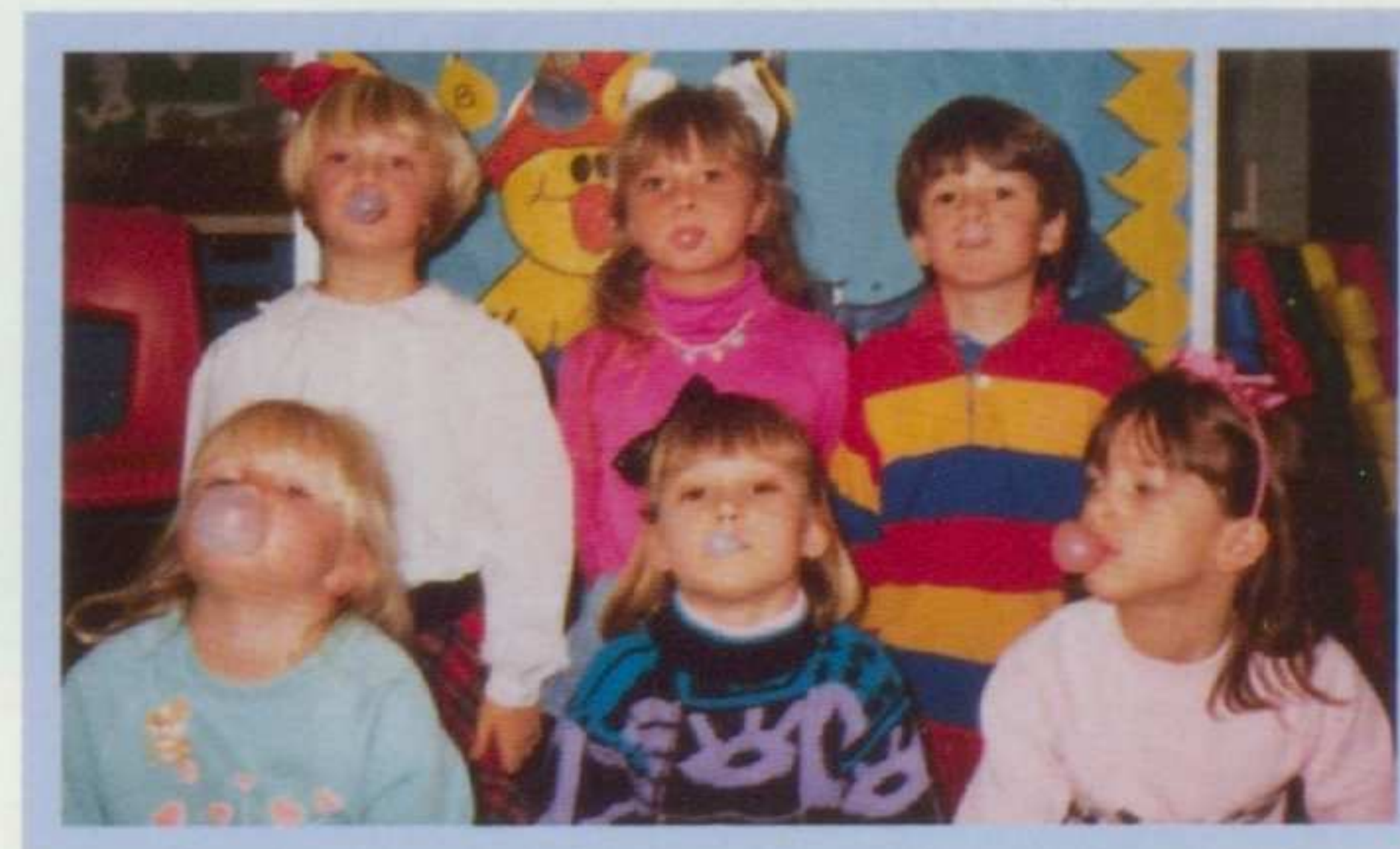

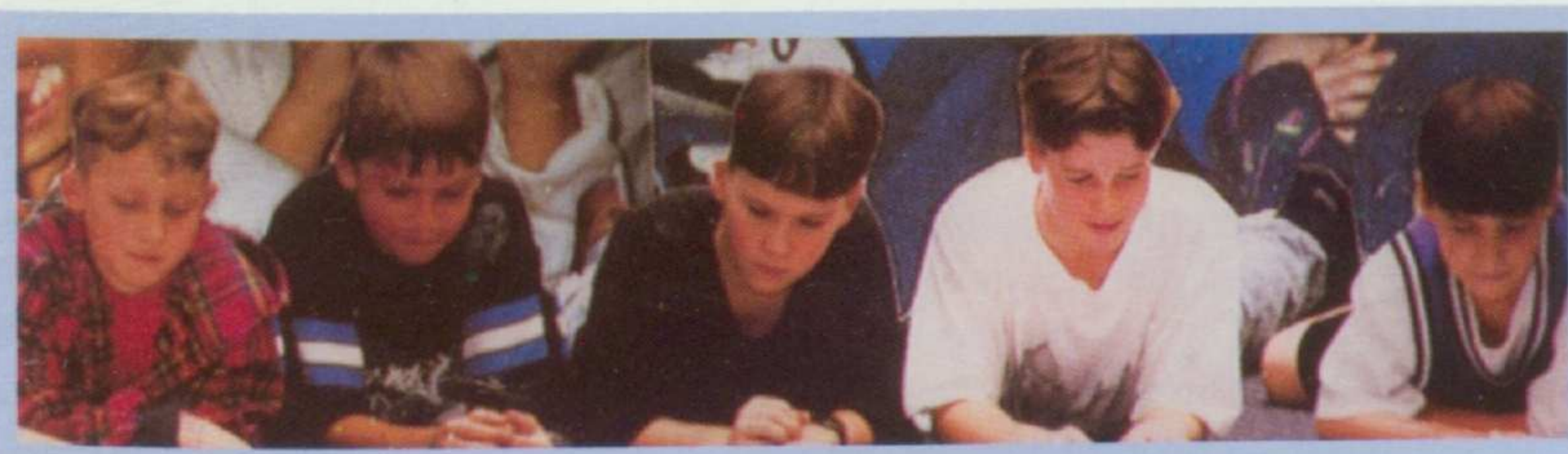

Since 1973 students who want to explore life from a different angle have had a chance to go to a less traditional campus. At Linworth, students have the advantage of learning in smaller classroom environments and establishing one-on-one relationships with the smaller student body and faculty. Linworth stresses the importance of hands-on student involvement and decision making. In fact, the student body meets on a weekly basis to submit ideas on how the school can better serve them. These student-led meetings give them a chance to develop their leadership skills.

Linworth has the same student issues as Kilbourne and Thomas. However, what makes Linworth unique, is the way in which they handle these situations. At Linworth, the Fairness Committee, composed of one staff member and five students, addresses students' conflicts and reaches decisions by group consensus. Linworth Alternative High School is truly a place that functions by majority rule.

According to teacher-leader Wayne Harvey, Linworth kids have the responsibility of focusing on their future. Instead of simply "shadowing" a professional for a few days or a week, Linworth seniors spend their second semester doing an extensive senior project that allows them to function completely in the real world; sometimes, it requires overseas travel.

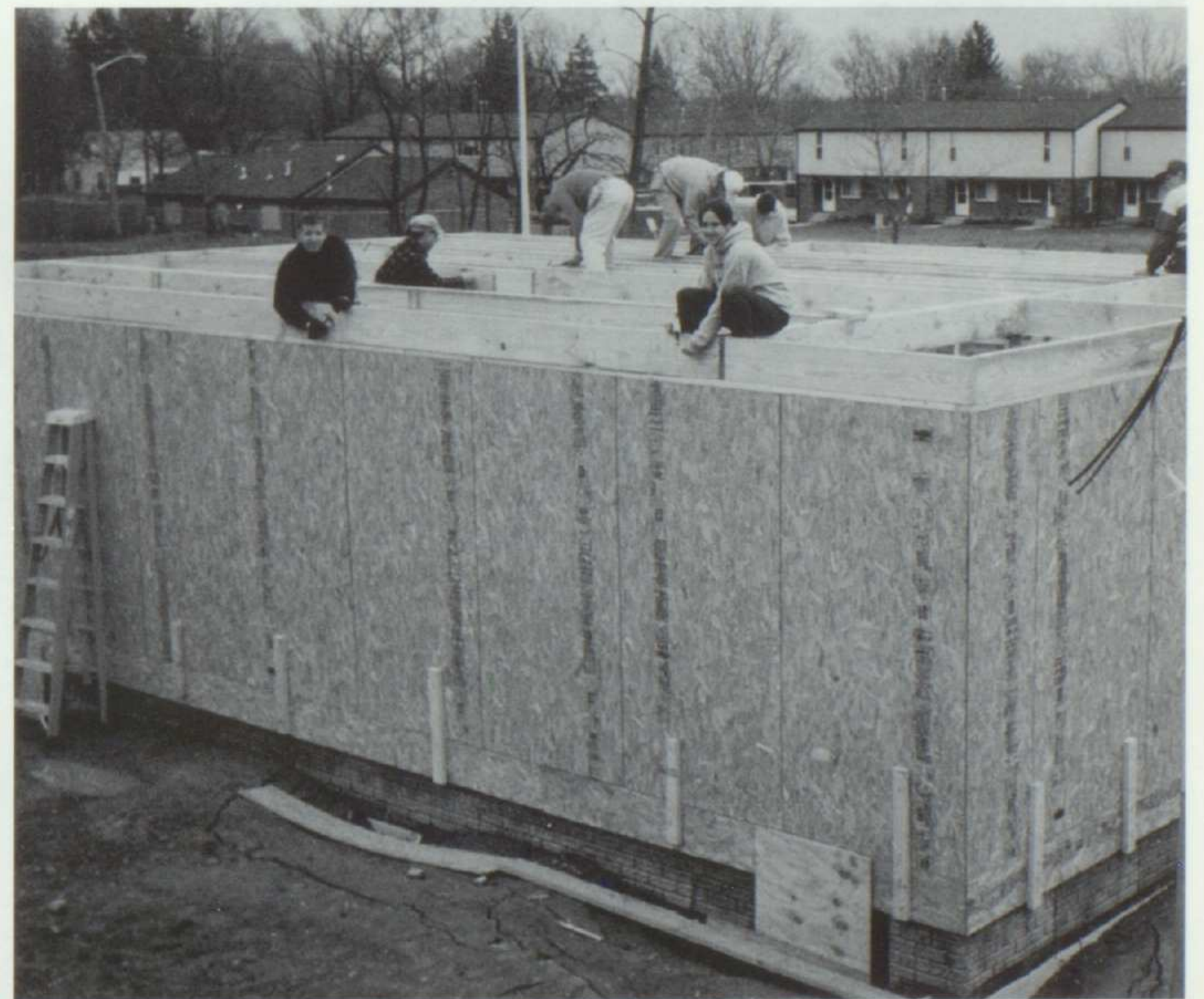

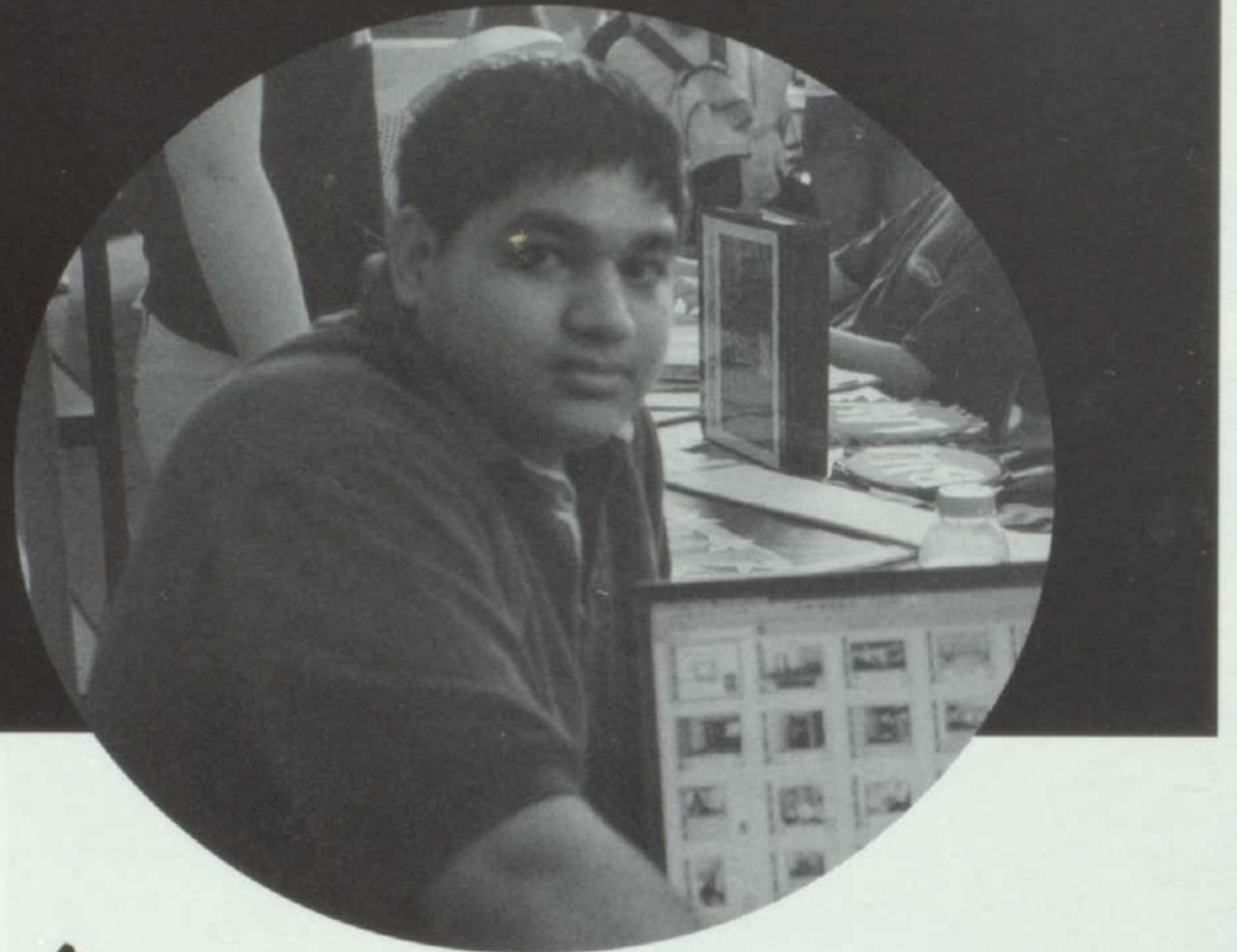

***sports:** a particular athletic activity engaged in for pleasure.*

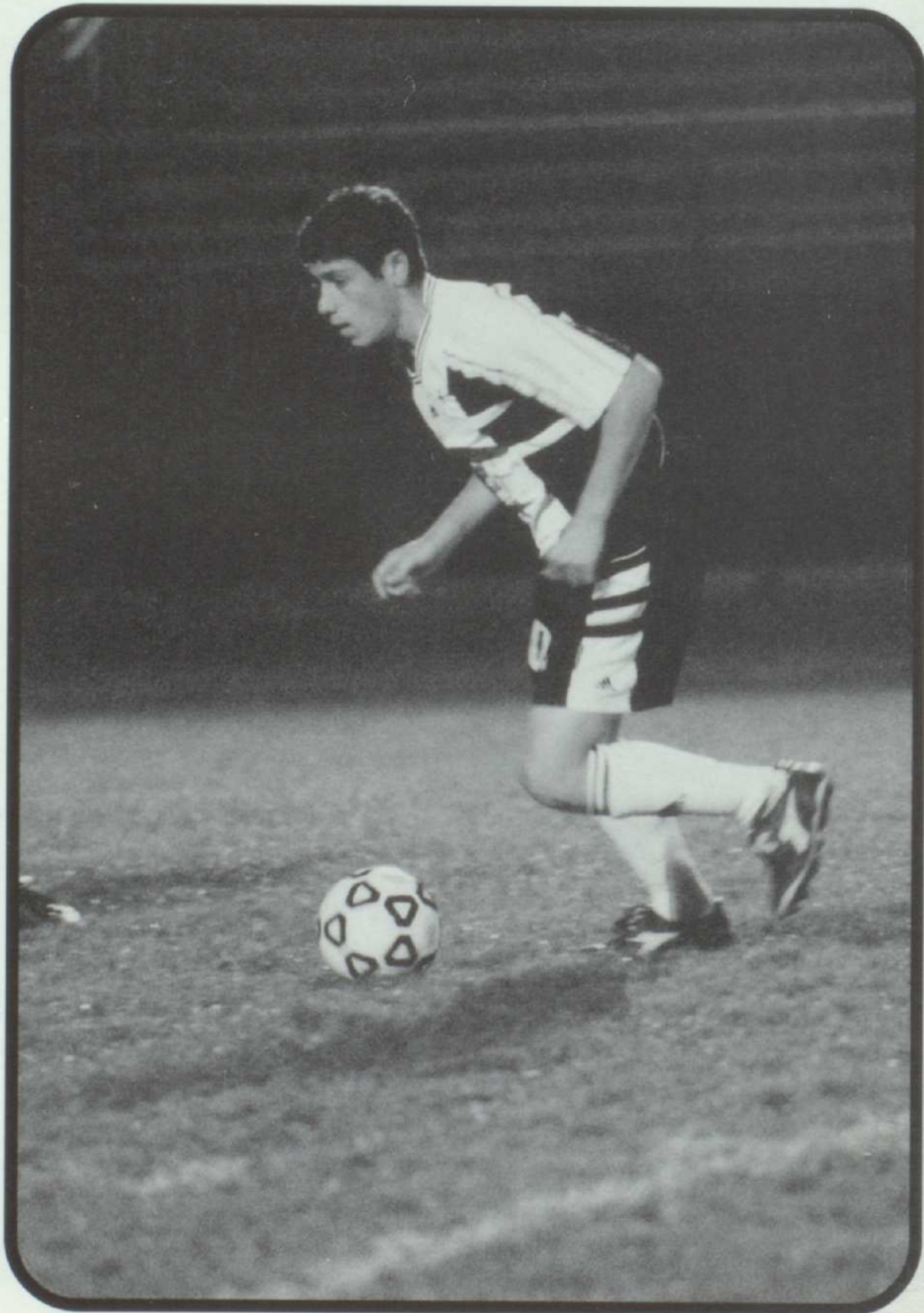

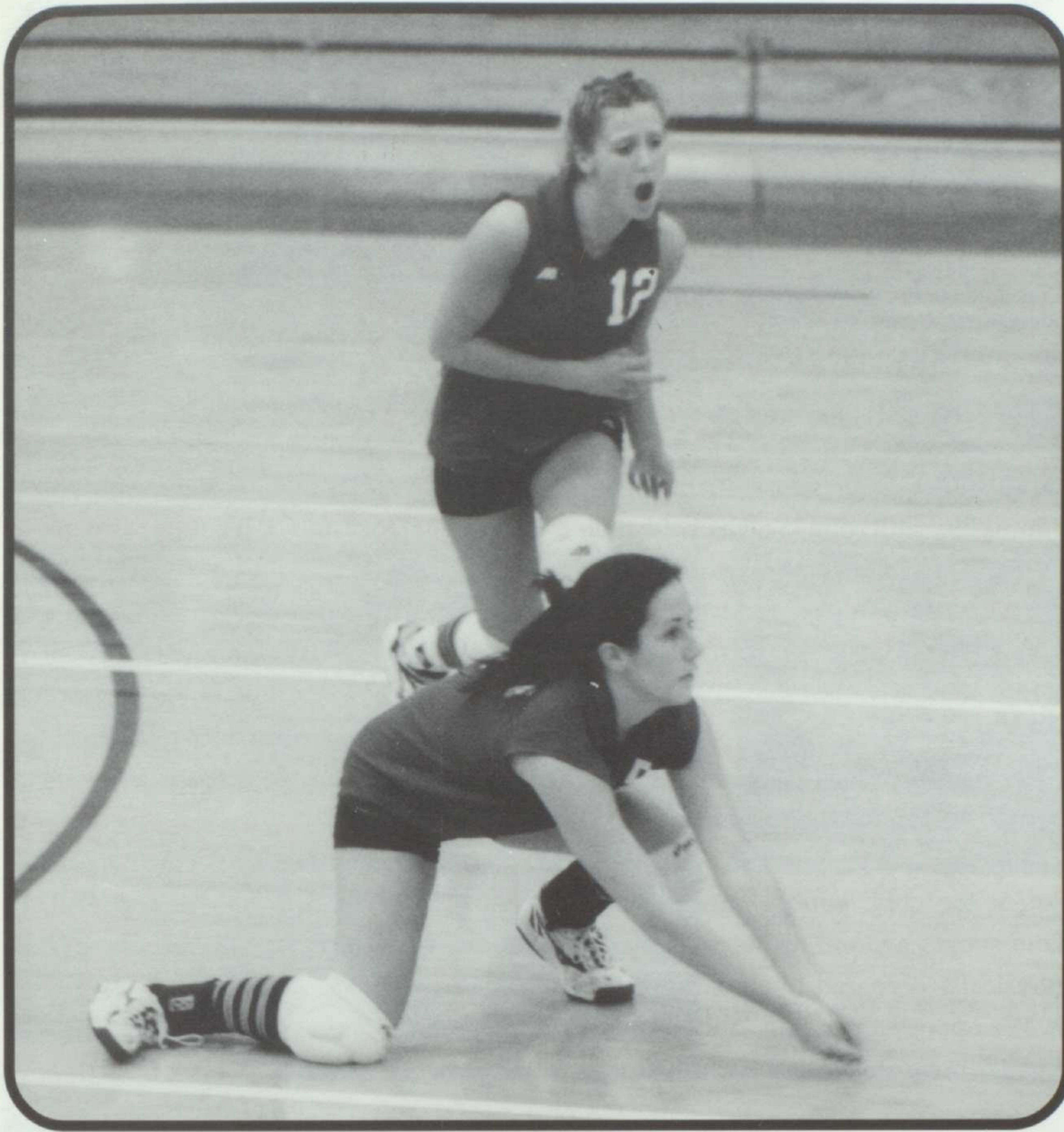

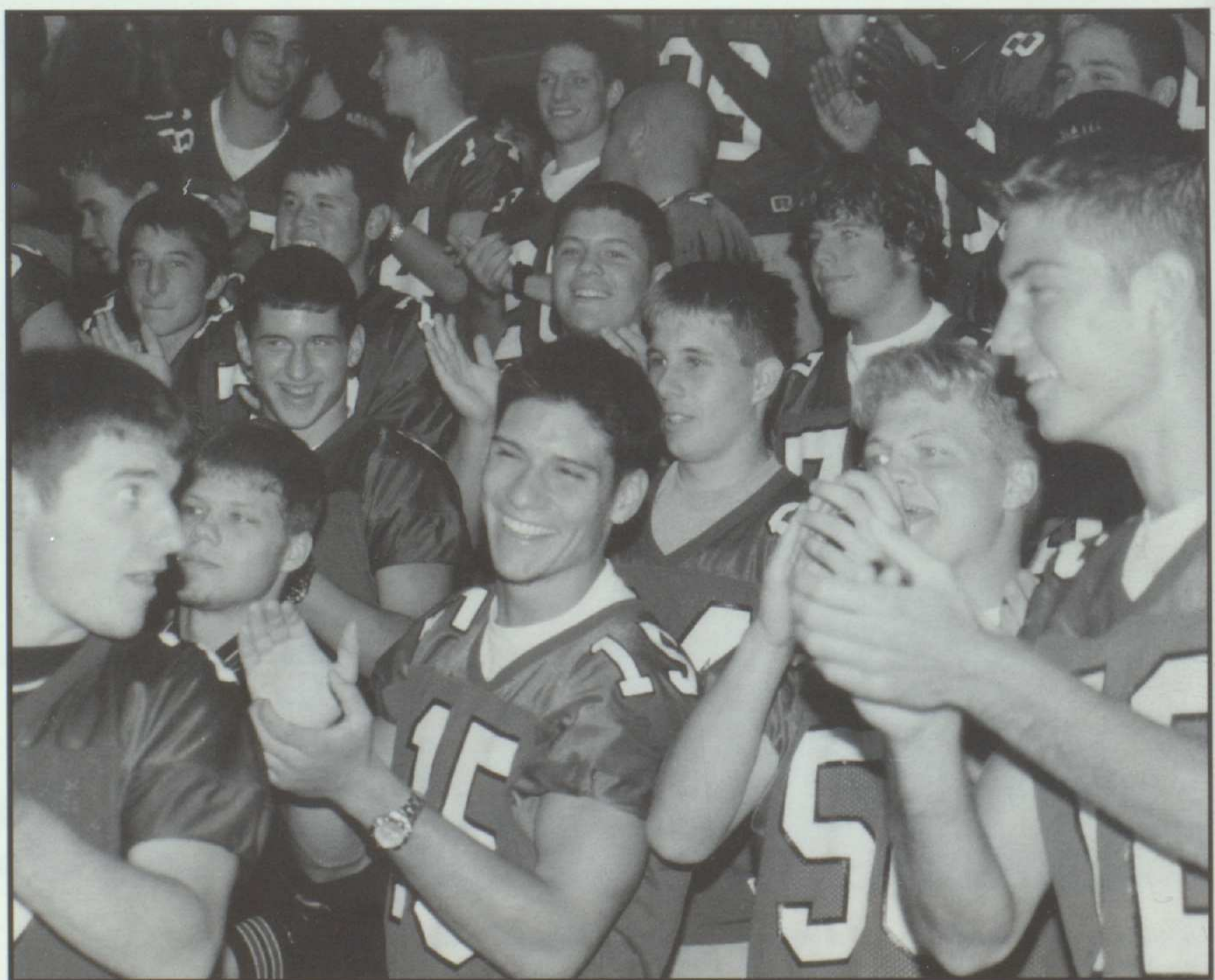
by four points in the end.

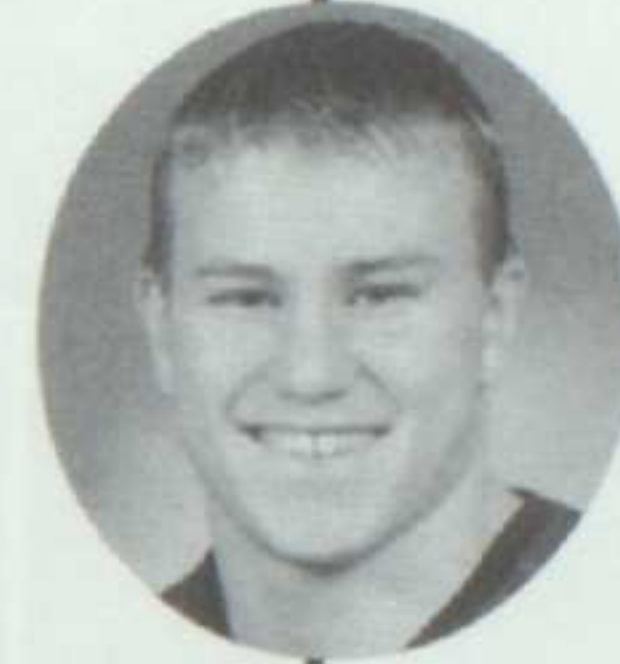

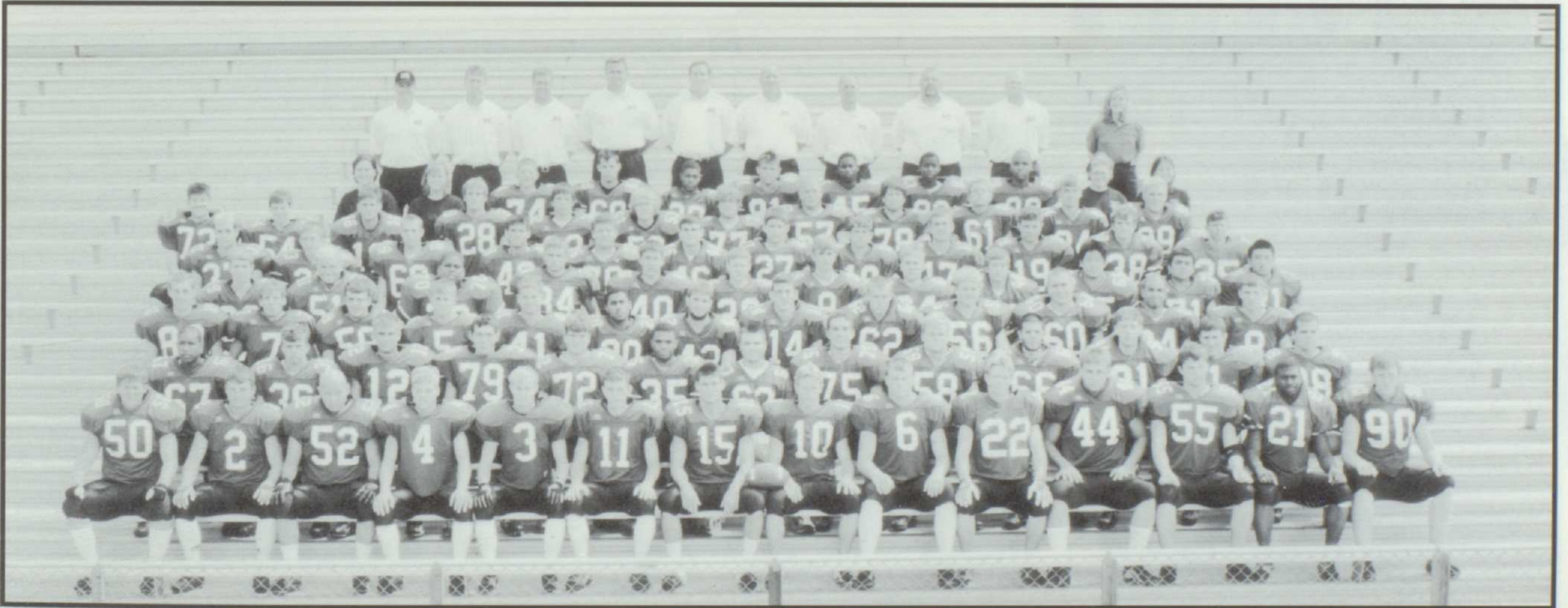

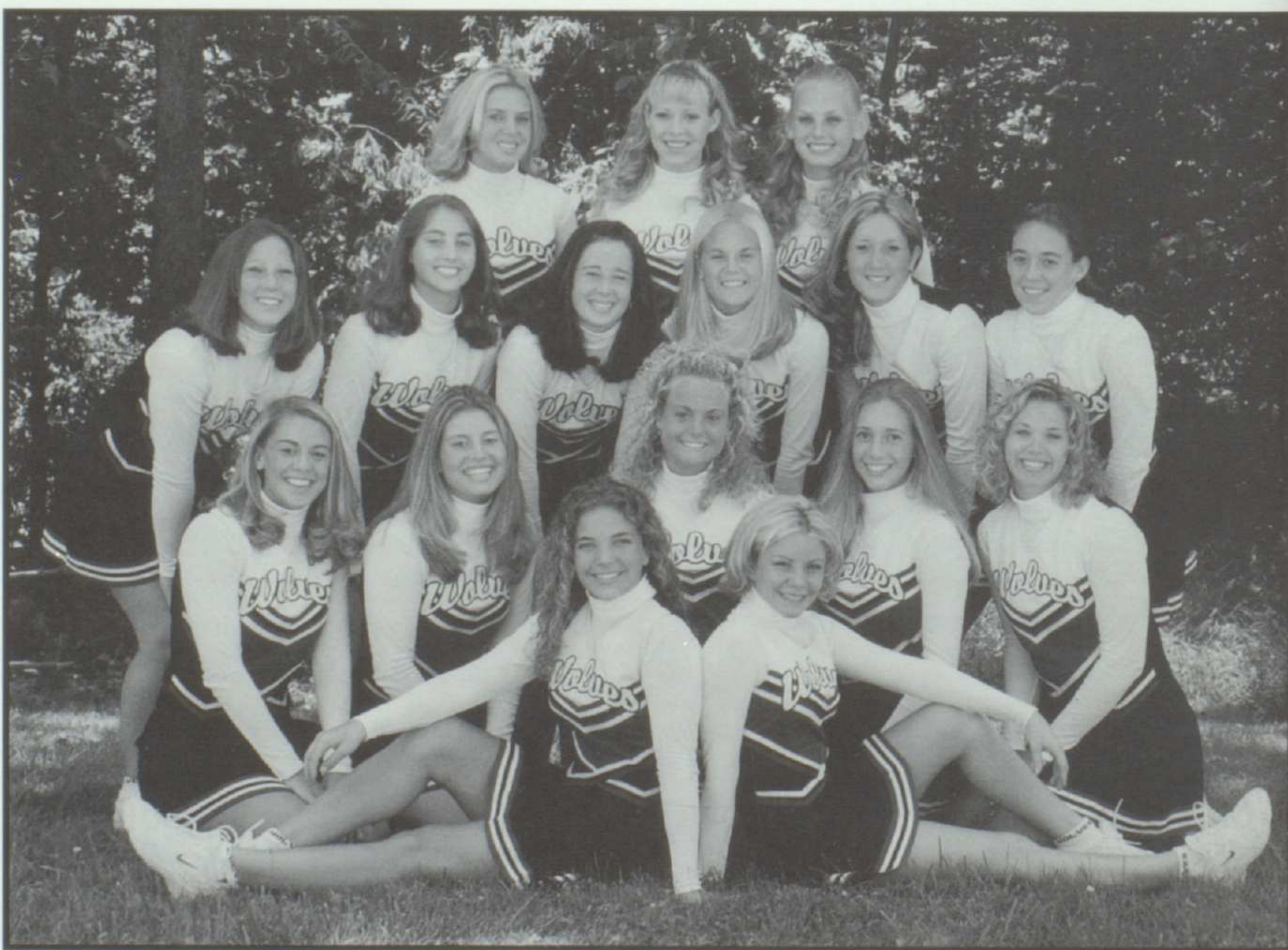
Twenty girls have joined their talents to compete on the competition squad. Start-

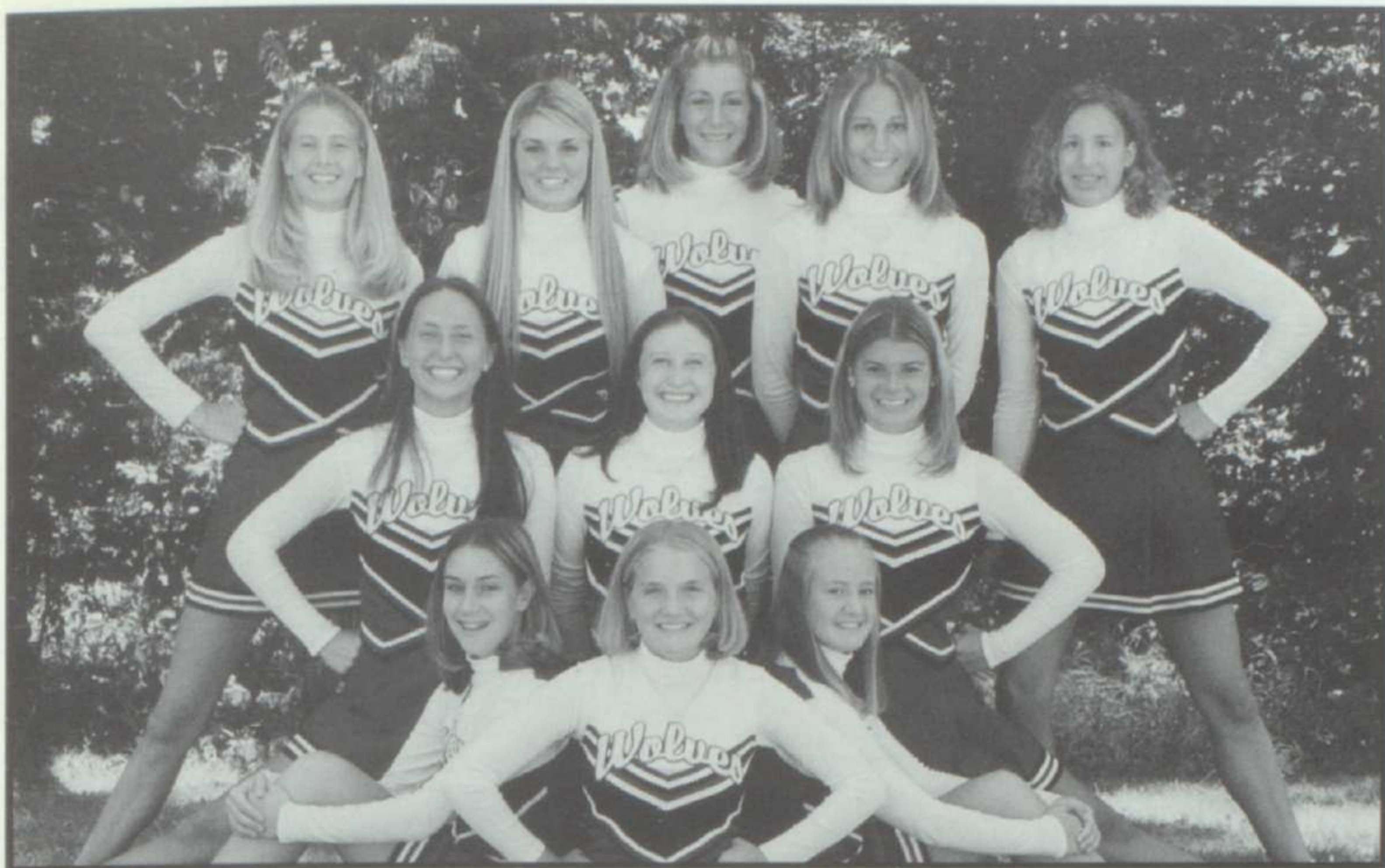

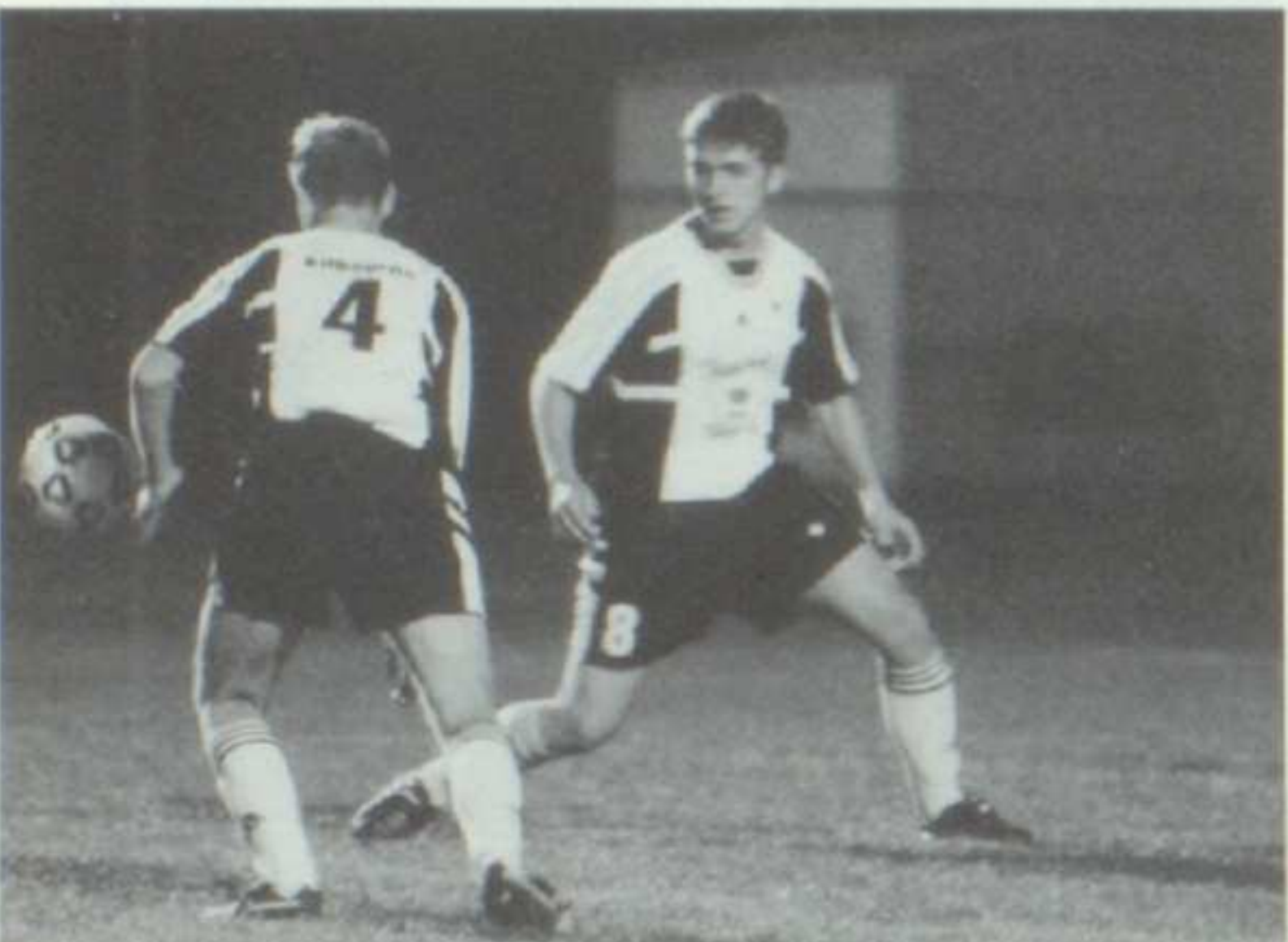

out of fourteen teams. In late October, they placed fourth in the OCC-Central meet amongst some of the top teams in the state.

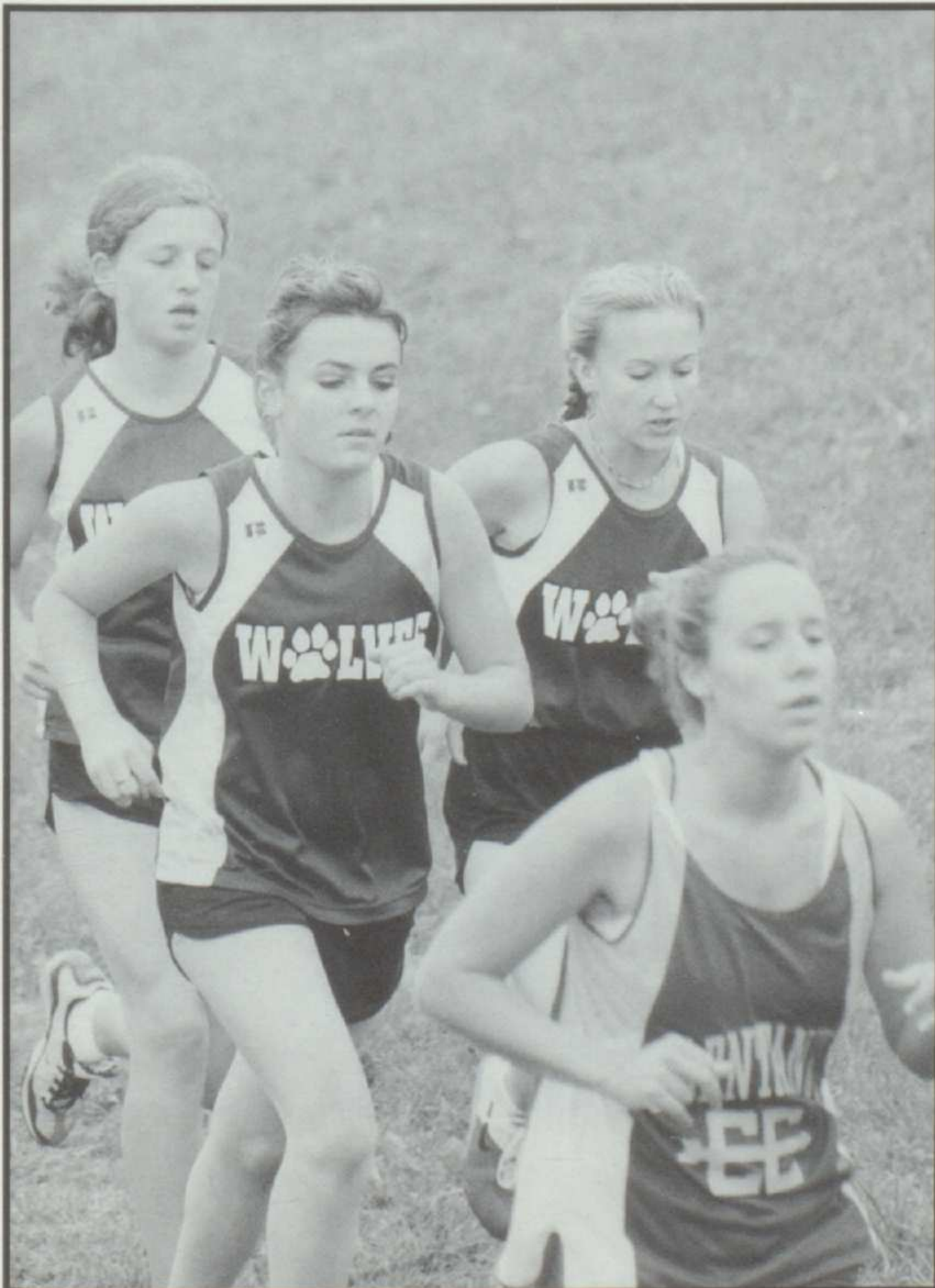

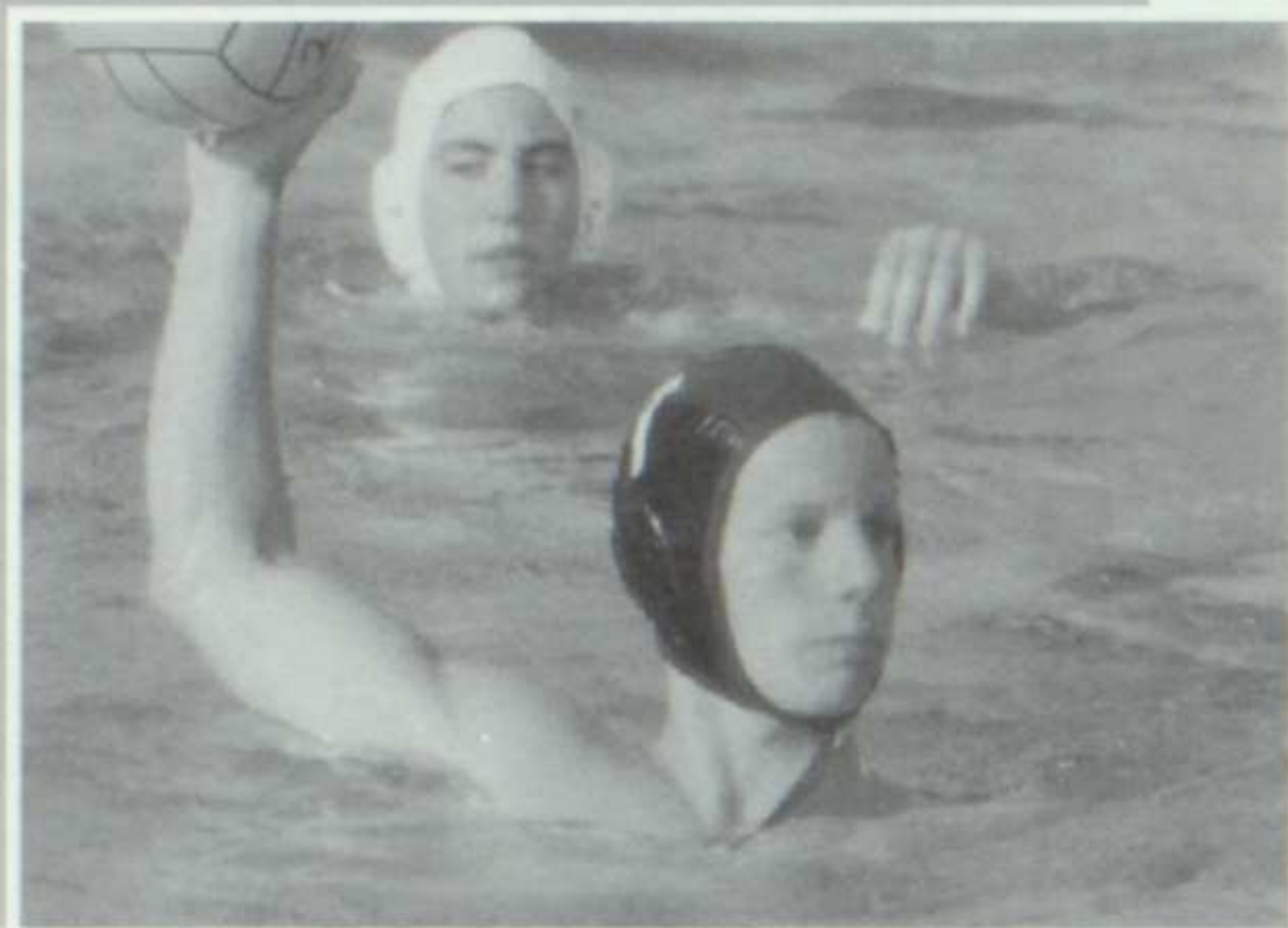

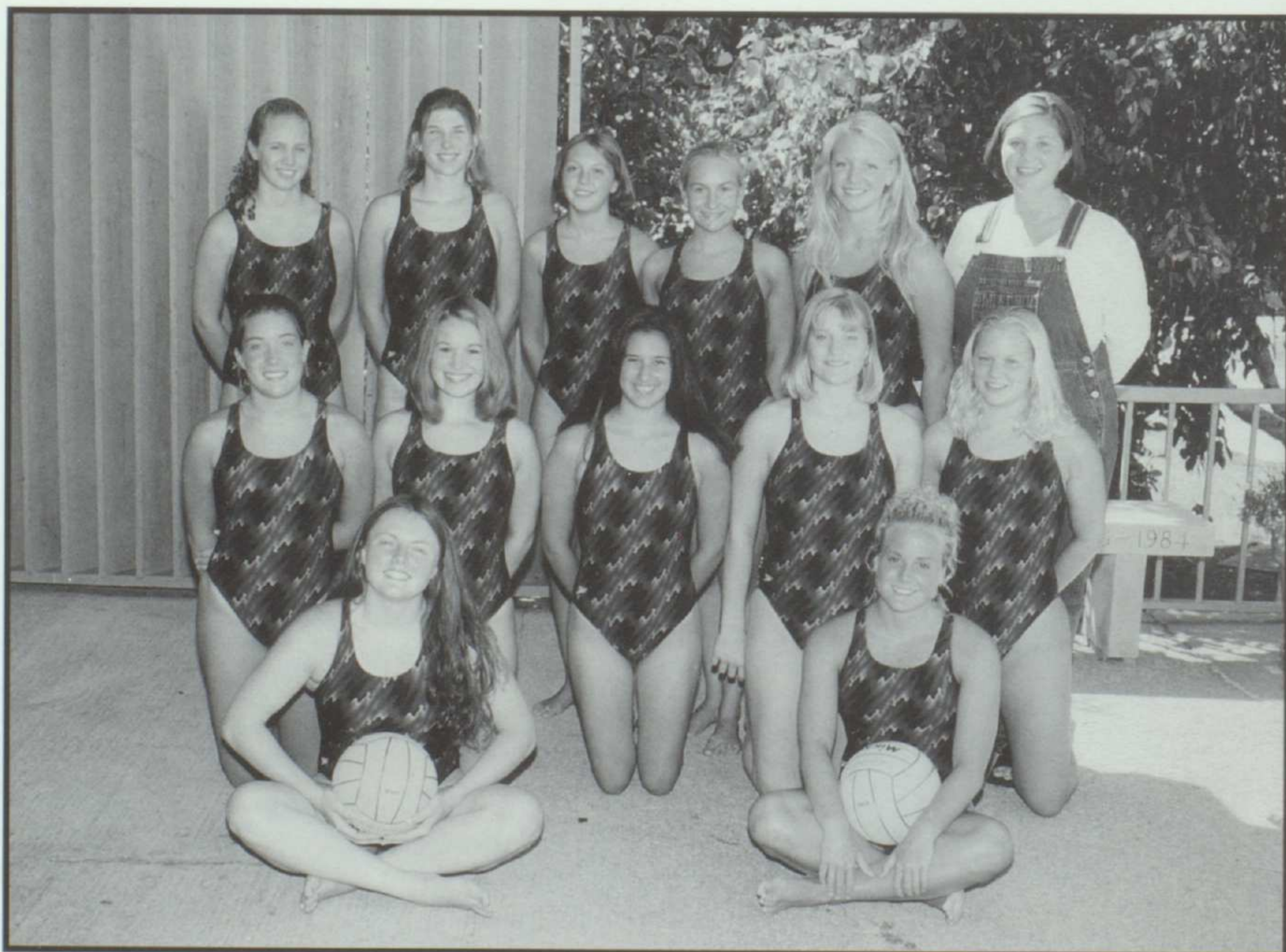
The water polo team had only two returning seniors, captains Katie Kelso and Allison Riddle.

The girls proved that team unity and hard work can lead to the feeling of success. If the underclassmen reach their potential, they will have no problem winning in the seasons to come.

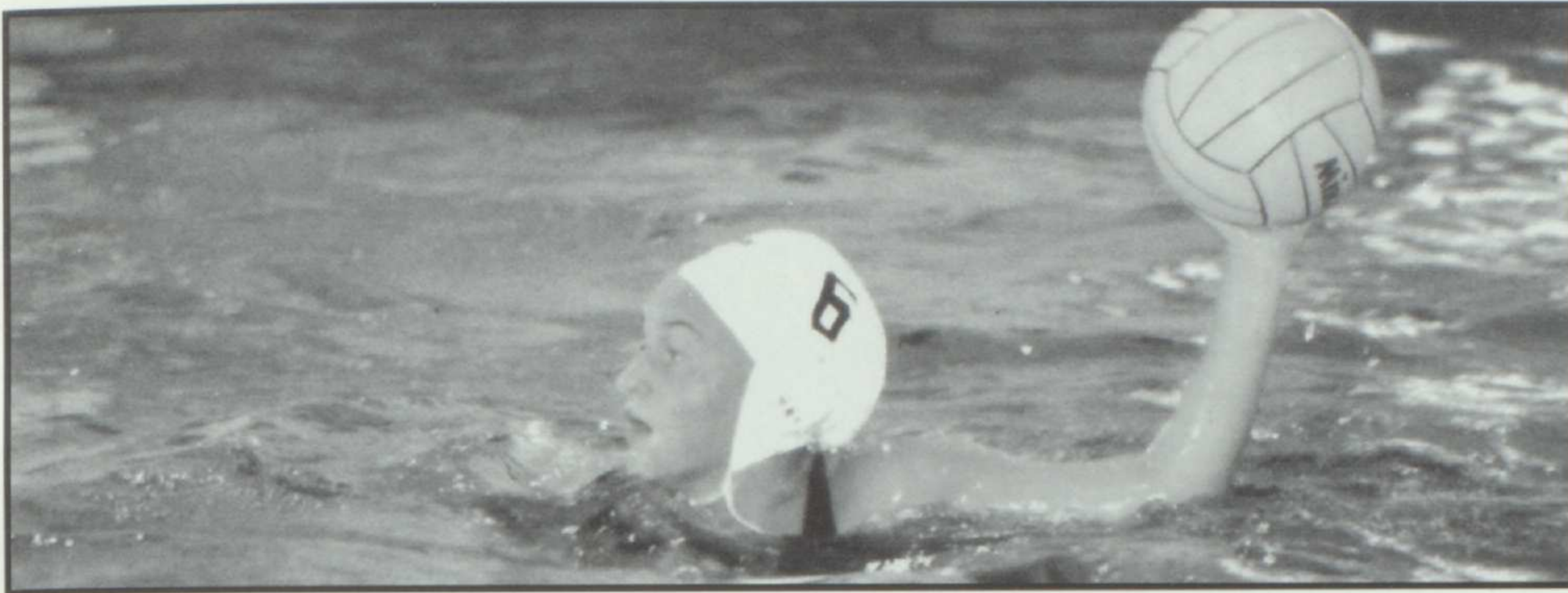

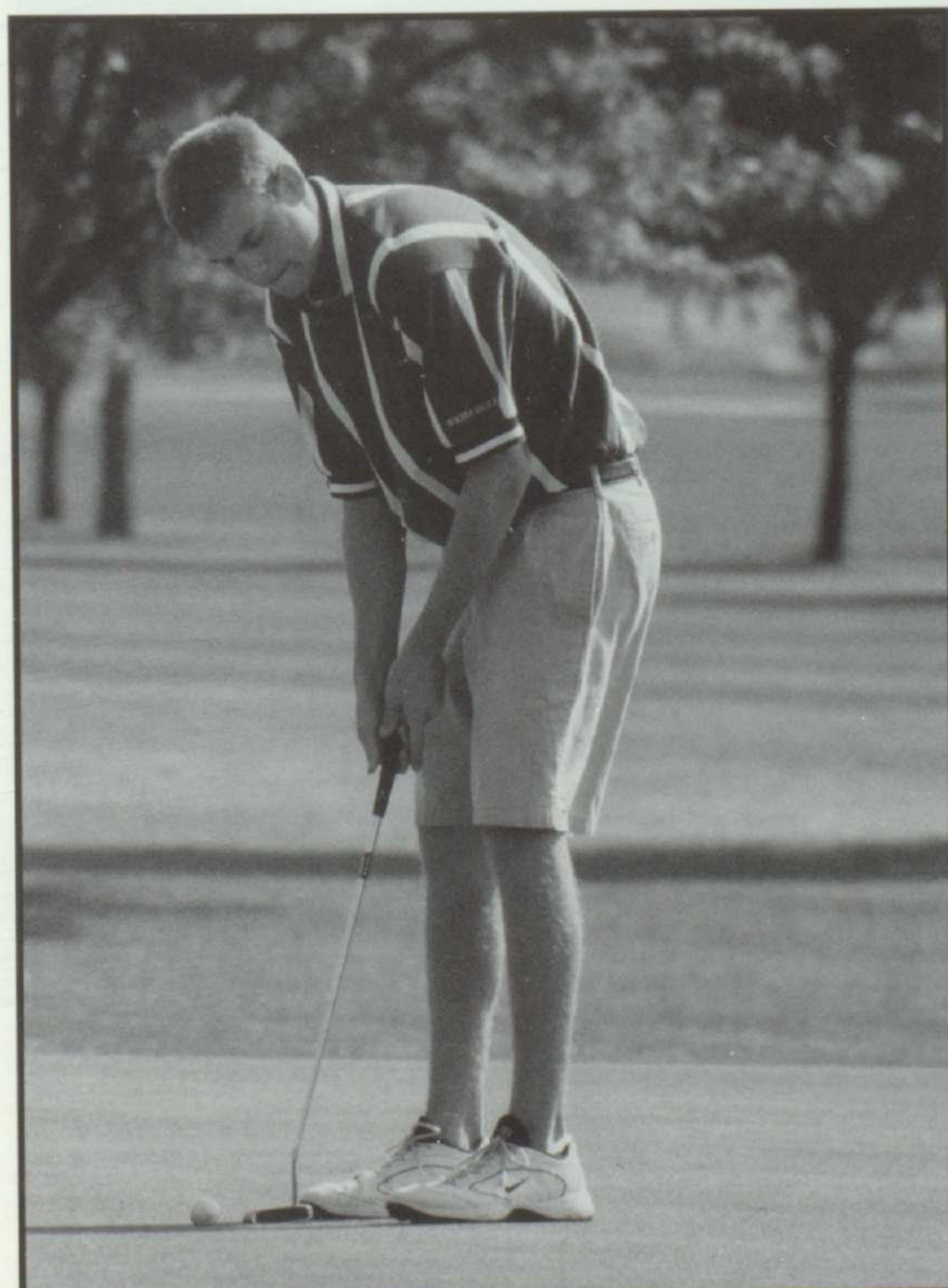

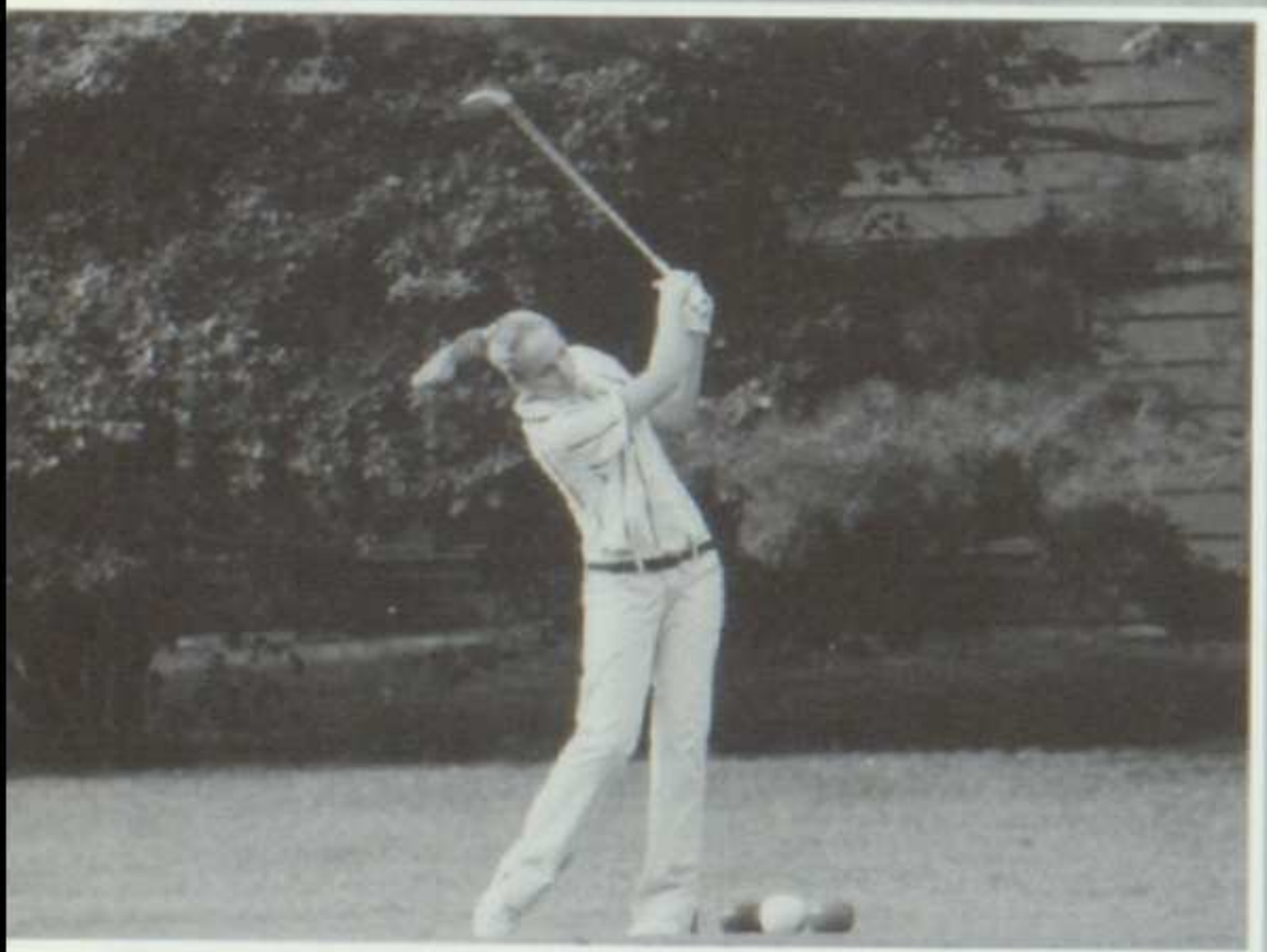

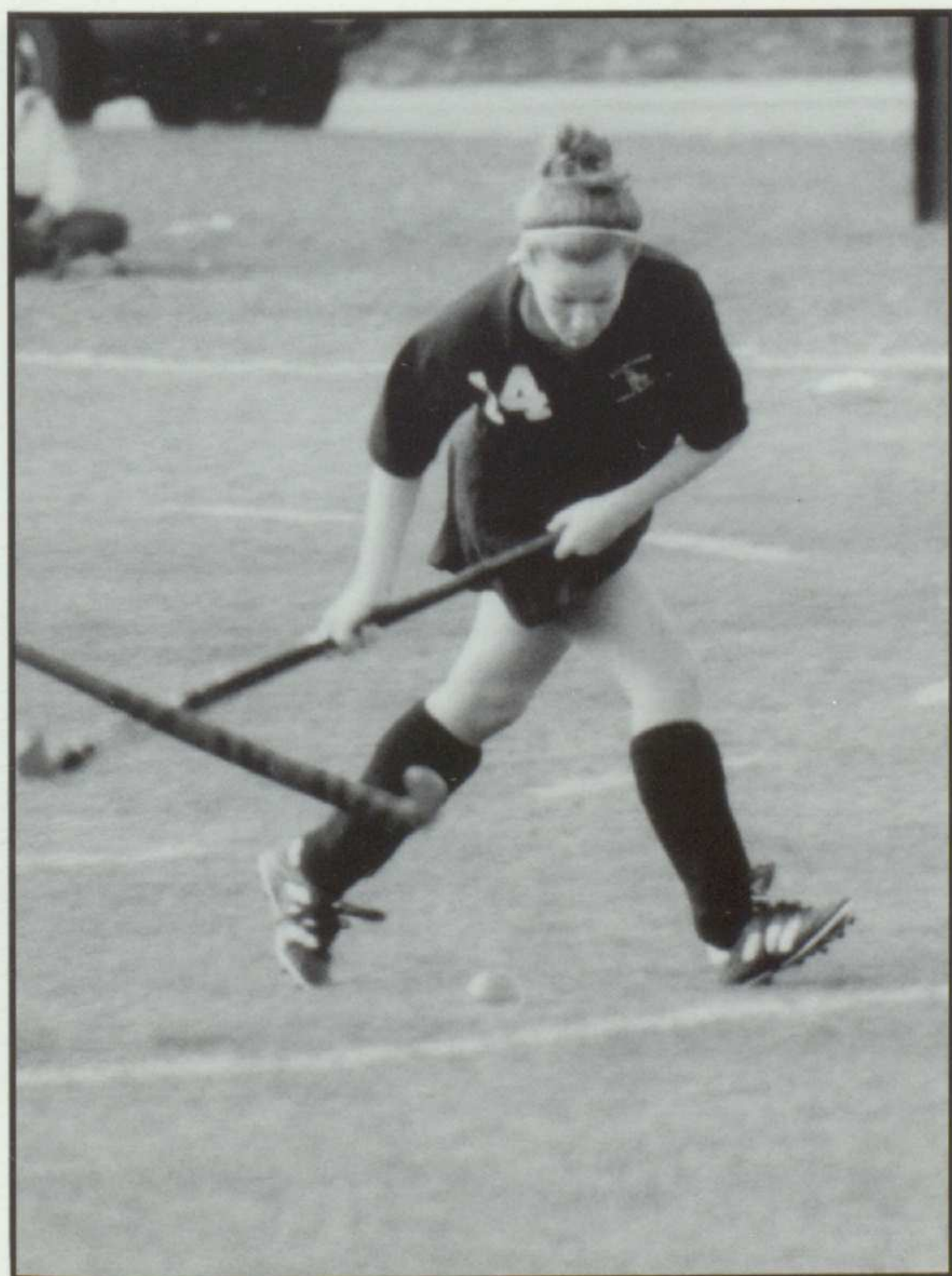

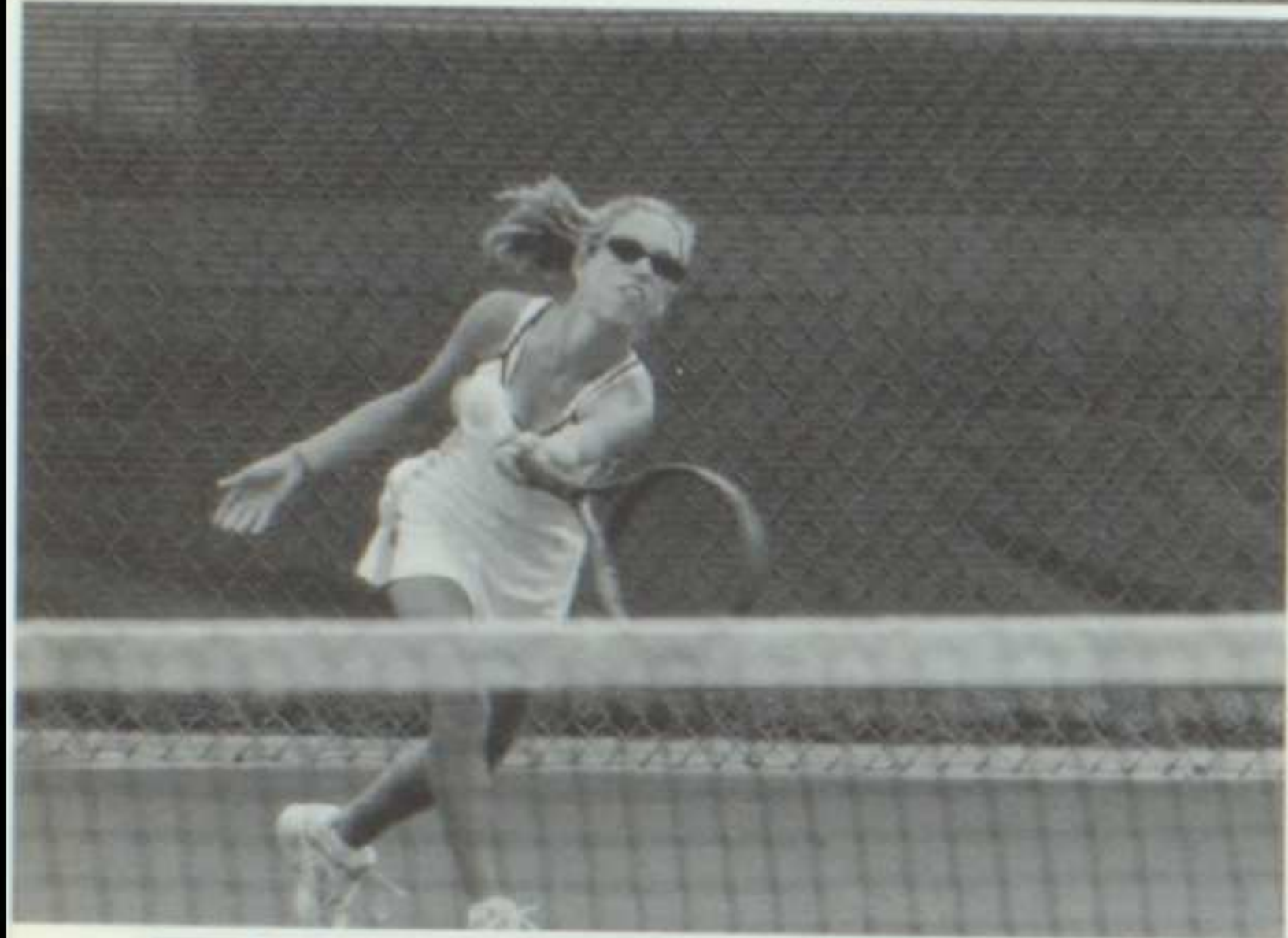

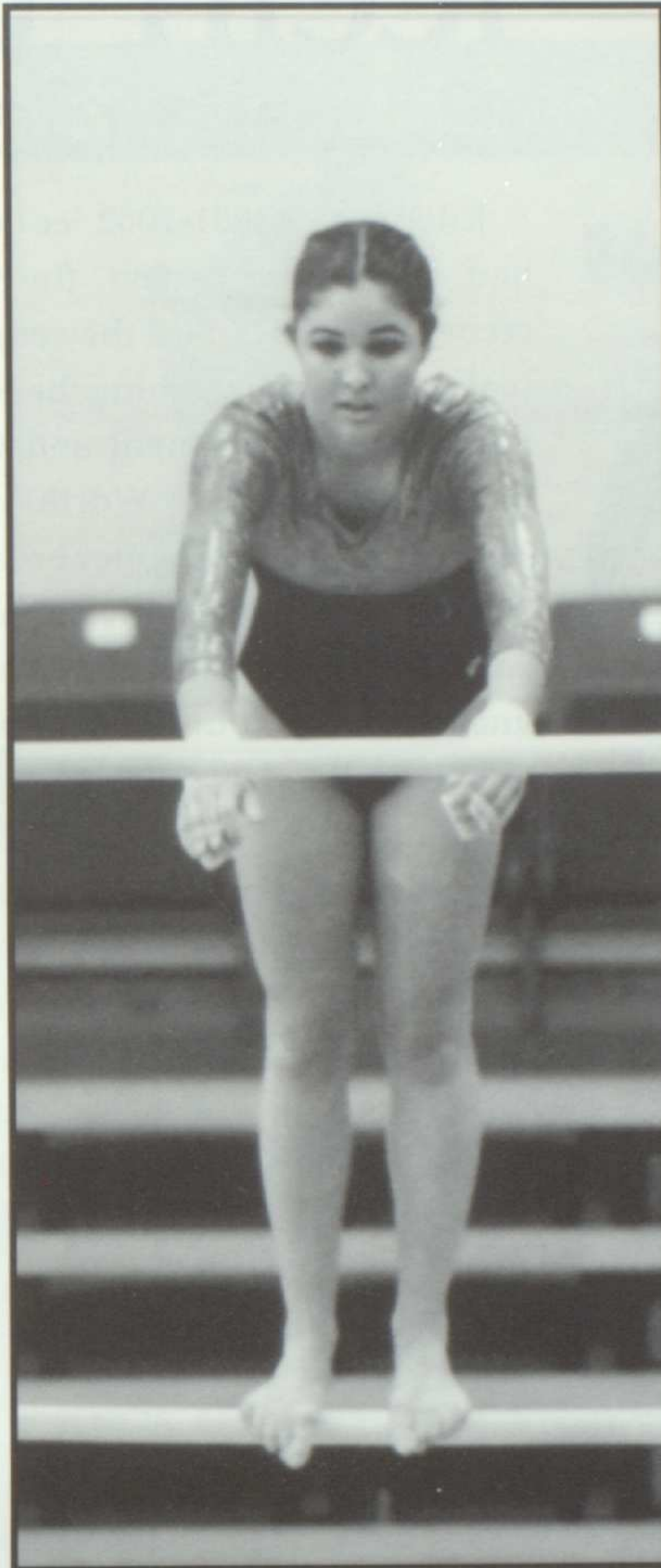

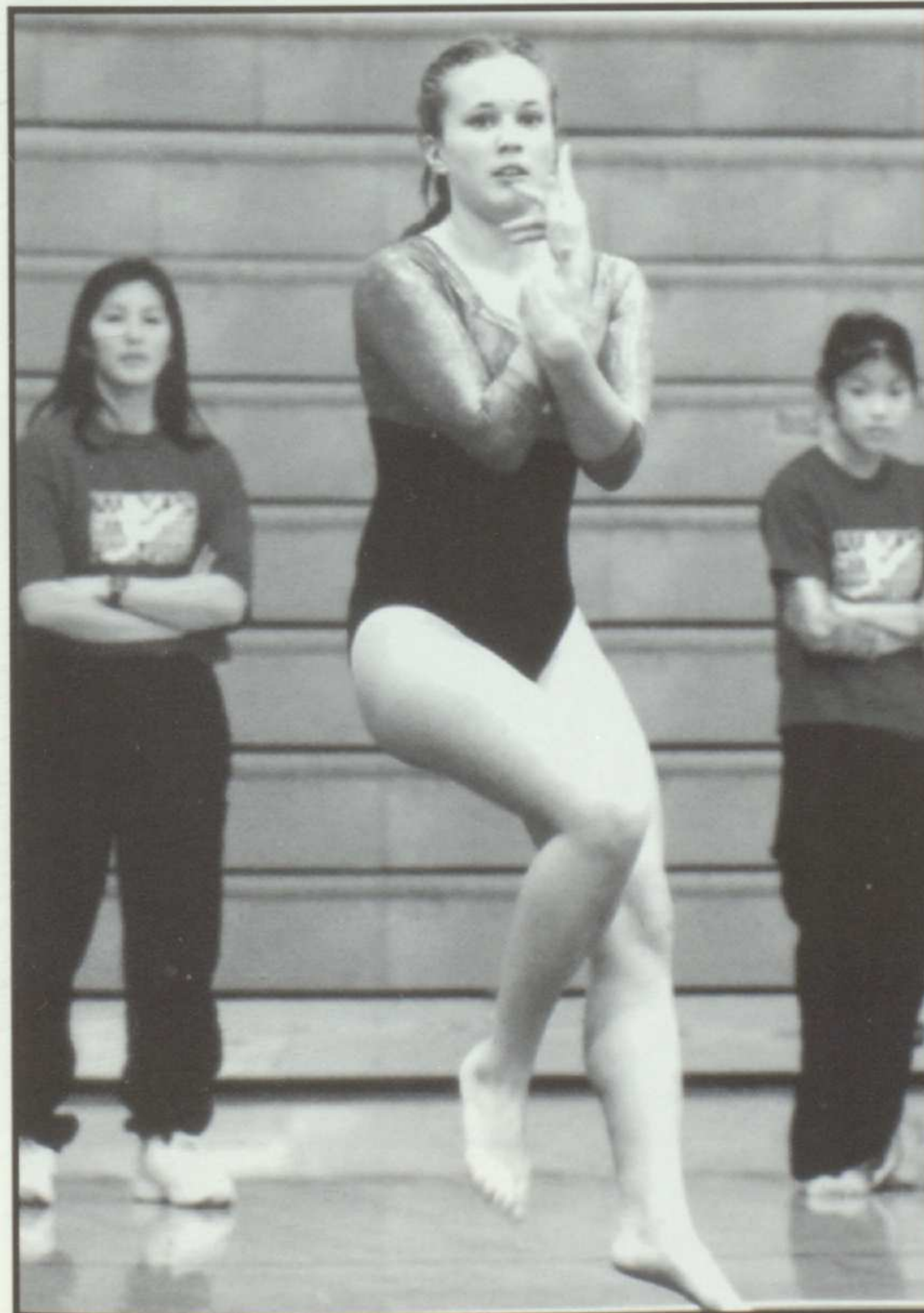

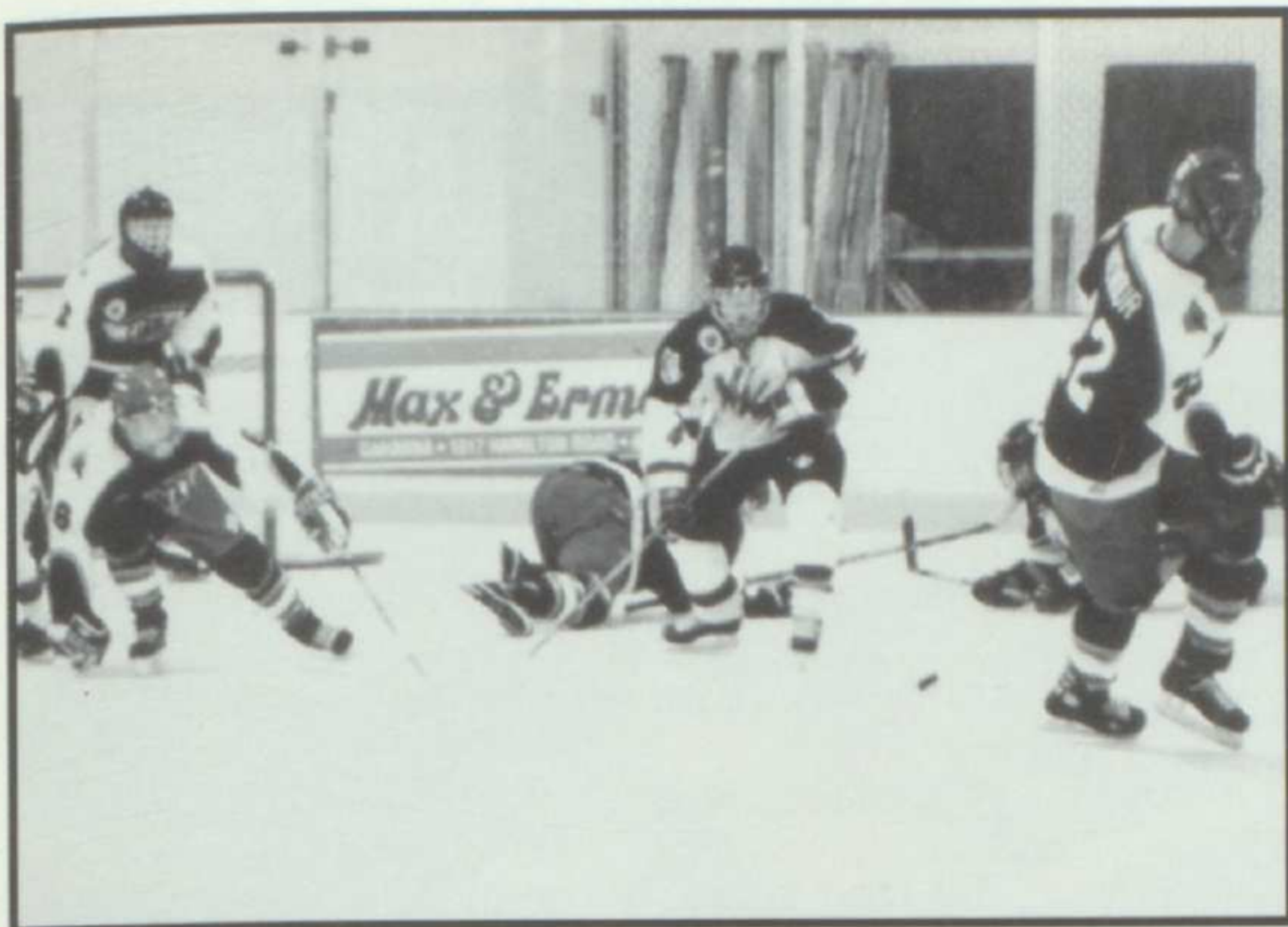

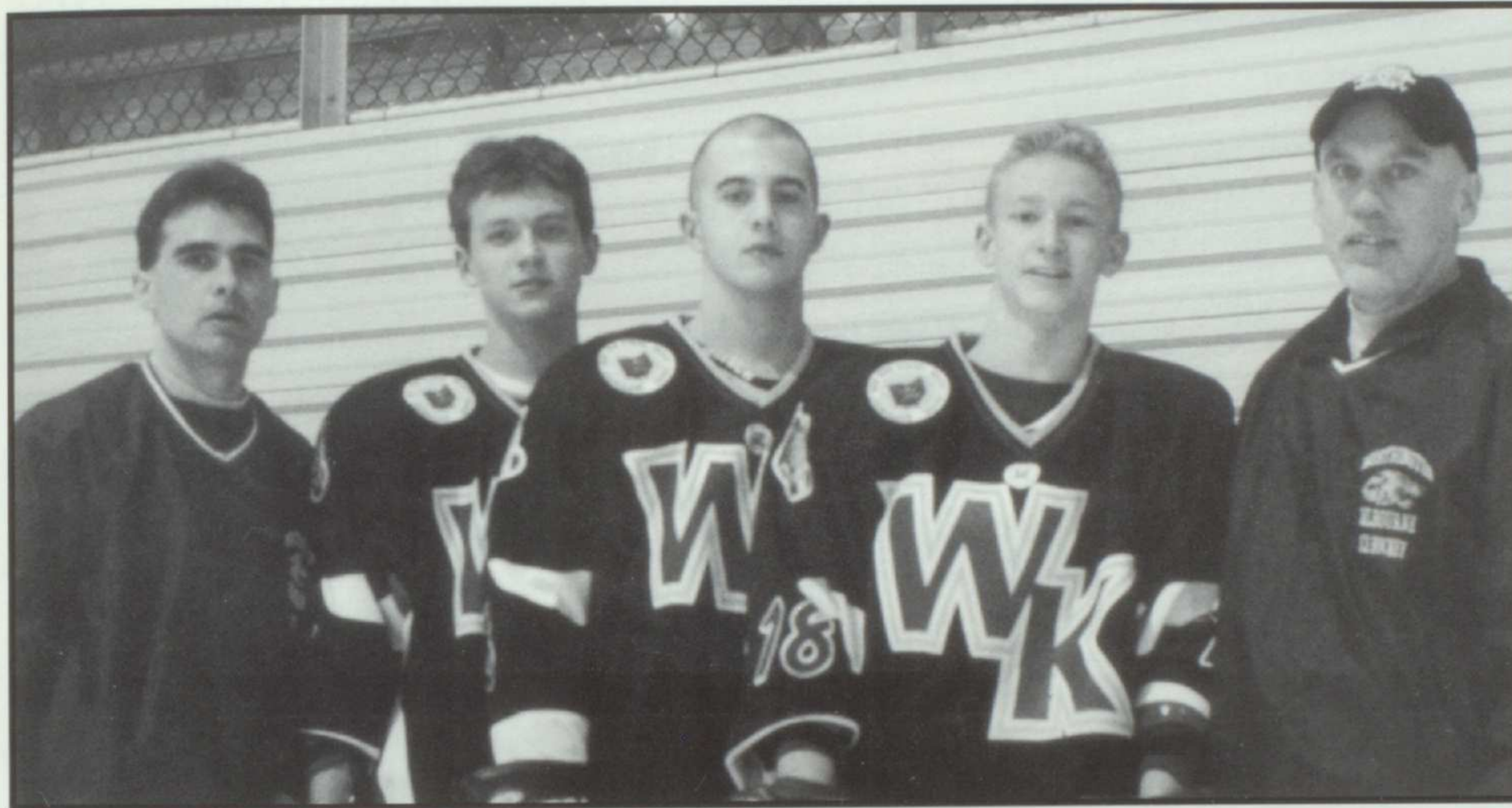

This year's team also captured the OCC championship title. They stood out from every other team and won first place in every event. This meet was a real standout in their swimming season.

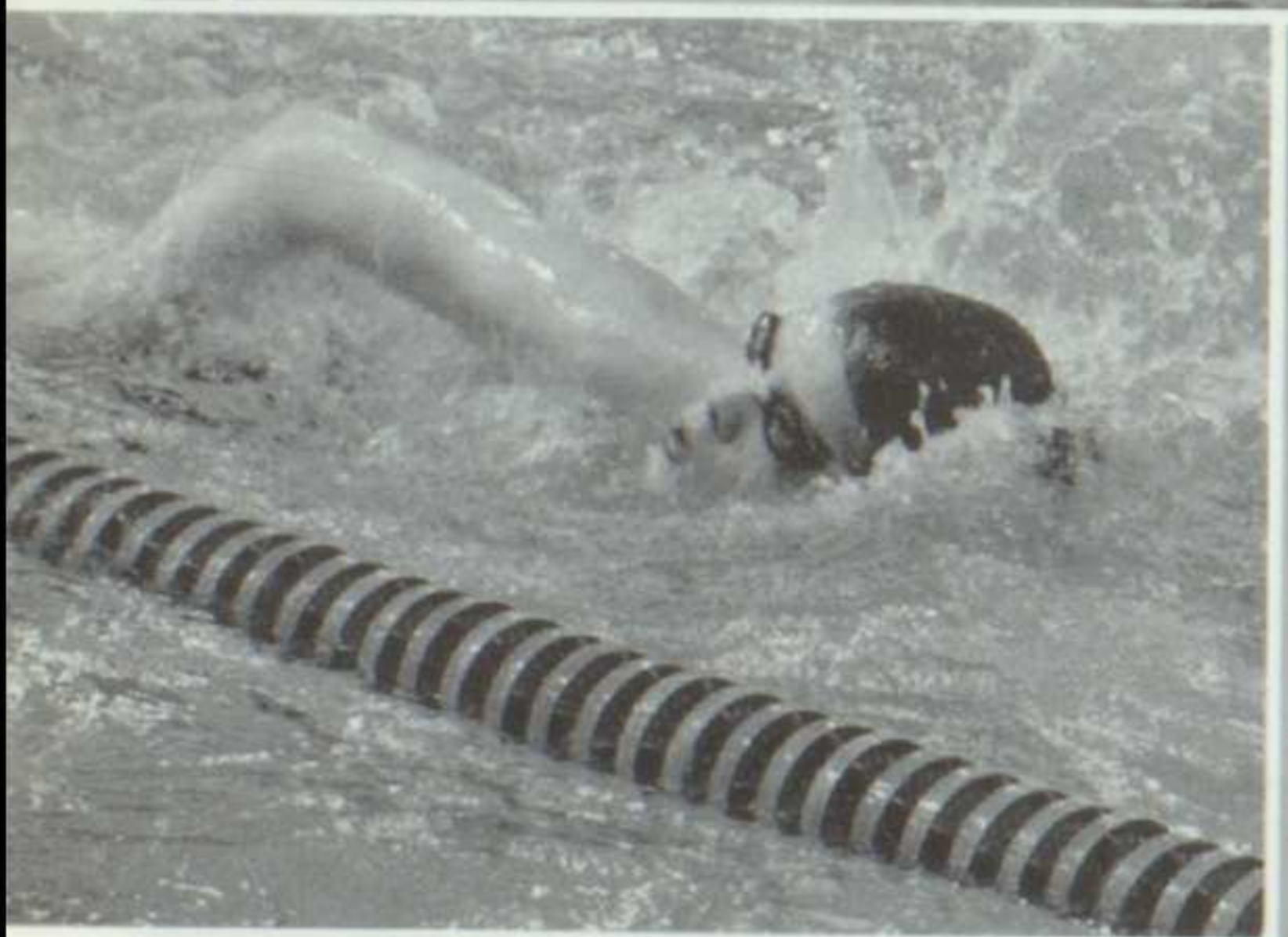
In the state competition, the boy's team

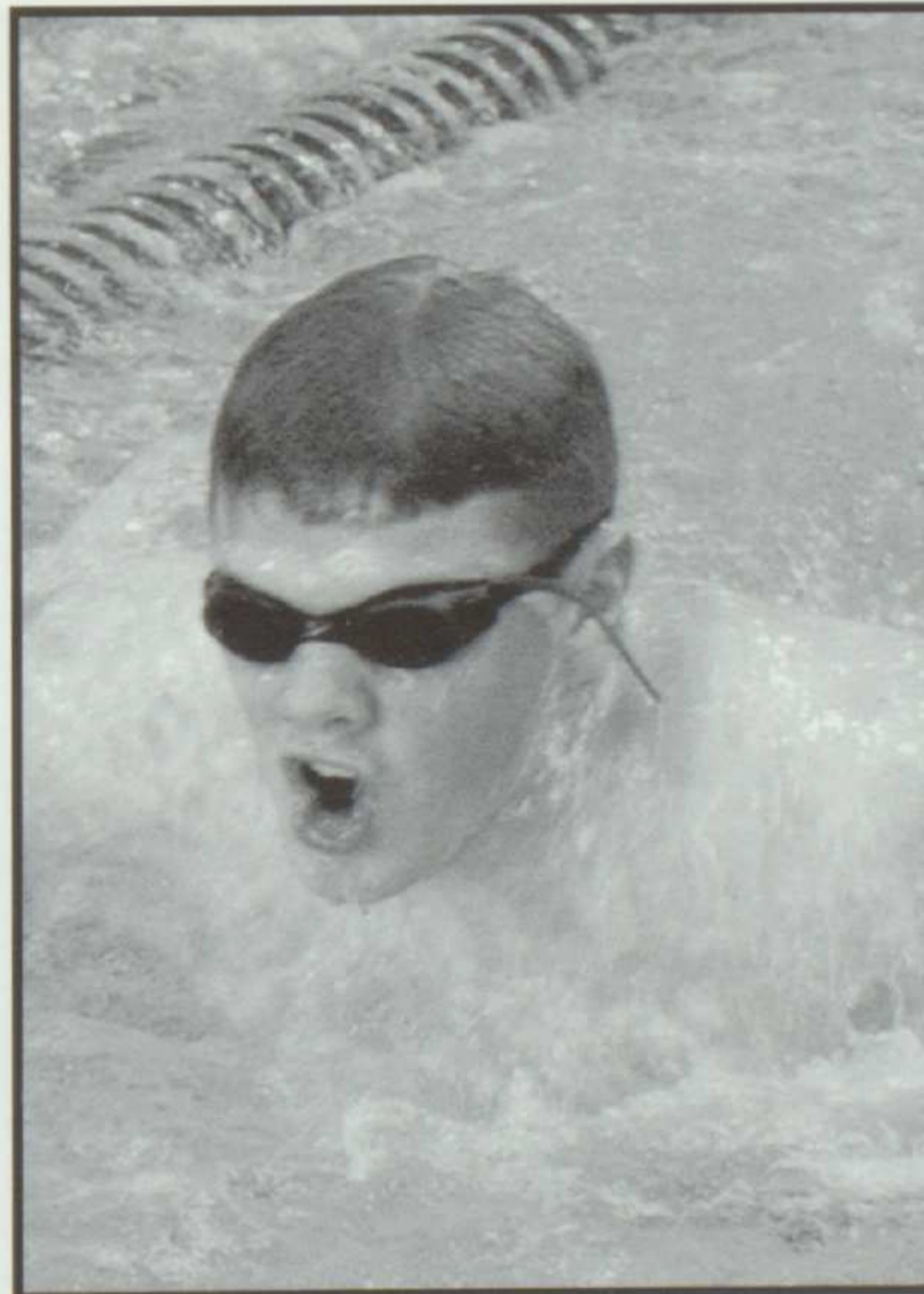
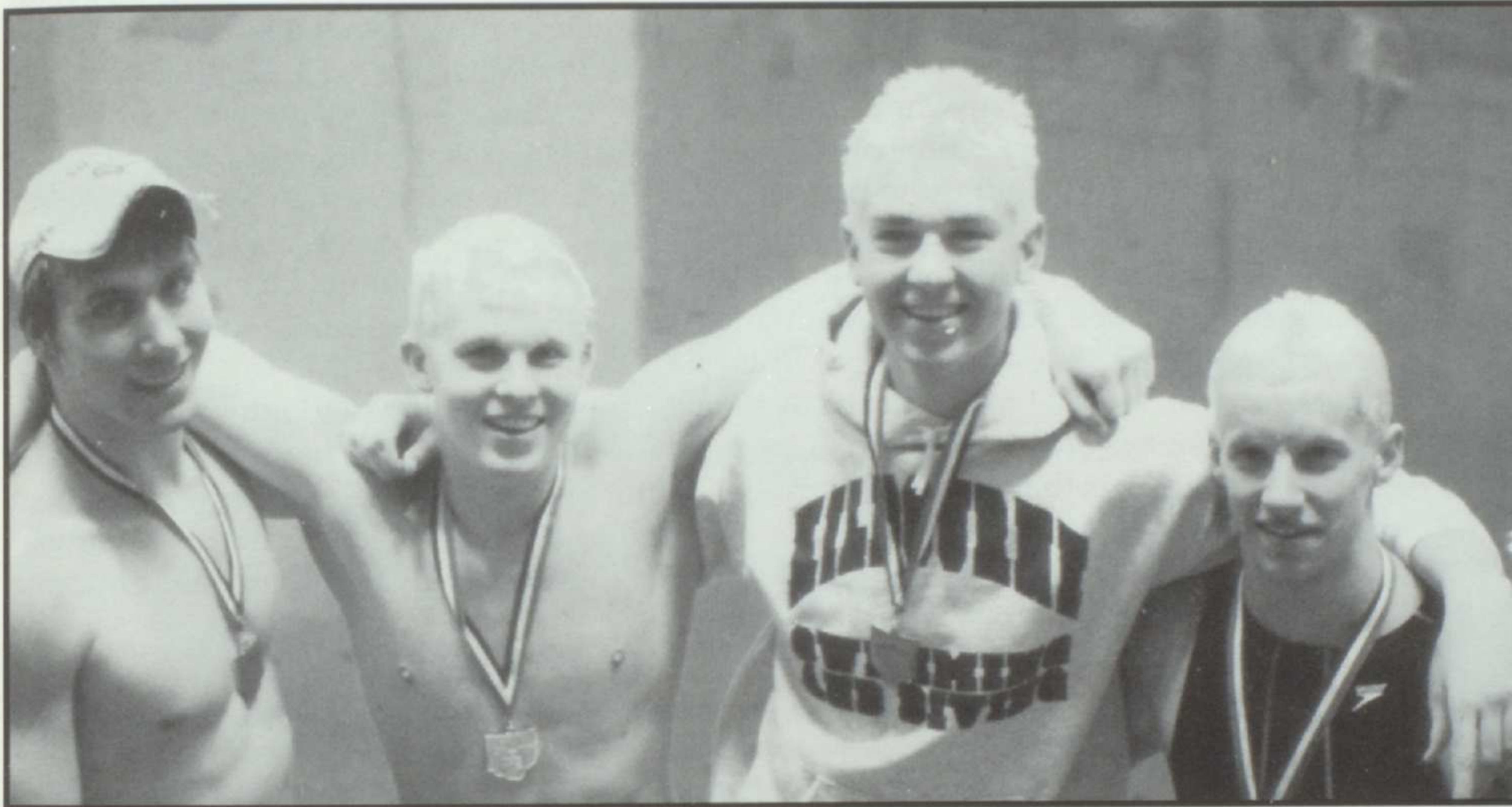
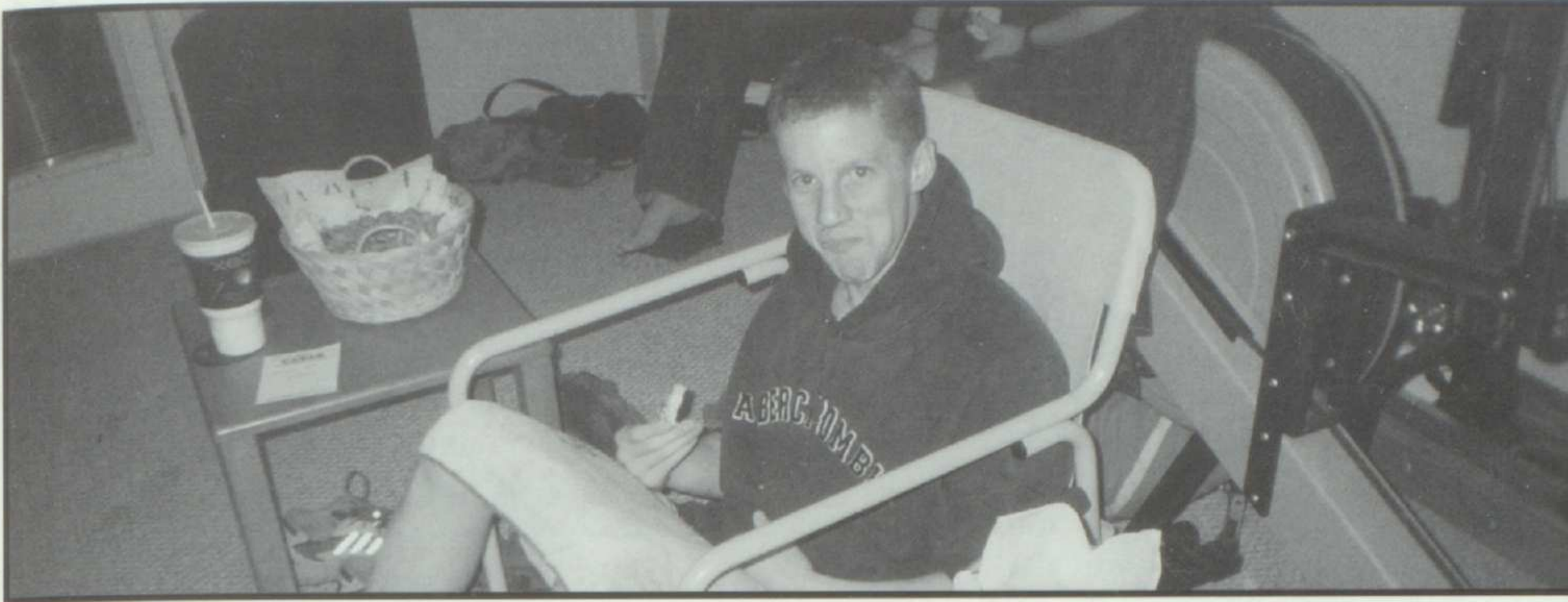

It will be difficult to replace the three seniors, Wolves captains, Katie Kelso, Jolie Schwarz, and Allison Riddle. They've all

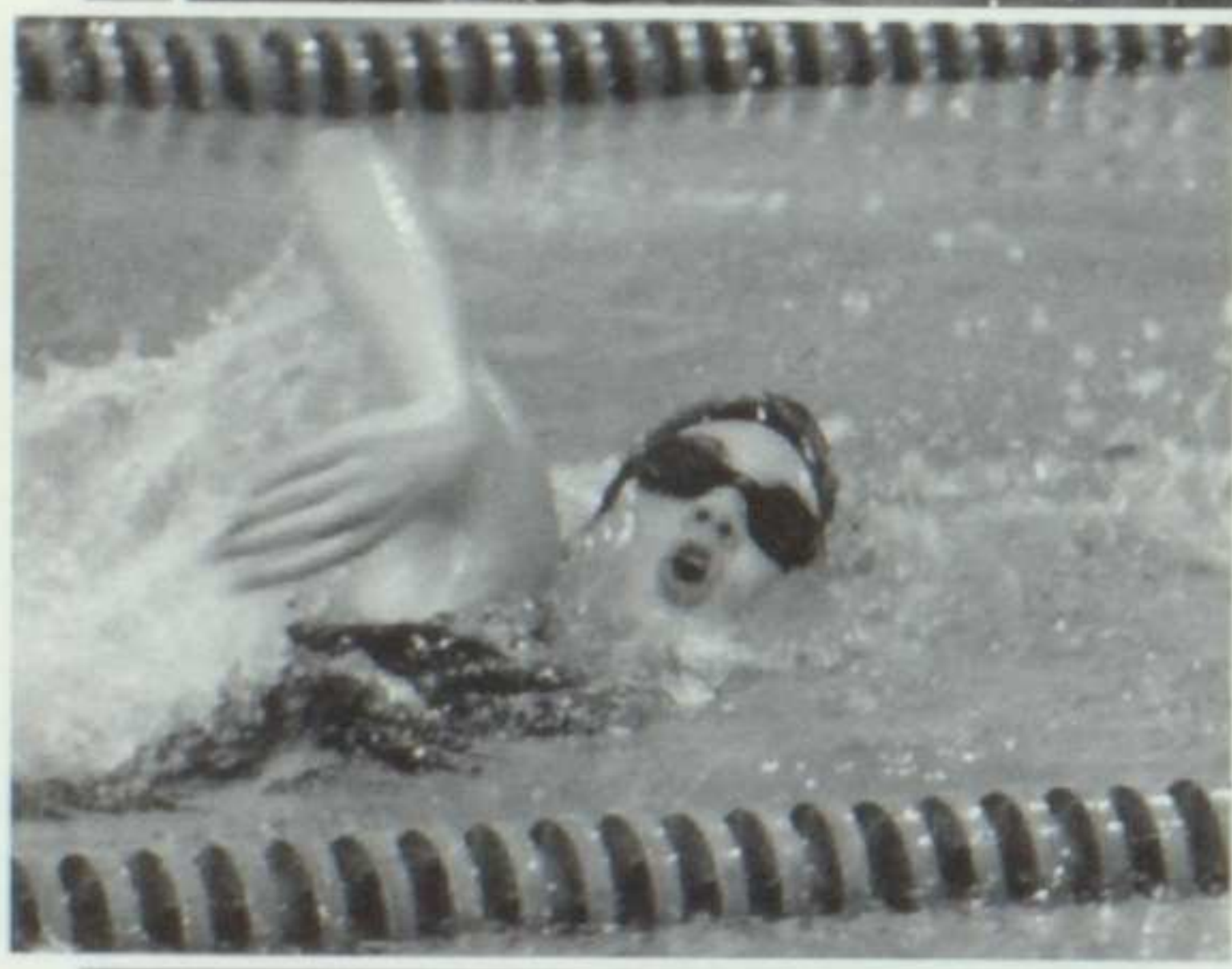
worked so hard for four years and developed such close bonds with each other. "Our seniors have been real instrumental leaders for us. They will be hard to replace," said coach Jim Callahan.

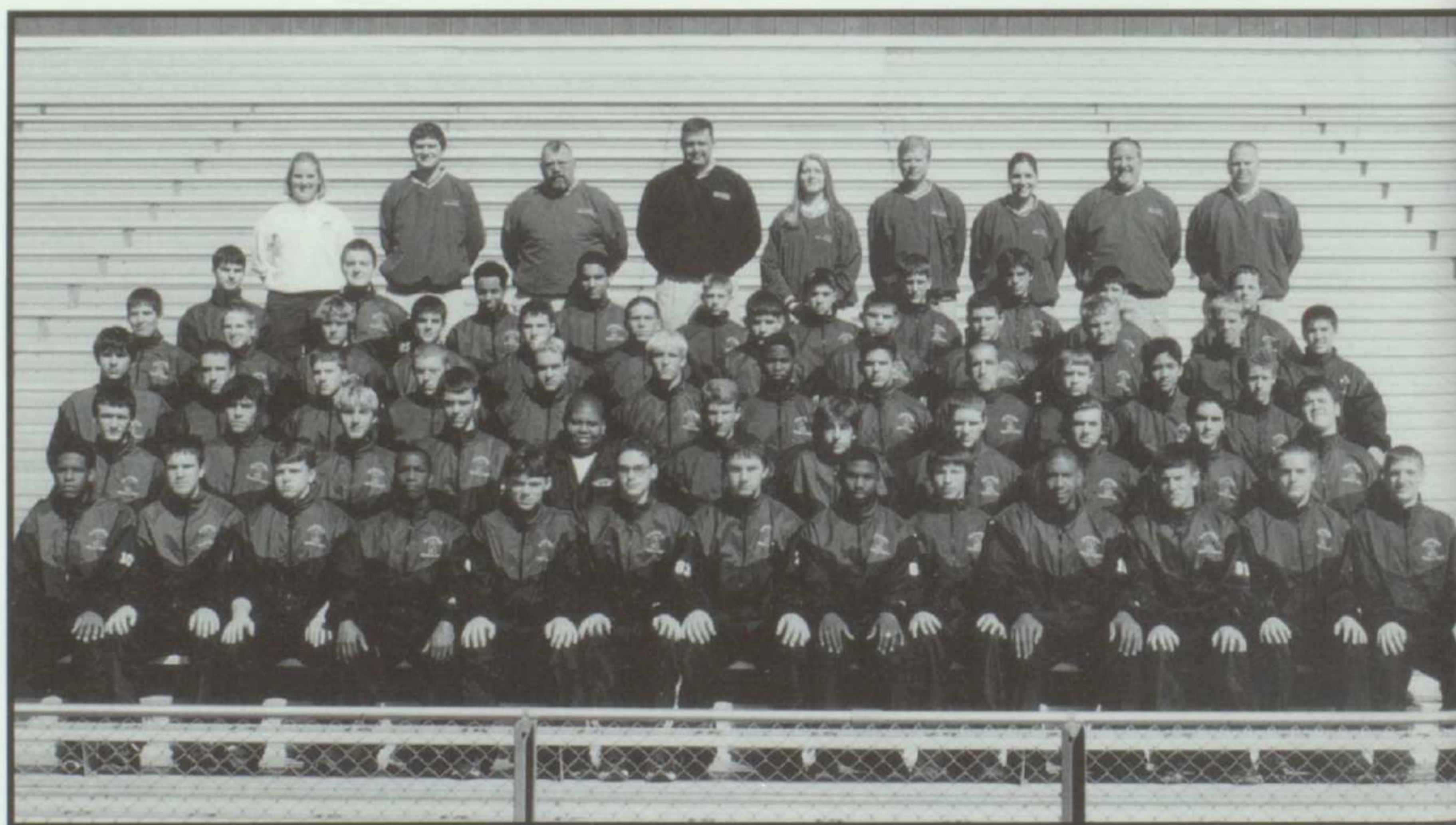

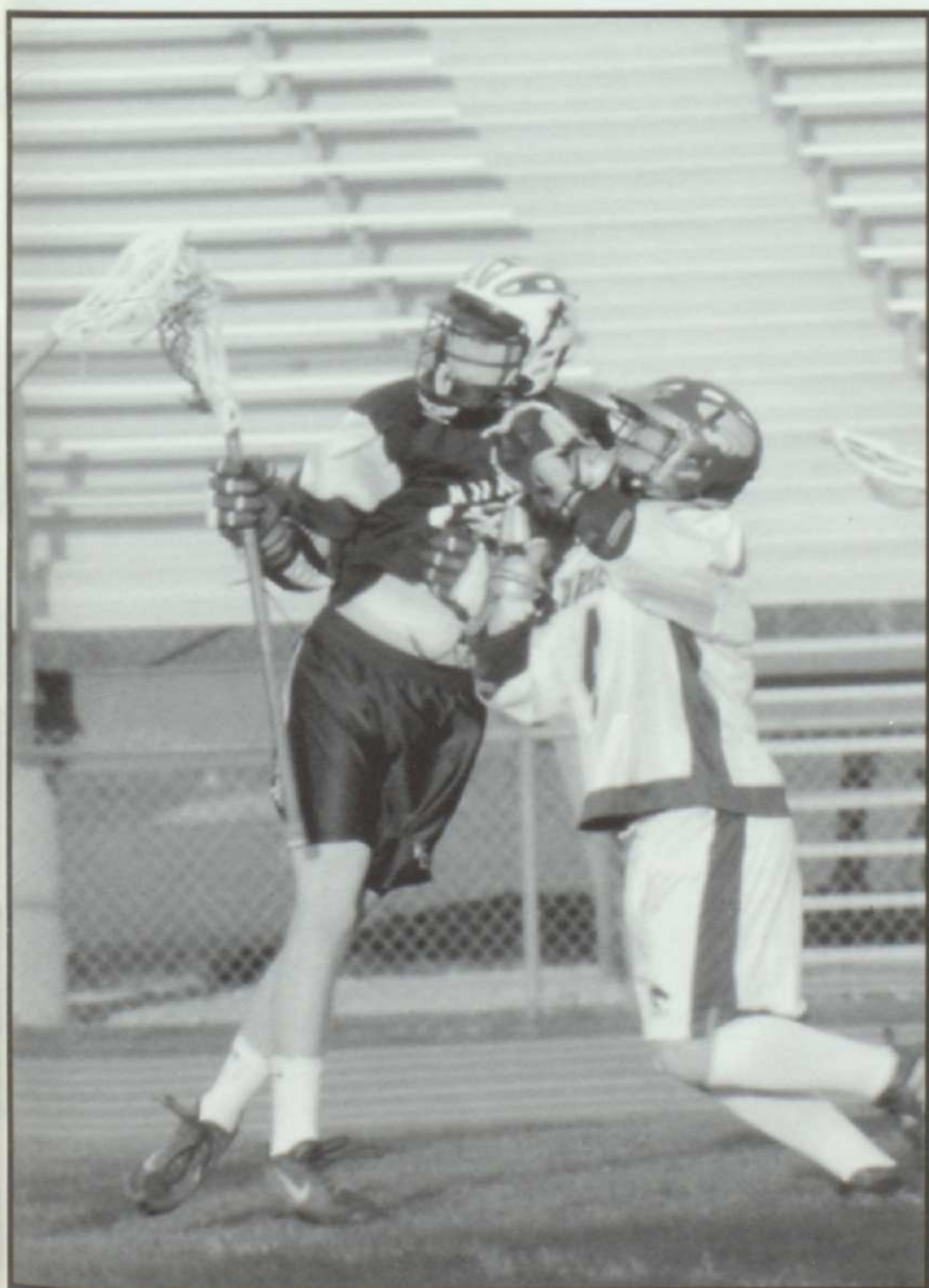

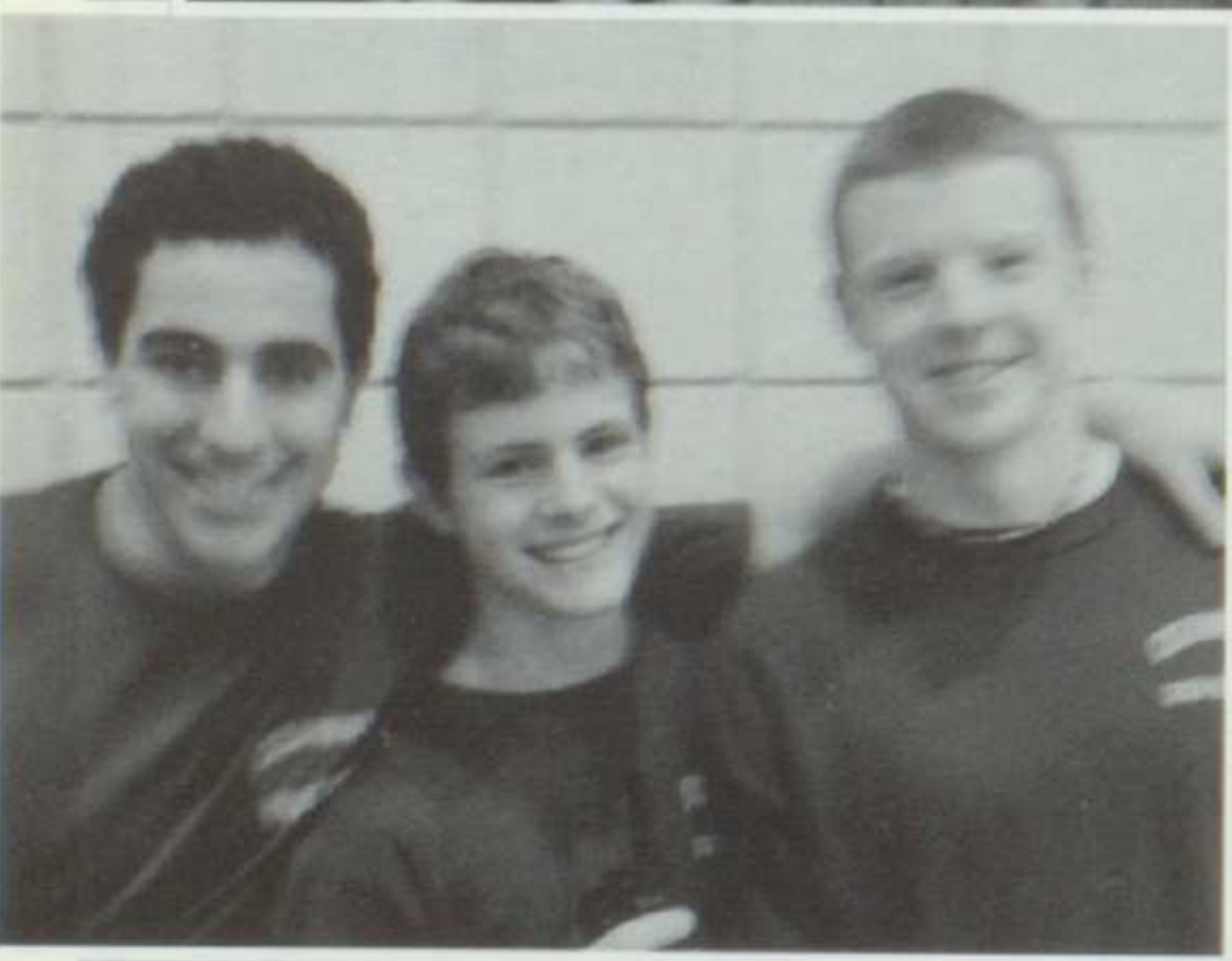
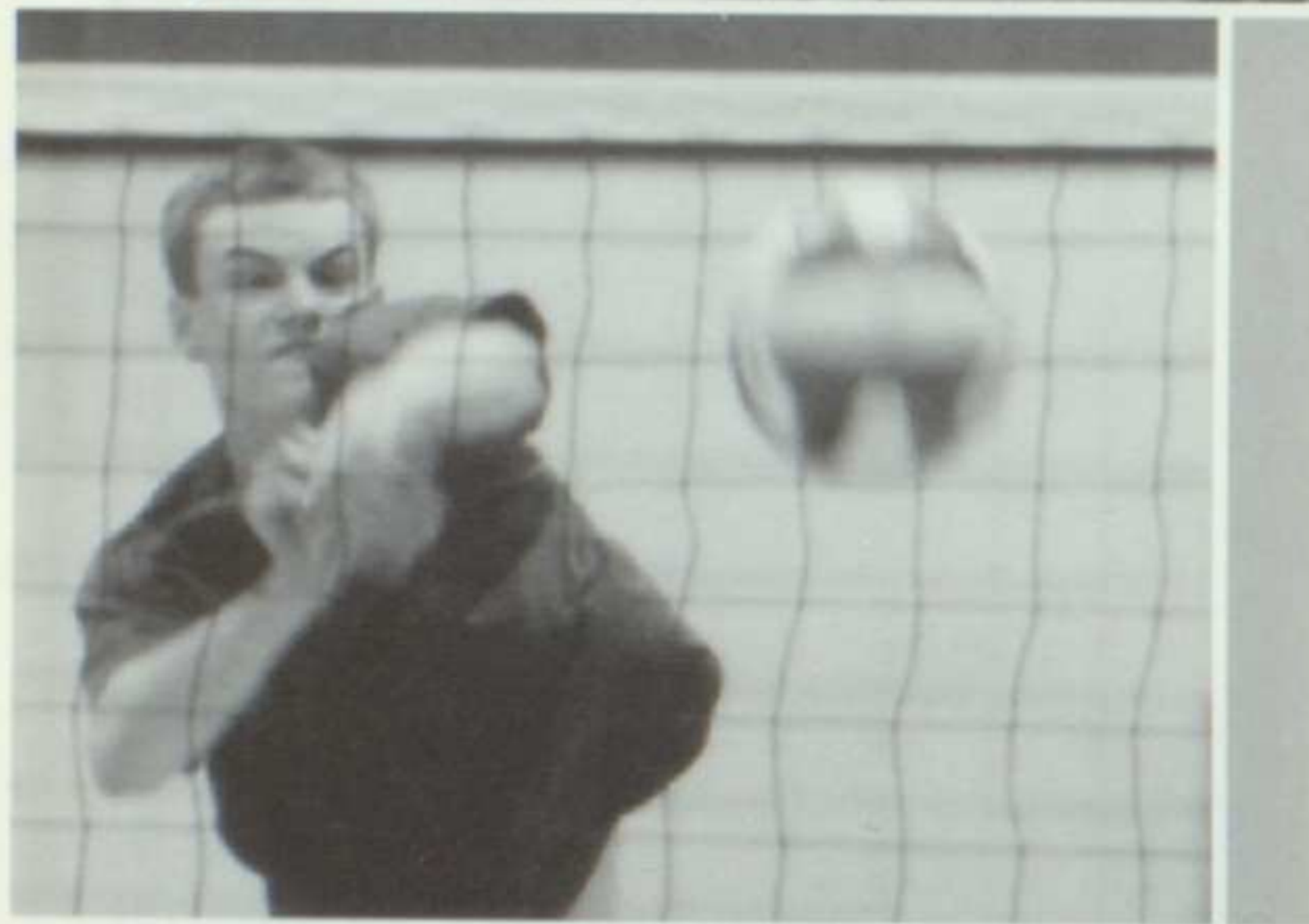
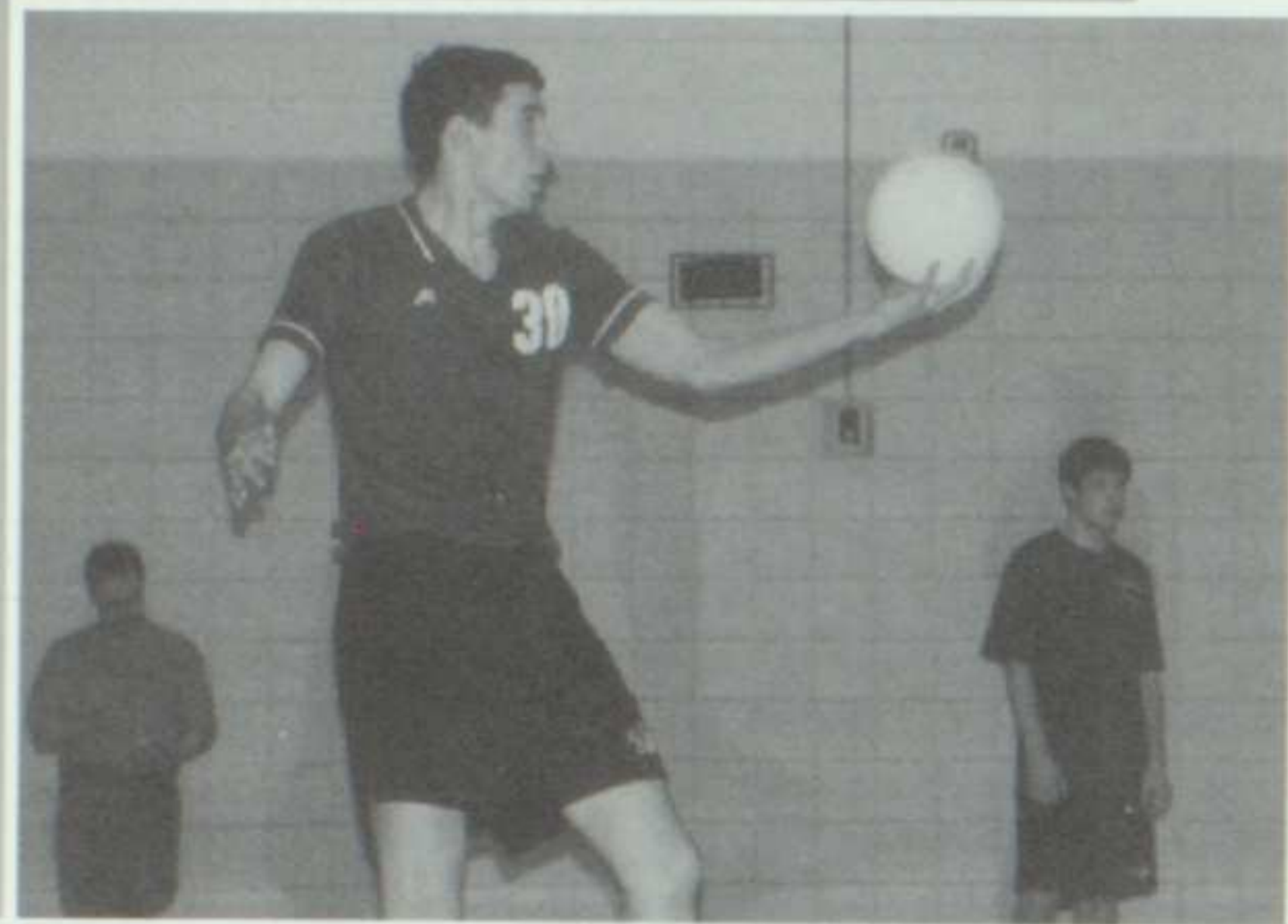
They shared this year's OCC title with

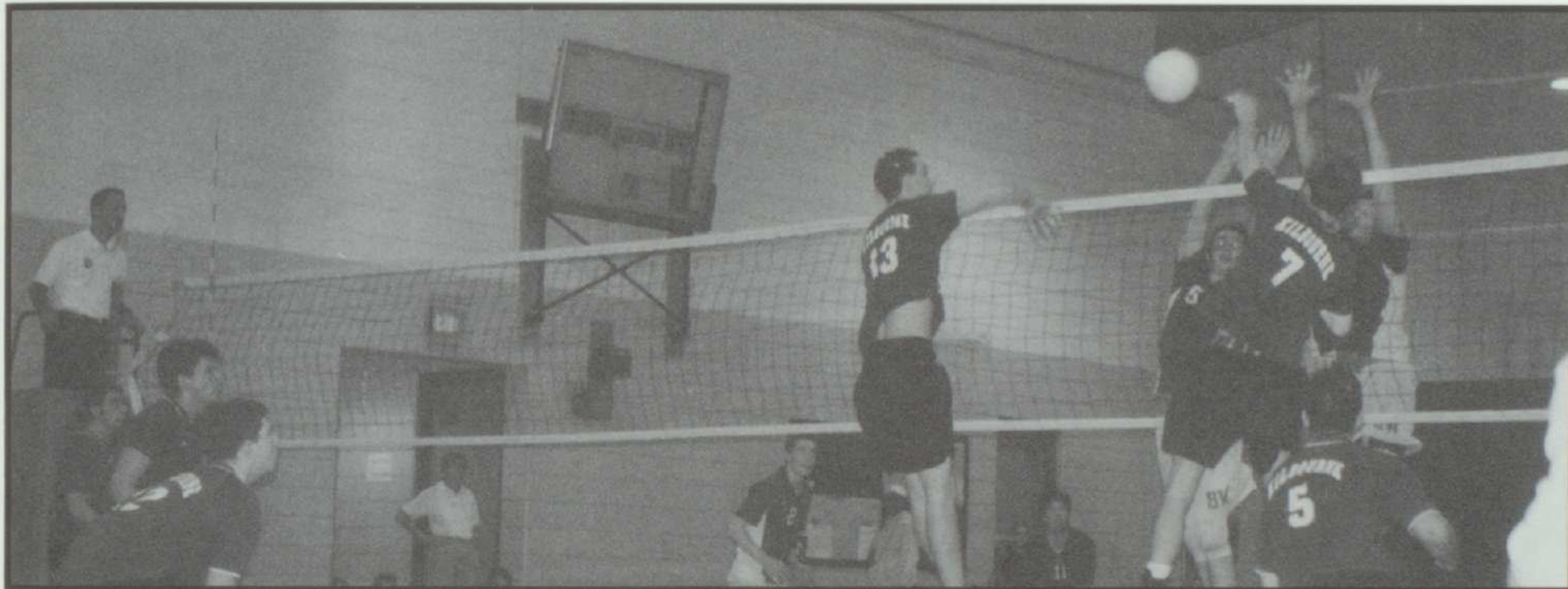

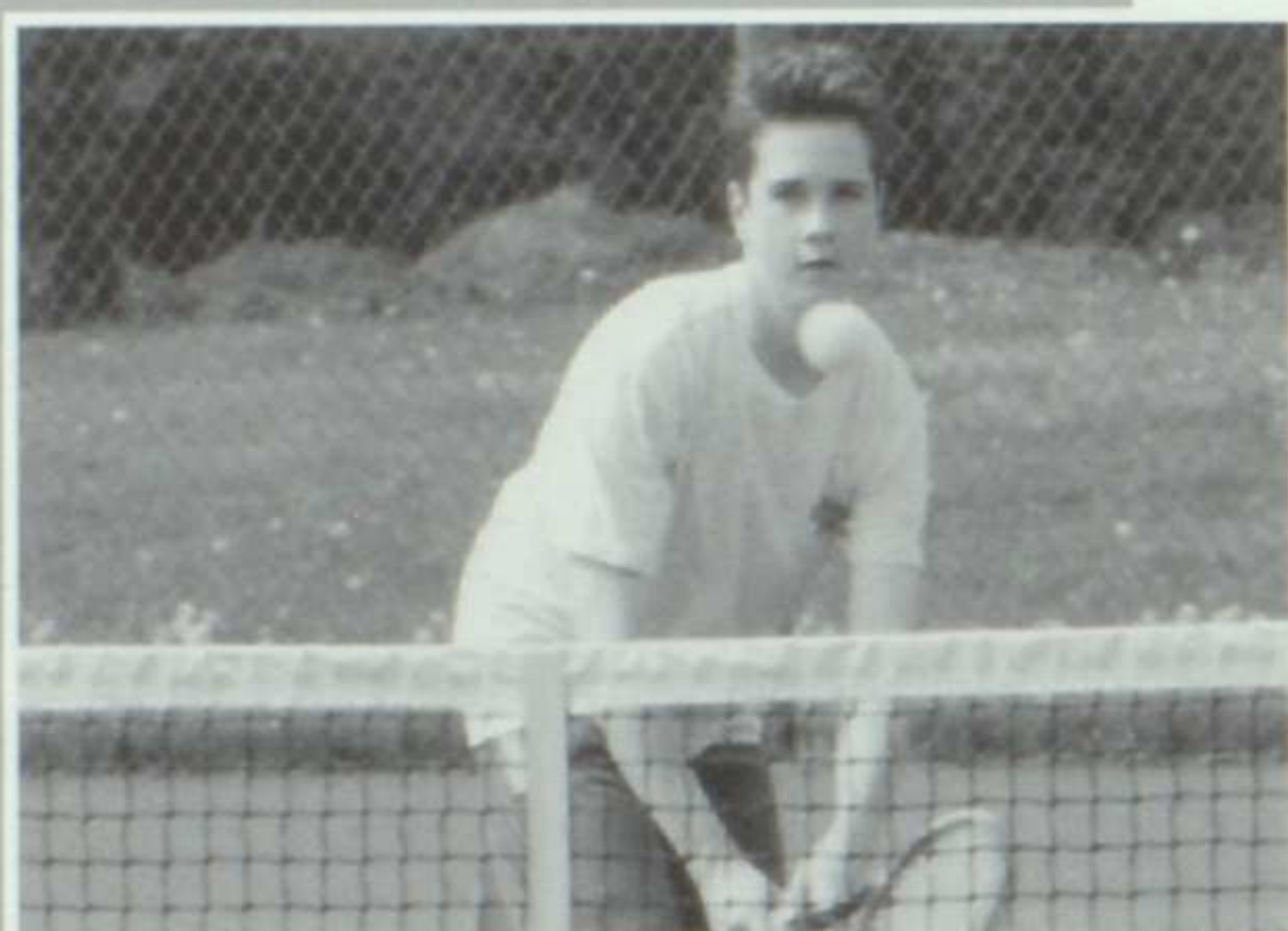
was the Worthington Cup.

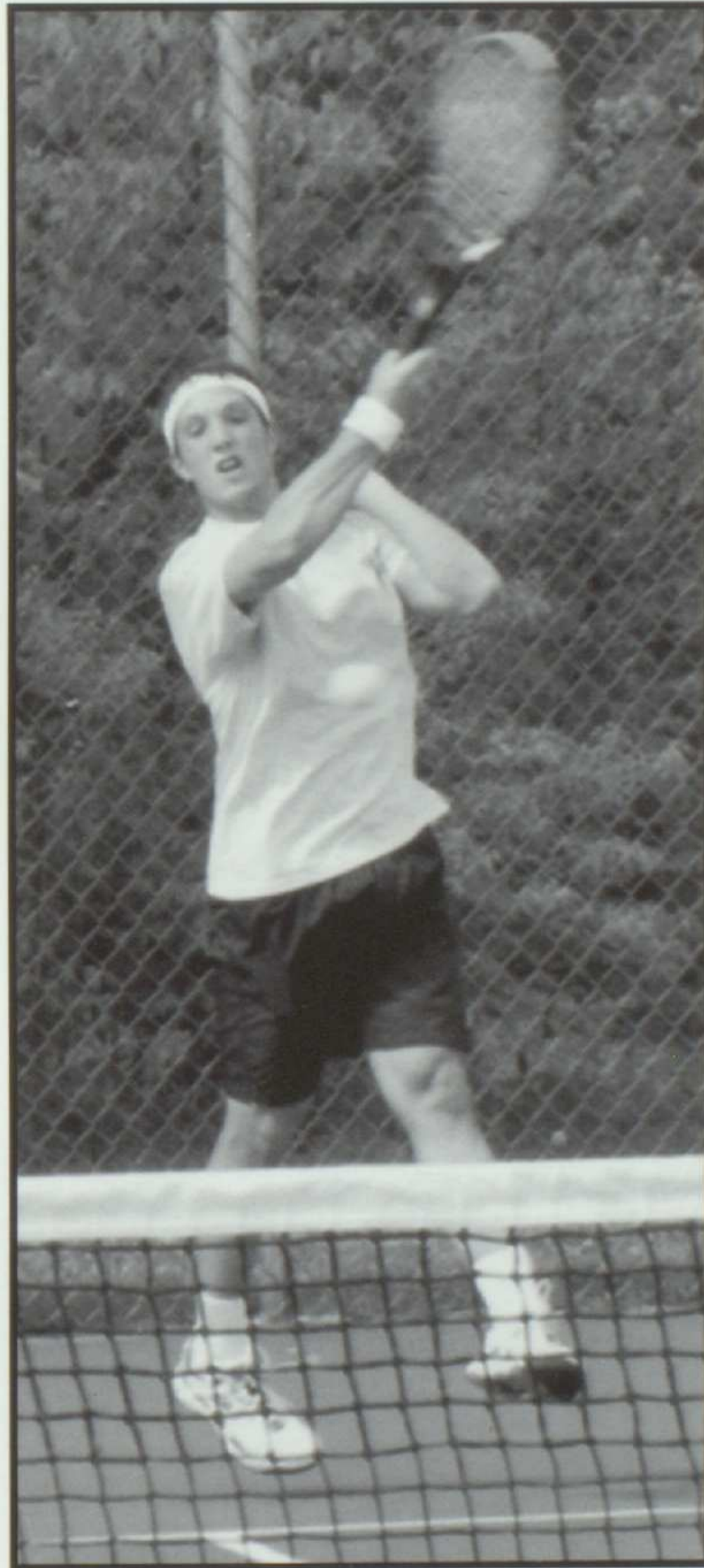

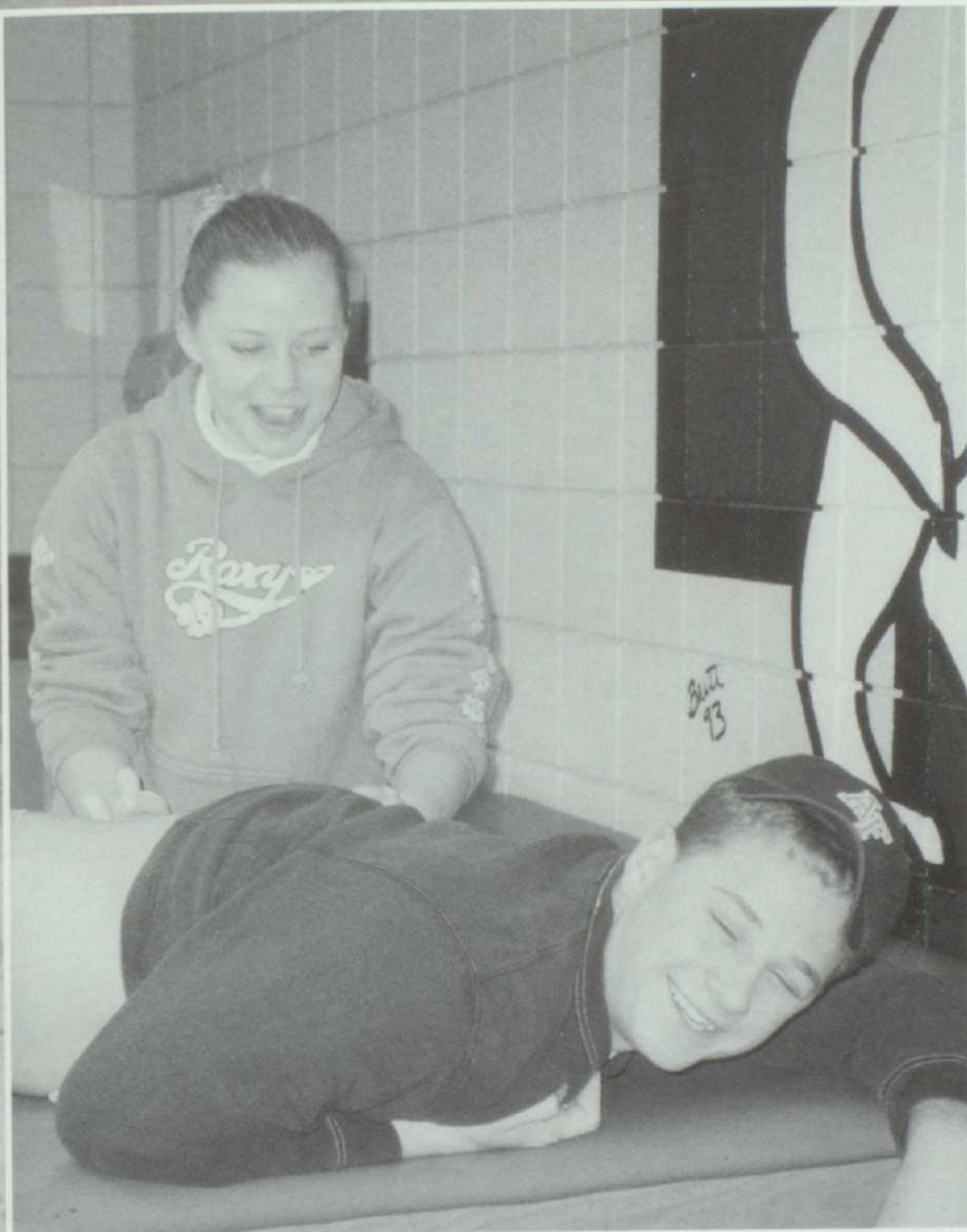

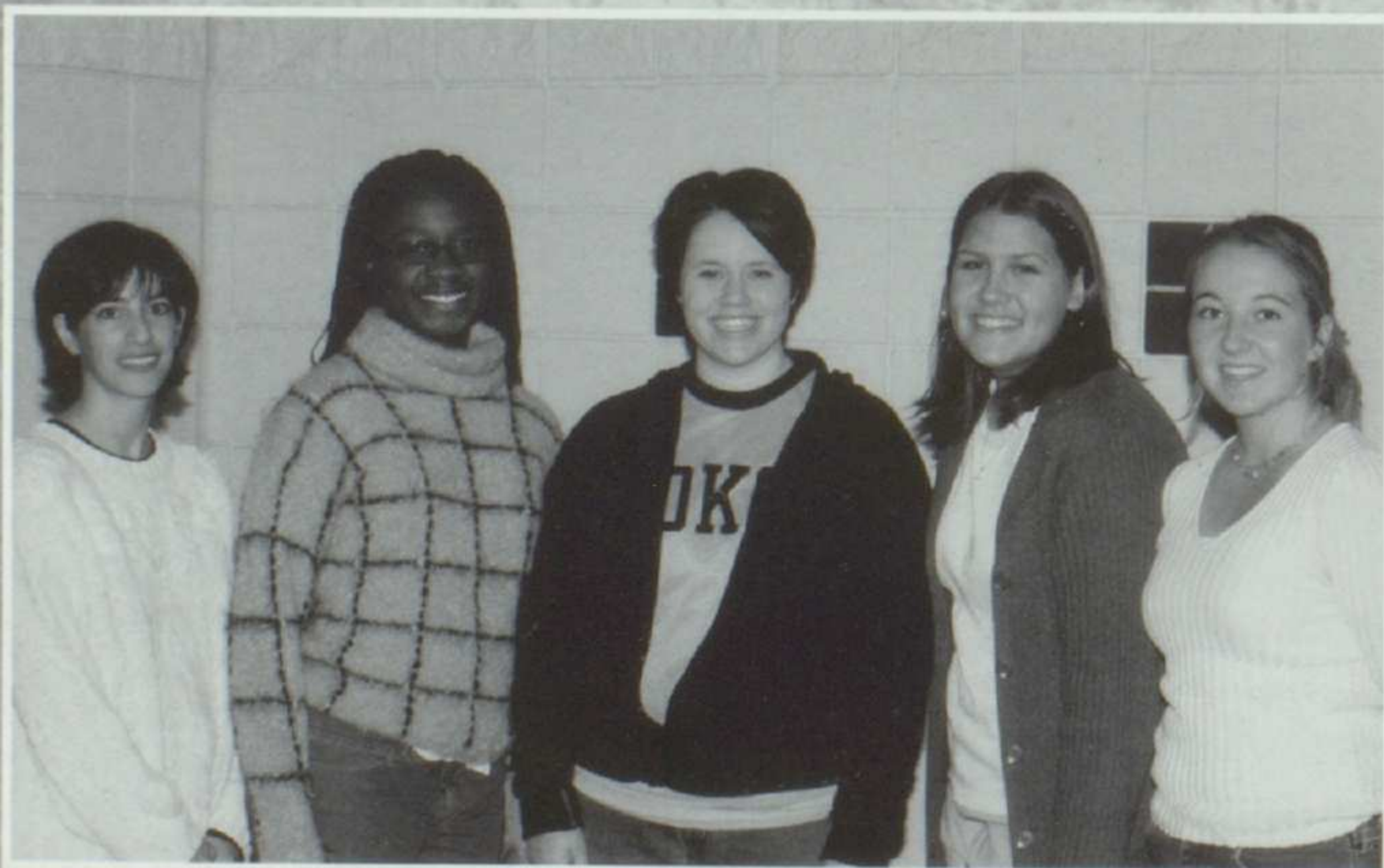

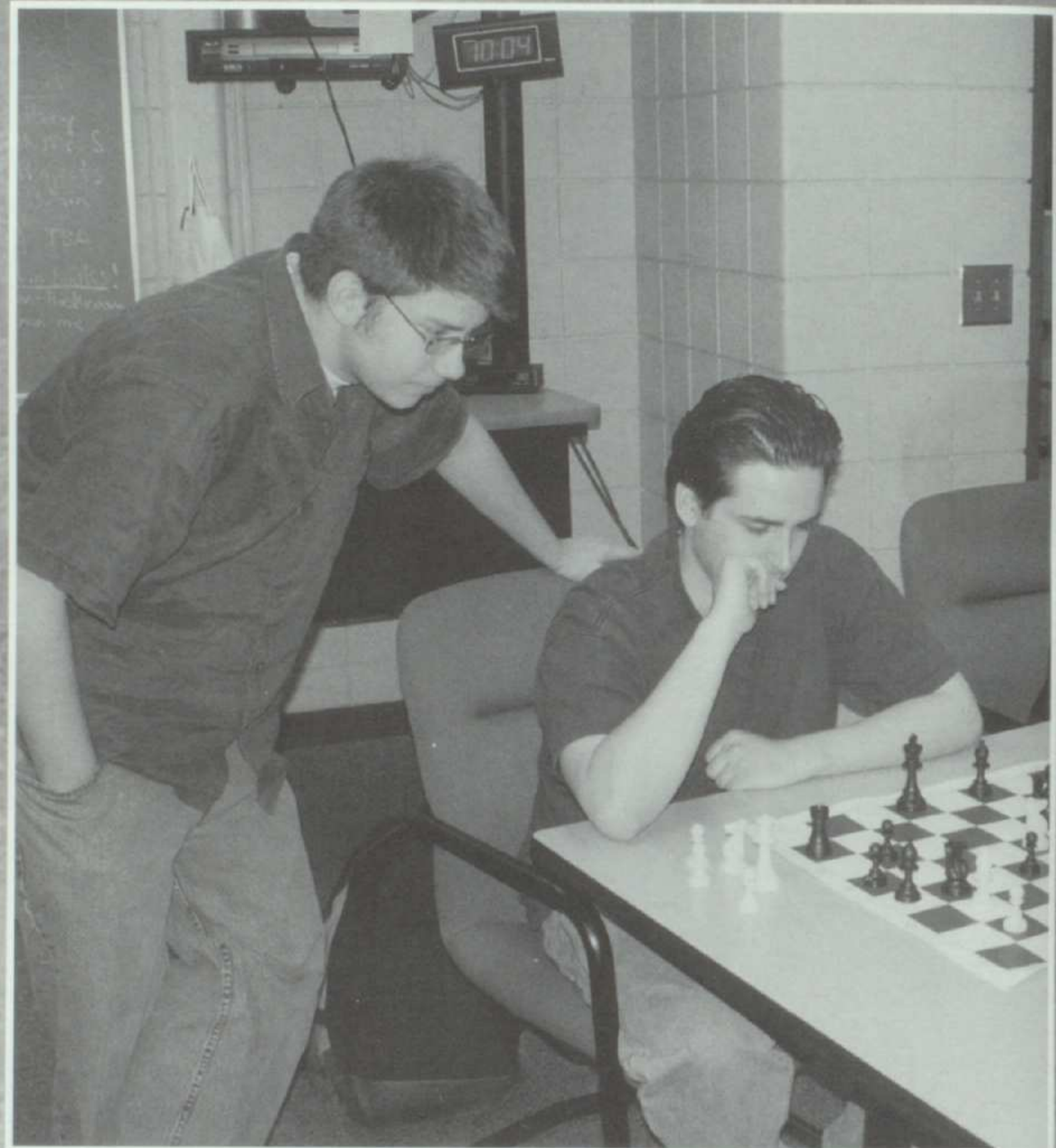

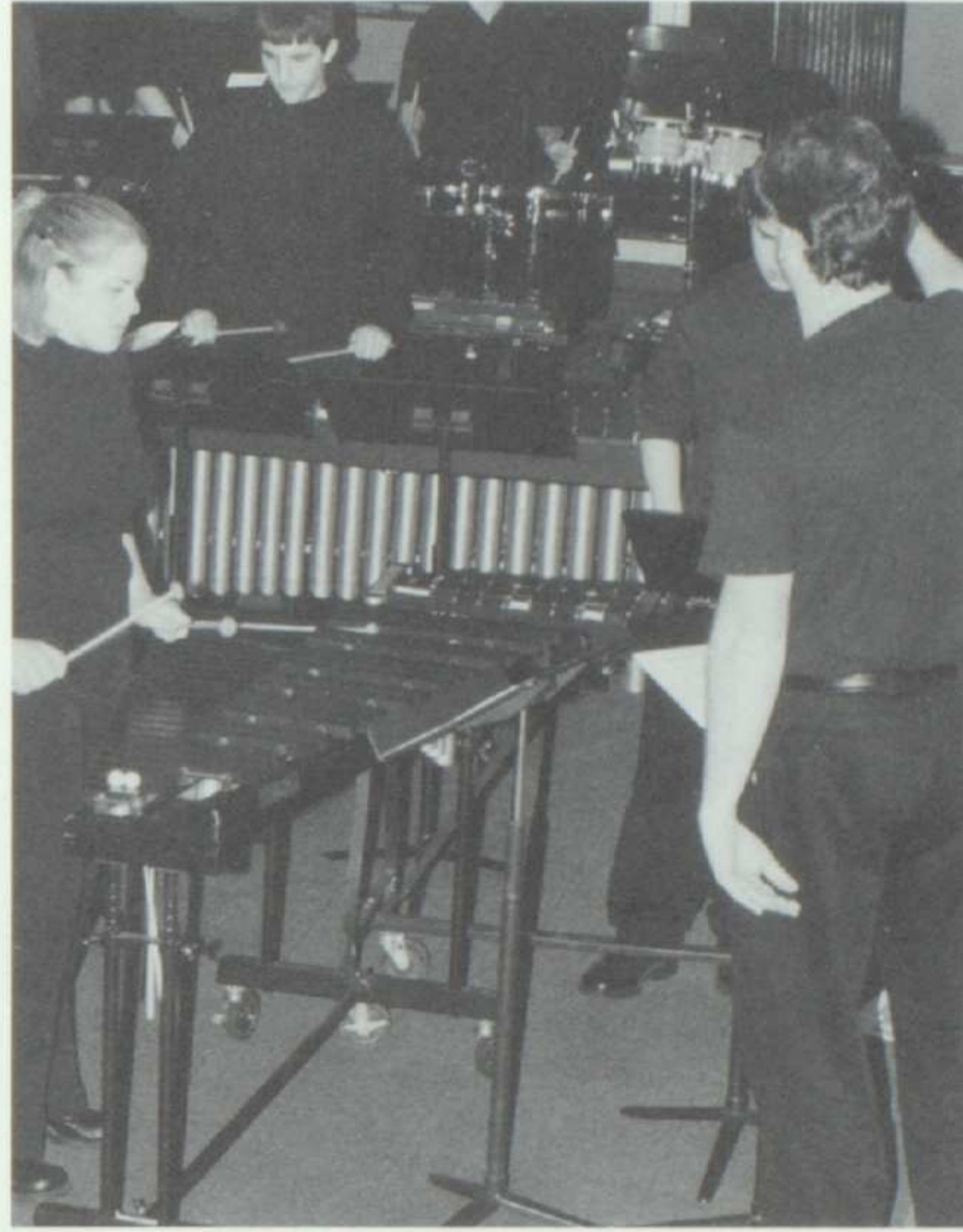

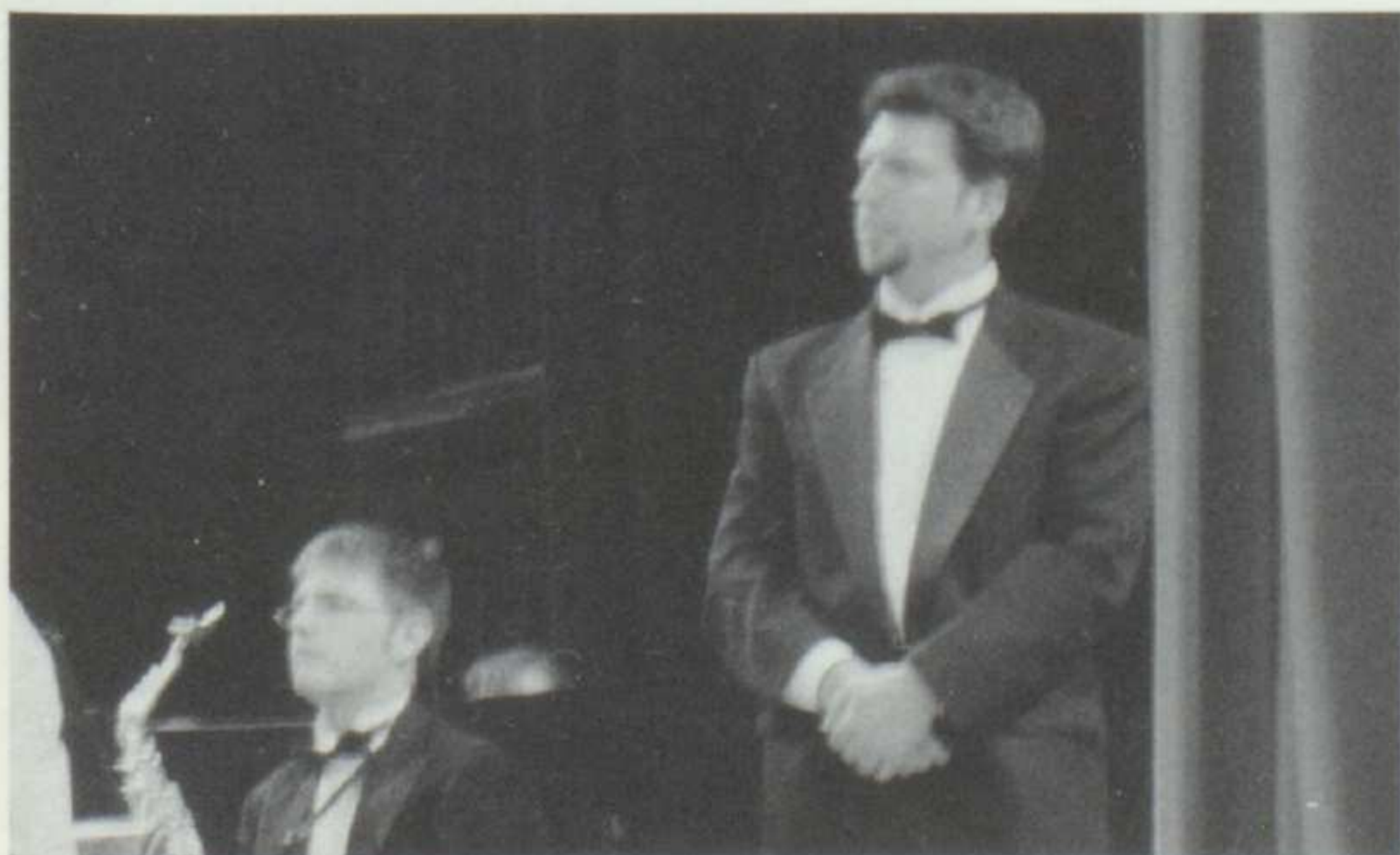

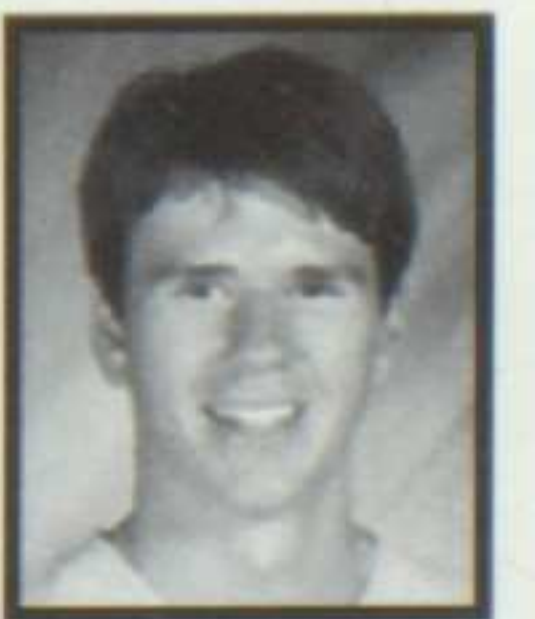

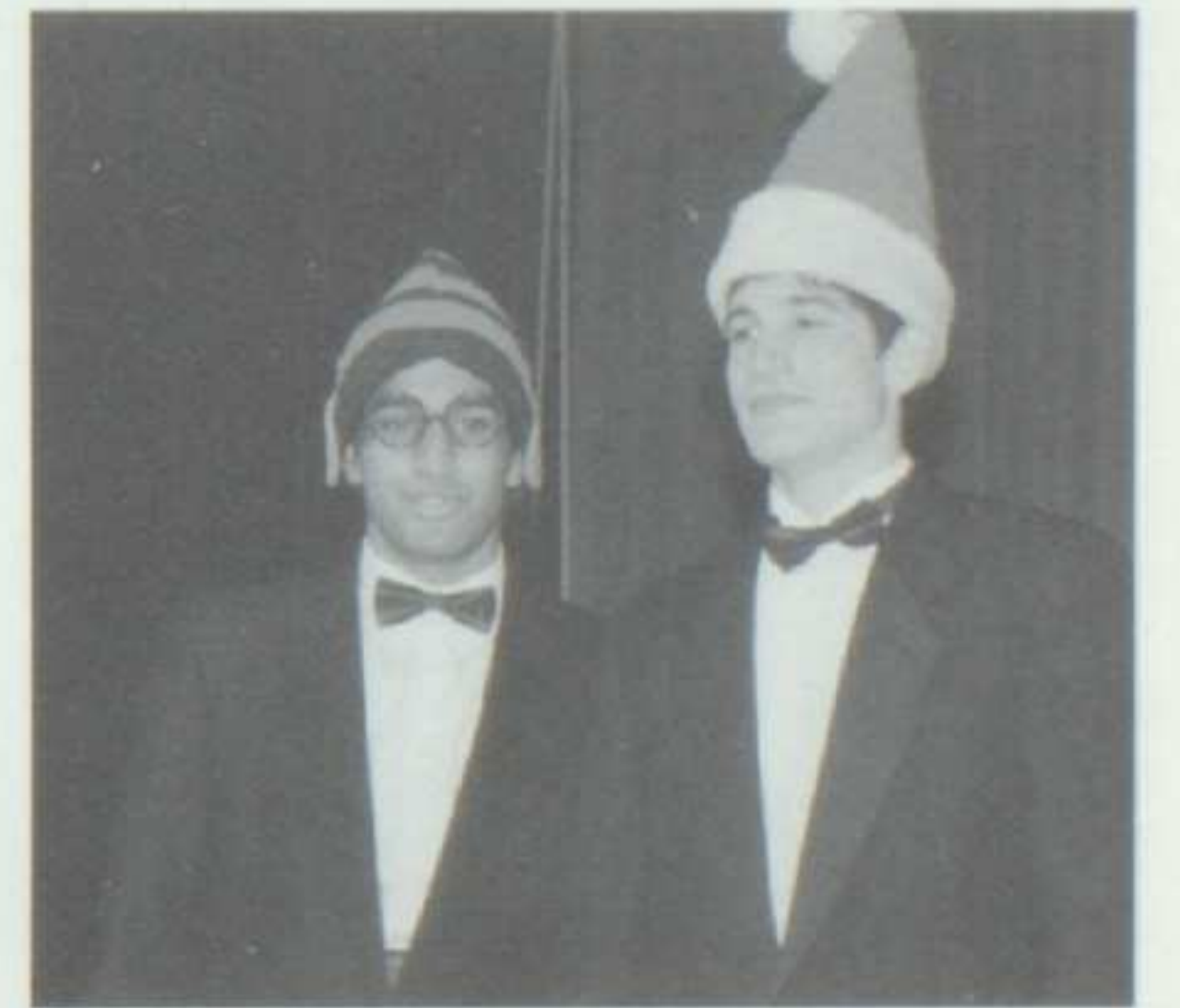

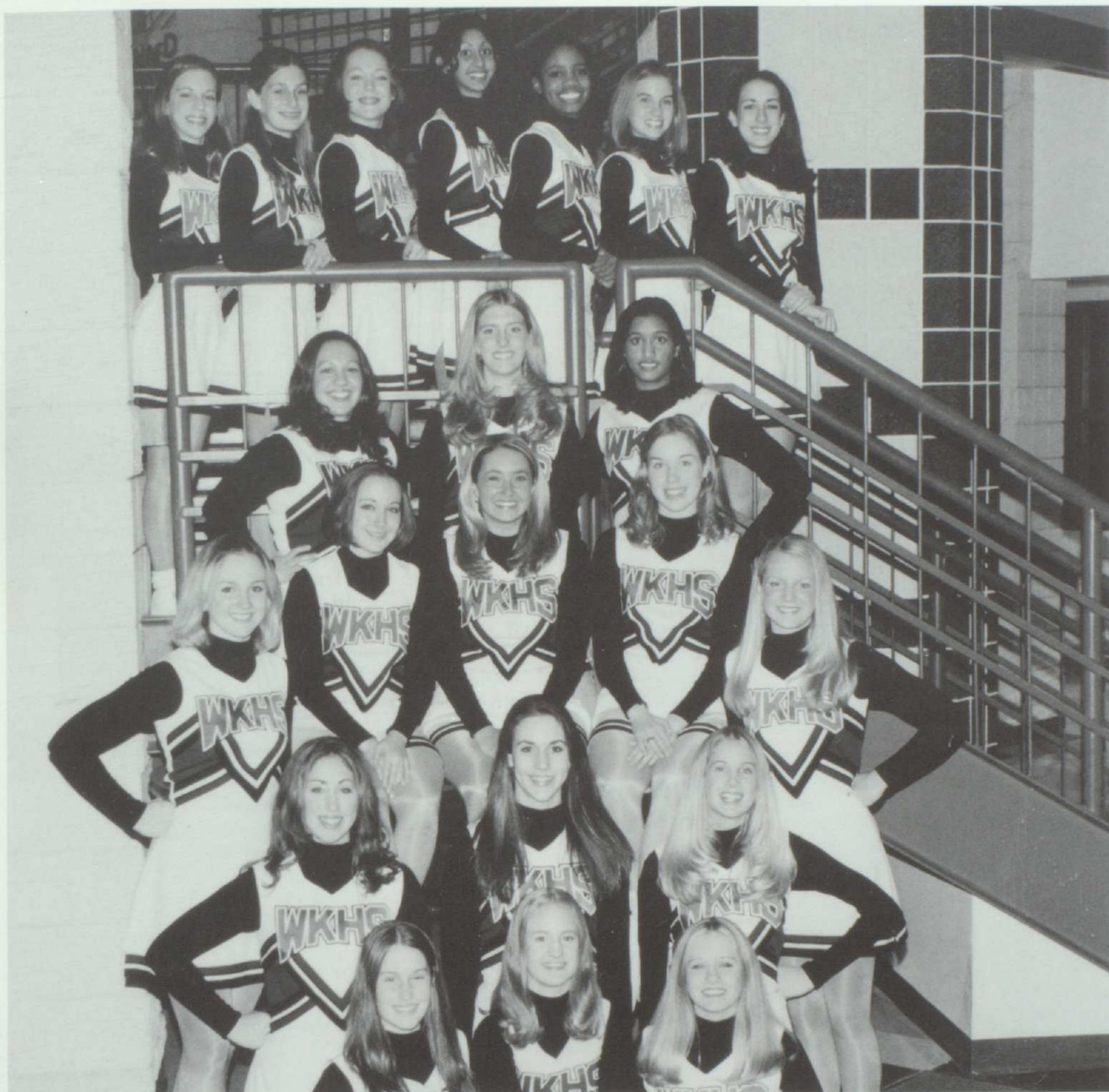

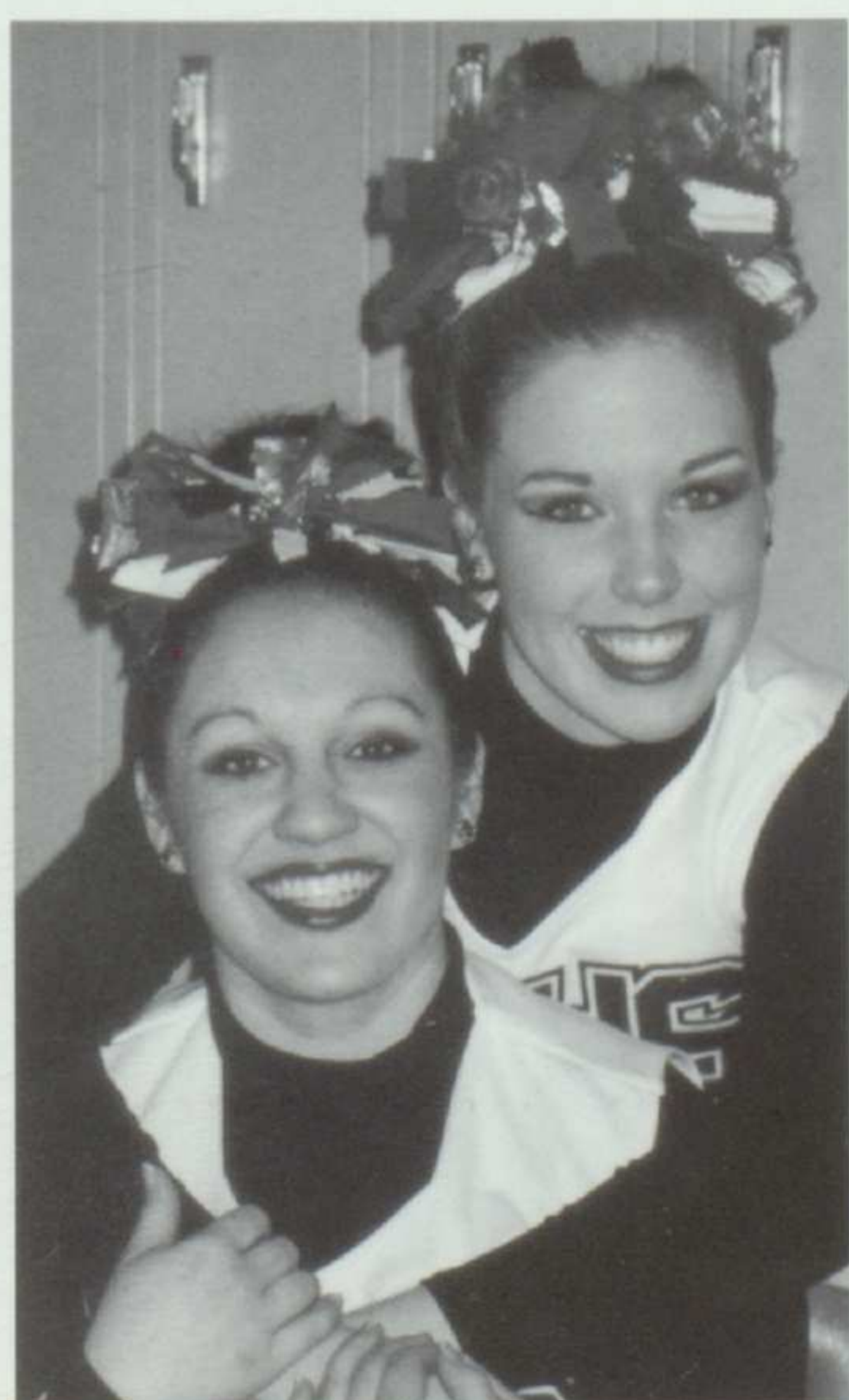

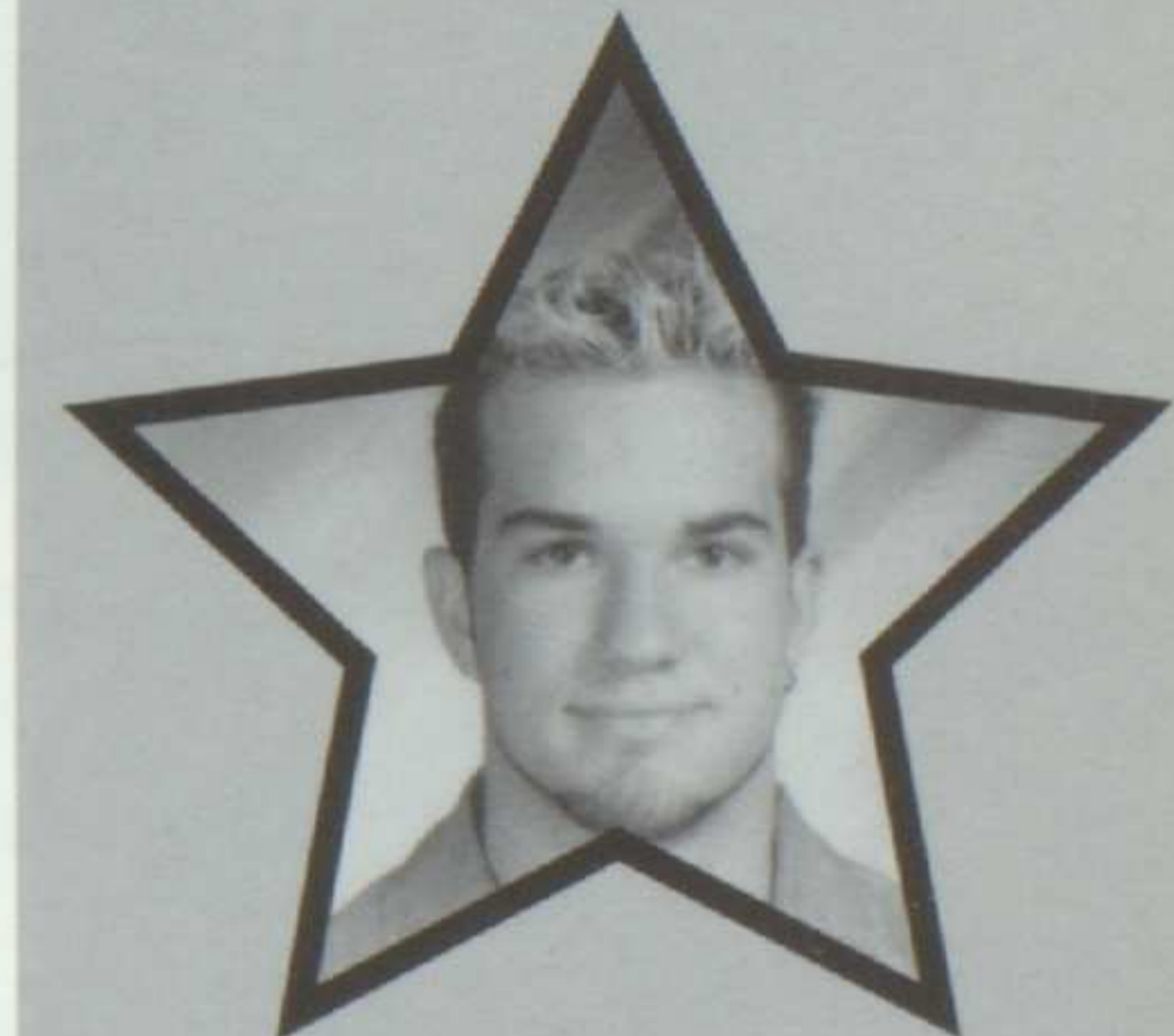

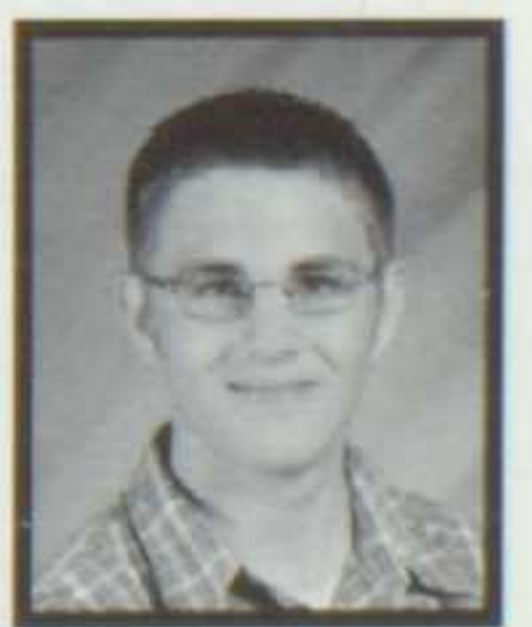

a suspenseful Wait Until Dark thriller

What do you get when you combine two con men, a murder plot, a blind woman, a rambunctious eight year old, and fifty thousand dollars worth of heroine? A thrilling play filled with murder, suspense, and plot twists and written by Frederick Knott, *Wait Until Dark* details the dangerous and deadly struggle of Susy Hendrix, a blind woman in a New York apartment, against three ruthless and organized conmen.

The lights rise imperceptibly on the apartment of Susy and Sam Hendrix. Mike and Carlino, two conmen sneak in, lured to the same place by a mysterious message. While recounting their sordid pasts and examining their unknown rendezvous, they speculate on the identity of their would-be employer. A cold, calculating man arrives, identifying himself as Harry Roat "Junior and Senior." As he unfolds the details of their assignment, they become involved over their heads: he wants them to con Mrs. Hendrix out of a heroine-stuffed doll her husband unwittingly brought home from Montreal. Roat traps them into doing the deed, and the con game begins under Roat's carefully arranged supervision.

The next morning, Susy bids farewell to her photographer husband, lured away from home by a phone call from Roat. Susy, who struggles daily with her blindness, is having a crisis when Mike walks in, pretending to be an old friend of her husband. It doesn't take long for Mike to earn Susy's trust and draw her into a web of deceit before he supposedly departs for home. When Susy squabbles with her helper Gloria, an erratic old man, none other than Roat, barges in and rifles through Susy's things before rushing out. Mike returns just in time to help Susy and then call the "police," pulling her only deeper into danger.

The mystery thickens when Carlino passes as a police detective who construes the facts to implicate Sam in the murder of a local woman found nearby. Roat returns as a crabby old man and spins even more lies to convince Susy that Sam has had an affair with the dead woman from whom

he took a doll. Susy is in shocked horror, knowing that the doll the "police" seek is in the apartment.

While Mike and Susy sack the apartment looking for the doll, Susy becomes suspicious. With Gloria's help, she begins to see through the lies and stories of Carlino and Roat, who reappear to put more pressure on her. When Gloria phones her and reveals that all three of her informers, Roat, Mike, and Carlino are in league, Susy tries desperately to throw them off her trail, eventually discovering the doll. She fights the conmen on her terms-in the dark. When Mike returns from one of her false

trials, threatening to hurt her but losing his nerve, Roat, enters the apartment having just killed Carlino and kills Mike. He moves in on Susy, searching for the doll he so desperately wants. Susy then out-cons the conman, keeping him from the doll long enough to smash all the lights and successfully disarm him. A fight in the complete darkness unfolds, with Roat and Susy engaging each other both physically and mentally in a struggle for survival.

Roat gets the doll, but Susy ultimately wins the battle in a climatic scene lit only by the dim light of the refrigerator. In a trap that was supposed to kill her, Susy emerges the winner, a blind woman alone in the dark over the dark evil of a malicious villain.

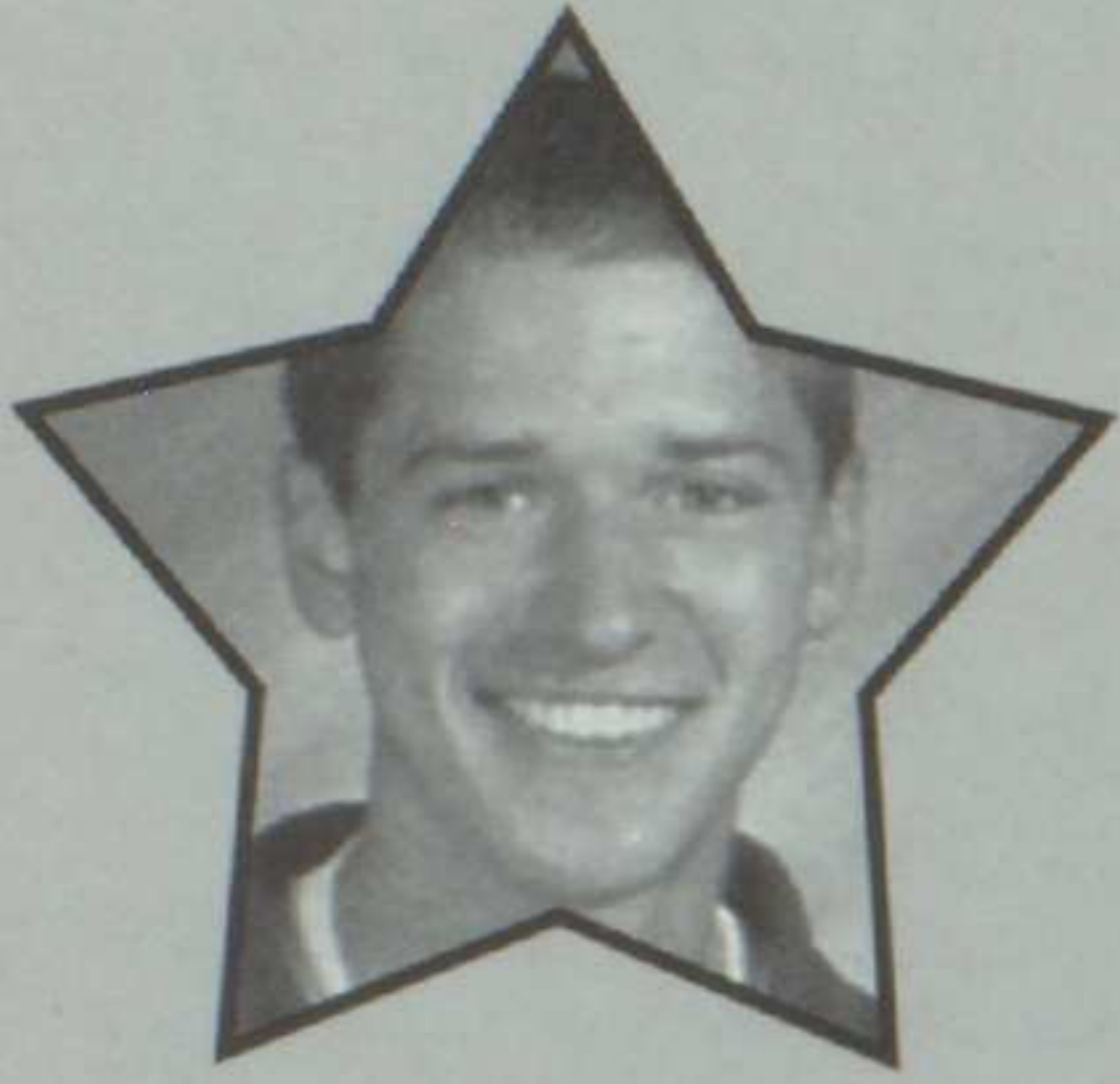

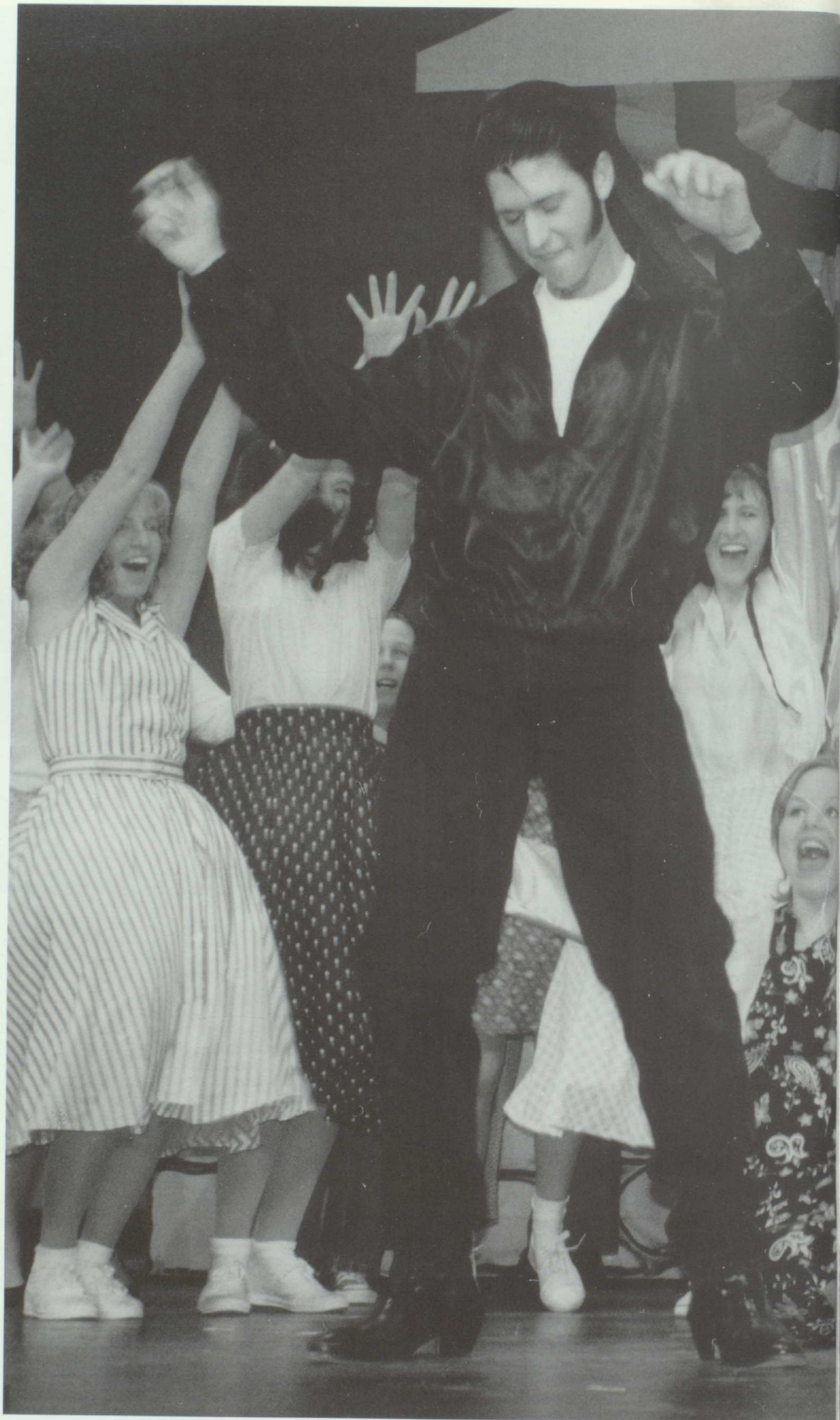

As Albert scrambles to save Almaelou, his ailing music company, the curtain rises on *Bye Bye Birdie*, the popular musical written by Michael Stewart with music and lyrics by Strouse and Adams.

As if Conrad's loss wasn't enough, Albert faces an ultimatum from his loyal secretary, Rose Alvarez: either he makes a serious commitment to their relationship, or she resigns from the company—and his life. Rose reminds him of his dream of being an English teacher, to which Albert replies that he needs the money that only Conrad can generate. Rose, therefore, proposes a scheme to free Albert, release Conrad, and dissolve Almaelou. Albert is to orchestrate *One Last Kiss*, an event highlighting Conrad's music career. With a parting kiss to a random fan, Kim MacAfee, a popular girl from Sweet Apple, Ohio, whose steady Hugo Peabody has just pinned her, Conrad will join the army.

At Penn Station, throngs of young girls screech *We love you, Conrad!* while Albert's domineering mother who doesn't like Rose, Albert, and Rosie successfully ward off a swarm of reporters and fans, assuring all that Conrad is a "healthy normal American boy."

When Conrad arrives in Sweet Apple, Kim and her friends worship him while the adults and Hugo are more skeptical. When Hugo confronts his steady, she assures him with a knockout performance of *Honestly Sincere* at the courthouse. The irritable Mr. MacAfee, who is housing the pop star, doesn't like the boy and tells Kim so at breakfast.

As Rosie shows Albert around the movie house where the show will occur, he explains his plans for the future. No sooner has he mentioned the dissolution of Almaelou when Mrs. Peterson appears, wrings repentance out of her son,

insults Rosie, and matches Albert up with a stage girl she found on the bus. The now star-struck Mr. MacAfee hampers Conrad's performance until Hugo, directed by Rose, knocks out Conrad, stunning the audience.

Rosie then prepares to start a new, wild life, free of Albert. When Albert confronts her at the MacAfee home, she storms

out leaving him alone and confused. Mr. MacAfee tries to deal with his daughter, who is determined to join Rosie, and laments his loss of "respect." Meanwhile, Conrad has decided to run away but first goes out for a night on the town with the youth of Sweet Apple joining him, which spurs their parents to action and Hugo to despair. The MacAfees wonder *What's the Matter with Kids Today?* as they hunt for their lost daughter. When Rose arrives at a local bar, her declaration of a new life as "Spanish Rose" leads to desperate phone calls from Albert, who is still trying to lull her back. She hangs up on him and proceeds to engage in a carefree

dance with the Shriners, leaving when the situation goes wild. Albert arrives at the bar in time to tell off his mother, finally ridding himself of her dominance. After she departs in a torrent of guilt, the Sweet Apple parents further detain Albert until Rosie arrives and reveals that Conrad and Kim are at the Ice House. When the Sweet Apple adults arrive to rescue their young ones from immorality, Conrad is arrested, and Kim redeems herself with Hugo. Albert shows Rosie that he is truly an independent man, urging her to meet him the next morning at the train station.

At the station, Albert sneaks Conrad, bailed out and dressed like a woman, onto a train. Mama appears to regain her son, but he bustles her onto the train too. Albert reveals to Rosie that they are going to Pumpkin Falls, Iowa, where they will marry and he will teach English. The happy couple sings a duet to *Rosie* and kisses as the curtain closes.



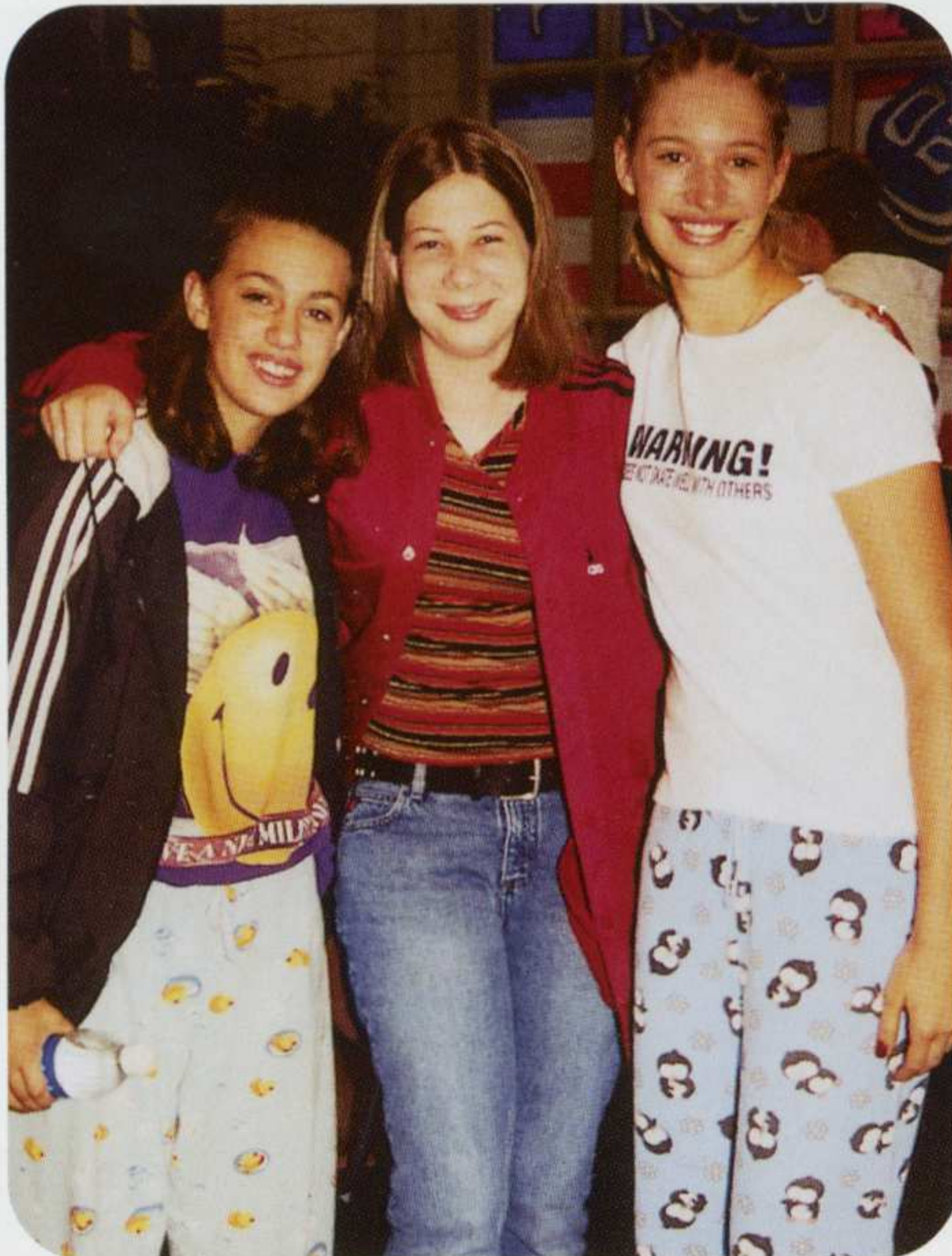

seniors Jessica Gebbert, Eric Boulware, Marissa Houk, Shawn Patterson, Colleen Riddle, and AJ Gafford.

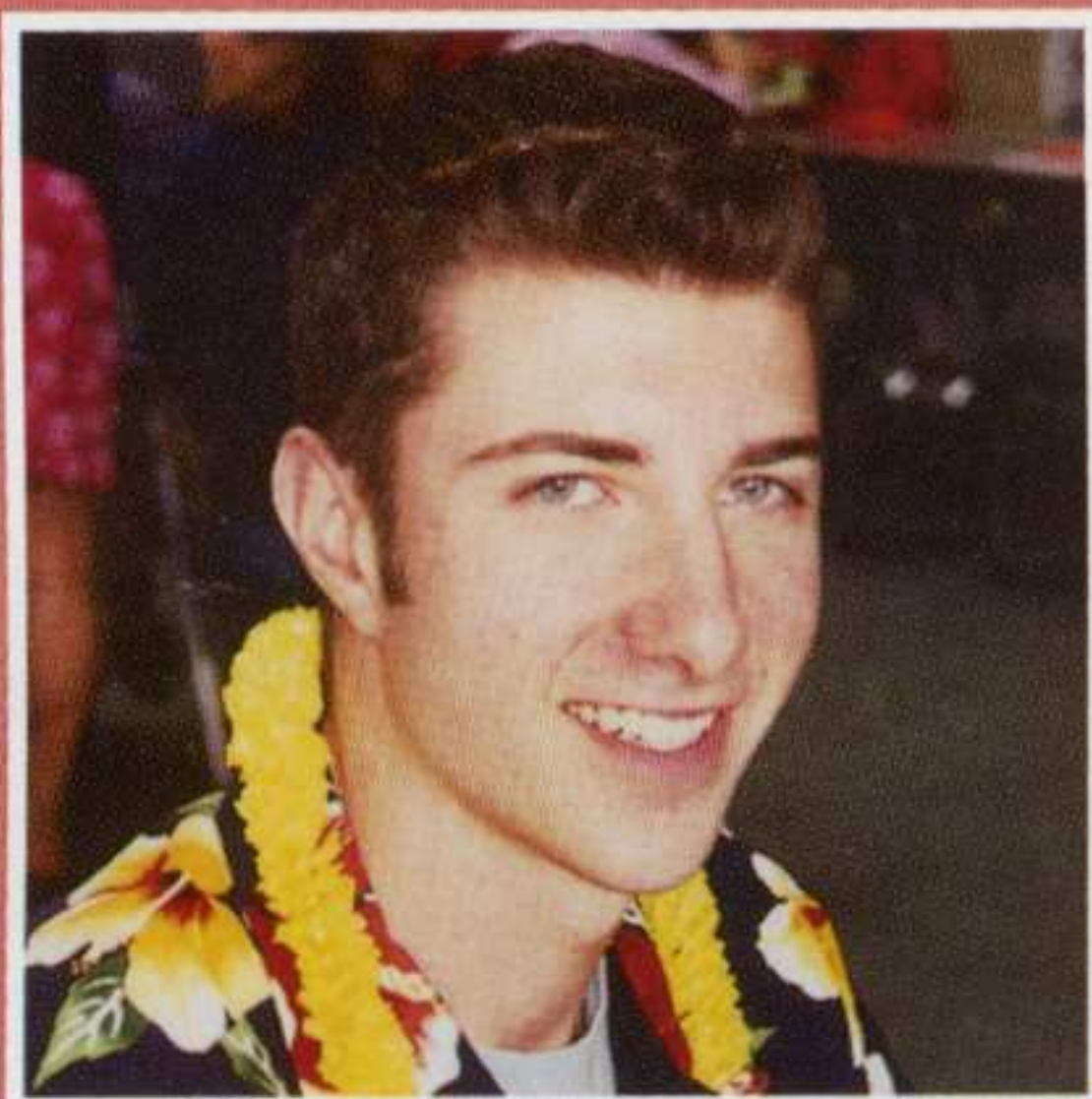

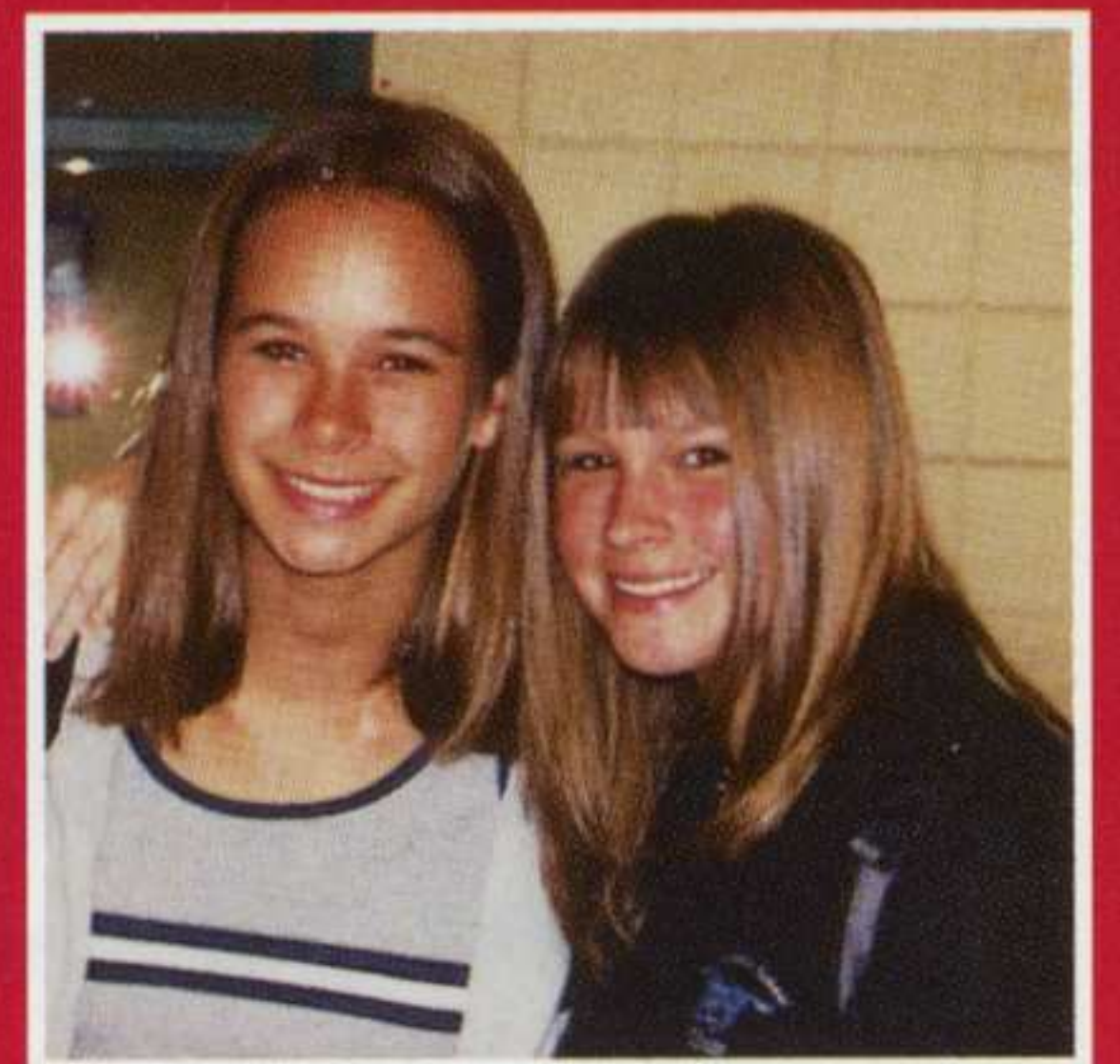

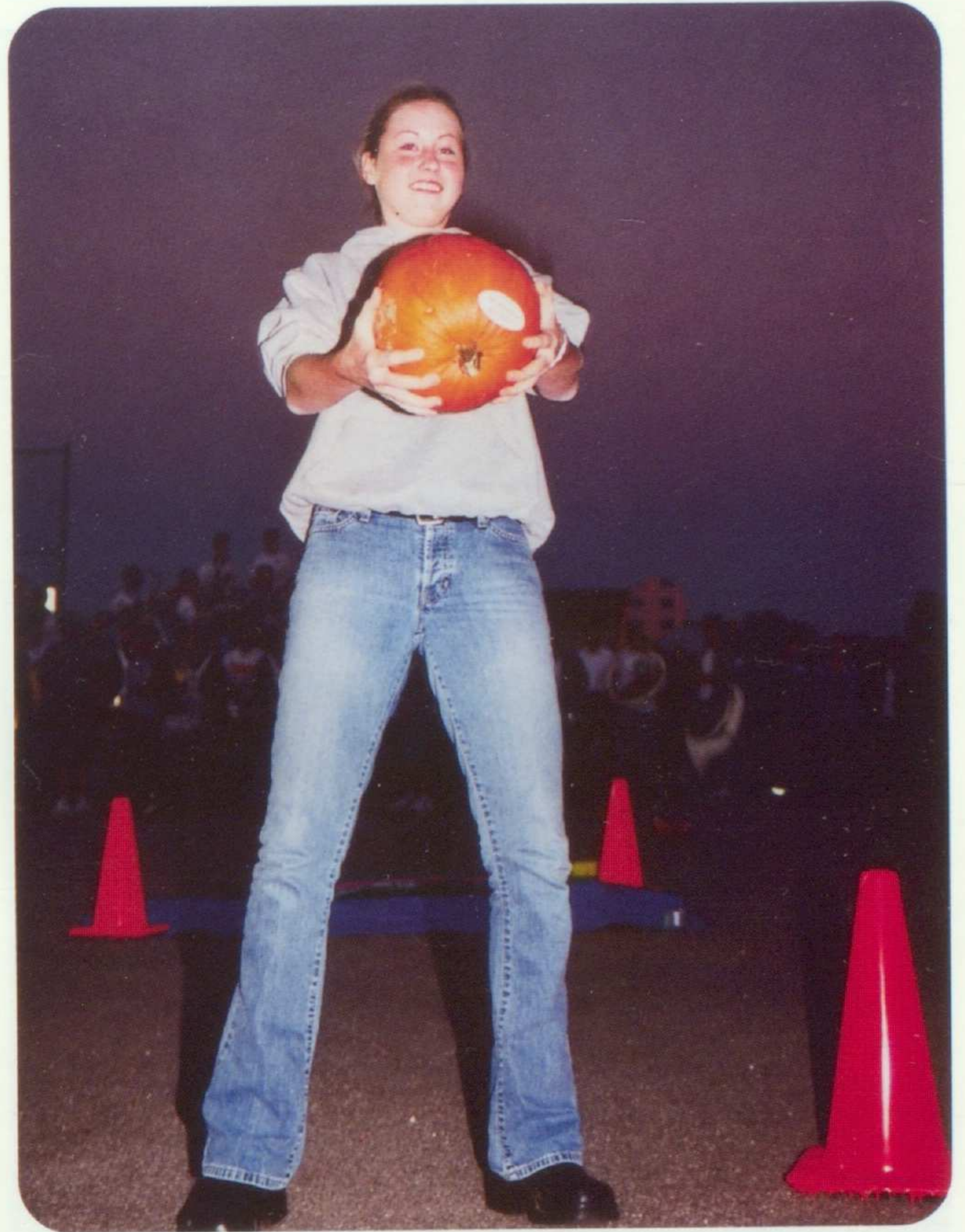

Faith Hill.

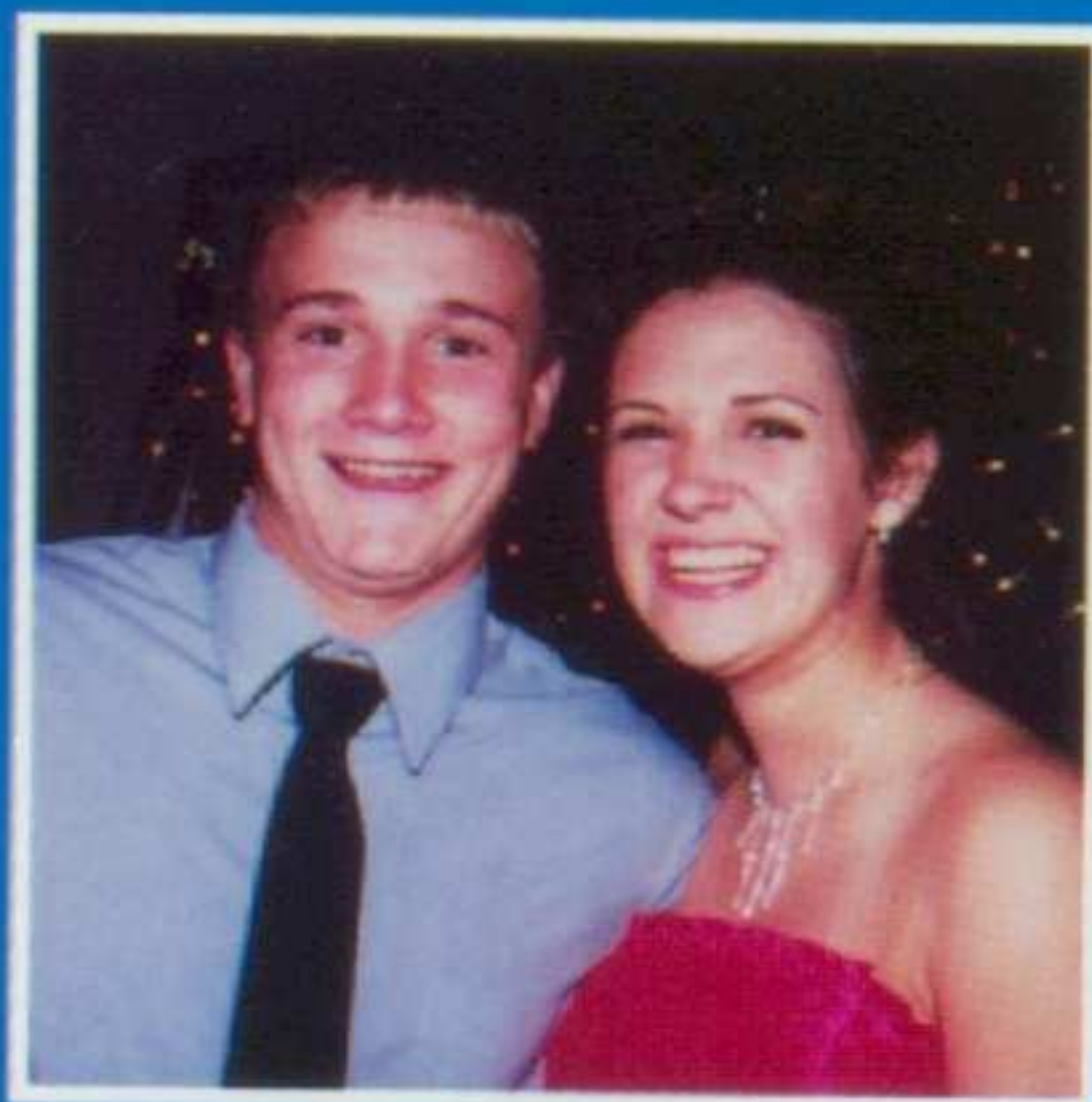

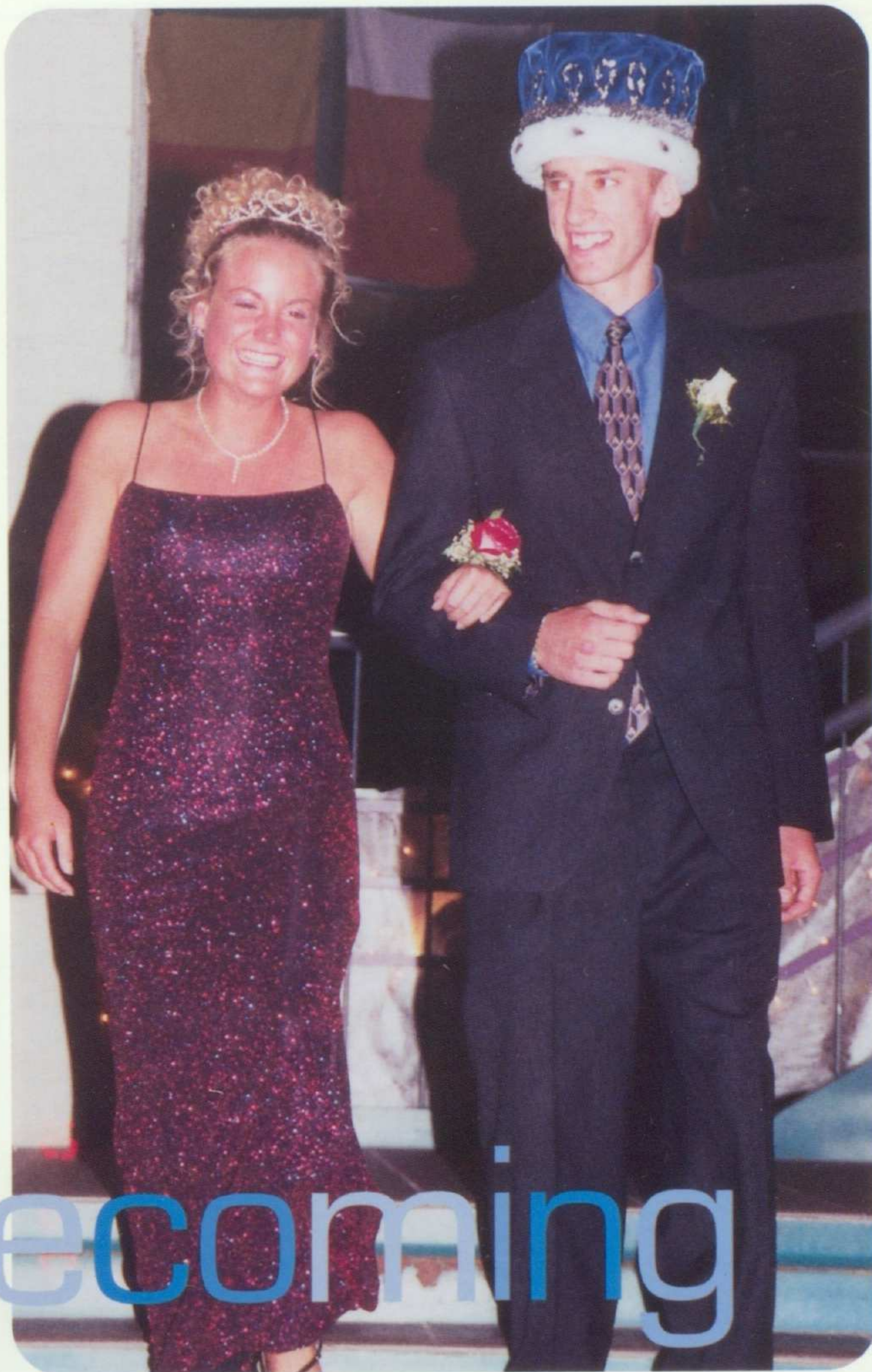

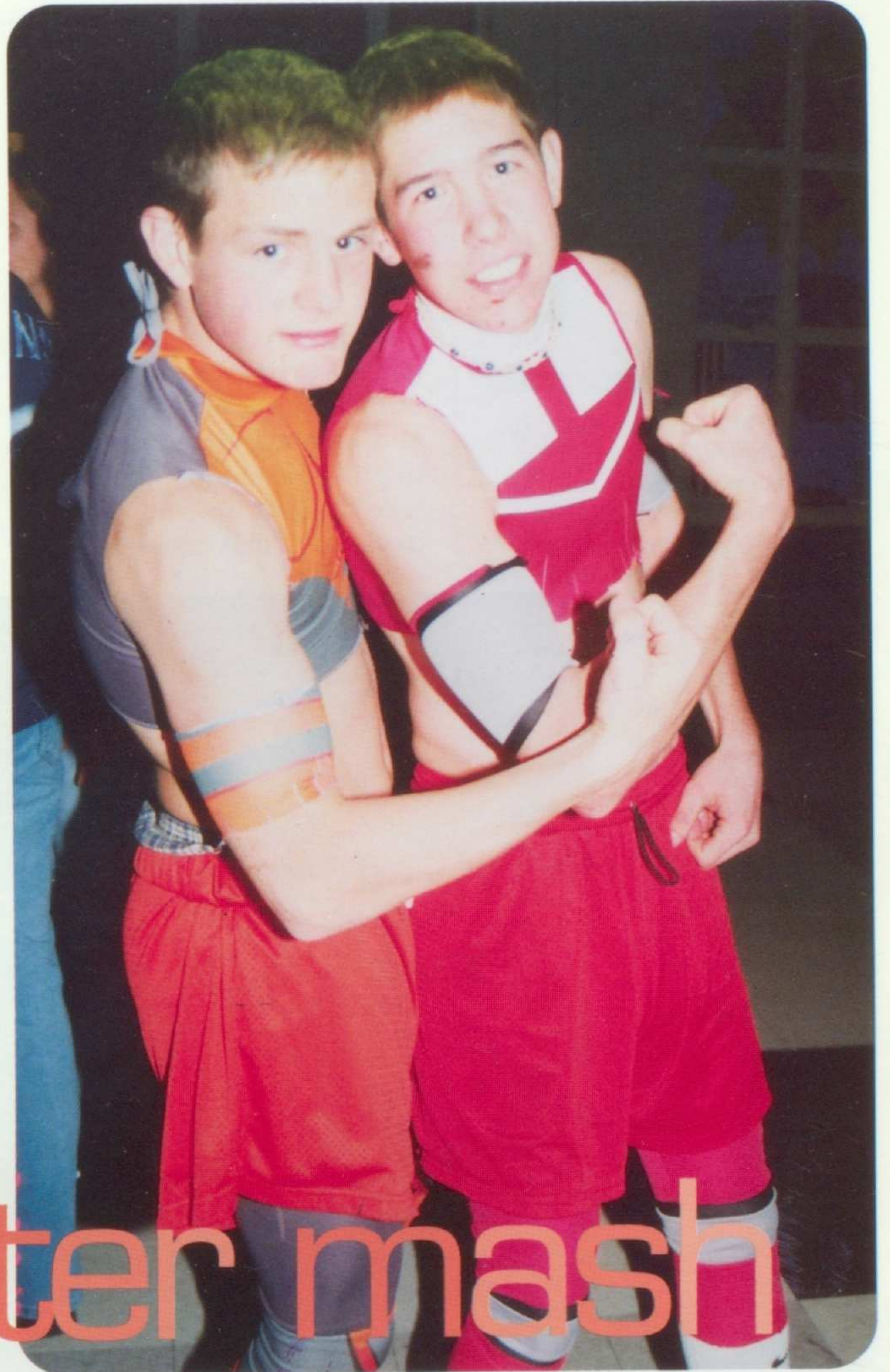

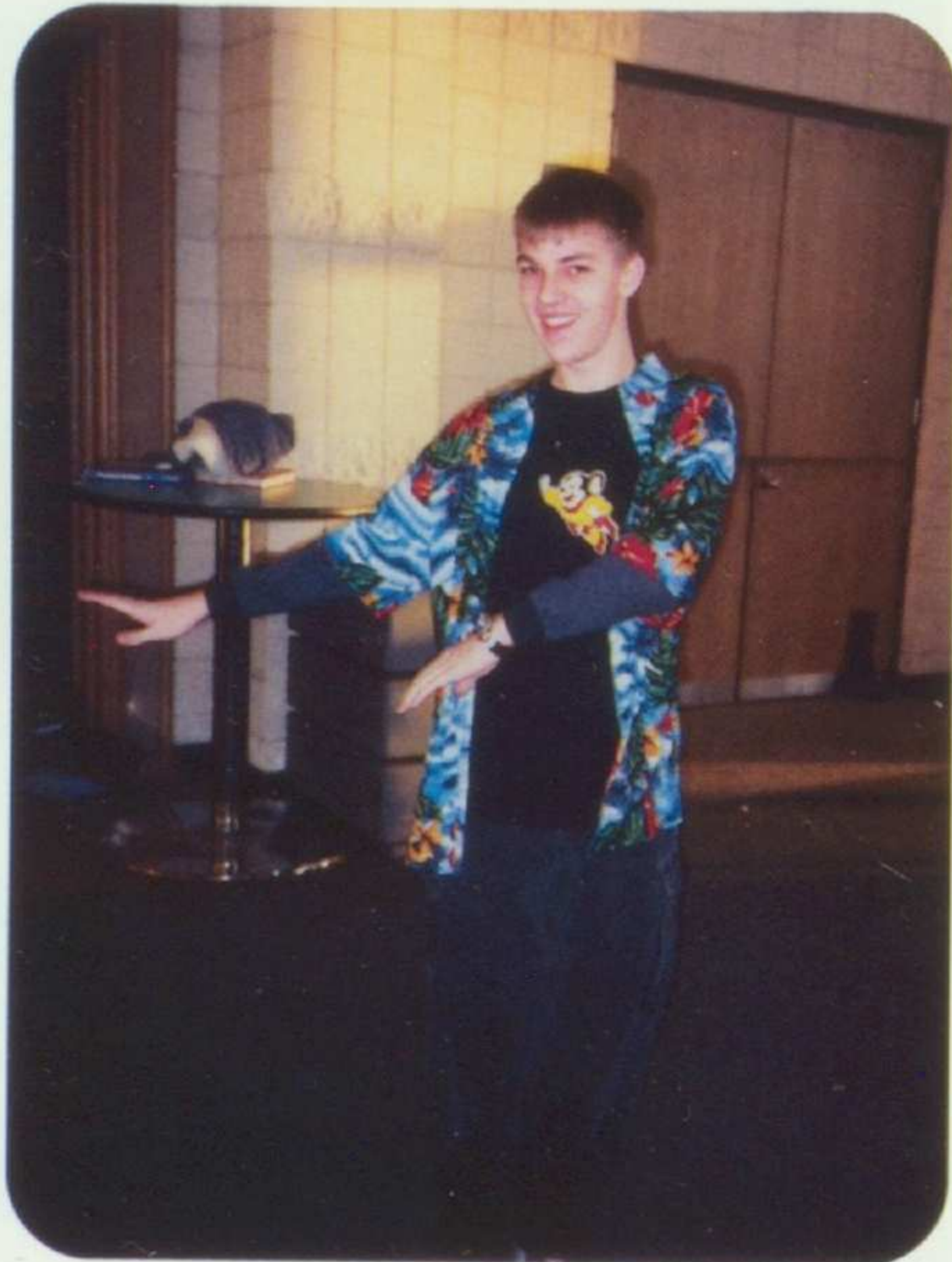
Friday was also the final day for the ten seniors nominated for sweet-

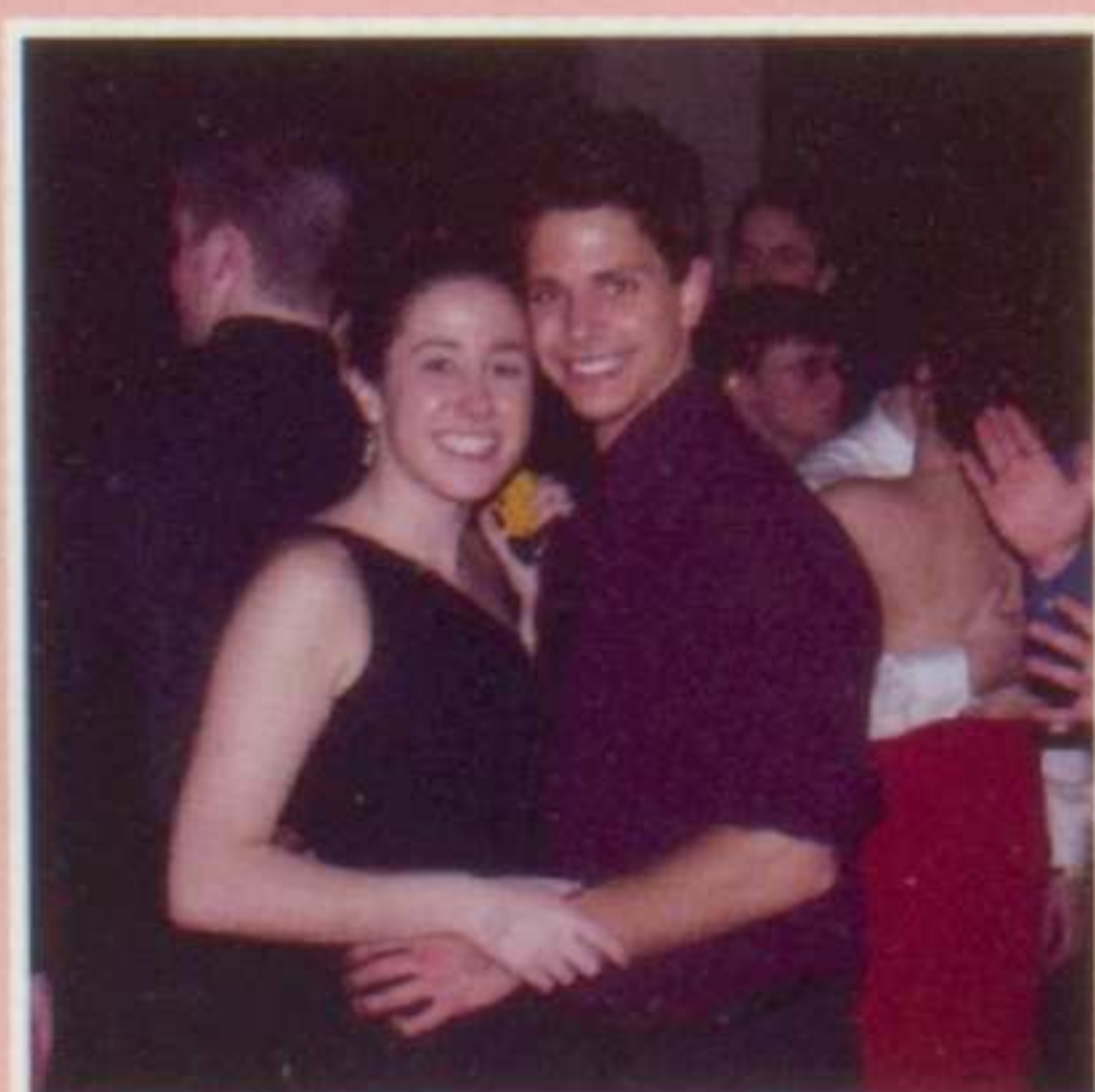

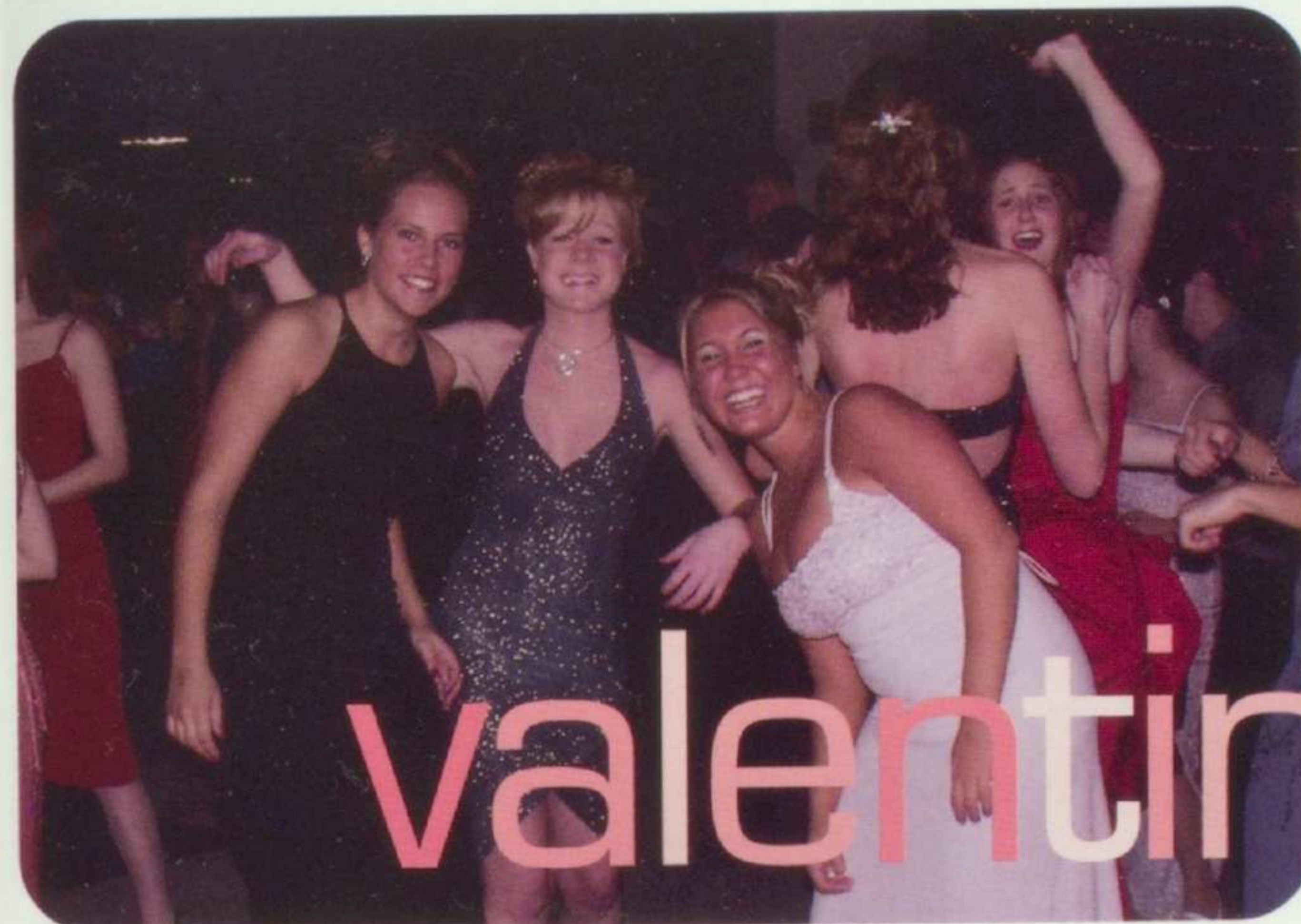

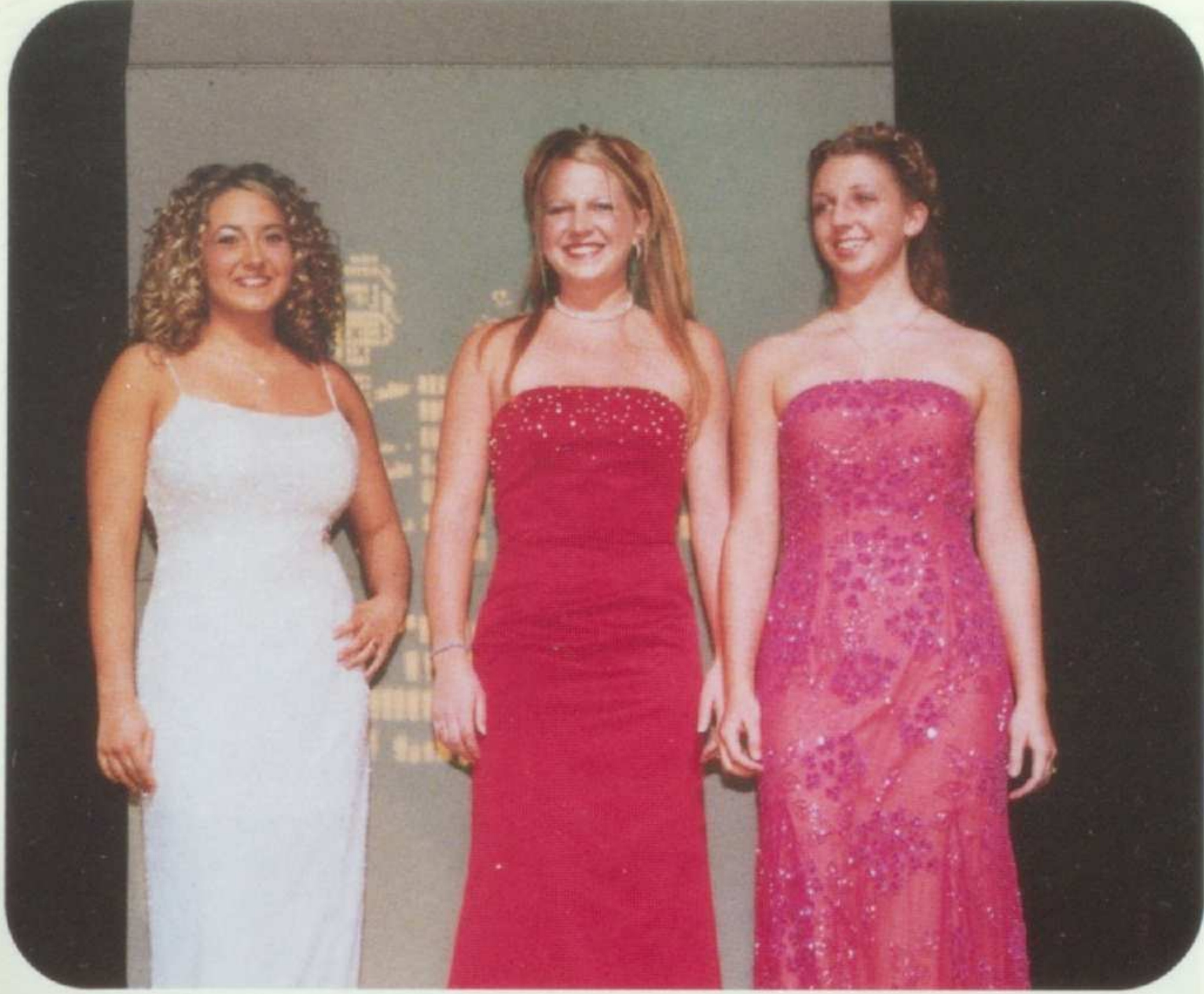

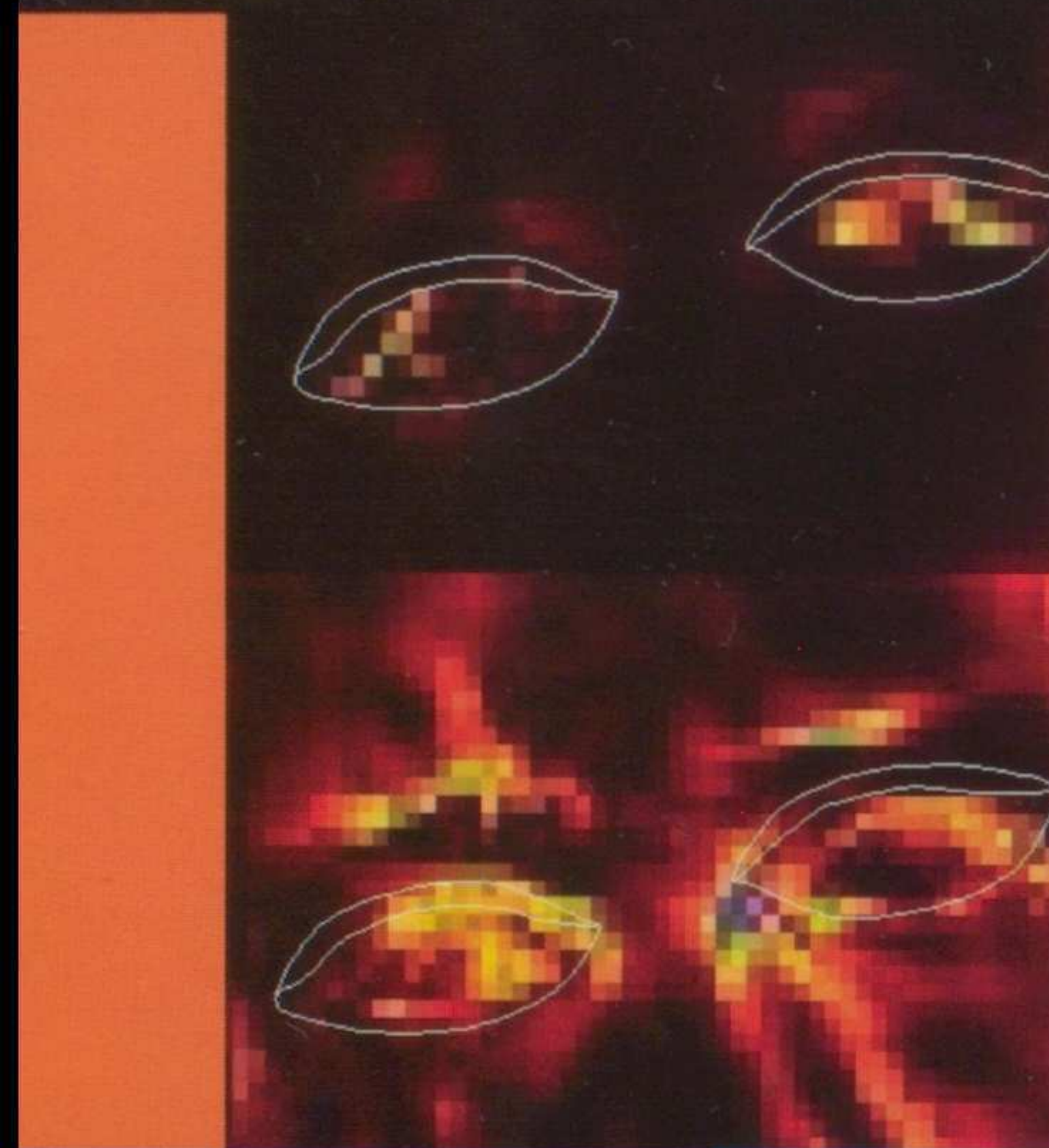

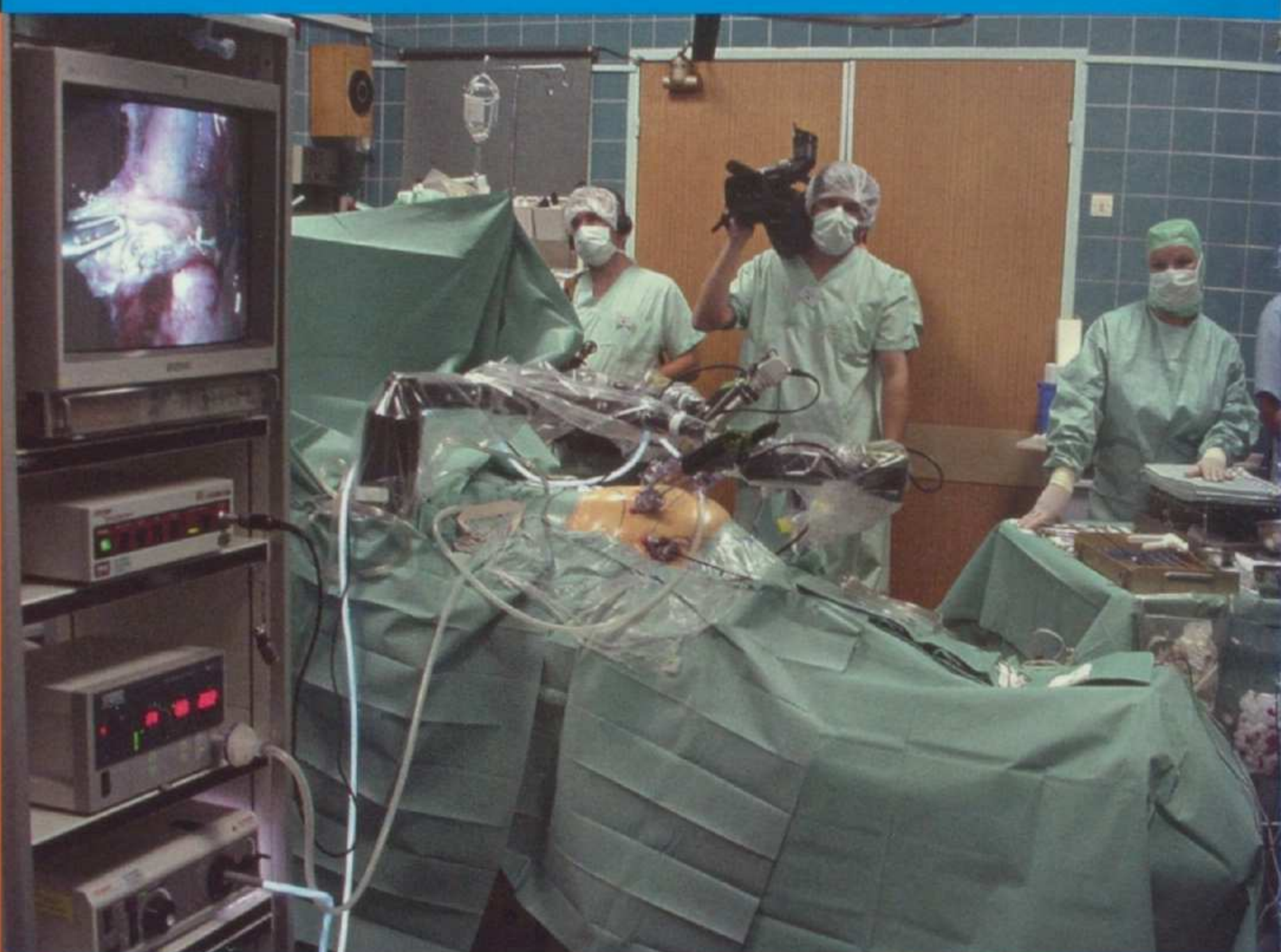

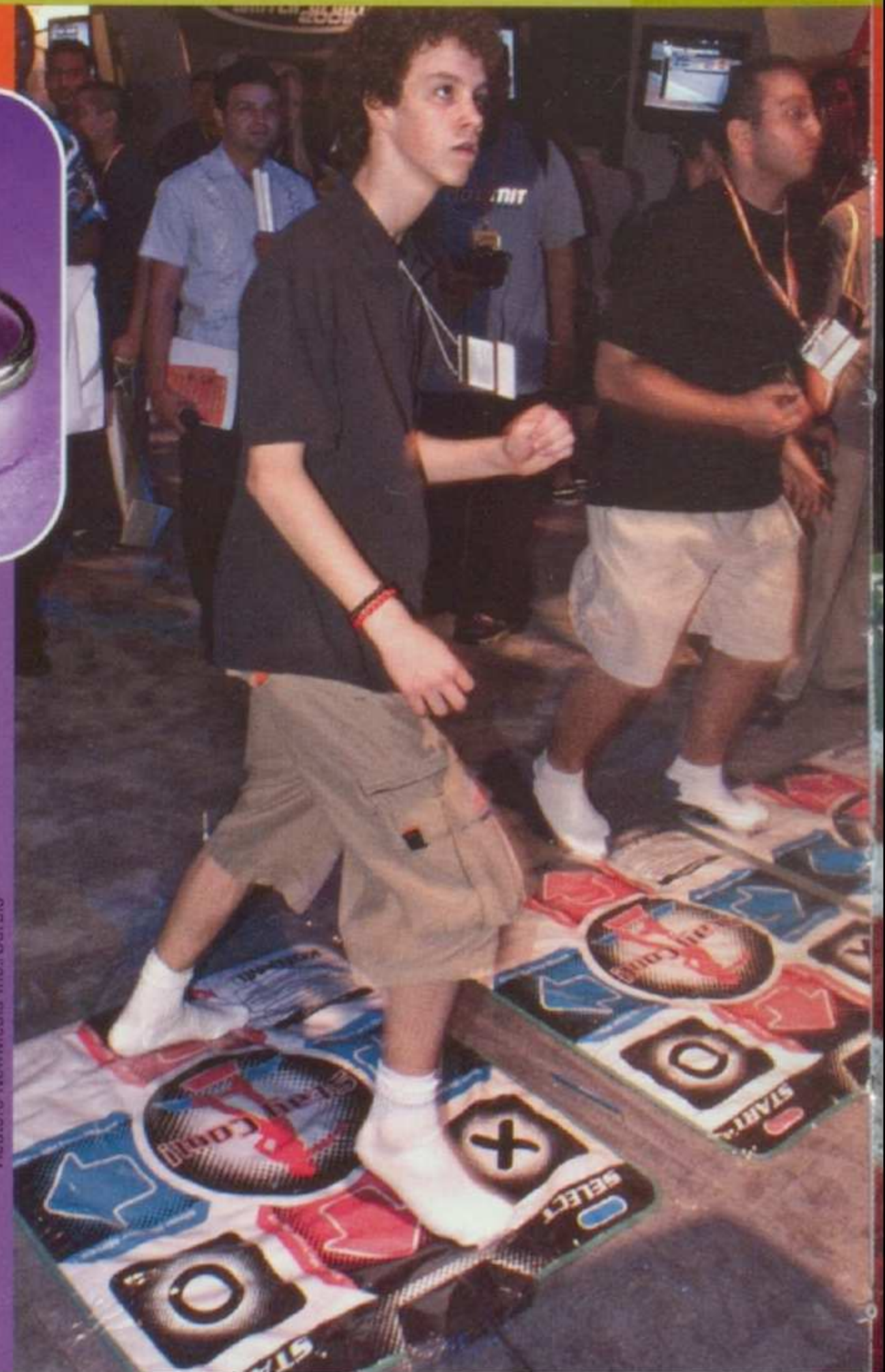

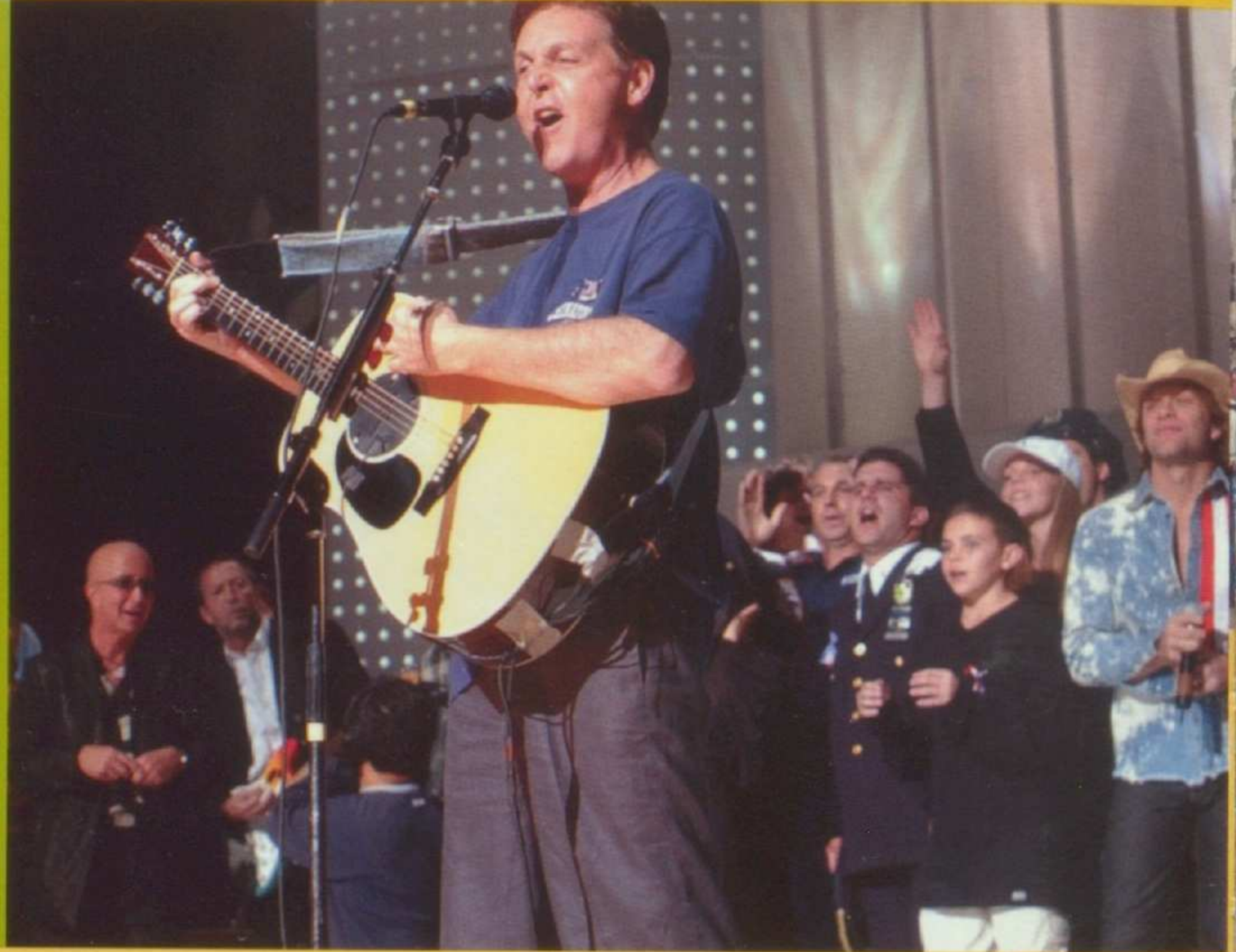

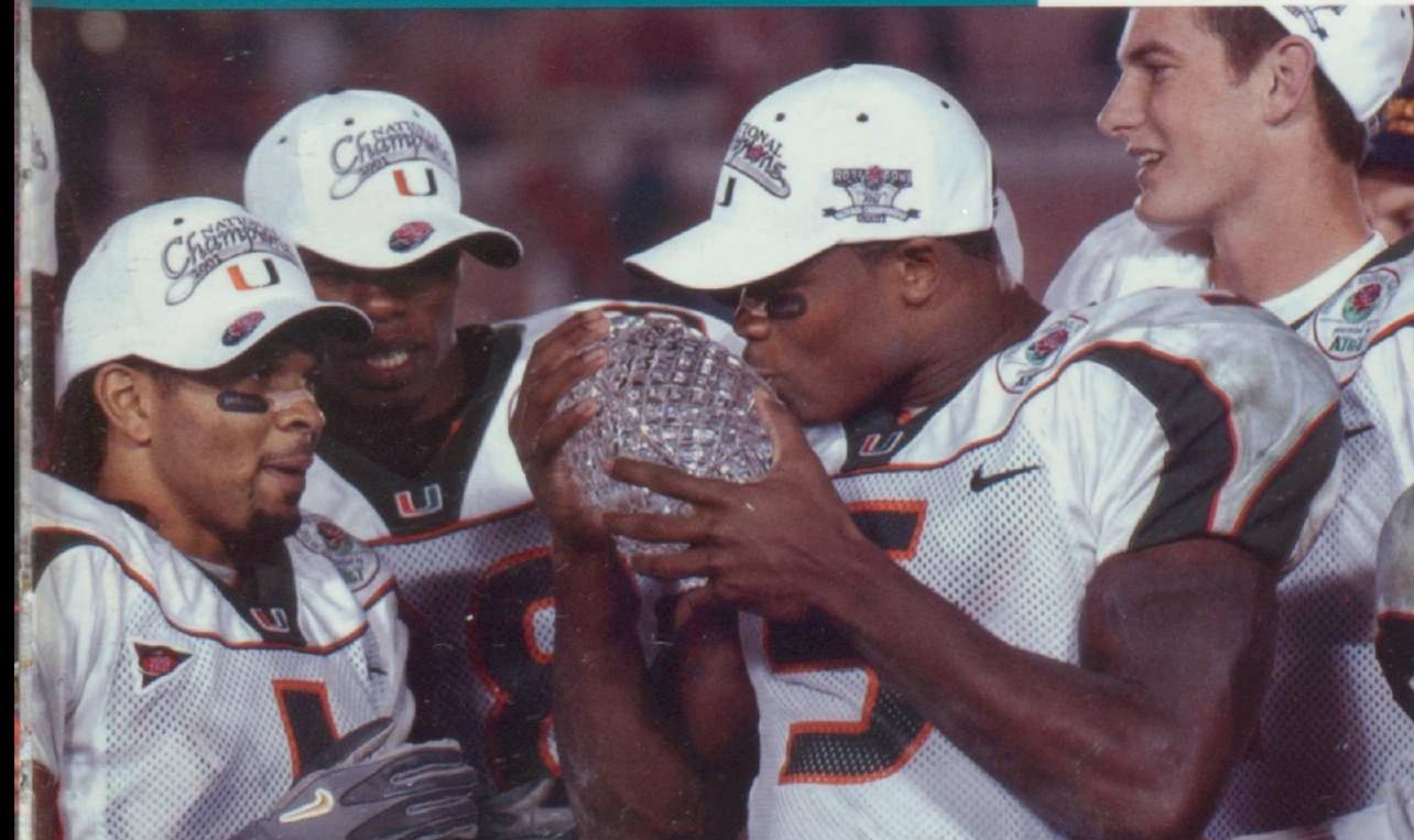
